COBB moves from front to back of plane. . . . ATTACK BEGINS



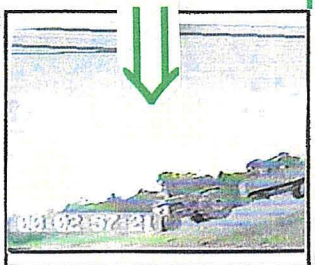

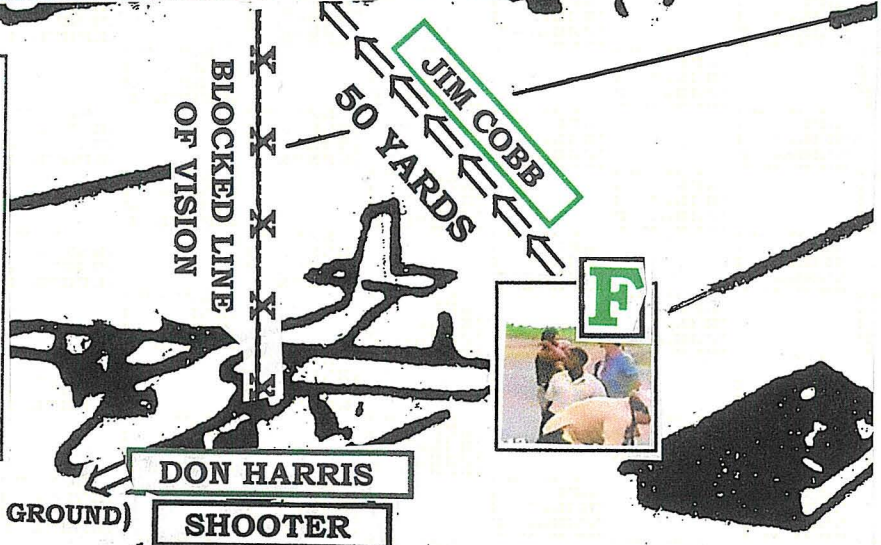

THE BUSH

COBB FIFTY YARDS OUT

"Don Harris fell" on LEFT, Cobb fled "fifty yards" on RIGHT, **THEN** "looked back and observed" that "TOM KICE" (or anyone!) "shot Don Harris"?"



(ALREADY DEAD ON GROUND)

NOTE: Even had Cobb fled UP-runway diagonal to the bush, he would need to see **AROUND** the body of the plane.

There was **NO** angle from cross-runway where body of the plane would **NOT** have blocked his line of vision. * * *

* Note also: Reporter Ron Javers gauged the distance as *100 yards*, not 50.
** Nor did Cobb wait to flee until Brown was killed. Cobb would not have waited for the several extra seconds Brown was filming. If he did, the alleged i.d.s would have been close-range, **NOT** "fifty yards away from the aircraft"!!
