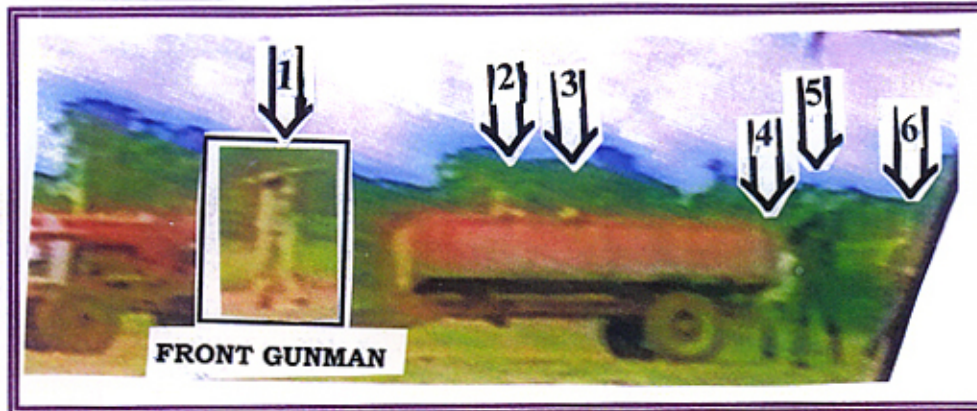

Were they "hid"?

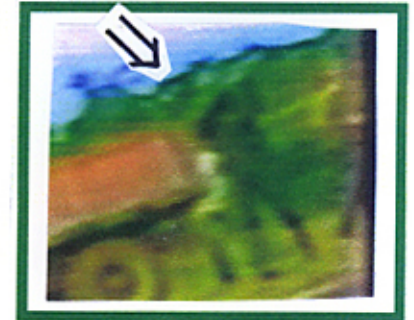
