29 I, JYNONA NORWOOD, declare as follows:

30 1. I am the executive director of the Guyana Tribute Foundation. I submit this  
31 declaration in support of my and Guyana Tribute Foundation's *ex parte* application for a  
32 temporary restraining order and request for Order to Show Cause why a preliminary injunction

1 should not issue against THE EVERGREEN CEMETERY ASSOCIATION, BUCK  
2 KAMPHAUSEN and RON HAULMAN (hereinafter collectively "Defendants") regarding the  
3 Defendants' construction and erection of a memorial wall on the base and setting promised by  
4 Defendants to Plaintiffs, and specifically requesting an order that Defendants and their  
5 principals, officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and those persons under their control,  
6 or in active concert or participation with them, immediately cease and desist from permitting the  
7 New People's Temple or any other person or entity from constructing any memorial upon the  
8 mass grave site of the victims of Jonestown until the instant action is adjudicated.

9         2.         On or about November 18, 1978, exactly 918 American citizens, including  
10 Congressman Leo Ryan and his UPI news group were tortured, massacred, and killed in  
11 Jonestown, Guyana by the People's Temple Church under the direction, guidance and instruction  
12 of its Reverend, Jim Jones (hereinafter referred to as the "Jonestown Massacre"). These victims  
13 were led to their death by Rev. Jim Jones in a mass murder-suicide pact. Among the bodies  
14 recovered, 305 victims were children, and 40 were infants. These bodies were flown back to the  
15 United States and eventually laid to rest in a mass grave located at the Evergreen Cemetery,  
16 located 6450 Camden Street Oakland, California (hereinafter referred to as "Evergreen  
17 Cemetery") and owned, operated and controlled by Defendants.

18         3.         I lost 27 of my own family members at the Jonestown Massacre, 17 of which  
19 were children. Most of these victims are buried at Evergreen Cemetery.

20         4.         Moved by this tragedy and overwhelmed with people grief, in 1978, I began to  
21 take steps to honor the child victims who needlessly died in the Jonestown Massacre. For the  
22 past 32 years, I have organized an annual public memorial at Evergreen Cemetery to ensure that  
23 the lives lost in the Jonestown Massacre would not be forgotten. Supporters of these memorial  
24 services include, and have included: Senator Diane Feinstein, Poet Laureate Maya Angelou,  
25 Former California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger, current California Governor Jerry Brown,  
26 Congresswoman Barbara Lee, former San Francisco Mayor Willie Brown, comedian and activist  
27 Dick Gregory, former Oakland Mayor Elihu Harris, California Attorney General Kamala Harris,  
28

1 President of the San Francisco Chapter of the NAACP Reverend Amos Brown, and former San  
2 Francisco Mayor Frank Jordan.

3 5. In November 1992, the supporters, family members and friends of the child  
4 victims developed the idea of building a permanent memorial to honor the memory of the three  
5 hundred and forty children who perished during the Jonestown Massacre at the hands of the  
6 People's Temple and Jim Jones. It seemed only fitting and appropriate that Evergreen Cemetery  
7 would be the home to a physical memorial that would stand as a permanent and painful reminder  
8 to future generations of the child victims' families and supporters of the lives of the precious  
9 child victims who perished so young.

10 6. From 1980 through 1992, I began advocating for, and approached Evergreen  
11 Cemetery about erecting and building the Cherishing the Children Healing Memorial Wall  
12 (hereinafter referred to as "Jonestown Memorial Wall") in the memory of the 305 children, their  
13 families, Congressman Leo Ryan and the UPI news crew who perished at the Jonestown  
14 Massacre. In 1992, Buck Kamphausen, President of Evergreen Cemetery (hereinafter referred to  
15 as "Kamphausen") and on behalf of Evergreen Cemetery, verbally committed to me and the  
16 families of the victims, a numerous memorials, that Evergreen Cemetery would provide the land,  
17 base and foundation for the Jonestown Memorial Wall.

18 7. Shortly after the verbal assurances by Defendants, I began contacting granite  
19 companies across the county for a quote to build the Jonestown Memorial Wall. When I told the  
20 Defendants that I found a company who could construct the Jonestown Memorial Wall for a  
21 reasonable price, I was met with resistance. From the onset, Evergreen Cemetery expressed an  
22 interest to be involved in the design, size, height, length, width and thickness of the Jonestown  
23 Memorial Wall (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Specifications"). The Defendants also  
24 required that, as a condition of Evergreen Cemetery's promise to donate the base and the setting,  
25 that GTF must exclusively use its team of contractors; that is, Marin Monument Company, Inc.  
26 and Amador Memorial Company. Evergreen Cemetery's President required that the Jonestown  
27 Memorial Wall be made of thick enough material so it may be drilled allowing for steel or  
28

1 aluminum rods to prevent tipping or falling and the base of sufficient size to adequately hold the  
2 monument.

3 8. In 1995, Marin Monument Company, Inc. prepared Specifications for the  
4 Jonestown Memorial Wall and submitted it the Defendants for approval. A true and correct copy  
5 of the document containing these Specifications is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated  
6 herein by reference as if set forth in full. Left with no choice, I, on behalf of GTF, agreed to use  
7 the Defendants' contractors.

8 9. In 1998, GTF was formally established as a public benefit non-profit  
9 organization. Its primary objective was to develop ideas for the scope and design of the  
10 Jonestown Memorial Wall, and determine ways and means of financial support for the project.  
11 The purpose of GTF is also to provide assistance, comfort and support to the family members of  
12 the victims who were killed in the Jonestown Massacre.

13 10. The Jonestown Memorial Wall was envisioned to serve as a strong link between  
14 the child victims and their surviving family members, a collective gravestone, and a place where  
15 individuals could prominently see the name of a loved one carved in granite forever. It was  
16 planned that the hundreds of names of the children who perished at the Jonestown Massacre  
17 would be etched and engraved into the wall. Further, the Jonestown Memorial Wall was to be  
18 constructed in the spirit of those who honored the tragic passing of their loved ones in events  
19 such as the Jewish Holocaust, the Columbine shooting, the Vietnam War and, most recently, the  
20 tragedy of 9/11.

21 11. In or about January 1997 and again on or about September 24, 2002, Kamphausen  
22 confirmed in writing Evergreen Cemetery's promise to provide GTF with a base and setting for  
23 the Jonestown Memorial Wall (this letter is hereinafter referred to as "Commitment Letter"). A  
24 true and correct copy of this Commitment Letter is attached hereto as **Exhibit B** (or attached to  
25 the verified Complaint for Damages, Declaratory Relief, and Injunctive Relief as Exhibit A?)  
26 and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

27 12. Relying on the previous oral representations and the promises represented in  
28 January 1997 and again in September 24, 2002 Commitment Letter and countless verbal

1 assurances, GTF began to take steps to bring the vision of the Jonestown Memorial Wall into  
2 reality. First, we launched an aggressive, multi-faceted fundraising campaign consisting of  
3 letter-writing, phone-athons and private solicitations. This fundraising campaign began in 1993  
4 and continues until today. GTF also invested substantial resources into the promotion, public  
5 relations firms and the creation, design and implementation of a website to attract and retain  
6 donors.

7 13. In March 2007, I sent a letter to Ron Haulman (hereinafter referred to as  
8 "Haulman"), as a representative of Evergreen Cemetery, memorializing a conversation I had  
9 with him concerning the Jonestown Memorial Wall. A true and correct copy of this letter is  
10 attached hereto as **Exhibit C** (or attached to the verified Complaint for Damages, Declaratory  
11 Relief, and Injunctive Relief as Exhibit C?) and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in  
12 full. In that conversation and the subsequent confirmation letter, I described the Specifications  
13 as follows:

14 "This design showcases the Heart shaped center by giving a slight dip between  
15 the heart and the other monoliths. The text by Dr. Maya Angelou will go around  
16 the heart, with the rest of the names on the Wall with a few names on the panel  
17 below the heart. The wall is 36 feet long; with the wall that features the adult  
18 names 7 feet above ground and the heart 8 feet above ground. We would like for  
19 the names to be readable on black granite. We would like for the date of birth to  
20 be next to each name."

21 Defendant Haulman never responded or protested the Specifications or dimensions of the  
22 Jonestown Memorial Wall as I stated in our discussion and in the confirmation letter.

23 14. In or about November 8, 2007, GTF, at the direction and mandate of defendant  
24 Evergreen Cemetery, entered into an agreement with Amador Memorial Company ("Amador")  
25 for the construction of the Jonestown Memorial Wall to be erected at a cost of \$97,800. The  
26 agreement required this amount to be paid in three installments. A true and correct copy of the  
27 contract is attached hereto as **Exhibit D** and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in  
28 full. Per this agreement, the Jonestown Memorial Wall would consist of seven granite ledgers;

1 of which six would be black pieces five feet by seven feet in size, with a center piece designed  
2 to have a red granite five-foot-six by five-foot-five heart, and two hundred and seventy names  
3 would be placed in the heart. These Specifications were consistent with the Specifications that I  
4 communicated to Haulman in my March 2007 letter. On November 18, 2007, GTF paid the first  
5 installment of \$13,371, and in January 2008, GTF paid an additional \$17,000, a total of \$30,371.

6 15. Shortly after receiving the first installment, but before they commenced work,  
7 Amador prepared additional plans and specifications and sent them by fax to Defendant  
8 Evergreen. A true and correct copy of these specifications is attached hereto as **Exhibit E** and  
9 made a part hereof. Defendant Evergreen reviewed these additional plans and specifications and  
10 no one on behalf of Defendant Evergreen protested. In fact, the owner of Amador, in a dying  
11 declaration, stated that sometime in April 2008, while the construction of the Jonestown  
12 Memorial Wall was ongoing, Defendant Kamphausen inspected the Jonestown Memorial Wall  
13 and made no objections.

14 16. By November 2008, two of the seven granite pieces were completed in time to  
15 celebrate the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Jonestown Massacre. At the November 2008 memorial,  
16 USA TODAY published a feature regarding the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Jonestown Massacre and  
17 the Jonestown Memorial Wall. The cover of the newspaper USA TODAY was featured John  
18 Cortez, Kamphausen, Haulman, Officer Yulanda Williams, survivors, family, myself, Reverend  
19 Amos Brown and Reverend Eugene Lumpkin. A true and correct copy of this feature is  
20 attached hereto as **Exhibit F** and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

21 17. Suddenly, and out of the blue, in or about December 9, 2009, I received a written  
22 request from Defendant Haulman asking for, among other things, the Jonestown Memorial Wall  
23 Specifications. A true and correct copy of this request is attached hereto as **Exhibit G** and  
24 incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full. I did not understand this request as I,  
25 Evergreen Cemetery's contractors, and others had provided him with Specifications. The letter  
26 went on to state that the granite slabs featured at the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary were too big and were not  
27 approved. This was false and untrue.

1 18. From December 2009 until the present, I, and GTF supporters, political leaders  
2 and the California Lawyers For The Arts have made numerous phone calls to Defendants  
3 Haulman and Kamphausen. Over this two-year span, mediators, political leaders and I have left  
4 many voicemail messages asking for a return call so that we could discuss the content of the  
5 letter and complete the project. Neither one of them have returned any phone calls.

6 16. In fact, the only response I received from Defendants was through the media. On  
7 or about March 1 2011, when reading a news article, I found out that Defendants had approved  
8 plans for another monument to be erected on the base and setting originally approved for  
9 Jonestown Memorial Wall. This monument was proposed by the surviving People's Church, led  
10 by Fielding McGehee and Jim Jones, Jr., and proposes to include the name of Jim Jones himself  
11 as a victim of the Jonestown Massacre (hereinafter referred to as the "Jim Jones Memorial  
12 Wall").

13 17. In response to this article, I organized a protest in front of Evergreen Cemetery.  
14 Again, Defendants failed to respond to me except through the media in a February 28, 2011  
15 article featured by the Contra Costa Times, in which Defendant Haulman stated that the  
16 monument "can't physically fit" and that neither I nor GTF gave them "one dime" for the  
17 project. A true and correct copy of said article is attached hereto as **Exhibit H** and made a part  
18 hereof. GTF did not pay the Defendants anything because they insisted that Amador Memorial  
19 Company be paid first.

20 18. Over the last few days, I learned that the Defendants have done additional grading  
21 and foundation work, and have renovated the memorial site to allow for the Jim Jones Memorial  
22 Wall, in the same place, base and settings originally planned for the Jonestown Memorial Wall,  
23 but have not yet put up the memorial. News articles indicate that the Jim Jones Memorial Wall  
24 will be completely installed by May 16<sup>th</sup> and unveiling will occur over Memorial Day weekend.

25 19. Unless enjoined, the Defendants will permit the Jim Jones Memorial Wall to be  
26 fully constructed upon the base and settings promised to myself, GTF and the family, friends and  
27 supporters of the hundreds of children who died in the Jonestown Massacre and are buried at the  
28 mass grave site. The Jim Jones Memorial Wall will serve as a deterrent to all individuals who




This is subject to approval by the Evergreen Cemetery Association Board of Directors as to the design, size, style and height of the memorial.


The contract for the Jones Town memorial wall will be \$97,800.00. The first payment due of Nov. 18 will be \$30,000.00.


The second payment will be due March/April 2008 for \$33,935.00 when the granite is delivered to our shop.

Dear Dr. Norwood,

In your email of December 2, 2009 there were 3 points which I wish to address directly to clear up any confusion.

- Plans for a future memorial wall
- Committees, foundation and or organizations
- Memorial Services and cemetery visitors

Let me start by addressing the last point first. It is the policies of Evergreen Cemetery Association that the family and friends of persons buried in Evergreen Cemetery all have the equal ability and access to remember and memorialize each loss in their own way. Jonestown survivors may not be unified in the approach, but *all* are welcome to come and pay respects regardless of association, affiliation, or perceived intent.

Further Evergreen Cemetery has never recognized, nor it it our intention to recognize any particular committee, foundation and or organization with respects to the Jonestown, Peoples Temple grave site within Evergreen Cemetery. If groups of family members and there friends choose to organize for mutual comfort and solidarity in there intention to pay respects to those buried at Evergreen Cemetery that is of course there individual choice. We will make every effort to respect any reasonable request made to us to accommodate the needs of all our guests.

Lastly there is the matter of any proposed memorial wall plans. It has been my position from the very onset of memorial wall conversations, and planning that I would need to approve the design and final concept before green lighting the project. Last year 2 private parties where awarded at Evergreen Cemetery bearing the status of some of those victims of the Jonestown Massacre. As they where proposed the plans are too large to be placed on or near the current grave one, nor would the expenses be inconsiderable. Any design must be approved in advance, and in writing.

To date no design has received the approval of the Evergreen Cemetery ownership. The obligation of paying for the extensive foundation work, and installation required for any wall has not been agreed upon, while making a pledge of financial support for the memorial wall it is not our intent to incur massive and open ended expenses involved in the creating of such a wall.

Any plans then for a wall should take in to account these basic facts

- Placement (the current marker can not be moved)
- Size (the area must be able to accommodate the wall)
- Expense (foundation, installation, and future use restrictions)
- Consensus (a majority of family members with loved one's buried at Evergreen Cemetery's Jonestown site should be in agreement)

As always I wish to provide a safe, clean and peaceful location to all the families who have entrusted Evergreen Cemetery with the great honor of lying in rest there loved ones. In pursuit of that goal I will continue to work with all parties involved in try and build consensus for a Jonestown Memorial Wall; however my part can only move forward after a washed, funded and practical proposal is presented and approved.
