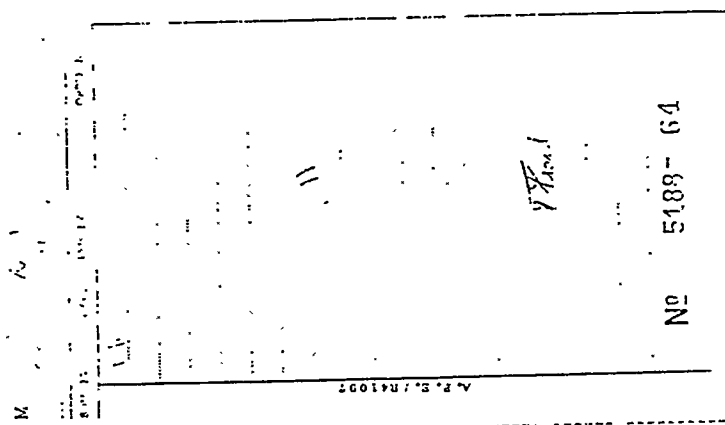



RESPIRATORY: Have ordered thoracotomy tools.

TREATMENT TABLE: Open all day. To be treating the children morning and afternoon. Also Bessie will be going to Apt. 1 and treat children there.

PRACTITIONERS: Breast exams complete. Gave 28 shots of tetanus at .60 each. Judy and Sharon now seeing patients in Apt 3.

SPECIAL CARE UNIT: Christine Young very unhappy there. Wants job change. No one with the training necessary wants that job. She said she would hold on until Don Freed left. I don't see a solution at this time.

MEDICAL INSURANCE: Penny had the files organized Monday which was a monumental job. Pat wants her out of Apt 1 because she's always telling the children to live there to be quiet. She has to work alone because we are too crowded here and more important she's getting into people's business needlessly and saying the wrong thing. The medical office and patient privacy is enough to handle without her. Pat is going to talk to Ava about a cottage where she'll have room enough to work.

SECRETARIES: Sue has switched over to medical librarian...much needed. Shirley Fields will be working half days in afternoons.

Basically our infections are improving.

SUPPLIES: We had a meeting with Richard about exploring Trinidad as a source for medical supplies and medications. Richard was quite optimistic. Joyce will bring back a Trinidad and Georgetown phone book and we are considering with Dad's approval contacting different medical suppliers in both locations. It might be a delicate job with Socialized medicine coming to Guyana. Different departments are working on their inventories. Annie says she won't be complete with hers for two weeks.

LAB: Technicians are learning to do blood typing. We want to do culture and sensitivities more frequently than we do so we don't use our antibiotics so indiscriminately, however Larry says we will need the incubator we let the chickery use and an additional

NURSES OFFICE: The problem that is plaguing us this week is missing charts. We have a hard time keeping track of them.

At this point 3 people are responsible which might be one of the problems. I'm considering asking Heloise Hall to be solely responsible for all of their coming and going and I would relieve her of the protocols so she's have enough time to get the job done. Luyster Lewis who has been working in the rice area part time would like to do it. She told me Joyce said if she found another job she could leave rice picking. I don't know if she's bullshitting, but I do think its a waste of talent her doing rice picking. I told her to check with Joyce as she said Joyce told her to do. I will communicate further on this to you. I am pushing the inservice....we don't know enough for the responsibility we have, we rely on Larry too much and his judgements aren't always terrific due to his subjectivity on matters. We have to be in the position of questioning him in a polite professional manner. We also have to aware of simpler more inexpensive ways of diagnosing and treating whenever possible....our training taught us to be too passive and use machines and equipment too much. I will be writing to other countries to see how they do things. In a book I'm reading by the World Health Organization preventive medicine through education seems to be a common thread in Socialist developing countries. I bit off a piece in that direction today by setting up the health and hygiene class for the high school students, I'm also thinking of asking Nancy Sines when there is a PR lull to do some health and infection control posters for the nurses office. The job seems overwhelming.

My schedule is never the same every day. However, every morning I do go to the nursery at 0630. I am usually there for at least an hour and longer if there are any problems or if the babies are given physical exams. All the babies and toddlers have had one complete physical and developmental at least. My plans are to examine infants at least thoroughly with a developmental every two months. After the age of 12 months I would like to do a physical exam and developmental every three months. As they reach toddlerhood they should be examined twice yearly. Elementary children should have a complete exam yearly. A height and weight and head circumference chart are kept on all the babies. (in the nursery) I am trying to get enough height and weight charts so there will be enough for all the toddlers and elementary children.

I talk to Irra about the toddlers daily. There is no specified time, though it is always (99% of the time anyway) in the morning.

There are usually meetings from 2 PM until 4 PM. From 4 PM until 5 PM I see any referrals of children from the nursing office.

Many days I do not take a lunch hour. I usually use lunch or break time to shower, eat, and occasionally to get news.

I am responsible for all the immunizations in Jonestown. The children are up-to-date. I keep records of when their next immunizations are due. The high schoolers are not complete and this is a group that should be. Judy James will soon be taking over junior high and high school so she can see that their immunizations are brought up to date. The adults are another problem. They have not been thoroughly checked to determine if they need tetanus boosters. I did give tetanus shots to all the piggery, chickery, and many of the kitchen and vegetable stand people. I need to talk to all of the adults, determine if they need a booster, and give if indicated. We have tetanus that will be expiring in November so this should be started right away.

Whenever a newborn is born I stay with the baby for the first several hours - usually all night.

Afternoons are spent looking up info, charting, seeing referrals, attending meetings. I don't regularly do complete physicals at this time because the children nap and shower at this time.

I am responsible for having everything ready for the next delivery. I keep a suitcase in Larry's office which is packed with supplies or sterile packs that will be needed.

I am a supervising nurse one night a week which will probably change when the other nurses arrive. When I am in the office at night I take a break in the late morning and early afternoon which takes time away from exams. Also since my only time of working in the office is a 6-10 shift once a week it is always a hassle finding things, determining new routines.

I was put on the committee to help with the blood typing. I guess this is at a standstill temporarily.

I am on the committee for breast exams, library, ordering.

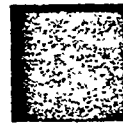
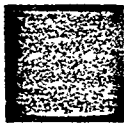

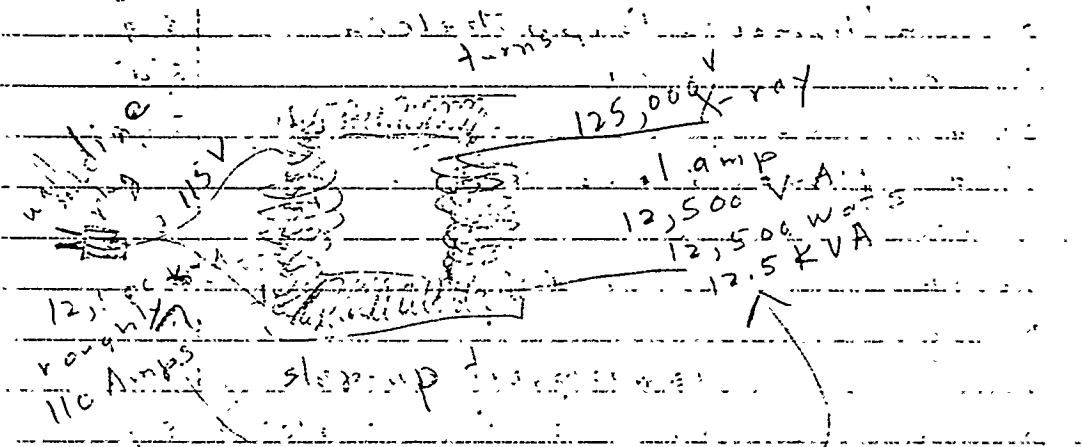

I'm sorry about this; I tried to pick the most stable reagents in the catalog, but there are no stable chemicals that perform those tests.

Besides that, many of the chemicals need to be protected from temperatures over 86 degrees. This isn't too hard but it does take a little attention, for instance, when they're on our boat they can't be next to the engine. A responsible person should escort them over.

When you get this order of chemicals from the company, please have somebody read all the labels to see if any of them call for refrigerator temperatures besides the two I named. It's possible the company catalog did not list all the unstable reagents as unstable since this sort of information does not help sales. The same person should check for expiration dates. It would be easy to swindle by sending expired or about-to-expire stuff and if it is about to expire, the company should replace it or refund the money.
