EXTERNAL EXAMINATION: The body is that of a <sup>Male of</sup> Caucasian descent, measuring 5ft. 2 ins. fully dressed in long top boots, khaki suit, pants held up by a leather belt with pouch. The left top pocket of the suit had a "Bianca" breath spray and red plastic band. On the right little finger there was a deformed gold ring the stone was missing. When the body was undressed there was a bony fragment on the pubic region; deceased was circumcised. There was also a birth mark on the (L) lower abdomen.

The following were seen:-

- (1) On the (R) side of the chest perforating wound 1.5 c.ms. by 1 c.m. elliptical 6 c.ms. below the (R) collar bone. (Clavicle).
- (2) Perforating wound (L) upper limb lateral aspect 2c.ms. x 1½ c.ms. It is 8 c.ms. from the top of the (L) shoulder - one deformed bullet removed.
- (3) Perforating wound angle of (L) jaw 6 c.ms. from tip of (L) ear and 10c.ms. above root of neck.
- (4) Lacerated wound 4c.ms. long running diagonally across nose.
- (5) Abrasion point of chin - circular.
- (6) Laceration at junction of eye brow 2 c.ms. long.
- (7) Healed scar in abdomen (appendix scar).

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

OROPHARYNX: Empty.

TRACHEA & BRONCHI: Blood stained mucus in lumen of Bronchi.

THORACIC CAVITY: Blood and blood clots in thoracic cavity to a volume of 600 ml.

LUNGS: Perforation of (R) upper and lower lobes in two places. Perforation of left lung lower lobe. Collapse of both lungs.

HEART: Normal size; Coronary vessels patent. Myocardium firm and normal, some atheromatous changes in arch aorta, one small plaque present.

ABDOMINAL CAVITY:

- LIVER: Congested.
- GALL BLADDER: No gall stones.
- STOMACH: Empty. Some gastritis.
- SMALL INTESTINES: Normal, appendix absent.
- LIVER: Normal in appearance.
- KIDNEYS: Normal in appearance.
- PANCREAS: Normal in appearance.

SKULL:

FRONTAL: Compound comminuted fracture of the (L) side of the skull beginning at the temporal bone extending upwards and backwards to the occipital bone. Fracture lines running in all directions on the (L) side and extending into the (R) side. Bits of the parietal bones were missing. The base of the skull was fractured in the anterior, middle and posterior occipital fossae on both (R) and (L) sides.

**BRAIN:** Multiple lacerations with protrusion of contents of cranium.

**CAUSE OF DEATH:** HAEMORRHAGE AND SHOCK FOLLOWING MULTIPLE INJURIES:

- (1) PERFORATION OF THE LUNGS WITH BILATERAL HAEMATHORAX.
- (2) COMPOUND COMMINUTED FRACTURE OF SKULL WITH LACERATION AND HERNIATION OF THE BRAIN.
