

WHAT BAIT AND PLOYS DID MAZOR USE WITH THE UN-BRIEFED, GULLIBLE

PLAYER: CHARLES GARRY

THEN-CURRENT SITUATION: Peoples Temple attorney. Only met Jones once, who gave Jones a rave review. Believes community was shot at, believes there is a conspiracy, but it is not yet actionable. Stuck with local issues and trying to discredit arch-enemy Stoen. Making no headway.

VULNERABILITIES: Needs help or for it all to go away. Believes, however, that if only people visit Jonestown ("I Have Seen Paradise"), the anti-Temple campaign might disappear.

BAIT AND PLOYS: Mazor claims inside track on disbaring Stoen. That State Bar is investigating; the Temple just needs to cooperate with Mazor. Offers incriminating materials. Wants to meet to cement a new friendship.

THE UPSHOT: Convinces Garry that Stoen ripped off one million dollars from the Temple. Mazor will fund the anti-Temple campaign, thus "no conspiracy." (From Charles Garry's mouth to Larry Schachtel's ears post-tragedy.) Garry threatens to quit if Congressman's party not let in.

He went on to speak of the consistently high level of medical care. . . . "Why are those people so happy? . . . They are learning an answer to a better life. When I returned to the States, I told my partners. . . . that I had seen paradise."

HELP TO DO IN ARCH-ENEMY STOEN: ". . . we just collected on Stoen's bonds. . . notary bonds for fraud. They are admitting that Stoen did illegal and unlawful acts by signing and notarizing documents which he knew were false. . . the State Bar is now getting ready for. . . suspension or disbarment of Stoen. . . This ought to make Garry very nervous."

HELP WITH THE PRESS: "I've got a better in right now with Tim Reiterman [S.F. Examiner] than Charlie. . . be the first one to go to Tim and lay down the whole thing I saw down there [i.e., angling for an invite]. . ."

LED SNIPER ATTACK ON JONESTOWN: "When were you last in that area?" Mazor: "Well, Charlie made an announcement. . . Didn't Charlie make a nice news announcement? Somebody tried to shoot my client yesterday."

MAKE FRIENDS: "I think maybe I can talk to Charlie. . . See where we are. We've been fighting for a year. . . ought to get together and see what's going on."
