Minister MIngo 8 June, 1978 (Prokes, Sharon, Debbie)

-we talked to him about the Venezelan Colonel, he said Venezuela does have a strong intelligence division and could be working with the US. However, when we mentioned that we need to be able to defend ourselves, he said that Guyana doesn't have the might to take on Venezuela. We said that we didn't expect them to but if we could just defend ourselves and try to defend Guyana in the event of an actual attack/ we wouldn't be takeng on Venezuela. He said that he appreciated our willingness to stand for Guyana but "we can't start an incident." We reiterated again it was not to start an incident but to protect ourselves and Guyana. He said theat "no government could risk aiming non-citizens." He said he could never sell this. He said it is the responsibility of the State to protect us. He said that what we already asked for in terms of arms is reasonable and in the letter we whad mentioned it was for the purpose of hunting. He knew it wouldn't be enough for defense. I asked him if that had gone through / he said he thought knexkx it he said no government would arm you to the teeth.

He said it might look like a Market but to the teeth.

-he said it might look like a "citadel to certain people"
-we said what would we dox if attacked/ he said we could notify them, asked if our radio could make contact/ we said sometimes it is not able to make contact and besides we can't contact their stations. xkex Mike said he had been trying to get 24 hr a day contact for emergencies/ Mingo said Narraine handles that/ and we should see him. I asked him if he could make the appt. He called Narraine up and x arranged tht we should see him Monday at 10:00AN.

-we talked about the local wharassments, saying our truck was tearing up the road, the x woodchipper coming back browken, Joyce's medical program being stopped and that Hoyte was def trying to start trouble again. He said that Hoyte could only try to bother us in his area, but the Venezuelan thing was a f different story as that wasn't within Hoyte's area. I said that if Hoyte could irritate us locally when we are trying to be productive and no-one interferes how could we be assured that we'd ke have people to stand up for us ek when it is on a larger level involving a more difficult issue. I said that I couldn't believe that Dr. Reid and the PN with their goals of productivity could want Hoyte to be so petty and jealous and get away with it. Mingo said that if he were in the position we were in, he'd x feel the same way about Hoyte
-but he said he didn't know what he could do about it himself as he is a very small

-I asked what he thought was Hoyte's motivation for harassing us/ he said that Hoyte might be nervous and may wish he'd stay a successful lawayer with all the pressures in government right now. WEXERAID

-I repeated again, "why isn't something done to stop him frmm bothering us", he said "we're too free here. That's why there is a difference with us and you, that's why you are so disciplined."

-when we mentioned the situation with Joyce and that we were told in Green's department that is was a question of legality (insurance), he said "legality doesn't impress me" (in other words, he doesn't think that's the issue) -he asked if Nurse Noel had agreed with our work in Kaituma originally and we told him yes she did

-he said that despite the harassments we've gotten, he knows Min. Green likes u and it is ki he that would be helping us not Mingo.

Nike asked why he couldn'thave written a statement for us to clarify the Kathy Hunter situation/ he showed her an article that and the redicultous charges/ he Mingo said it wasn't his job to write such a statement, it was up to the attorney general. Mike said that Kirton wanted a statement to add facts to his article. I asked Mingo if Kirton could at least check with im him by phone or come in and at talk to him and he said yes (tho Mike didn't seem to think tht would be a good idea???)

-Mike asked if we could see him weekly/ he said he was too busy now for that, but said we could see him the 17th. We asked him o tell Dr. Reid about BB-2-Q-1 the medical situation and he said he would. (OVER)

MINGO &xxxx telephone x call 10x 9/6/78

(told him about how Carmichael and Wyatt embarrassed us in front of the local PNC meeting - they made light of medical care to a Guyanese child (seed in the nose) and said that people traveling to Jonestown, it would be risky and they would no longer provide transportation for people coming to Jonestown, even if for emergency care) and Carmichael said he was a long standing Guyanese citizen but you....)

Mingo said he would have to talk to Carmichael, I asked when and he said Carmichael would be coming in to Georgetown in a week and he'd talk to him then/ I said couldn't you call him before that (in Mathews Ridge) and he said he would do that/ I asked if he could talk to Hoyte as that was were it started and he said "Minister Hoyte, as if considering it, or as if he didn't want to talk to Hoyte" but he said him would (not with that much conviction)

-he did mention when I said it was at the PNC meeting, "You mean in front of people at the PNC meeting" as if he didn't approve of that



Carrie Ramsaroop (Minister of Parliament) 14/6/78 Sharon, Anita, Tim J

-said he had spent a long time in Port Kaituma at a conference talking to some of our members and it was a good talk

-he was f very friendly, he is not a contentious man, kind of easy going, you feel he wouldn't be one to raise a hand against you, tho I don't know that he would ever fight for you, he doesn't appear to have any fight in him -he said he has wanted to come and visit Jonestown and would do so when he has more time (after the referendum)

-I gave him our booklet, Model Community and told him we wanted to see him today so that if there κ is any way we can improve he can give us feed back/ he said we were doing a good job

-regarding the conspiracy, he says he wikked always reads our letters, doesn't put much stock in what our enemies say about us/ said something about receiving some scurilous attack against us from some magazine

-I asked him who sent the attack but he said he didn't recall, I asked if he could fi nd out and then he said it was us that sent it to him (sent something to him about what our enemies are saying)

-he said when you are doing good people will attack you


-I asked if he could come for dinner and he said yes after July 10th -he didn't hurry us up, seemed to be willing to talk/ I showed him the letter Mrs. Carter wrote JJ, and gave him the picture of JJ and Mrs. Carter

-I talked about Tim SToen and what he is doing and he said "yes," in a hostile way against Tim Stoen and I showed him the letter of Kendra Alexander saying that Tim Stoen said he'd pay her if she would lie against us/ hekakshidaksax he acted disapproving of this (he seemed as if he was makshakshidaksax willing to hear our position or just doesn't like conflict)

-gave him the letters ofsupport from Willie Brown and Harvey Milk

-he hasn't heard anything about the Stoen case but said that most judges ‡ usually take vacations July 15 to Sept 15

-told him that all the officers of the corporation are the directors and the secretary is the same (the names Mrs. Haniff has) - and told them him that the names Debbie T is working on, that's what it's for, that's why they are the first t onest to do it (naturalization)/ most haven't been here long enough -he has 5 names, Debbie T., Phillip B., Tommy J., Jan Wilsey, Paula Adams (he needs to know who is the Secretary and which is the registered office, Jonestown or Georgetown)

-regarding expediting the corporation, Debbie T. came in to sign the papers but she told him to wait for forther orders so he doesn't know when to proceed, he figures it would take about a week to complete it once he is given the go ahead

-re. push to legalize name of Jonestown, he says this would have to go to Cabinet, he thinks it would be a good idea and is downexkxx that way for names that are known kxx by popular acclaim but weren't named by the government/ Hoyte would be the one to take it to Cabinet but they have too many pressing things right now so it would have to wait

-re tax concession letter (I asked if we could have * a copy of the letter he wrote requesting special consideration for JODestown), he said * Mr. Moore is expecting word today from the Income Tax Dept. sending the reply from the Ministry of Finance so we can go on with the issue so he said we can wait for his letter/ Mrs. Haniff will call me when the letter comes

-re Barker (why he doesn't like us), he said that he didn't think Barker and Hoyte were close but he did say that maybe Barker thinks Hoyte is still mad at us because of the letter in the paper, he said that if Hoyte does bring k our name to Cabinet to be legalized that would help us. He asked why we thought Barker didn't like us/we said he was cold whereas in the past he was friendly and that he had talked to us about law and order and people not being free there -Clarke said that Barker is under Mingo so he hasn't that much power

Hoyte: he said he talked to Hoyte but didn't get the impression that he was still upset at us. He said that Hoyte gets hot and then forgets. -she told us to invite Chancellor Haynes/ he said he was going to come but had a meeting he was to speak at and if he didn't come by 9:00PM he probably could't make it but he was friendly on the phone and did remember to call and tell us he might not be coming

-it was interesting she told us to invite him/ told us he was approachable and would be good to know someone like him (he's head of the entire judiciary), now we have in intro to invite him again - said he was poor as a wangkx youth/ she has a group she works with who were formerly in jail and she said often the police don'gt give them a chance to rehabilitate themselves but pick on them/ they put on a mock trial at city hall and she invited Hayes/ he came and talked to them/ told them that he could easily have ended up in jail had it not been for luck (and God)- in that he was employed as a young man and used some of his employer's money/ the employer asked for it and he was afraid to tell his parents/ he was had an uncle who came to visit at that time and he convinced the uncle to give him the money or surely he would have ended up in jail - she said Hayes is that kind of man who will go to anyone's home and is not one to put on airs

said "I'll have to see it", she is very mag supportive

-she speaks favorably about the PM being a great man and Viola being a wonderful woman (of course she would do that), says when the PM gives her a project he'll say "you take care of it" (leaving her to figure k out how to deal with it -she has 3 children, 2 are in the states, her eldest is here

-she's worked in the party for many many years/ was a kindergarden school teacher at one time but was interested in politics also and so involvedherself and kept on working for the Party -

BOAT: is there any problems of buying a boat in US dollars owned by a Guyanese citizen, registered in US or Trinidad (waxa wants twice as much Guyanese money as US)

-Mingo said this was a racket (on the part of the Guyanese person) and we couldn't do it

DICK MC COY/AMERICAN EMBASSY; Visited by Sharon, Deb, Prokes, Marceline... -People from the Embassy thought the Cultural show was very good. -Dan Webble mentioned assanation attempts were mentioned in the speech, was supprised. to say that to a group of Guynese, in that you are a foreign country. to talk of Pres Kennedy's assanation. Dan took it in a political sense, our political -Dan thought the show was very professional, but long. -Dan mentioned that part of speechthat said the Embassy had been helpful in defending the Peoples Temple, but he was puzzled that there was a great deal of -Dick said from Dan's explanation it sounded as if we were practically explaning why we were forced out of the United States. Why did you do that? he asked. -Mike Prokes said yes, but it's due to the fact that we were asked to explain, to let people know because there was so much crap going around, -Dan Webble was in the Peace Core in Affganistan befor he came to Guyana. -a man named Ellis will be - eplacing McCoy, hes a young officer, Dick said a very fine officer. he served in Luxemburg, then Manilla, has a little girl. -Sharon told him what Shirly Feild-Ridley said-we practiced for hours, she wished some of her people could have been there to see the example, they have trouble with this, also mentioned Min. Kennard had praised us. -McCoy said it went on and on and on. They could be a pretty tough audiance here, he said a Russian group performed and they were really third class, they were bad, he left at intermission, he had to appoligise to Cheddi Jagen, and even Cheddi was upset by the performance. -Sharon asked him if he knew Cheddi? McCoy-were on speaking basis, sure I know -the man, his daughter went to a moscow university and couldn't stand it, shes now living in the states. Dr. Jagen spends most of his time in the states. He's a communist, but every time he wants to go, he had to go through this office. -Sharon mentioned to Marceline that Dick said his sons were young faciest. Dick agreed. Yes, their young faciest. they go to a school run by a babtist church but it'sset up like a military-run by military ciréclum. -(ref. to Stoen issue) Dick said, all this about a cheif court order is a straneous issue. Both sides have reputable attorneys, he tells people, the Judge is hard nosed and independent, no one is going it influence him. Dick said -people in power want to get from him what they can give as answers back there. -Sharon asked to see a report on us. Dick said thry were getting it, it was on it's way. Sharon asked to see his copy. Dick said it was a classified U.S. document and he couldn't just give it out. To see the more recent reports we would have to apply again, each time a new one comes out. -Dick said he told state Dept. he didn't feel it was any further use to explain to peoples that people in Jonestown were not being held against their will. -the Embassy could be charged with harrassment. When they get inquires about their children, well we will check it out when we go up there. -as soon as all this presscame out in the U.S., enquires about you were inevaitable, Dick said. He told us of a situation in Equador and Iseral when people inquired about there children, certinly three times more then they did about the P.T. -Dick said basically the only time the U.S. will interfer is 1)if a person is being discriminated against soley because he is American. 2)if a person has been subject to physical brutality. 3) People can be put in prison for years and years without knowing what they are being tried for, before they even have atrial. -Dick tells those that pressure him, I'm not in a position to say what they will do, State dept. keeps presuring them to tell them what the Guyana Government

will do. Dick the didn't want to commit himself. Hesaid Stoen contacted ninty congressmen. Hyacawa was not interested in this, said it was a case for the courts.

-Dick said he was impressed w/Hyacawa, he had done alot for the school system.
-McClusky has shown interest for Tim Stone. an Interstate Foreign Congressman in the United States, friend of Dick's said mostly all staffaids respond to Tim Stones letters.

-Stoen is saying this court order is not being obsurved, theres no basis for this in National Law. Dick said Hass didn't understand why Dick wouldn't take John and give him to Hass to fly to the U.S. Dick said he didn't mind a man being aggressive for his job, but he started throwing threats -Dick-we don't have (letters ragatory)-when one court makes a decission based on another courts decission=doesn't apply in Guyana,

-Dick said these people showed interest for Stoen; Dellems, Bryon, Burton, Phillip/ and John, one didn't care, the other showed interest for stoen, he couldn't remember which one it was.; Rayon, Cranston, McClusky, Church, Lugan

-they showed him alot of things on filein Washington. Frank Domminion showed -him. Dick is taking Frank Domminion's job. Frank speaks suribokrosh

Dick-Yogoslovia has capitalism in fact, they have alot of theory, but drive mercedies benze, there are some in upperclass, so Dick used to tease them, not everyone has jobs, depends on the republic, about 16% unemployment. They have a welfare system theoretically. Have free medical care, some are good facilities, some arent, but there system is better than some because they ablow for some freedom of expression, they're tough people, he was very impressed with them. theres a certin oppressive police system, couldn't live there all his life. In terms of criminal law, thats different, but in terms of politics,

-they are much tighter. Dick said there were three nuculer reactors in -Yogoslovia from the U.S. also Petro state Chemicle, and American Co. in Hungrey -as well. We have a certin amount of military systems in Yogoslovia. He mentioned something about Tito as one of the three leaders of the non-alined policy, -they were the corner stone of our Eastern-Policy...I didn't quite understand this part...

-Sharon asked what he though the decision would be. Dick-Stoen ask me that, everybody ask me the outcome. It was mentioned that Cheif Justice Bolders was at our program. Dick said he knew.

Suppose Touchette has custody and Stones go bizerk, how does the Embassy prove that the Embassy didn't have political intervension. He told Stoen to send him something in writting.

 -no room for specualtion anymore/ you can't even send \$50 out withoutem permission
 of the Guyanese Bank
- -have to have express permission to transfer external bank abroad/ and then can't put Guyanese money in that kind of account

-his uncle is responsible for maintaining the cultural traditions and is **** consulted for this, like if someone is going to plan a marriage/ his aunt is considered the first lady of the village because of being able to trace her heritage back

-there is a man who also is like a Chief Counsellor/ they call him the Owele of Onitsha who is also an advisor on & the cultural traditions. However, he has no official position anymore, through he once had, he is just in a position of being a counsellor or the Chief Counsellor

-in Nigeria, the premier is called "Odu"

-Uyanneh doesn't speak Swahili, he speaks Erdo or something like that/ I didn't recall what his dialect is

-he speaks English rather well tho at times takes pains to formulate his words

well.

-he is a young man, late 20's I would say, large, -has a friendly open looking face but when you talk to him, you find a difficulty of communicating with him because he is a realist which is good but in his realism he has settled on no particular committment to anything

-he has traveled a great deal, been to London, many places in Europe, has been

to Yugoslavia and Hungary in the socialist Bloc

-I asked him what his politics where - he said he is a "Athiest" of politics as well as religion. He does favor a sort of welfare capitalism or rather a system like Sweden where there is some individual enterprise but with a welfare system

-he said that one things he does feel about socialism is that people have more opportunity to develop as a person under socialism, but the he believes socialism can be good, basically he believes that whatever works for people

-we talked about our project, but in the beginning he wanted to talk about his tradition being destroyed in Africa, and we agreed with him bout Christians being destructive of traditions of people, and mentioned how blacks inthe US of course had all their traditions destroyed and how JJ had become a minister to help people come ato socialism thru some of the things in Christianity that made sense in terms of socialism and in pointing out the errors of the bible

-he said that some sof the things that the) Christians teach are good and should

be preserved

-he said that In Nigeria the older people have stuck to the colonialist ways but the young people are radical some of them/ he said that in some ways there is a tendency toward extreme capitalism/ but as the young people take over they are impurlative he said and are radical and young like him and have some of the ideas he has (but I guess he considers them more radical than himself as he called them impulsive)

-what he means by impulsive is that if they see racism in the US they want to "indigenize" the US industries - once they had him make up a statistical report on indigenizing all the foreimgn industries in Nigeria

-he said that Garuba the f Minister of Foreign Affairs is ones of the New

-his home town Onitsha means "white bank" - which is the impressive sight

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that the people saw when they first came to settle in this area/ some settled in this area and some stayed on the other side of the river and now they are joined by a bridge

- -he said that in the North of Nigeria is a place a called Kano which is basically feudalistic. It is a moslem area and showed us a picture of a group of people dressed in ancient type clothing, Moslem, and the leader on a horse had a white moslem outfit on with a head cover (that long sheetlike thing) but he said that despite the garb, he personally knows this man to be liberal tho he wears the ancient clothing
- -this man is the "Emir" of Kano this area that is Moslem was settled by Moslem conquerers and tho it is feudalistic it is known for being oneof the least corrupt areas of Nigeria and is very wealthy/ they are wealthy in agriculture, they raise horses and cattle and their people are very powerful in the federal representation as they have a lot of them in positions in the federal
- -Uyannah said that he had been to London and among the wealthy English people they don't care what color you have as long as you have money, there is no racism
- -his point was that racism is superficial but even if you get rid of racism you still have people who are in another social class and we agreed with that and I said that in Russia it wasn't a racial devision anyway and in the US, some economists say that race is just used to divide people so that the poor whites and poor blacks and other minorities don't unite which would be dangerous and mentioned MLK only being seen as dangerous when he united the garbage workers
- -Uyannah agreed/ he said that you find in certain areas that when certain minorities prosper, they cease to be conserned about liberation struggles and he used Bermuda am lot as an example
- -he said that Bermuda is capitalistic but the people are in such poor straits that they have ceased to think in terms of racial division as they have to work together to survive
- -he said that when he was in England he and a Jewish xx man worked together for summer work in some factory/ this Jewish man didn't want to associate with English people as he said he had nothing in common with them but this man would ask Uyannah to go out with him to look at monuments and the like and Uyannah would go with him but Uyannah would also play dominoes with the British people as they would help him, like giving him credit for working x exera hours etc as they x knew he wanted to save money to travel and Uyannah didn't see anything wrong with associating with them
- -he said that the he doesn't basically feel people are evil, he does feel that if you get rid of one social evil you often have anouther to replace it/like if you get rid of racism, you have to deal with bureaucracy and that often can be just as cruel in terms of personal relationships/ he said that his friend in Poland complained about this bureaucracy
- -we talked about Jonestown where we are working one by one on social* problems as well as getting rid of racism
- -he didn't pay great attention to us, but seemed to be intent on his own dialogue which is one I think he has had with a great many people with no particular answers

Ng A Fook visit to him 11/8/78 Sharon Amos

- -went to his office today / Tony was tied up with the situation with Margaret (security) so I went alone
- -I saw him in between him pulling it teeth of people/ it it looked like he was doing it without any novacaine/ just clipping them out

Symmon responded immediately by delivering the following letter of intent to Fred Silverman, President of NBC, with copies to ther NBC officials, the West Coast office of NBC affiliate KRON, and all mem-. hers of the Board of Directors of RCA, NBC's parent company.

In addition, copies of the letter with a cover letter from S.C.R.A.M. President Ron Cool were delivered to President Carter, Vice President Mondale, all Justices of the U.S. Supreme Court, all members of the Inderal Communications Commission, and all members of Congress. In his cover letter, Cook spoke of S.C.R.A.M.'s goal, the establishment of a "robust, free, competitive, responsible media," and its belief that "a free people depends upon a free press." But, he continued, the press must be "responsible to the people . . . not supreme over the people, their elected representatives, executives and their courts

At the same time, Synanon residents and friends faunched a nationwide letterwriting effort designed to innundate Fred Silverman, I-CC Chaleman Charles Ferris and the RCA Board of Directors with hundreds of expressions of outrage.

3 Here is the text of the letter of intent.

Synanon Foundation, Inc. and Charles E. Descrich, its founder, intend to flle an action for defamation against you, the National Broadcasting Company, and those persons responsible for and who partiel pand in the broadcast of the Segment 3 protion of NBC Nightly News on June 12, 1978, purporting to present a picture of the contemporary Synanon and its work. Aside from the obvious bias and prejudicial slant of the broadcast and its numerous and glaring factual inaccuracies, which can only be explained as either incompetence or deliberate distortion of the true facts regarding Synanon and Mr. Dederich, the broadcast contains at least six false and defamatory utterances for which you, the National Broadcasting Company, Mr. Newman and the other persons who were responsible for participation in the broadcast are liable in law and in damages.

Among these defamations is the false and outrageous statement made by Mr. Newman that in 1976 "Pregnant women had abortions or got out": the totally false statement that "In 1975, members were ordered to shave their heads or get out"; and the untrue statement that Alvin Gambonini had sued Synanon and won, lending credence to his false charges. It is also untrue and defamatory that in 1976, Mr. Dederich "was given a \$500,000 retirement present," meaning that he and Synanon illegally disbursed charitable funds. There are other defamations in the broadcast, such as the statement that Synanon was "rich...in profits from its own advertising and gifts business..." A more detailed demand for correction will follow.

We understand that you intend to broadcast charges of child abuse at Synanon in the second part of this series. Be advised that these charges are totally false, and, moreover, were investigated at least three times by the duly-constituted and appropriate authorities at Marin County and were found groundless and baseless. Be advised that the Marin County Grand Jury report on Symmon, which you intend to nir on the second part of this series, is an example of a new brand of Mc Carthyism in its most virulent and hateful form. SIMULTANEOUS S.C.R.A.M. LLIES HELD ON EAST AND WEST COASTS; TIME INC. PROBED

Four hundred and fifty native New Yorkers joined a core group of Synanon members on the steps of the Time-Life Building at Rockefeller Center to rally in support of Synanon, while, three thousand miles away. 900 Synanon residents and supporters massed in San Francisco's Embarcadero Plaza.

At the same time, inside the Time Life Building, S.C.R.A.M. representatives dominated Time Inc.'s annual meeting with a battery of probing questions about the ethics and editorial policies of its executives.

Both rallies were organized by the Synanon Committee for Responsible American Media to protest Time Mapazine's recent hatchet Job on Synanon* and subsequent defamatory coverage by San Francisco's KGO-TV, KGO "entertuiner" Fred Non-Amburg, and ABC, Inc.

Birdie London visit to his house 12/8/78 (sharon, Tony Walker, Eddie Hallman, Karen Harms, Leslie Wilson)

-Birdie had invited Debbie T. to come over some time and we were to make contact with him so I called him and he wanted us to come over -said Basil Armstrong had left for the States but told Birdie to give all

his friends hiswe well wishes so he Birdie was doing that

-Birdie lives in quite a nice house in a rather fancy district/ his house
is an excellent taste/ his wife makes macrame things/ fantastic beautiful
things like a plant holder that had 3 wooden trays held up by macrame
and a hanging plant that hang quite low with a beautiful fern on it

-they have a daughter who married a Guinean doctor and is in Liberaia
with him but wants to come back to Guyana. She met him in France/ she
is a math teacher at some company/ Birdie said that Liberia is US dominated
-another daughter is married to a white Canadian (the daughter is black) and

they have a little son and live in Canada/ Mrs. London (Carmen) is going to see them on holiday soon

-Carmen is an elementary teacher/ she's very committed and by talking to her I could see she really cares about the children/ reminds me a little of Evenne Golden/ she said the system now is to pass children whether they learn or not and sometimes she thinks it's a mistake but we talked also about the trauma of being kept back and children teasing you so it's a

difficult problem

-she has one child in her class who is obviously bright as he can take his whole family (the children) all across town and get them where then need to go and figure change but he can't read - she's working with him -both Birdie and Carmen very strongly feel it's improtant to build a childr's self-image and they enjoy talking about that/ and I talked about how important that has been to children in PT etc etc etc

-we talked about JT as a social experiment/ Birdie said that he had read abou t a Yugoslavian that Tito arrested/ his named sounded like Djealous???? / the man wrote a book about the classless society and claimed that there w couldn'y be such a thing because there is always some class of people rising up to take dominance, whether it is in the intelligencia, the business class, or some group

-we talked about JT, I said that was what was so interesting about JT because we were working on those problems and keeping it from being a power elite of some type or another / we all mentioned how people all put in their imput

-Mr Thompson only stayed for about an hour

- -his wife was in Canada/ she's the one who visited the project and had enjmoyed it so much
- -he was the permanent secretary for forest lands and minds and is now working on seasonings with someone who won the Guinnes record for applied chemistry * they feel they can develop certain seasonings - and this is a big money thing to work on
- -for instance Guyana imports Ex cinnamon but it grows like a weeld -one problem is that high temperatures are destructive of flavor
- -you can make a million if you can grow certain things in the winter and then export them Israel can grow roses in the winter and freezes them and exports them for instance to Canada but they follow the exporting every step of the way even having an Israeli to meet the roses in Canada to see that they are taken care of properly
- -if you could grow strawberries in the winter you'd maek a killing but strawberries are easily perishable
- -chashew nut is in great demand and the seeds shells give a good dring oil (not edible but for industrial purposes)
- -a company min Surinam Burnzyl (spelling?) has the edge on this they take the wood Deli logs from Guyana and Guyana gets little royalty from it/ other tree logs can make plywood also
- -if you tried to make plywood to export and make money & Burnzyl could lower their price until you went broke and then & go back into it as they are international -he didn't think Guyana did have a plywood factory in the past, he said they had a particle board factory and it colapsed because they used Jallaba ?? wood and it had too much silica and the blades only lasted 2 hrs instead of 8 hours and it went broke

Freighters:

- -he said that people are dying now to get rid of freighters because they have a new kind of freighter that is containerized and therefore the old kind of freighters are dying out in useage
- -he said that if Guyana could properly season wood they wouldn't havesuch a need for plywood
- -if you tried to produce plywood for Guyanese use you would have to have a mini-factory as you would soon saturate the market
- -he said that cassava might be a good crop to develop as they use floculation (casava starts) for aluminum plants and there is always a demand in general for mcasava but you'd have to do it in big cultivation with high wheel tractors
- -he said in terms of an industry you have to think of the whole process economically and the marketing aspects
- -he said one friend of his bought mixkxxxxxx steers and put them on land, pasture land, fatted them up and then called on some buyers and sold them and made a good property pin profit as the land was free, he already had it
- -another friend had milk cows and he was milking all the time and you have to have machinery to cool it and problems transporting it and he soon went out of business
- -another person tried to raise crow hops ???? and you have to pick them and market them immediately and he couldn't manage
- -in terms of his own orchard he doesn't have too much trouble finding buyers for the fruit but the Guyana Marketing Corp. is very unorganized in terms of how who is selling what and how much so it is chaotic

Mr. & MRs Bone visit - we dropped by there house $16/8 \pm 7/78$ Sharon & Debbie

-we were visiting with them and talking about our project and some of the things that are happening in the US with black elected fofficials/ she was kind of tired and nodding off but he seemed attentive and not arguementative -Debbie had worked with her on the referendum day and she had been both very appreciative of her work and concerned that Debbie didn't have any problem with what she was doing (ix the rigged aspect)

-Mrs. Bone had invited her to come by

-he is w quite smart and she seems kind

-he asked all about the project/ we talked about various aspects/ like the new chicken incubator we were getting, he asked penatrating questions like would we have the facilities to raise that many chickens - do we buy feed or raise it

-he said he mused to know the mixture of feed to grow - for chickens -he seemed interested in all we had to say, the conspiracy was interesting to himmedaxegumx and the persecution of black elected officials

-we were talking about developing some project like plywood/ aaked him why the plywood factory had failed that was going in Guyana, he said it was mismanagement (someone took money, stole from them within the company) and so it folded

-rather fortunately I thought while we were there a man dropped in from National Insurance Scheme NIS who is going to be working as an assistant to Gaskin in the Northwest and hopes to visit Jonestown/ he has listened to our broadcase and is very interested inth the project

-we gave both him and the Bones one of the booklet's model community -he was fascinated with the talk about conspiracy/ talked about imperialism and seemed very well informed about the CIA

-he is a policeman as well as being with the NIS and said he worked along side with prisoners as rehabilitation but he said he didn't think Guyana was as advanced in rehabilitation techniques as the US/ he wasn't otherwise positive to the US

MAY DAY

The Origin

In December 1888 the American Trade Union Congress meeting in St. Louis decided to organise made demonstrations on 1st May the following year to secure a cut in the orking day to 8 (eight) hours.

When the inaugural Congress of the Second Socialist Internationals met in Paris of 14th July 1889 (on the centenary of the fall of the Bastille) it calried French resolution that workers in all countries should display their solidarity "simultaneously in all countries on a given day".

Im 1891 the Brussels Congress of the International pledgedall
Parties to celebrate May Day on the first day of the month by
demonstrations and strikes. "The day of demonstration is to be
a day on which work ceases, in so far as this is not rendered impossible by conditions in various countries".

Since then May Day in one form or another has been taking place throughout the orld. It is a time for labour demonstrations, which, at times have led to violence. In Moscow, the Soviet Union, the

2) first

first socialist state, usually puts on a great military show of proletarian power. However, in recent years they have emphasised sport.

It is also marked in the U.S.A: which has its Labour Day in September, though Socialist groups in New York City and possibly in other large centers have to some extent followed the international custom.

May Day is an International holiday to commenorate the struggle of workers and re-kindle their solidarity for the pursuit and achievement of political, economic and social improvements.

In Guyana

In 1930 the British Guiana Labour Union organised the first Labour March in Guyana which started at Bourda Green and ended at Parade ground (Indep indence Park), via Albouystown and Kingston. The Union's members and other workers marched with Hurbert Nathaniel Critchlow and other labour leaders: men were dressed in red shirts, white trousers, and red resettes, and women were red jackets, white skirts and also carried red resettes.

An important feature of these marches was the emphasis on collecting donations to subsidise Union finance. "From May 1974, the Trade Union Youth Movement to aid its Educational Activities revived these collections in the form of a tag day".

At Parade ground, addresses were given by Critchlow, other leading Trade Unionists, and representatives of the government, while messages were read from the Caribbean and International affiliates.

An important item on the Agenda was the passing of resolutions dealing with general political, economic and social issues. For example, resolutions centered on Adult Suffrage, rent-restriction, unemployment relief, the abblition of night-work in certain establishments, and a West Indian economic and political union.

The British Guinena Labour Union retained control of May Day celebrations until 1950 when the Trade Union Council began to organize the activities throughout the country. From that date Guyana which had been celebrating May Day on different dates in the month of May, to coincide with given events, joined the rest

4) of the

of the World on commenorating Labour Day on May lat. The Trade Union Congress maintained the pattern of marking May Day with marches and demonstrations, the usual address and messages from abroad and the passing of resolutions.

In 1957, at the age of seventy-three (73), Gritchlow gave his final May Day address. On Fibruary 12, 1958 a motion, initiated by Mr Rupert Tollo then general secretary of the Trade Union Congress, was passed making May 1st a Public Holiday, and Empire Day, formerly celebrated on May 24, was dropped.

Conclusion

Today the working people of the world, especially those in the so-called Third World, are still blatantly exploited by imperialism.

We in Guyana have opted to institute a socialist revolution for the creation of a better world. Revolutions are by definition disruptive to existing social formations but the old exploitative imperialist economic order operates to create greater difficulties in Guyanese social life.

We the working people of Guyana must use this international day

- -Melghan said that it is the fault of Christians what is mappening beckause she saw people fighting for soap and she said that if Christians act like that people will see them and will not want to embrace Christianity "Praise the Lord
- -they wanted one of our young people to speak there and Erin said Alke Prokes will be speaking there



-the place is not horrible in terms of the physical looks of it but it is the lack of

care to the children and the malnutrition that is horrible
-little babies in one section were in the toilet/ some were lying on the floor, one
had her head right by the toilet/ others were wex sitting on the pot and an aid
was feeding onex them porrage (at dinner time) while they were on the pot (she

was using onebs bowl for all of them

-some of them were so thin and malnurished that they were quite passive
-one child was whimperinganx and the aid stuck her on the potty (not very gently)
-one "spastic" woman in her 20's (retarded too) was lying on the floor/ paople were
stepping over her

(with all the corruption in govt it is rather sickning to see such horrible conditions, Mrs Dolphin said they were understaffed /she said that some of the parents bring in the children for medical care but end upk leaving them/ or some of them take the children home and then the children return to the same poor condition they were in before)

-the reason we went here in the first place was this was the place w that ran an ad inthe paper about 8 abandoned children and JJsaid to call her and offer to take them/all those parents showwed up but we took in some literature about us and said maybe we could help in the&x future

Mike argued the point alot, disagreed with me on this. He pointed out that Luckhoo didn't even say goodbye. (someone came into the office as we were leaving and Lionel was talking to them and didn't acknoledge Mike Prokes good bye) I don't know if he heard him or not, but I thought we should do something for him, like take him some scotch, or some baked goods to his home because the man was irritated and I don't think we can afford for him to get hostil against us?

(We didn't ask the same questions over and over in this meeting, but asked questions that had been asked in previous meetings)

We can't find any Homende Greater and there is a Bel Air and a Bel aire Gardens and we looked for hak it in Bel Aire Gardens we but couldn't find it and if she could give more instructions it would help.

-after the broadcast today 31/10 with Dr. Da Silve someone called right away to say that they heard the show for the first time tonite and liked it very much. A man who is a clerk at Davis Memorial Hospital Seeram Pershad. He said he had also heard we sold watches and radios at Jonestown. I told him we didn't have any store in Jonestown. He said he'd like to visit sometime and would call me. I told him that Jonestown is a very exciting place and we had a Danish filmmaker presentimly filming it.

Dr Ng a Fook (the dentist) may come to Jonestown again in about 2 weeks but he wants to discuss getting American dollars as that was something he had wanted to discuss the last time he went to JT and at that time the isntructions from the radio were that waxebulkikdbxkebulki

-Sonny Ogle: I asked if he would do a radio broadcast and he said not this time, he is planning to get **Him Hamilton Green to come visit JT and if he can get him to come ? Sonny will fly in with ** him but Sonny will then do a kxxxxi broadcast after that ** visit. He was interested in what we are doing and I twidxwim showed him the articles about the project (Mark's Lane, the Sun Reporter etc) and told him about how we are a cooperative.and He am said it seemed we preferred a socialist form of life and I mentioned the Disciples sharing all as they had need etc. He's not religious in terms of going to church but he ian't a non-believer and he could relate more I thought to that kind of socialism than the g kind he sees in Guyana which is political and in his mind ineffective. Hexm reminds me a little of Dr. Ng-a-Fook in that he's kind of a common guy not politically aware but not axex judgmental. He's net a warm person but did spend a lot of time talking to us and wasn't in a hurry to terminate the conversation. he works at Public Hospital and is a general surgeon. But he's the one that wanted to operate on Yvonne Hayden and Dr. Balwant Singh said her xxxx x-ray wasn't conclusive showing plymx pyloric stenosis even tho she had some of the symptoms.

-I it talked to a Dr. Lacori (sister Lacori) from Mercy Hospital about coming and she would have been willing to come last Sunday but we couldn't get a GDF flight and she can't come next Sunday when thereis a GDF flight. She is a American a citizen and did ask me if she had to have govt. clearance to come to JT. She is quite friendly and responded when I said I was afraid if we

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didn't get a diagnosis the patient might not live. She said she wouldn't want that k to happen. (I said that because at first she said she couldn't get away but then said in the case of that severity, she wouldn't want a patient to go undiagnosed). She was the dr. who did the surgery on Ruby Johnson and Joyce and Anita feel she did an excellent job and Ruby was in high morale which isn't always the case in an amputee situation.

Q-the other Dr. willing to come is Dr. Balwant Singh who said he could come next Sunday. I wrote up his situation.

-one thing I'd appreciate: I was told to get contacts for the Trinidad trip for Charley, Helen and Richard and Guy and I spent several hours calling people. **EXIMENENCE** I should have analyzed that they'd now be staying on the boat but I didn't know the items itinery of the boat or anything and being dumb I just followed instructions and started to make contacts. It would have helpedwhen your have dumb people like me to a tell me that since these people aren't flying ahead on the boat we no longer need to make contacts for them.

-do we still give a gift to the Chinese Embassy: I have heard nothing about this except to do it and when I asked for a gift to be made, I have heard nothing. I make called them several times for films and they said they'd look into it and call me back but they haven't called me back. I wonder if they think we'd show them to the Soviets or that there is something finny about it or they know about the Soviets visiting?????

-I never got a response as to whether I am still to MARKKER make contact with Lenetta Dolphin of the Cultural pregr dept. (she's the one who came out magainst the referendum --but saw our show and the May Day and was very impressed with us).

MARGARET ACKMAN: I called her tonite and she's still put planning to come for dinner on Thurs and fly up to Jonestown Friday or sometime the end of the week. I hope we can get a R GDF plane because the pilot didn't think there were any more flights this week but for her they might do it and then she could return on Sunday on the flight which is already arranged for that day. She said she does need some clothes for men for the family whose daughter tragically burned to death—4 men in that family, they lost everything and the sizes are and 144 15 sauch family. Marilyn Pursley:

I think she's primarily been very REM positive. Has helped around the whouse and cooked dinner here WAR a couple of nights—one night she went out and got the groceries and did the whole thing. She has been under—standing of the whole situation here—the political thing with Guyana struggling to be socialist—the only socialist country in South America. R Got some papers and read about some of the conflicts but I explained to her that Guyana is struggling herd as the first so. American socialist country but it isn't easy of course. Told her about Burnham nationalizing 85% of the ** industries ** and how the English did divide the races (as she had heard* about it) but Burnham was trying to integrate his Cabinet etc.

She was x emotional about paying for all 4 tickets to the Interior (air tickets). She would ave paid for all 4 but Joan initially had her just pay for hers and Cynthias (Marilyn's and Cynthias) because we had two tickets already (to exhrange exchange). I suggested Joan expansion explain that we had a lot of medical needs, antibiotics etc, and get the money forthe other two by saying she Joan was going to exe cash in the tickets and get medicine and to explain that they were flying in specially with her and otherwise would have takings waited and taken the boat. But i Marilyn got all emotional and said she didn't like her Intelligence insulted and obviously she couldhave been asked before but didn't like all this cock and bull story about the fact that Joan made a mistake and should have asked for the money for medicine, so we talked it all out with her and explained all about the medical needs and possible devaluation eventually, which will be a problem forus. Also She said she had planned to give a donation eventually anyway and money didn't mean anything to her and she paid the other two tickets. She talked to Joan for a long time (they have somewhat of a personality conflict anyway--I think Marily is somewhat thereatened by Joans's independence and by the fact too that her children have committed themselves to a cause while she a "former communist' just visits around here and there and doesn't do that much. She got a lot out in the talk Joan and Diane said that she needed to get out anyway and I think now she might oxexesex compenseaste by any guilt by making more of a donation (tho I don't know). She said she had paid Cynthia's way here (as if that wasm a m big thing) -- said Jim Randolph would have had the church pay it (?) but she paid Cynthia's way.

I talked to her about hesse's Journey To the East about a man who leaves a cause only to find out at the end that he left the one thing that would have been the end of a long search for truth—but along the way he had rationalized his leaving so he even convinced himself it was the right thing to do. She seems interested in such a discussion but I can't imagine her being contented in one place—where you can't do your own thing and come and go as you wish. Tho at one point she did make a comment that she might just stay in Jonestown and when she was taking Joan and Diane out she said once that she felt bad spending the moeny and would rather give it to the cause wor have everyone go out and enjoy it. We invited her to eat dinner with a guest tonight but she said she'd rather not eat special and she had realized that she was getting eggs when others in the house weren't and she didn't want to be treated differently.

She definitely sees the US is NMX getting worse and worse—has no illusions about that. She was surprised tho when I told her Diane Mertle was in infi ltrator from the begginning—tho she knew we had to have some infiltrator being a radical movement—but liked Diane more than Elmer—he she didn't like at all. Ran into them right after they left the church but at that time they weren't hostile but just said they'd like to come once in attile to PT but next not all the time but PT wouldnt have them on those terms. (I personally think that very few pressmen wouldwant to leave even for one day at this time when all the hot poop is comming out about corruption in govt/ it's the Guyanese watergate and we would look pale right now in comparison - in terms of Guyanese events. Not that I agree that we are pale right now but this is a big thing in Guyana and will probably be breaking news on various days and I don't think mxmexx professional press will wax want to be left out of it) - but I can still try if your want/ I think it would be a mistake in trying to put out money to arrange a charger and call everyone right now and then it not go thru again/ I think we should wait until things quiet down a bit altho I know we need press coverage.)

-I tried to reach Steve Naraine and he was out but I may still try to reach him as we want to see him anyway / he's the one that gave the good story to the House of Israel

-Vick Forsythe will replace Hutton Archer next week - Monday as Chief MInfo officer and I'll try to reach him

- -I mentioned that our work speaks for itself and that people see our project every day and that even the US Embassy had said that wax the "concerned relatives" (as he mentioned ax that as one of the articles he read) were foolish to write obvious lies such as we have barbed wire faence as they have been to the project and questioned people if they wanted to leave and that Debbie lied also as she moved freely in Georgetown for several months even going out alone at nite and she obviously found it easy to leave so she wasn't restrained in any way
- -kbxkxkdkthuktkikgktbxkdukuksktbxpxkntxthm I mentioned that the stace dept even wrote a letter regarding people's freedom
- -he said the thing to do was to print something like the concerned relatives statement and then print the State Dept thing to refude it -I said "why dignify the lies"

Pat Cameron (Radio Demarara) visit for dinner 25/7/78 (Hue, Kay Nelson, Maria, Sharon A.) -we talked a lot about food/ she's very interested in food and cooking and I gave her our recipes -finally I changed the subject of food -diinner was late maybe that's why because Paula hadaxhaught had forgotten she was coming at 5:30 and thought it was 7:30 and Paula was making the dinner over at Bunny Mann's -we got on the subject of conspiracy and Dennis Banks/ showed her the letter Dennis Banks wrote telling of how the agents approached him -we talked in general about the Kennedy assassination and the problem black elected leaders were facing in the US -she is not too politically aware / after awhile she looked as if it was getting a little heavy for her tho w she wasn't critical and she followed the conversation but I wasn't sure it was exactly her cup of tea to have political conversations

-she had done the announcing for the cultural presentation for the Chinese and told about that

Dr. Ptolemy Reid Deputy Prime 'Inister Ministry of National Development

Dear Dr. Reid:

We are facing a crisis situation in which it seems evident, at this juncture, that you are the only one who can resolve it for us satisfactorily. We were given assurances regarding the matter of licensing our doctor, Larry Schacht, which were subsequently reversed. It is impossible for us to accept the new decision as it would have an adverse effect on the health and well-being of too many persons- not just Peoples Temple members.

Originally, we were told that the situation would be worked out by the doctor who heads the decision making medical board. We were told that Dr. Schacht would only have to come into Georgetown for a couple of weeks. After that he would have consultations with a preceptor over radio telephone from Port Haituma.

You can check with the Soviet Embassy to confirm the type of work our clinic is doing. It would make you proud. The Embassy official-who is a Tass correspondent -- and his wife were overwhelmed by what they saw. (We are inviting all the Embassies from socialist countries and home to have the Chinese as our next visitors.) The couple said they were very impressed after setings some serious disorders and medical problems treated in our facilities. They saw our staff of some 30 persons which include nurse practitioners, respiration therapists, an x-ray technician, RW's, WW's, lab technicians, EKG technician, pharmacist, and a pediatric dispensor who have treated all kinds of critical medical cases. Our doctor has meant the difference between life and death on a number of occasions. The medical board doesn't doubt this but some on the board insist, nevertheless, that Dr. Schacht must do a year's internship in Georgetown. We said that if he had to be away for any extended period, it would likely result in some unnecessary disabilities and even deaths. The response by a few of the rore outspoken board members was shocking. They said there would just have tobbe a few deaths, as there were deaths before we came. They used the aroundnt that they wouldn't be able to go to the States and practice without the proper training and credentials. To us, this indicated a netite bourgemmile attitude toward professional standards. (In other words, "We went through the process, and so must you.") For a third world developing country, this attitude seems highly impractical. Some sort of amendment to the rules (if that's what it would take) should be made for remote areas where no proadoquate existing medical services exist. We know you have deep compassion for the Amer-Indian people, and we provide the only adequate medical care they can ret in the area. As many as 50 a day have come into the project, having walled from miles around. A number have complained of the treatment they rectived from the dispensor in Matthews Pidge who is not qualified to treat

treat any but the most minor cases. Our doctor has actually had to treat people for the mistales that the dispensor made.

Then we began to describe some of the more critical and complex cases that Dr. Schacht has successfully treated, we were supped by one board member who said that our doctor's competence was not in question. We said it was a legal issue. (One woman did say that something ought to be done on humanitarian grounds; but it seemed that the ones who were pushing the legal aspect had an intimidating effect on the others.)

If it is strictly a legal issue, then surely there is some way the board can credit the work that Dr. Schacht has already done, which is documented and which is more intensive than any internship program. Some of his work has been the result of expert consultations from specialist in the best medical clinics in the States and Carribean, via our radio. Surely Dr. Schacht can somethow be Licensed without having to leave the area that is so dependent upon his services which he provides around the clock. It is ironic, to say the least, to charge that our doctor is seeking special treatment when the opposite is true. A prominent physician in the U.S. views Dr. Schacht as a "modern-day Dr. Schweitzer," as the enclosed letter indicates.

It would be tragic if our dootor had to be out of the area in another emergency situation such as that which took the life of the Port Kaituma. PNC head, Ken Green's child. The child's condition was very treatable and and the life would likely have been saved had Ken known about our doctor at that time. So it is deeply distressing when we are given a message eminating from Minister Loyte that we cannot post a message offering our medical services and which would have conveyed the appropriate days and times for the people's convenience.

Morally, our doctor feels (and we absolutely agree) that he cannot leave the project beyond the time period originally agreed upon, because it would be inhumane to do so. You can imagine how difficult it would be to say "no" to the Amer-Indians who seek our medical services and the effect it could have when suddenly the free services are no longer available with no reasonable explanation being given. It is generally knownthhautue are PMC members, and so I'm afraid it will reflect badly on the government and us if the services are eliminated. Dr. Reid, would you please help us in this ratter?

CUSTOMS

We still have made no progress in customs. We submitted a letter reducating various duty-free concessions which were alldennied. The letter was issued from Minister Mope's office. The effect of the answer to our letter is to penalize socialists and give incentives to those who are capitalists. The regulations are obviously archaic. The Deputy Comptroller, Stanley Mite, stated flatly, "The law makes no concessions for co-operatives. I know it makes no sense but it's a holdover from British law."

In jonestown we distribute equally to everyone. Thus, personal items are never earmarked for a single individual. If it were otherwise and every individual had to claim their own goods, everything would be chaos when the goods arrived as each person would have to come to town.toThit would mean

bringing up to 1000 people into Georgetown to get their belongings which would be an insandeand impractical situation that would halt production on the project.

Something needs to be done when the favor is being given to people who live non-communally. We've been given duty-free concessions in the past, so we know it can be done. A government official told us that our trouble began when Interpol (which we have proof is part of the conspiracy against us) sent customs a letter stating we were smuggling banned items in our shinments. Then one of the dock owners told us our crates were broken into 'w six special police officers. The approval on our forms was rescinded before the officers went through the crates. Of course nothing illegal was found (although we did fear that something could have been planted on us). Frothat time on we have gotten no co-operation from customs- only a series of endless frustrations and closed doors. The heart-breaking thing is that we have had to actually purchase the same type of items that were in the crates because we could not get them released and they were urrently needed.

The customs roadblacks are also costing us many thousands of dollars in increased fees for rental of space for our crates. The longer it takes to get release of the crates approved, the higher the rental cost. This is money that would otherwise be used in ways that could only benefit Guyana through increaded development. Again, we are looking to you for some way to resolve this problem, which is having a crippling effect on our goals which are your goals.

Dear Comrade Prime Minister:

We wish to bring to your attention the conspiratorial custody harassments which have been a major source of the lowering of morale of our people because of the indecisive actions taken here.

Joseph Mazor, the ex-con with the ten year criminal record, has now been proven to be a special agent of Interpol and works hand-in-hand with other clandestine agencies. Yet this fact has all but been ignored and Mazor's knowledge of the weak point in Guyana's refusal to take a position of non-jurisdiction on court matters has opened up a spectrum of activity which could bring Mazor, Interpol, and his covert connections right into Guyanese territory which is exactly what you are trying to avoid.

Three matters have so far been brought forward by Mazor. All three similar in nature, similar in procedure, and if no action is taken by you, could similarly be pursued in court in the same manner as the matter was of Jim Jones' son, John. This is bleeding our finances: taking money away from the project.

OLIVER:

The parents of William and Bruce Oliver arrived in Guyana two weeks ago over protests from their sons that they were both happy here and that they did not want to return to the U.S. Foreign Minister Wills handled the entire matter very well. Because all of the custody matters form a pattern, we mention the Olivers to enhance your understanding.

Both sons are happily married with their wives on the project. In fact, William was in Georgetown for four weeks going through the procedure to get married. That is all the proof needed (by the U.S. or anyone else) that he was here by choice. He is 6'2" tall and weighs over 200 pounds. He walked freely up and down the streets of Georgetown and could easily have requested aid to return to the U.S. if he wanted to return. So why this rushed trip to Guyana to whisk away their sons?

Reliable sources have told us that Mazor paid their way and gave them encouragement that the Guyana government would assist them in every way possible in retrieving their sons. This was also supported by the father of member Maria Katsaris (24 year old woman) who went back telling people friendly to us in official positions in the U.S., that officials in the

Guyana government were saying that we are a bunch of fanatics. People like Ambassador Mann were quoted whenever he was not supportive of us. This we know to be an attempt by Katsaris and Mazor to sow seeds of division and to make Guyana look like a fool. It would be far better (and self-serving for Guyana) to present it like it is: a political conspiracy to destroy one of the most progressive movements in the entire U.S.

It is obvious that some in the government feel pressured by our presence. It is inconceivable to us that people like the Olivers could get so far if this were not so. The father of the two sons has a criminal record and has been involved in credit card forgery. Mrs. Oliver is a crazy woman and she openly stated she was doing this for money. She had to be held off by four people from trying to murder Jim's wife, Marceline. They used violence already and are probably trying to force us into some violent reaction with their threats.

An American judge told the Olivers, "I'll give you the order (for custody), but I'll tell you, it amounts to nothing." He was referring to jurisdiction and not to the boy's age (who was 17 at the time), because in California law a married person is an emancipated adult. If a U.S. judge can be convinced of this point of law, then why is there such a reversed opinion from Dr. Reid's original stance about Jim's son, "that they (U.S.) have no jurisdiction and it will never go to a Guyana court?"

Neither the Oliver's nor their representatives represent Third World opinion. Thier lawyer is known as a joke in the legal profession and is called King of the Con. He will jump on any bandwagon to make a buck. The Olivers are anti-socialist and pro-conservative in the U.S. yet this harassment again reaches down here, forcing your government to have to confront us with yellow journalist lies.

A picture of the wife of Bruce Oliver was in the <u>Guyana Chronicle</u> assisting Dr. Ng-a-Fook. She is a dental technician from a more affluent background, but they both have found a good life here. This is where Jim and everyone else wants to be.

Our people's incentives to work would be destroyed if we go through legal battles on the socialist side of the world. We have endured 25 years of hell for standing against injustice. We have spent U.S.\$50,000 in legal fees. This money could be used to improve medical care in the interior and save babies like the ones brought to us everyday from the local community. We can't do both, moreover, we won't be able to sustain ourselves and pay legal costs.

GRIFFITH/TRUSS:

Mary Griffith has been rearing her granddaughter, Dana Truss, since Dana was a baby because the mother is a drug addict and a prostitute with brain damage from overdosing on drugs. Now, all of a sudden, this mentally .ill daughter, who abandoned her child turns up a concerned mother and wants her 8 year old daughter back. This is so blatantly a set-up situation. If she comes down here, it will be paid through the same means as the .Olivers: Joseph Mazor.

Mary Griffith's family and the Truss's have been threatening Jim's wife and any member coming in or going out of the Temple door in the U.S. to the point that we had to get police protection.

These people are mentally disturbed. The members of the Griffith family here can tell you (not only is the grandmother here, but two grown sons and another daughter are here also). When Mary sold a piece of property in the U.S. a few months ago, her daughter and son went into the house in the middle of the night and padlocked the house after it was already sold. They do not behave in a rational manner.

Our people have said they will not let this woman's granddaughter be taken from her. The Griffith's are good workers on the project. We cannot deal with people like this or give in to their demands, as you cannot back down to the U.S. You can see from history that more is gained in the long run by those who don't back down.

We have endured a lot because of our loyalty to you, but if there is too much pressure we will look elsewhere. Jim does not want to be placated. Our people will never let him go back to the U.S., but he needs to know your position to enable him to plan our future.

JIM JONES' SON, JOHN STOEN:

Jim Jones has a devotion to our people that goes even farther than his own blood son. He stood more resolutely behind the Olivers and Griffiths than that of his son, because he would not have put his movement or his beloved new home in Guyana through the pressure of this custody action were it not clearly proven that his son's mother was unfit, exploiting a child's life for monetary gain and vengence.

We have absolute documented proof that she is at the helm of this conspiracy, which by her own words, she says, 'hopes will drive Jim to kill himself and his son, so his socialist seed would be eradicated from the earth."

Her vengence stems from Jim not marrying her. Although Jim's wife, Marceline, was willing to permit him, and Jim would have gone through the hell of that marriage for our people's sake, our board and the leaders of our movement felt it would affect the morale of our membership and result in a loss of support. Jim tried to explain this in a kind way but she turned on Jim with viciousness and took it out on their son.

She picked up with the first man she could find, a racist man named Walter Jones (who is no relation to Jim). She knew the child hated him and was terrified of him from an ordeal where he beat the child unmercifully. She topped all sadism our group has ever heard of by locking their son in the garage and making him witness a sexual act between her and this man. She also sublimated sexually with the child in a gross manner to torture Jim. She said cruel and rejecting things to John to the point that the boy openly talked of wanting to die at the tender age of "2".

The child has these incidents indelibly printed in his mind, but the trauma is over now. John is happy in this lovely new environment with his father. John's life is full, happy, and complete now that he is spared from his mother's seductively sick and sordidly manipulative example of motherhood. Our psychological counsellor and Jim have observed that John does not want and obviously does not need to discuss her any longer, although Jim always tells John that his mother cared.

Jim has said he would have withdrawn from the custody battle if his child's mother were a reasonably normal mother. He said he would have

stayed out of his child's life because his socialist values would cause conflicts for the child in his mother's racist, reactionary family. They have always hated Jim's guts and taken it out on John. Therefore he could not send this child, or any child, to this fate worse than death. Our people would never permit such a thing even when Jim made this noble gesture for the sake of our movement and Guyana.

John is a bright, sensitive child taking after his father in many ways. He considers himself Guyanese. He has a deep concern about racism, is very knowledgeable about socialism and knows all about Guyana's modern and historical struggle against racism and colonialism.

It is this very loyalty to all people that makes Jim more unusual in ability to take the pain of leadership in this movement which is on two fronts at the same time.

DEMANDS NEED TO BE STOPPED

Please don't let people push us with any more demands. We want to know: are we going to have to go through answering these yellow journalism lies on both sides of the world? We had hoped that the anti-Guyana propaganda that circulates in the U.S. would help you to identify with the harassment we are going through.

Jim is having a considerable amount of trouble with his heart and I am sure you would not find the movement so productive if Jim dies, thus we beg you to give him what he needs to build during these crucial stages of transition. He is constantly building new leadership to carry it on, but we are not ready yet. This project is a model of productivity in every sphere of activity, as has been observed by guests from every part of Guyana and many parts of the world. Impressions by guests have often been written in newspapers praising our community as a model and as inspiring.

Living does not mean that much to us if we have to go through harassment here as we did in the U.S. You are setting precedents with these custody matters which will open us up to every right-wing stooge. People like Tim Stoen, who is the legal father of Jim's son and who has joined the conspiracy, should not be allowed to get pas the airport. (The same is more true for Grace Stoen who has been part of the conspiracy since its inception.) Tim Stoem's purpose for coming here is not to support this unfit mother (as he himself has called her unfit), but rather to get grist for the media to write up an emotional sensational story which will depict Guyana as an oppressor depriving a mother (even though she abandoned the child) of having her child. If people like Tim Stoen are not stopped, there will be no end of people paid by the conspiracy. They must clearly be told there is no jurisdiction here and that it is a waste of time going through any process. The money to send people to Guyana to harass us with custody matters is all coming from the same source. The harassment will no doubt continue until a posture of non-cooperation is clearly shown from the start with these cases, on the basis of the nonjurisdiction. Any cooperation will give them encouragement to keep this up.

One final matter that concerns all of us for which it would be extremely helpful to receive an expedient answer (which we have not been given despite former attempts). Our people do not understand why the errest orders are not immediately revoked. These orders necessarily keep

Despite all the assurances we've had to the contrary, this makes it look as if we do not have much support from the country we came to serve It has been impossible to explain such a thing as arrest orders to our people and we humbly beseech you to resolve this for us.

Our productivity is greatly affected by the level of morale of our people. We are duty-bound to communicate things of this nature with everyone in our membership so they can be part of the decision-making and can totally participate in the decisions that affect our lives. A promise was made long ago that everyone would be included on all matters affecting the organization. This is how we operate and this is what has developed the high level of trust in our leadership. Understandably, good news increases our production, whereas low morale causes a decrease. Our cassava crew, after hearing that the matter with the Olivers was resolved, quadrupled their production.

Thank you for taking time out of your busy schedule to read this. We appreciate your service to our group and we will honor our friendship by producing more in the coming year when all of these conspiratorial matters are stopped.

The reason I am writing to you at this time is that the medical team, including Dr. Baird and Cde. Charles Wines, will be contacting you in record to their visit to Jonestown in which they inspected the medical services there. They will be consulting with our in record to the future arrosp ments of our reclical services.

We had a very satisfying disloque with Dr. Baird and Cde. Fines and tall of for several hours. The communicator to them the essential need for our doctor. There will be soon upocaing visits from dignitaries (such as the "athorist" in a rintendent) who would be very judgmental and critical if we didn't have a ligh standard of medical care. Charles Garry (our attorney and well known activist leader) was so impressed with all the services he witnessed in Jonestom forcluding the medical program — that when he returned to the U.S. he made several press releases to newspapers stating that "I have been to paradise." Also, because of Er. Garry's suggestion, there will be a TV documentary made on life in Jonestown. The people on this TV craw are very friendly.

It is essential for Comenc's image and ours for us to continue at lower present high standard of redical cars and to allow us tohave our own doctor (increase sharing - free of charge - fith the entire North Mest District community). Several people were legally approved to come here based on Dr. Schacht being a majorner resident in our community.

we have a significant problem facing us if we cannot get our crates (not court 150 in number) released from customs. We are getting threadbare in clothes, and common receive distinguished quests until these crates are released. The clothes in these crates are used and are essential for members in our community. The duty on these crates (and we have placedy asked for a duty free concession from Minister Hope, who did not great this) will be between \$14,000 to \$16,000, which we simply cannot afford - especially with all the free services we are providing. Nay help you could tender in this area would be greatly appreciated.

We thank you for any process that comes about through your meeting with Dr. Baird and Cde. Hines. We will never forget all that you have done for us in the past, and it is deeply, deeply appreciated. As you know, our only wish is to be an asset to Guyana.

Because you have taken an interest in Peoples Temple over the years, we try to keep you up to date on some of the background of our persecution in the United States so that you can get the full picture. Two articles that I am including will give you some idea of what we are doing in the United States and what we have endured.

The first one is an article about Rubert 'urdoch, the press magnate, who was one of the people the lead the offensive to discredit Peoples Temple. You can see by this article in a progressive magazine that 'urdoch's tendency is not just to discredit Peoples Temple but to use the same technique against another individual, 'Hilfred Burchett, who has also, like Jim Jones, champeoned the rights of people and who has "covered peoples" liberation struggles all ever the world for forty years." The type of lies he used in this came was to say that Burchett participated in terture of prisoners of war in Vietnam and Rorea and also "urdoch's paper demanded that Burchett's tour of US campuses and cities be stouped.

The other article "Peoples Temple Investigates the Investigators" indicates that Peoples Temple is taking the offensive to investigate those the attempt to destroy any mention of freedom in the United States, and also explains that People imple is now bringing these facts to the people in the United States through peaceful protest.

That you for your attention to these articles and we hope they are informative.

Dear Frime Minister Burnham;

We have been asked to pay for recent GDF flights into the interior to take emergency cases into Georgetown. This means we will not be able to send in emergency cases and will condemn some persons to death. We will not be able to continue as we have done in flying people outside our community because the cost will seriously affect our production. The fact that it will affect so many outside our community is very upsetting to us. Too many people than we can enumerate have been brought into Georgetown and maintained at our headquarters here either while they are getting treatments or their relatives are treated. We have actually brought in more people from outside our community than those in Sonestown. We never turn anyone away. We help with food and lodgings at our headquarters.

One person had body lacerations. In other cases there were cut tendons, concussions. One woman was hemorrhaging for two weeks and when she reached Georgetown, she was operated on for a pelvic mass.

It's not that we wouldn't be very happy to make donations to the FNC but it would be helpful at least f the cost of the flight could be more reasonable. We made a donation of \$200 worth of chickens and \$500 to the FNC so we are certainly glad to be supportive. We've saved Guyana from many of these mercy flights by using private flights and our boat just last week took a mother and baby in from a neighboring community. If we had to have a lot of trips into Georgetown, we'd bear real trouble. Fortunately, our medical staff is very competent and they have taken care of more medical emergencies for our neighbors as well as our own community than we could enumerate. However, in an emergency, the GDF plane is the only one available quickly.

We are willing to make up a goal for the FNC each mouth. We provided movies this week and other weeks in Kaituma so that our FNC there could make money. We would naturally want to helphin any way we could. But we were told by several officials that there was a protest over our use of GDF flights by one Minister. According to these sympathetic officials this one Minister doesn't like us and we feel it's a shame that this action is being done for one reason; this hurts us deeply. We understand economic austerity but we deplore personal vendettas.

We are doing all that is in our power to help Guyana's problems. If we could get certain things behind us such as the John Victor case, the problem of having our doctor licensed, and the problem of having our school fully recognized, we could branch out and every dime could go into the economy in a direct manner, through goods and services and through other cooperatives and facilities that Guyana is undertaking. If we are given these basic assurances that we need to function and expand to our total self-sufficiency with our production, we will certainly never mind paying the emergency slights for ourselves or for anyone else, no matter how many times duty would call.

At this time, however, we will have to cut down the service for the outside communit and this is devastatingly rainful to us because someone doesn't happen to like us. This kind of vendetta causes racist smears to come on Guyana but we are an enduring people.

Recently, a woman needed emergency attention for a special problem. It would have costs her life if it wasn't possible to have an emergency flight. We don't want to reflect on Brigadier Trice or anyone in his department. They have even given up their own seats on the plane to accommodate emergency cases. In one case, seats were given up for an Amerindian woman and our doctor who accompanied her into Georgetown. We just want you to know that this will drastically limit our services. There is a terrible strain on us when we are trying to be conscientious and respond to community needs for care. When there is an accident in the area, reople are sure to come to us and if our medical staff can't take care of it, it will be overwhelming to our conscience. We have, in the past, been able to offer this service. In fact, reople in the neighboring communities were very rrateful for the GDF planes and when they would complain about a composition of the GDF planes and when they received at Mathematical Staffe Capital, we would always point out the excellent public service of the GDF.

We would certainly do the best to continue treating people when they come to us even though we couldn't fly them into George town. But we even have a problem in this area because some concur specialized equipment is still in customs. This means that some types of specialized surgery is impossible for us to do if we don't have the quipment. Even so, some very complicated feats have been undertaken, each time successfully, and our doctor consults with doctors on the medical net and Stateside and all over the world. They all speak highly of our doctor's competence. Dr. Schact never says a critical word on the medical net but only praises the medical facilities here. These doctors on the medical net have gone to academies where they have had the best possible training so the consultation is very helpful.

It would be absolute chaos for Dr. Schacht to have to leave the area to train in Georgetown in terms of the press. We have to be sure we have a doctor here because of the concern and interest of people in the US, and because of those who have been critical in the past. Our doctor is qualifying himself everyday and from what we have heard the area has always been served by paramedics so since he is more qualified, much more, than the average paramedic, what is the problem? We have received no complaints from those he has treated. And those he has consulted with have praised his thoroughness. He will spend hours on the medical net. He is much needed from the standpoint of this community as well as the neighboring communities and he needs to be put in the position to be of henefit to the entire Torthwest.

We are very grateful for the wonderful care people are receiving in Georgetown. We brought a woman, Elaine George, and her baby Steven in from Kaituma (where she lives) on our boat this last trip and we were very moved when a doctor came off the tennis court to see the baby even though it was a holiday. He was very kind and never complained.

Our doctor had to treat the baby until the boat could leave because the haby couldn't even have traveled when the mother first brought him to us. That would have been a very embarrassing situation for Mr. Hope who was treating him because the baby was dying. Normatter what skills he has, a lot of information comes back to us that he has operated on people when he doesn't know what he doing. You can check into this for yourself. However, the conditions with him have been much better since the Ministry of Health had a dialogue with us and with him, much better. We are very grateful for the intervention of the Ministry which prevented antagonisms.

Another baby also would have died in the Mathews Ridge Hospital. This baby, Shad Yudson, weighed only 9 pounds when he came to us and he was 11 months old. In just one day after he came to us, he gained 7 ozs. Our doctor said that it was just a matter of hours and he would have died; the baby was almost lifeless. But after just 24 hours of care, he gained the weight and became very alert. At Mathews Ridge he was being treated for something else and the medical regime he was under wasn't helping at all. The problem is that the man in Mathews Ridge, Mr. Hope, refused to release the baby to come to Georgetown or go anywhere else for treatment. Finally the parents just insisted on leaving with him. The The parents said he was being given some cough syrup, Ferrol Cough Syrup, and was just dying from gross caloric deprivation. This was due to lack of adequate food as well as the inability to gain weight due to his medical condition. There was no fat on him at all. (By the way the first baby was suffering from Chronic upper respiratory tract infection).

Another case Dr. Schacht worked with was a 15 year old who had diarrhea for a year. He was given a couple of tablets by the Mathews Ridge Hospital. He was found by Dr. Schacht to have Giardiasis, an intestinal parasite Trichuriasis (Thich is a worm), likely also Amabiases, and a severe deficiency of iron. He's being treated now in our facility. (His name: John Adams)

John Fhillips, 77 years old, came to us for help. He had peripheral deterioration of the nerves and he had been given some 30 injections for an ulcer over a period of two weeks in the groin just before the onset of this disorder. A full medical history was done at our clinic and now Dr. Schacht has taken this situation into consultation with medical specialists on the ham radio. The man is hardly able to feed or dress himself. They ruled out just about everything and the symptoms appear to be something similar to arsenic poisoning. It is possible that he had injections of a medicine that is metallic based. The neurologists were not critical in their analysis but we did make it very clear to them that he could not have gotten any treatment like this in a Guyanese medical facility. We went on to explain that

he is living near a border area and there were all kinds of ways that he may have done this to treat himself. The neurologists did confirm that it appeared to be something that could have been caused by a metallic based injection and they wanted to rule out any possibility of a social disease which we are doing right now to study that possibility thoroughly. We will get back to the people on the medical net about this man's problem. We have not administered anything but advised him to come to Georgetown as soon as possible and even offerred transportation on our boat and housing in our headquarters. We asked him to stay with us in Jonestown until that time, however he went back into the bush and said he would come back. We would very much like him to see a specialist immediately. One thing that would have been helpful at the time is that if we could have taken an x-ray on the spot we would have been able to see immediately if there was a metallic poisoning, however our x-ray is tied up in customs.

We have had many cases in which we have been able to treat snake bites effectively for people in the surrounding area. We have treated them when they came to us for help and also our workers have gone outside the community to treat them. Fortunately, teaching people how to work in the fields, forests, around water holes, we've never had one snake bite in our community. Our workers have all been given classes in snake bite treatment.

As we have mentioned to you before, when we talk on the medical net, we are always very positive about Guyana, the fantastic medical care given here, the helpfulness of the government and the friendliness of the people. One doctor was so impressed that he offerred to come for two months and give medical services free of charge to our District.

Flease take note of the necessity of our doctor to be of service to Jonestown as well as to the larger community. We hope that the personal animousity of the one Minister will not deter the facilitation of this problem because innocent people will suffer if that happens.

We thank you for your attention to the matters in this letter and for all you do for Guyana.

IRS CONSPIRACY: UPDATE OF CURRENT HARASSMENT BY THE IRS

We thought we should bring to your attention at the earliest opportunity information we have received from a friend working in the IRS. This woman told us that someone in the interestructure of that department is disgruntled about our presence in Guyana, most notably our giving money to the government in Guyana. There is a memo to this effect and we are hoping to get a copy without jeopardizing, of course, this person's job. She is a friend who has helped other progressive people in the past when the IRS has thought to initiate some form of harassment.

The IRS is noted for its auxillary function as an arm of harassment against third world and civil rights leaders. Jack Anderson, a highly respected nationally known columnist, revealed that an IRS agent stepped forward recently and admitted the use of the IRS as a weapon for political harassment. ... This did not end with the Nixen era. This officer stated that the agency still continues with petty herassment, hate mail, and even such sordid techniques as anonymous phone calls and arranging for the water and electricity of a targeted individual or organization to be cut off.

The IRS shares no love for Carter. All prominent and respected black and

civil rights leaders have been subjected to the IRS "for treatment" over the years. Cecil Williams, an outstanding clergyman who is very active in civil rights, and who has always avoided being labeled a Socialist, has been undergoing an IRS investigation for over two years. Lt. Gov. Dymally has also been investigated by the IRS and he may still be under investigation.

One of the more sinister aspects of this kind of harassment is that the IRS camouflages its activities under a mask of bureaucratic secrecy, and has no objection to inform an individual when and if an IRS investigation has been completed. They retain for themselves as a practical matter an unfettered license to pry, investigate and interfere with the functioning of persons and organizations it deems "undesirable." This latest move against our organization represents the second time the IRS has conducted such harassment against us. Many years ago we took a strong stand against Vietnam. This was very early in the anti-war movement, and we were selected for IRS herassment. Over eighty of our church members were called during the investigation. One of our members, Mrs. Jack Beam, got out her files of every receipt she had accumulated over the years. She marched

into the IKS, dumped the contents of the boxes all over the IRS investigator's desk and told the startled man to look through it all if he wanted. The investigation abruptly ceased and we were not bothered after and the second that.

This latest move was undoubtedly organized, as the visit came on the same day that an attempt was made to file against Jim Jones and a few other persons both in Guyana and in the US , two groundless, flimsy, civil suits. We are frankly surprised that those behind this conspiracy have not tried to frame us on more than two simple, easily won civil suits.

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Thank you for taking the time to read this letter. We just wanted to give you some background on this issue.

Venezuelan Incident

An incident occurred in Papaya when a number of our members went to hear the Prime Minister speak. A Venezuelan Colonel approached several of our request members, in fact he purposely edged his way through the numbers of people there in order (as if by chance) to encounter some of our teenage estimate. His deliberation was evident to those present. Indeed, he quite clearly chose the time when our more worldly-wise members were speaking to the Prime Minister.

Apparently, he tried his best to obtain information from these young people, whom he no doubt thought were very impressionable and would thus be quite talkative. He judged them wrong, however. He have seen too much of this type of interrogation for even our vouth not to be well aware of the technical people appeared to be ingratiating and warm, saying he had heard much about us a our project, and that Dr. Reid had praised us highly. In the next breath he asked a myriad of questions about our lifestyle, production, how we got people to work so effectively, what kind of social system we had, etc. He was very clearly fishing for information and bore the classic earmarks of one in intelligence work. Our people are very astute and he picked some very sharp young people. They pointed out that the work ethic is put in a very positive light in our democratic town government and in our school as well, and that people work effectively out of a sense of cooperative responsibility.

He said he wanted to come visit with a delegation and seemed to have a sense urgency about the visit. We remarked that Guyana is a beautiful country and we are very glad to be here. He smiled and said, "You are close to Venezuel" and it is equally beautiful." Paranola notwithstanding, it would be safe to say that he was working very assiduously at being personable, was more than casually interested in the project, and was definitely trying hard to sell us at Venezuela. We have no desire to live anywhere but in a black socialist mation, and Venezuelan jurisdiction is absolutely unacceptable to us!

We were told long ago by someone in the inner circles of government that Venezuela claims were a serious concern, the paramount concern to Guyana, and that problems with Surinam were secondary, perhaps even exaggerated as a major of diverting people's attention away from subversive plans against our present convernment which we are devoted to completely. That would certainly be understandable. However, if Venezuela is truly an immediate or foreseeable conversions then——arm us! We can defend your border with unmatchable determination.

being trigger happy. We can fight like mad, and we'd damn sure give the Venezuelans one hell of a time if they were to come through this part of the country. What we need is the proper equipment to do the job. Give us clear ance to get the advanced veaponry we can use to fight effectively. We are totally ill-equipped to resist an invading force at this time. It would be unrealistic to think that a regime with the vestiges of oligarchy would head to invade Guyana at some time to annex disputed territory. Our lovality to you is unshakeable and well-proven and our life style clearly shows that we are peaceful and constructive. We are politically aware, more aware than you can imagine, and by nature are absolutely peaceful people. But we do not wish to see those whom we have pledged our lives to—our beloved comrade leader, and yourself, jeopardized in any way. This is our home and we are glad to be able to help defend its borders. I think!I can say without being immodest that you could not find a community more aware, more sensitive, nor more loyal—even among the youth and senior citizens.

We have another eason to be concerned about our border. Some time ago we wrote you about reliable information we received regarding a Venezuela military officer's offer to aid a mercenary effort directed against us. This person would aid the political conspiracy by guiding mercenaries through the border. We do not know, of course, whether this inquisitive Venezuelan colonel is connected with the mercenary effort, but the sense of urgency he imparted about his desire to "win us over" and visit the project makes us highly suspicious. We encountered too many undercover intelligence persons in the United States (and some here who were reported to us) not to be able to recognize their methods and approach. Do you want us to welcome this colonel and his delegation (he suggested some from the Venezuelan Embassy visiting us also) and tape record what they say while they are here? We will gladly do your bidding on this matter. Although this colonel made a posture of being friendly to socialist ideology (and perhaps he really is), we have seen too many deceptive newsmen in the U.S. use such a ploy to be taken in by verbal commitment alone. We are very careful about political conversations and are not foolish enough to be taken in by a person's claim to support socialism alone.

Need for Security

Many of our people feel that we will never be given security. So if pressure from the U.S. comes, Guyana can wash their hands easily of Peoples Temple because no commitment has been made. We revere the Prime Minister and yourself and appreciate how you have treated our people but it seems at times on all matters, we are given a put-off treatment as if we are an inconvenient burden. So you can imagine the kind of long term effect that has on people's morale. It is a miracle that people work hard and produce in every department everyday not knowing the future at all. We have met a lot of people who could not face death out of loyalty to anything or anybody. This applies to a lot of people in Guyana. But here you have a people who can face death over Venezuela and over the United States. But nobody can face being an island unto themselves. First it is assimilate and when you do that successfully, your wrists are slapped. Then when you face a conspiracy like the one Tim Stoen belongs to, night and day, it is just too much.

Trust us, as we have trusted you, as, for example, in the case of John, with verbal promises. We have been very honest to tell you that we cannot live

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Our doctor was called the brightest of over 5,000 by Dr. Thain, the head of a large medical network of physicians in the U.S. Dr. Schacht has never had an unsuccessful surgery on our people. He is an excellent doctor but unfortunately cannot be utilized fully because one of our few basic requests are not being granted. We hope that can be worked out, for the benefit of the people in the area. The situation with the nurse practitioner is also nonsense. Last night, if our vehicle had not been notified by the gate and thus we were able to send out emergency equipment on our vehicle, the Guyanese baby would have died out on the road. The vehicle that was bringing the baby to Jonestown for treatment went off the road. Our vehicle went out to meet them, carrying emergency equipment and found they had gone off the road. Before we could get the baby back to the clinic another of our vehicles had to go back and get the man out of the ditch. Two lives were saved in just that one day.

We will pull back from Fort Kaituma dispensary and their residents there can come out to Jonestown but it's a grave mistake and also demoralizing. It is also inhumane to make people walk miles and miles when they are ill or when they require emergency care. Why is it that when we are being the most procutive, in areas we have the most to offer, obstacles are put in our way. And when we are the ones that are willing to travel the extra mile to give care, why would our government want to tell Guyanese people that they have to walk when they can be treated in comfort.

A New Medical Harassment

You may wonder why this letter goes on and on stating various difficulties Peoples Temple is facing. We wonder the same thing. Why, when things just start to calm down, does someone take up the fight against Peoples Temple? We would like some response so we understand the kind of harassments we endure. We know it could not be with your sanction; but why isn't it stopped. The following incident seems to be done with the express purpose of provication. Last Thursday at the local PNC meeting in Knituma, District Minister Carmichael and Comrade Wyatt put Peoples Temple in a very embarrassing position and were very rude. Their behavior made us wonder what the goals are of some officials.

Again, our medical services were the main focus. They made fun of the medical condition of a Guyanese child who had been treated by Peoples Temple. The child, it seems, had something stuck in his nose, a seed or something. The child had great difficulty breathing. Carmichael and Wyatt showed total ignorance of medical matters in their sarcasm. The seed, the obstruction, could have gone into the lungs and caused pneumonia--a very difficult type of pneumonia to treat because it is not caused by bacteria and therefore will not respond to antibiotics. Carmichael and Wyatt minimized the condition and rediculed Peoples Temple by saying Peoples Temple exaggerated the gravity of the situation. They distorted the facts and made it appear as if Peoples Temple was saying that the seed would have gone to the brain, which would not have been said by us, as we have much more knowledge of anatomy and medicine than that. There was callousness in their attack as the father of the little child had rushed the child to Jonestown very late at night because the child was having difficulty breathing. The medical team at Jonestown removed the seed from the child and the child began to breath normally.

Not only did the two men embarross and redicule Peoples Temple, but during the course of the PNC meeting, they also said that anyone who wanted to visit Jones-

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without our community intact, with none of our people taken away. Fears and anxieties would be greatly allayed if, on some discreet level, you could give us a word that we need not worry about any of our people being removed by reactionary and racist elements in the U.S.A. As it is now, we are left up in the air about John Stoen.

And yet in terms of the conspiracy, things must be better, because of Bunny Mann's reactions. He never calls and asks Paula Adams to be his houseguest unless things are getting better with the conspiracy, and that is what he did. That is our opinion unless he has some new trickeration in mind, but he doesn't seem to be that sophisticated.

Bunny Mann and the District Attorney

Bunny Mann said to us in San Francisco that there were no problems with the District Attorney and that there wouldn't be any investigation of Peoples Temple, and thus there wouldn't be any problems for Peoples Temple. This statement came as a response to questions of our members in San Francisco to him if he will stand behind Peoples Temple. We don't expect unqualified answers but when you are dealing with a conspiracy, even though they've manifactured no charges for a year, we don't vant our support based on that kind of statement about the District Attorney. We don't understand in the first place why socialists would be concerned if the D.A. did not like socialists like Jim Jones. It should be understood that if the D.A. did attack socialists, which both Guyana and Jim Jones are, it should not come as a surprise. We have no incommation of the D.A. doing anything, but if he did, he would have to manufacture his charges. And we don't like support for us to be conditional and linked to the D.A.'s mood.

Our Medical Services Hindered

I have to say at times it appears that there are people who seek to cause us difficulties, and in doing so, almost seem to be acting with deliberation, in a subversive way, to reflect on the government. This last week our medical practitioner, who is our licensed dispenser and not a registered nurse, as was mistakingly reported to you-(she is a woman who in the U.S. had been qualified to diagnose as well as prescribe and she is licensed in Guyana) went to the Port Kaituma dispensary to give medical services. win front of a large group of people waiting to see her expressly, she was told that she could no longer use the Port Kaituma facilities. The people waiting for treatment were very upset and shouted out that they would go to Jonestown, as it is known that we give topnotch care! We quickly said it was a miscommunication. a mix-up on a local level that in no way is a reflection on Comrade Leader or the government. The timing of such an incident nevertheless leads one to wonder if there were not some design in mind to try to reflect badly on the government, as our support for you is well-known.

Our medical services are a morale boost for Guyana. They take pressure off facilities in Georgetown by being able to help deliver healthy babies for the community and to save their lives, as well as the lives of others. An engineer, for instance, would have had to be flown in to Georgetown by emergency flight and then it would have probably been too late. He and his baby are Guyanese. He was going to stay by the child's life to the end. So that would have been production loss. This kind of thing has been repeated dozens of times. So we have to take it up with you because Minister Green is out of town. Our services have done nothing but build popularity for the government.

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town could do so but they implied it would be risky (they actually said it flat out; it was much more than an implication). They also said they would no longer help to provide any transportation to anyone who wanted to visit Jonestown regardless of whether it was an emergency, no matter what. They said that if Carmichael thought it was necessary, he would provide transportation to Mathews Ridge, which as you know, is quite a distance away.

Carmichael said, "I am a long standing citizen of Guyana but you..." (and he left the rest unfinished, addressing our residents). This is a super nationalistic point of view and a very unsocialistic statement which in no way fits in with the very principled commitment of unity of all peoples that the Prime Minister and the party are upholding. Carmichael said this loudly right in the middle of the PNC meeting, which was very imappropriate.

I think it is very apparent that Carmichael is very jealous of Jonestown because many people like Jonestown and it is very popular. The attitude of these men is certainly not helpful to Guyana. It just gets Guyanese people all stirred up because they like us and appreciate the care we are giving, and it makes them angry. It looks as if Carmichael is just trying to play Peoples Temple against Guyana and vice versa. This is especially unkind as Peoples Temple has been getting alon well lately in Guyana and the Prime Minister was very sociable to us when he was in Papaya. Peoples Temple always speaks highly of the Prime Minister of yourself and gives you the credit for the services we give. We have even spoke highly of Carmichael and Wyatt though Carmichael at times tries to hinder Jonestown's activities.

Carmichael and Wyatt even ran down their Guyanese colleagues for not attending the recent PNC conference at Mathews Ridge. At the same time, Garmichael was very critical of Peoples Temple for bringing so many or our members to the conference in one vehicle. The jealousy and the pettiness of it all were very obvious. We have heard it said that Minister Moyte does not like people who are not Guyanese. It doesn't matter to him if they are socialists; he doesn't care. The kind of attitude that Carmichael displayed and the attitude that Moyte displays seem to be the pattern of Moyte when people like Minister Green are away. With as skilled a medical team as we now have, it is a shame for us all to lose sight of the goal which is to meet the needs of the people. Case after case, which we can show you, can demonstrate to us the very professional medical care which is being given. But with this kind of response to services offerred freely, willingly, and caringly, death would look nice compared to this.

Tim Stoen's Threats

Tim Stoen gets more and more irrational. He said to a friend of his who told us what he said, "I have plenty of powerful friends and money and I will take care of Jim Jones" (this is the implication that mercenaries will carry this goal out). Tim Stoen wants to first try to get at our money through law suits. It has been verified that they will also try to use mercenaries. Tim Stoen is continually discovered in his lies and in his heinous plans. He and Grace Stoen claimed that they had reconciled and wanted John Stoen, but we have a photo we can show you of Grace and her boyfriend Smitty coming out of their home to go to work together.

Please, Dr. Reid, give serious consideration to our request for proper means of defense for the border of Guyana and in case of a mercenary attack. Thank you for reading this letter.

Guyanans approve constitution change

GEORGETOWN, Guyana (UPI) — The government announced Thursday that Prime Minister Forbes Burnham's proposal to change the constitution had won the approval of 98 percent of the voters in a referendum election.

National Assembly Speaker Sase Narine, giving the official results of Monday's referendum, said 397,577 out of 406,544 voters endorsed the measure to expand socialism in the country.

Both the Marxist People's Progressive Party and the Conservative New Force Party boycotted the referendum, charging it was a pretext for Burnham to postpone elections and to perpetuate himself in power.

The "yes" vote allows parliament to become a constituent assembly and draft a new constitution.

Elections, originally scheduled for October, will be postponed until the new document is drafted, probably within 18 months.

Opposition leaders have charged Iraud and duplication in the balloting, but Home Affairs Minister Vibert Mingo said the allegations were "ridiculous."

The government said that public hearings will be held and a wide range of groups consulted before a new constitution is drafted.

As you very well know, Peoples Temple has experienced press smears from racist rags in the United States, and we so well identify with your words that Guyana will undergo bad press as long as it is working to improve the lot of the people. We have also been the victim of a campaign to mail to officials and church leaders materials that imply that Peoples Temple is denyiny people their human rights, another experience which socialist Guyana knows well.

We know you are not affected by such propaganda and that gives us great confidence in you. However, we feel it would be a great mistake for the local press to succumb to nay attempts to print such lies about us which are designed to destroy a socialist movement.

The story of Jonestown itself is more than exciting and we think it should be covered objectively without even mentioning the lies which put in the reader's mind doubts about such a group as ours. Some say it is good to print the lies and then refute them, but we have found in our experience that some people tend to dignify anything they see in print regardless of the refutations, and why put it in their mind to begin with when it is not true.

It is obnoxious to say the least to us who are peacefully growing cassava and providing medical care of over 300 people a week, and attempting to live socialistically with full participation in the PNC and national goals, that we have to even answer, on these shores, the same lies which made life in the U.S. most destructive to the cooperative life of our members.

If in some way the newspapers could be told this, we would be eternally appreciative and will be able to put our full energies into making you proud of us.

Dear Prime Minister Burnham;

We in Peoples Temple are anxious to help in any way we can in the surrounding region and we are reaching out to people there everyday with medical assistance. We have a young twelve yearold Amerindian boy who was brought to us with glaucoma. He had an injury to his eye and glaucoma developed. We sent him at our expense to Georgetown where he stayed at our headquarters. The opthamologist said that he would have to have a cornea transplant and it couldn't be done in Guyana. Most of the time we have been able to take care of people that come to us for help but this would be too expensive.

We are asking the United States to help but they are very slow and rarely help in situations like this. We asked the GDR Embassy but they said we should write a letter and they couldn't promise anything, but this too would be a very slow proceedure. We want to help this young boy and this is the right time for the surgery to be done.

We feel like we are Guyanese nationals and try to live in every way to demonstrate this. We are just desperate on this situation. You really begin to wonder who is a socialist and who isn't when it comes to something like a young boy's future.

Our boat is now being used to make the regular run from Port Kaituma to Mabaruma because the Daemon is not functioning at this time. This is done every week at a great expense to us because we pay for all the expenses and we have been doing this for several weeks.

If any help can be given to this young Amerindian boy, we would be very grateful.

Dear Prime Minister Burnham: We feel the following matters are of grave importance turgence to both Gayana and AT.:

STOEN CUSTODY CASE AND THE HEALTH OF JIM JOKES

Because John Victor's custody case is still unresolved, the situation for Jim Jones is very difficult in terms of his health. The conflicts of opinions we find wherever we turn is draining his health and he is too tired and ill because of all the harassment he has endured for so many years. He has had to strategize every day thus far successfully, since the media found out that we were moving to Guyana. But now he cannot even go to a kidney specialist for a vitally need operation or participate in a conference that he was asked to attend by Lt. Governor Yervyn Dymally. How long he's going to last due to his medical condition, we do not know.

STOEN CASE: DIFFICULTY GETTING CLEAR ANSWERS AND ASSURANCES

We have difficulty getting assurances from some people although others have given us assurances.x There seems to be some disagreement amongst mofficials. We don't mean to cause difficulty for anyone so we are not mentioning names. Initially there were assurances that we don't forget. Recently, the words of assurance from someone who visited, about our general future was very helpful. This visit helped the alienation and estrangement we were feeling with all the backlog of confusion.

VISIT OF FRANK TUMBERIA AND JOIN BLACKER RD: STOEM CASE

We understand the problem of discussing this case but what is confusing is that we hear from other sources information that makes us wonder. The US Charge d'Affaires Mr John Riecken said to Jin Jones on his recent visit to Jonestown with Mr. Frank Tumminia of the Control Desk of the State Department that Jim Jones didn't have to stay here in Jonestown and that he should have more freedom of mobility to meet people and to build the movement. Jim Jones explained that he could not do so because of the -arrest order. John Blacken said, "They are not going to enforce that arrest order." XimxXxxxxxxx We said, "Well and arrest order is an arrest order; the law is the law." If. Blacken appeared to be very sympathetic and thought what we were doing was very good. However, it was very puzzling that he would state what he did with such assurance. Apparently someone has beenxxxiking telling him something and it wasn't us. He stated absolutely that there was not partiality on Guyana's part and that the American Embassy is sure about this. We would want to know what the actual situation is.

Both John Blacken and Brank Tumminia were very positive about their visit to Jonestown and word even got back to us later from others that they had talked to that they had a positive experience and thought a great deal about the buffet lunch and the programs that they observed. They said that the program for our seniors was most caring as senior citizens weren't put on a shelf but could be actively involved if they wanted to be.

A CONTRADICETORY EXPERIENCE WITH AN AMBASSADOR
Along with the other dissettling experiences we have been having with x certain persons, we get had some messages related to us through an Ambassador that were not the least bit helpful. Our attorney told us that he got a message from the Prime Minister relayed to him through the . Ambassador that Peoples Temple is not to mention to people that the Prime Minister is on their side in the SToen Case. When we got another message relayed

But there are others we have met outside of the very high levels of government of Guyana who have behaved just as despicably. We understand the necessity of an emerging country having to utilize bourgeoisie skilled technocrats. But why in hell's half acre can't a community of 1000 people who have no indulgences or excesses by their own voluntary committment to Guyana be guaranteed the safety that none of their residents will be moved?

And we still do not understand why such a man as the above becomes the one who is chosen to convey a message officially to Peoples Temple because this man has stated many contradictory and sometimes upsetting things. He said at one time that Jim Jones would definitely be the loser in this case, and at other times he has shown more understanding of the situation with John Victor that ix it is not a negotiable situation if you have conscience. It is very disconcerting to be put in the position of having to depend on his word.

We have kept what he says confidential because he does react in odd ways. He is crazy and threatens violence. It would even be wise that you check him even before he enters any of the offices because he is demented and often carries a gun.

COMMUNICATION IS VITALLY NECESSARY

What we ask at this point where communication is desperately needed to resolve the contradictions is that if someone will just talk to Jim Jones.

(yourself or Dr. Reid) and given him some of the strategies for future events, projections of problems and general goals for the resolution of the Stoen case, it would be most helpful.xnuxnexxxx We know you can't talk to just anybody on these subjects xnutherbakekkers but the problem is that others we have talked to have just been in a position mostly to listen. Minister Mingo has been for instance very very helpful star and we vastly appreciate the time he has xnnn spent with us. But if Jim Jones could have a one-time consultation directly with you or Dr. Reid, that would be it. Due to a faulty arrest order he is virtually a prisoner by Jonestown; he does not complain but he cannot communicate directly to others in Georgetown, and communication on such a serious matter as the future of over 1,000 people who wish only to serve in Guyana is essential.

This is in radio lingo called QSL's and radio buffs are very anxious to communicate with Guyana because they want to add this to the areas that they have talked to in other parts of the world. But many people are sincerely interested as well in Guyana and we have tsikkthakxkykhakzkikak given them a generalized picture of the beauty, the friendliness of the people, the loveliness of the land and the government without asking for anything. Later when we corresponded with them, we made up for any charges that have come from the US by suggesting in an indirect way how they could be helpful to Guyana. Jim Jones' mind is worrying anywayx anyhow and rather than get into a stew xhakkhakkahakakal thinking af about thiggs in the United States he has to do and about his son, he'd rather keep going 20 hours a day. Thus, he stays up most of the night communicating all over the US despite his poor health.

The work still has not been done and now the company is insulting us just as the mechanic said kenthey would do. The mechanic said it was their error. The mechanic goes around to all the areas dealing with that type of problem. We did not want to make an issue out of this but it is pathetic because we are struggling to obtain funds and then we are put through all of this expense. We had a 90 day warranty and they are saying now it doesn't apply. . .

The company was notified but never came to check it formally. We were told reliably if we wanted to avoid more trouble In Guyana we'd have to pay them. We can go on with story after story telling of what we have been through.

We have not been able to get things that we have needed and have been grossly insulted by customs. Things that we have needed the have been taken out after we have been told to pay duty on them, and then they kare disappear and can't be found. Furthermore, we have been told that certain personal items would have been let in duty free if they had been packed individually but since we came as a collective with many people's things packed collectively, we are quoted an old English law that says collective things items are not duty free. In other words a socialist country is tencouraging capitalists to come and not socialists that live the life of socialists. To add insult to injury, we who are the only group that I know of that will lay down their lives to the last man and woman for Guyana, and wyet we are put through non-sensical xxx trials for no purpose. BLEACH

We recently purchased bleach for our laundry, and the cleaning of our medical clinic and for our wonderful nursery. All the bleach was watered down when it emmerchement came to us.

ENSWIPMING POOLS

Now this situation is cleared up but we are telling you this to show you that our word seems to mean nothing to some. We were accused taxk of bringing in 75 swimming Dough Boy swimming pools though we explained that we had no need for 75 swimming pools, but needed these for storage of water. We are trying to produce well in agriculture and cannot afford complicated irrigation. At present we have to use bucket brigades because we have certain dry periods in that region. We were not believed at first when we explained that and had to appeal to persons to explain this on our behalf to the appropriate department. This kind of effort that has to be made on simple issues is a drain of our energies and our time that could be m more effectively utilized in helping the country rather than having to argue for needed supplies.

MEDICAL CARE AND DISEASED ANIMALS

We buy expensive medication to help the community outside of Jonestown and we were cheated, given instead a cheap medication of no value and not even for the same generic purpose. We have bought diseased pigs and horses in the past few days but why go on. You have lived with this problem and we can handle it too wif we have your support.

We have to maintain the highest medical standards because of the reactionary press breathing down our necks. Thus we have to have our own doctor and competenst medical staff. Our doctor has been competenst with everything he's tackled; we have plenty of Guyanese neighbors to prove that. He's been 100% effective, no failures yet. He has done complex eye surgery tumor removal; he has even repaired severed tendons of people in the community. These conflicts we have tukgetkentkebt had to get our doctor licensed are killing Jim Jones. He can understand and deal with conflicts when they are in takxix the interests of the country, but he cannot understand why people are cutting off their nose to spite their face, why deam deny Guyanese citizens medical care that has saved lives, it will only make Guyanese hostile telsheirlgovaramentsingidenjingxthemlearer when they knew care is available. The pressure is too graeatw when all Jim Jones wants to do is provide help to the community, a good life for his people. All he lives is a simple life, you can come and see he lives just like his people do, and yet we cannot get what we need despite this. In fact everything we have needed we've been hassled about, and that's what makes us wonder if we are being told something in this, are we wanted here or what ???? Common sense would tell you that you have to have a doctor, you need a community that can neet all of the basic needs. At least in the short haul one needs certain things in order to work productivityly. If you are asked to deny these basic needs, you are being asked not to survive.

OUR SCHOOL

Another situation which caused us would difficulty was occurred when Frank Turminia and John Blacken were visiting and it related to our school. The Mistrict Minister came and in front of these two guests confronted Peoples Temple for not integrating their school with the local school. It was a rediculous faux paux to do this in this fashion. We had to go into the whole subject of conspiracy in front of our guests which we hadn't wanted to do but they needed the background to understand why w our children need time to make adjustments. Also, some of our children have had traumatic problems in the ghettoms of the United States and have endured painful separations from their parents at an early age. They have problems which take specialized care. We had to explain about guardianship cases also and how certain families put their children inm a particular person's care and wekekaktkkendatk legally we can't send them off to school out of the care of the person that the parent entrusted them to. xXexexet Also, our students are on a work-study program and the high school students work in he the mornings and study in the afternoons, often doing research work right out in the fields on soil enrichment etc. We cannot develop a community without manpower ax so this would be a hardship on our development to remove the high school students. Blacken and Tumminia both seemed to understand when we explained about the guardianship # approval and the problems of dealing with youth. They understood that we would know better how to deal with gaetto youth in our school atk this time. We again don't understand this as we were given assurances that our school was approved and that our principal would be paid even (which we didn't even request) and authorized by the government.

Our relationship with the District Minister Fritz Carmichael has been for the most part very cordial. He's even asked us to do things to help the District. He said we were the "goose that laid the golden egg" in terms of boosting up the Dsitrict. We try to live up to this. A Later in the day after the unfortunate incident with the guests, he made no further mention of the im problem of the school. We hope this wasn't done merely to embarrass us. However, despitite this incident, we heard later from others outside our community that both Blacken and Tumminia were very impressed. They felt that our program for seniors keeps the seniors off

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the shelf and gave ther purpose. They like the buffet of foods grown and nurtured from our own soil and the display of items that we make both for practical use and entertainment such as children's toys. They got a chance to see some of our entertainment we we are told is as good as a kithigiality! Hollywood show except that it deals with socialist prinicipals.

PLAIS FOR PRODUCTIVITY FOR THE NATION We are too tengrossed in productivity to be involved in diversions from our work. We are not interested in just producing for ourselves; we want to share in the productivity of the nation. We cleared a field our neighbors of cassava that hadn't been cleared for three years.

We test the most to find the best kind of soil chemistry and now are putting nutrients back into the soil rather than take from the soil. We are making our own soap. We are working with experimental crops. We are trying to neet the goals of the government for their cassava mill though this will actually slow us down as their are other crops like peanuts and all types of citrus which would be more profitable to us. I'm not a farmer, but I see the great strides we're making.mmi "e weant to work with the government in width areas which are nost useful for to Guyana.

Now we hear that there is a need for plantein that could be experted to make flour and cereal. That's what is wanted so we will do our hest to get into this areas. The are planning everything based on need.

To and below useful because of the need to bring in invigrants to develop in certain fields especially in anticulture. Guyana, needs residents especially in the area there we are because it is disputed territory and it is unlikely that "Enezuela would dispute with or kill someone of American descent. "e are a progressive element in an underdeveloped region and x are the key to development of the Z region. In a recent talk made by 2 yourself in our district you stated that yourkex peoplexes are unvilling to move into that region and prefer to stay in Georgetorm. "e were also told that that others in the area see us as bringing up notivation because people in that district feel if we can do it they can too. Efficient agriculture is a key to production in Guyana and we are using research and all our energies to be as efficient and innovative in this field as we can, and we wish to share our information and help to spread this type of development if this would be helpful. Jim Jones' managerial skills have been noted to be useful, not only to our production, but to be a model for other areas as well. He has no motivation or interest to a use his skills for his personal aggrandizement, only to serve Guyana. Jin Jones leadership, in terms of how to develop a community and keep a large group of people productive with absolutely no crime rate, could be put to use for ixx other communitales.. Also, the fact that there is no racism or semism could be studied for use of Guyana in general. Finally, xthekinfluenceknt therebeather Jonestown has gotten rid of the influence of religion and the hereafter, though many people of our group were at one time very wanth religious. Jim Jones has enabled people to see principle as the strongest reason for living and he has emancipated them from dogmas and religious fantasies. He has done this by education and by his compassionate example not by pressure. We have been told by others who represent other socialist countries that even they have problems in this area.

All we ask is that we be allowed to exist and produce for Guyama. The are not asking to be "the government" or an alternative government. The RR-2-KKK-9

And then to have it come back to us that "we wish those Yankees would have stayed in America," This is a desperate cry from our soul. Please guarantee the survival of the comm-nity by providing the few necessities that we have asked for. We guarantee to put into the economy more than anyone if you will give us freedom from harassment and total acceptance that we, a tired people, need to have to continue living.

MEETING HELD WITH THE PEOPLE'S TEMPLE

On Monday October 17, 1977 Conrade Hinister of State, Region 1 and his Regional Development Officer met representatives of the People's Tomple Agricultural Project. Representatives of that Organisation were -

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss relations between the People's Tempis and the rest of the Sub-Region.

Conrada Minister alluded to the original understanding between the Regional Administration and the People's Temple underlying the latter's cettlement in the Keituma area. That understanding was that the Sattlement would be integrated with the rest of the Keituma community. Their way be integrated with the rest of the Keituma community. Their way be at Jonestown and import their knowledge of local agricultural practices. Later the People's Temple had dispensed with those persons' services. Now there was no member of the Keituma community employed with the People's Temple. He considered that this was not in kemping with the spirit of integration. It was his wish that the not it was proposed that the People's Temple accept groups of Guyanese, about twenty (20) at a time, to work with the Jonestown community and participate in farming and other activities. The Guyanese would, in this way, be learning the industry, organisation and discipline of the Temple's community which had shown considerable progress. Since members of the community were not paid for their work the Guyanese would not be expected to be paid.

The representatives of the People's Temple said they would have to take this proposal back for consideration of the members as a whole. In the meantime they offered the Kaituma community the services of their medical personnel on one (1) day a week in the Fort eros. Their "Water Daviner" was also available to the community to identify the location of ground water as they had done at "possitions.

Comrade Minister then referred to the schooling of children of the Settlement. It was desirable, he said, that the aducation of these shildren be integrated with that provided by the State. The Community School at Keituma provided education from Mursery to Secondary levels. He had observed that there were hundreds of children at Jonestown. These children should be sent to the Keituma school. There was accommodation for about two hundred (200) children at the Secondary level and others at other levels.

He was aware that the Temple was conducting it's own school.

Kowaver, education and the establishment and conduct of schools in Guyans ware governed by Guyans legislation and it was necessary that there be compliance with the relevant legislation. He was not aware that the school at the People's Temple Project was in compliance with the law.

The representatives of the People's Temple explained that the shildren at the Sattlement had a background of persecution, and had been generally disadvantaged, in their hative communities. They had come recently into a new and congeniel situation at Jonestonm. It would be traumatic to so soon remove them to enother strange school environment and easy from the people they know and had chee to trust. In addition there would be the problem of transport between Port Kaitums and the Project.

They were infermed that transportation of children at the Secondary level would be four times par term, at the beginning and shd of term and at mid-term when they were allowed to so home on holiday for a weak-end.

The Temple as this as yet enother difficulty, since the children were required to perticipate in an engoing programme of orientation. Living sway all term would interfere with this.

They were informed that consideration might be given to concessions as follows -

- in the beginning some children less likely to suffer from the change might be selected to attend the Kaitums school;
- they might be purmitted to go home at wook-ends during the early period; and
- iii) members of the Temple might visit them at pro-arranged periods during the term:

Again the representatives of the Paople's Temple wished to discuss those proposals with other members. In the meantime they were offering the services of persons knowledgeable in exts and exofts to teach part—time at the school.

Dinner with Chief Justice Bollers (14/10/78) Jimmie Jr, Maria K, Sharon A, Tim C, Anita

-we started by chatting for a few moments about nothing much and then I started talking to him about the Stoen case/ Tim C. was fixing drinks and the others weren't yet up -I XMINIMEM gave some of the background of the case about TOS being a homosexual and a minimed and in being pressured by some criminal forces because he said and was overheard that he was afraid etc. He listened to the background and to all the mention of the big wigs who have come to JT and recognize the conspiracy etc etc (some of this we had mentioned at his house * a couple of days ago also) -he said again about there being no problem about JJ coming to town because the registrar had made a committment not to serve the mpapers and they couldn't be activated except by him (this was discussed more fruitfully at the end of the evening and I'll go into that later)

-all the material in the attached notes were covered during some time in the evening but he didn't say much in the beginning except that there is no problem with JJ coming to town

Meeting with Registrar Barnewell 18/10/78 (Jimmy Jr & Sharon Amos)

--basically he did not feel that there was any problem with JJ coming to town because he said the case is "adjourned sine die" which means it is not before the court (so he's saying it's not likely JJ would be arrested) - of eourse I didn't accept this - in other words my arguements were all based on the fact that JJ couldn't take a chance of coming to town and being arrested and being asked to produce the child because he never would turn the child over to reactionaries and he would rather spend his last days and die with his people than to end up separated from them in jail -he kept trying to assureme me that he would never activate the case as he has the orders in his desk and he showed the file to me but I kept saying things like what if you are out of town etc. -I asked him how the thing could be activated anyway if it is not a correct order in the first place, he said the order may not be correct but it was issued lawfulty by a judge so to prove it is incorrect it must be proven incorrect -but he said it hasn't been issued at all so in order to challenge it you'd have to carry it out and prove it incorrect -he said that he is the head marshall and he thus is the Chief Executive officer of the Court - he executes the orders of the court and the marshalls are under his supervision -if he were out of town, it is the Chief justice who determines what is done (he showed me this in a legal book) #66 The % Chief Justice may determine the distribution of business - but he said in this case the "may" is like a "shall" and he shall determine the course of business -he said he as the registrat would have to authorize anywone to execute the orders -he said it's like a dedd file as it's not before a judge - so the order is suspended - as there is no judge on it -he said you have to apply to cancel the order - to have it set aside - he said this should have been done the order shouldhave been set aside (our attorney should have done this) -he said whe knows our attorney Luckhoo made some attement to withdraw the whole proceeding (but no decision was given by the judge at all) -Barnwell didn't understand the action of Judge Bishop/ he said it's redicalous to say you got calls and so you're not going to decide a case (I told him that it wasn't us and how this is a strategy being used against us as kit was done on several occasions in situations to aggrevate people like the DA) -he said that he wouldn't have let this influence him in that if you do, then people who don't like a judge will call him and then the judge won't sit on the case and the person could do this until they got a judge they liked -he said that when this case istarts again - it could start all over fresh. and Grace would be the one to initiate this, to ask it start all over again fe fresh (which they might do as the proceedings were subject to some question from the beginning) - if they do that this is called "Denovo" - to start all over fresh and then if you do so, the whole prior proceedings are no longer in action -he said the judge can make an order but cannot serve it - the Registrar must serve it -I said "what if he orders you to serve it" -he said that if he is ordered to serve it that is called a Writ of Mand Mandamus and then the Registrar must serve it or he'd be in contempt of court -however the matter must come before the same judge -(the particular arrest order) because if it comes before a different juge, he might say, I have no knowledge of kxix this, I will start all over and then it was would be "application denovo" -in regard to arresting him, he said there is no court to bring him to, the case is not assigned. The arrest order must have relation to existing bodies and since there is no judge on the case and no court working on this at present (OVER)

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then they can't arrest him (they'd have to assign it to a judge first who then could activate the case — who then wouldhave to make a writ of mandamus to have Barnewell activate the order)

-I said that we had to have it in writing becauseof what happened when Dr. Reid, the PM and Mingowere mout of the country when the order was written and illegally served in the first place/ I explained that we couldn't take a chance that JJ would leave the country and if those were out of the country, someone in customs mor immigration might stop him from returning because Tim Stoen was proven to be with the CIA and he might use powerful contacts to try to stop it.

-Sharon and Mike basically gave him the background of the whole conspiracy, and showed him articles of Jim with Mrs. Carter, the letter about Stoen being transvestite, pamplet that explains about the conspiracy...-Rachlee didn't make any comments until the end when Mike asked him what he thought.

-Ke wild he made it known how he felt when he was in Jonestown, he appreciated the background given, it was very compact -we also told him we were accuse of not letting parents or relitives vist their children, but told of those doing so now and Rev. add Mrs. Moore who will be comming soon.

May 26 Meeting with Mingo: Mingo said Barker said we were not under investigation following the zkxxxx incident in which our people were taken in and interrogated He wanted to get further details so he put a call in to 9km Skip Roberts. To show you how organized and effective the government is -- our people (Debbie and Terri) met with Roberts before Mingo heard from him. This is Saturday morning and I'm still not sure that Mix he has talked with Mingo yet. At any rate, Roberts confirmed that there was no investigation. But he said to Debbie and Terri that our people would have been detained (in jail I presume) had he not intervened. When they told him about ax our people being taken in he said "Rightfully so," because of their sleuthing around. He said we should tell him when we have a problem like this because Paula always did. He was busy and said they could come back Tuesday to look at our file. Roberts also said Mingo was emmbarrassed over the situation with Kathy Hunter. I'm sure this was true because he even looked embarassed when we met with him Friday morning. He said he presumed that his instructions to get her out would be followed through. I told him he should have followed through and he would not have a bigger headache as it turned out. He was in no position to be defensive. He told us that he realized we had been let down. When we brought out everything she was doing and showed him pictures of Stoen's demonstration and a letter I had began to write to him about Debbie Blakey's situation he said, "You've got a lot of forces against you. I now see why you are more nervous." I told him that even though we didn't expect the conspiracy to become so intensive, it could have been thwarted had quick action been taken in certain situations (e.g., TOS & Hunter). I said they would keep coming as long as they feel they can get any kind of co-operation. He apologized mixer several times for the harassment of his police. He said he does not have apolice mentality but he reslizes that their methods are not the best. I asked him for the names of the police officer who said he didn't understand why Wm Hunter couldn't go into the interior to the project. He hinted that it was Barker. Mingo said there are high officials who don't understand the conspiracy and so they won't take the appropriate actions because they don't see it as affecting Guyana. He also gave us the name of the guy in parliament that befriended Kathy. His name is Ratsom or Rensem and Mingo doesn't like him (though he is PNC). Kathy did go to parliament at this guy's invitation according to Mingo. I told him that was another HERX warning of ours that went unheeded. I said she wanted to get. something she could use against Guyana. He nodded.

One thing I didn't realize is that the ministers of government have no One thing I didn't realize is that the ministers of government have no any power to hire and fire anyone under them except their personal secretaries. Naturally it this causes problems with follow through when someone doesn't naturally it this causes problems with follow through when someone doesn't agree with orders. Mingo said that is why a new constitution is needed.

He gaid kexfeit Reid is still with us. But he said we could expect additional pressures as ax result of being supportive of the PNC. The pressures would come as part of the effort in against the referendum which is gaining kiera strong support. (e.g., most doctors and lawyers in the country are lining up to oppose the referendum). I told him we were ready for it but we just wanted to get the lay of the land and not get caught in a k vacuum; we wanted to stand for principle and would be with him and Dr. Reid no matter what happened (this was said later in the day to him as per instructions).

He didn't think we are a condition of the IMF loan and he reiterated that Burnham is opposed to it because he doesn't want to devalue and he feels their are so many restrictions that it would be like a return to colonialism.

He also repeated that Bunny Mann used to feed Burnham inside info. when Mann was with the PPP. Thus he enjoys ix a protective status because of the debt Burnham owes him. He doesn't know if Mann has anything over Burnham.

-the Ministry of Finance still hasn't sent a letter to him stating why they turned us down and Clarke says until they do he can't appeal the matter

-Mr. Moore used to be the lawyer for the Commission of Income Tax with Min. of Finance and he has been persistent in trying to get it

-Debbie suggested we could go over there and ask for the letter to be written while we are there but he said if Moore can't get it he didn't see how we'd be more successful

-regarding transfering our house/ we have to bring in the prex papers of the house and it takes 5-6 weeks to transfer/ it has to be advertized for 13 days in the Gazette stating the transfer from PT to PT Association (the lease on the Jonestown property to transfer would have to go thru Parliament but he didn't think that could be attached anyway as a lease isn't attachable) - if you want I'll ask him again about this

-regarding the NIS representative that Patty had trouble with I asked him if he had set up the appt with the man's boss/ he said the man had told him that when Roberts f returns he'll set up the appt but Clarek would call him gainxxx again about it

-Clarke had told us last time that the man had claimed to his boss that we wouldn't cooperate with him and that he didn't get any questions answered and that we should ge just tell him we get no salaries/ he said we the man had claimed we didn't even answer that question

-Im checked with Paula on that and she told me that she and Lee and Patty had repeatedly told the man this and I told that to Eric and he said that makes it different as the man im said otherwise

regarding Hoyte, he will try to set up an appt with Hoyte the first chance he has/ it's not appopriate just now because Hoyte is setting up the constituent assembly/ he said wait till the end of the month

-regarding the license for the haberdasherie he said if we come in one of the boys in his office will take us over there to get the license (tho Joan Purstey said the store already has a license as Patty got one) (I don't think that was communicated to us as we were told to look into a license)

-we invited Erics to come to Jonestown/ he has been having pains and has been seeing a doctor but no diagnosis yet, he is worried about it/ I told him our doctor could examine him / he said he might just come up. asked if Debbie and I could be his nurses. We told him we have a very good nurse practitioner and others nurses/ he said he might prefer to have Debbie and M me (sounds like his dad)

TILLS: 23/3/78 this was the day text that he was so mad at me especially because I hadn't returned is article that I borrowed in the morning as he said I promised to return it/ Debbie and I both thought he just said to return it tomorrow -when we got up to him,he gave 'Tim his hand and said he was very vexed at me. We said "you mean just because we didn't get this article back to you." He said "Well you know I'm here with nothing to do and you stopped my research" -we said we were sorry about that but what else was he mad at. He was furious. He said I'm sharon, I've told her not to do a certain things and she does them anyway/now sha's ruined everything. -we binxudxkinx asked him what it was that I ruined and he said that I had sent letters to the judge and even to the judges wife. I said I had done no such thing and Debbie and Tim backed kma up on this. He said "Oh, I thought you had dones so." We said, "No why would we do that, we would know that would upset the judge and besides that's what Tim did when the hearing was, he called the judge from his kakai hotel and we were told about that by our attorney. -Wills said well if it wasn't you, who was it, that's what I'm worried about. -We sind we were worried about the same thing. whe said that he thought it was we that messed things up because the last time Debbie and I came over his house we talked to him about John Clark and it was John Clark that the judge said was lobbying him and the judge was irritated about this -we said we had nothing to do with John Clark lobbying the judge -after awhile he calmed down, but we had to come on strong -he said of me "someone slong the way has ruined this beautiful woman" which was highly theatrical and not the least accurate in exither the first or the last part -Tim told Wills it was not fair for him to attack me the way he did and we all told Wills that he used a divide and conquer tactic with us, trying to ... play up to Tim and knock me down. Tim said that he definitely felt this was so and didn't appreciate it -we asked if this would change the decisionx/ he said no, in fact the judge came over to see him at his club, and wanted him to warite the decision for him and said he was going to write it by Wednesday. the said he was going to talk to Bishop tomorrow and would know more about it -he said after all that that he was sorry, that he had overreacted and blamed me, and it was because he loved me and was worried about the case (not loved me romantically but as if he was altruistically concerned) -he said, of course, if he did the decision it would be in favor of JJ -he said we should call John and tell him to lay off and tell Luckho we didn't write the inter-Wills 24/3/78 letters -after he wax phone Bishop and Bishop said "Forget the conversation" (the conversation mentioned in the prior report where he asked Wills to do kx the decision -Wills said that Bishop is going thru a "trauma" and wouldn't say what had changed the situation -he said it's ironic, before Wills couldn't get to see Bishop/ Bishop was .unavailable, and then Bishop comes to see him and raises all these issues about J.T. WClarke and the letters to the judge and asks him to write the decision -when Bishop first asked Wills to write the wreport, I asked him what did he say. He said, "I'll think about it." I asked if that could have caused Bishop to back out because he thought Wills wasn't really going to go along with it. Wills said he didn't think so, but had said that because he first wanted to find out about the letters to the judge and John Clarke -he said it has to be a new fact that's bothering Bishop. IT would not change the scenario funless he had new facts or a new fact. We asked what he thought it might be and he thought about it but said he didnt know -he said Bishop was "frozen stiff", he said "I'll have to go tomorrow and see him." He said he would use Stanley Moore, a right Winger who would tell Wills when Bishop is home. Stanley works with Rex McCabe in the broadcasting field (he does analysis and commentary on GBS) -he got a car thru Stanley and Stanley got the car thru Gordon Thompson. Moore was willing to go with Wills to drop around and see Bishop/ both ax wer students of Wills (QVer)

---When asked Wills said he doesn't know Mar Moore's views of PT/ but Bunny Mann and Rex McCabe are good friends (Moore works with Rex McCabe) -when we talked about the Judges conversation where he said "forget the conversation" we asked if Wills asked if he coult talk to the judge in more detail. He said he said," "If you can't speak on t-e phone, let's meet" - Wills thinks the key is J.T. Clarke but he said this isn't logical - it's just his instinct, but when asked if he thinks J.T. sent the literature, he said he can't prove that, but it's possible -the judge said he was approached and lobbied by J.T. Clarke/ since the Judge was told to write the defision in a certain way, he had could salve his conscience if someone else wrote it and he merely sent it. If Burnham ordered him to write it that it wouldn't actually be nice to have someone else to write it for him (it shows he didn't want to write it) -MAXE I wondered if Wills actually was the one that was backing out of the situation and asked if it would be any problem for him to write it. -I saw a book on a table (something about inner philosophy - Unity type thing and asked her about it/ this pleased her as she is quite involved in Unity the she is a Presbyterian, she really relates to "inner spirit" and pioneering in that inner growth way (I find in PR if you can find an area that people really relate to they are more likely to be interested in

-said any payments theat would normally go to teachers should go to the Party.

-Said our strongest case was the psychological climitazation our m kids have to go through. He said a persons body can adjust to the temperature change, but psychologically and cultural-y it is not that easy.

-He said we should get across first and foremost m that we want our children to be Guyanese

and socialists. ..

-When we asked him about the Hoyte/Green competition he said that Burnham thrives on thier rivalry. He said he considers (he being Burnham) neither one of them to be socialists. and

actually has no preference between he two. -he said he had been offered three different court cases to work on, every one of them in the thousands of dollars, and he refused a-1 three. He mad said he didnt want to get into that right now. (I thinkk he still has illusions he wihl be placed back in the maxixx government soon.)

He first started off by telling us that he had good news, that the orders had come down for us to integrate our school system into the Guyana school system. He said the report was that we had a good system. I asked if that meant our system "intact" and he said yes, intact.

-in regards to a Jennifer Small (Radio Antilles), Pat Small (her mom) and family: there dad's name is Leon Small who is an alcholic. He has three times lost government jobs and three times gotten them back. He said it now looks as if he has kicked the habit, and he now lives on West Coast Berbice. (He prefaced his remarks by saying that "we're now into security areas. OK")

-he said the family is matriarchal (obviously). He said the mothers is a very strong woman who will do anything for her family, legally or illegally. She has prostituted to get ahead and has sold her daughters all over town to do text the same.

-Inthe process he said she destroyed her daughter Marilyn (who is by far the quiesest and most passive of the sisters, almost mousy) by prostituting her.

-Wills said he helped family several years ago by putting up money to help them get a boutique started, and he was paid back in full in stocks.

-He said they are continually on the fringe of the diplomatic corps, and they make sure they are invited to all the parties.

-he said the mther has used their daughters" "to advance horizonatally through diplomatic society"

-Jeniifer met Ron Sanders. formerly known as Roy Singh, who was former manager of GBS, along with Shirley Field-Ridley. Jennifer went with him for a m long time (this is when she had her radio show on GBS) but moved to Canada when he married Shridith Ramphall's daughter (Ramphall is former foreign minister and represents the Caribbean community - I don't know his exact title km but he moved up)/

-While m in Canada Jennifer was caught shoulifting and aked Wills for help. She wanted to staythere. (Shes living here now so I guess that shows he failed there, but apparantly she didnt spend any time in jail.)

-Ron Sanders is now with Radio Anitlles, and this is Jennifer's connection there. He guesses that he gave her a job. (We have found subsequently that she is not the official rep in Guyana for Radio Anti-les.)

-He said they will use us to daxxdax advance themselves. He said that she has been a former party leader (PNC chapter head on the East coast somewhere) and they are very down with Jagan m but it is more for themselves than out of loyalty. He said they could go make either way.

-He said that we could manipulate her either way - to work for us. or against us. -He said that Goerge Luna, Prensa Latina rep and Jennifer's old boyfriend, is working with Cuban intelligence.

-He said that we are now a going thing in town and they will try to use us for themselves. By going thing he said that people are talking about us, and we are well enough known that people are taking sides eithe for x or against.

-He said Radio Antilles is very embarassing to Guyana, and it has lied, conned, and emaggerate in their reports about Guyana.

-He said they will go to Jonestown (Jennifer and family) and say they love everybody and integrate themselves and be very nice and then come m back and figure out kwa how they can best use us. He said km there politics are PNC and they say socialist, but they will go wherever - they are m opportunists.

-He said the mother has tried to se-1 Jennifer to Burnham, Reid, Hoyte, himself, all the government ministers (I think he may have taken her up on it and thats why he was a little cautious when he asked us what we knew about them.)

-He said the question was wether we could get meaningful propaganda from Jennifer or not, and he said he doubted if we could at this time. He said that it was possible that she would do a nice story about the Temple. He said that she is in with Blackmon at Chronicle because she fucks him.

-He said she will use Antilles as a lever of what she could do here. If they dont want her to do a story she will say she will go to Antilles, which will look bad for R GBS and the Chronicle.

-I asked him if he thought there was any way we could discourage them. He said she likes to name drop. -he said they leak information to the Venezuelans (they're good friends with the ambassador), the Soviets, and the Cubans. He said this is why they are considered a security matter. -Getting back to the school situation he said that Teekah wnated to hang tough with us but he can't, because he can't carry the opinion of the officials upstairs or downstairs. He said that now 'he's going to have to figure out how to tell Hoyte that the PM said to integrate the school system." (He would not tell us who gave the orders at first, and this was a half-hour after he said that. I don't think he realizes he slipped and let -He said Teekah is in love with his power as a minister. Said if he saw a little boy in the middle of the street and told him to get out of the street, and the little boy didn't do it, he would be the kind to calls the cops on him. -He said we should be expecting PPP attention in the near future, they probably will be attacking us. H -He said we've already gotten attention from the United Force (right-wing third party) and Fielden Singh (who is supposed to be one of the ones monitoring our radio.), and now its the PPP turn, because its election year, or at least a referendum, an appeal to the people. -He said the PPP is asking for a unified government, but rea-ly are trying to get some power. He said they dedide what to do with PT based on both options. -He said on the argument of national unity they have an asset the PNC dees not have, and that is Janet Jagan. He said she is white, American, Jews , socialist, who was criticized for years that her brand of socialism was not relevant. Now, because we are here in Guyana, she will say that if you have accepted PT then you have to accept me also. He said that she is the politician in the PPP. He said Cheddi Jagan was an idealist, and she is the politician. He said that she is in the Ehtel and Julius Rosenberg family, on the Rosenberg side. -he said as long as they are pushing national unity, we are safe from attack, becausews we are strong factors in national unity. But if they move to a PPP vs. PNC approach, then it will be dangerous. -He said when that happens they will attack us as being American stooges, plants, CIA, etc. Try to turn public opinion against us. -He said that right now is the PPP period of stressing national unit, and we must not conduct ourselves in any way that the PPP could interpret to be remotely embarassing to the -He said that he thought it would be hard for the PPP to carry out a really successful attack on us because of our strong support from the AmerIndians. He mentioned Patty and Rheaveann, and the good job they were doing. He said the AmerIndian vote is traditionally sympathetic to g the black vote.

V - 35 - 3 -He said he would talk to Dr. Reid about the problems we were having (in regards to the "hands-off" press thing). He said that he knew of no such policy, and had heard of nothing of the sort. (What bothered me about this is why he would offer to talk to Dr. Reid for us when in the past he has been reluctant to do that even when we have asked. The problems we presented were not nearly as serious as some of the others we have talked to him about, so why is he saying this now? I wondered if he knows

He said he also knew the Cuban ambassador well. -he said he would come to our open house. He also said he would like to talk to us out of his office in an informal setting. -we asked him for dinner and he said he worked late and then went home and cooked for himself - stressing his independence I thought. He said openly that he had some feelings against Americans because "Americans took my wife away from me." His candor was kind of refreshing, after playing so much diplomatic bullshit games with people like Wills and gang. -he said he thought was Sharon was a very well-rounded person, he told me that I thought too were much, like a politician. In Guyana it would be more difficult because you would have to "prove Publications", by proving that someone read the article in the paper and it was slanderous. Because there are so fewer people in Guyana, the damages wouldnt be nearly as great, as they are measured according to the number of people that have read the slanderous information. He said in Engladn our damages would be much greater. He said his firm here would work in conjunction with people there, and all depositions would have to be filed with him here in Guyana. If it came to trial then we would have to maked send one of our people to England. Even if we did take it to court in Guyana and wond the judgement, there would be a problem getting the judgement recorded m in England and then collecting from the paper. He said in Guyana you have a year to sue, in England he wasn't sure but felt it was 6-9 mos. If someone did have to fly to England for the suit they could not recover travel money as part of the suit. He said it would be mak much easier to get a settlement in England also because the papers dont like to go to court. Thye will fight to the very end, until it gets to the point of going to the judge, and then will settle out of court. The papers dont like the publicity and bad PR involved. He said Amin's former foreign minister won damages from every paper in England when they printed stories that she had had sex in the airport. --he will be in London for 10 days starting next week. We can speak to his secretary about any developments and has she can notify him. -- He said we have bean incorporated into the laws of Guyana. He said it was done in the best possible way because it was passed by Parliament. He said Chaikin had come to him earlier about changing the name from Peoples Temple of Disciples of Christ to jsut plain Peoples Temple. Also Chaikin wanted to make the Peoples Temple here a separate entity a completely (from stateside??) He said he drew up the papers but has not gotten them back yet. -- In the case of Brindlye Benn he said that we could sue, but we would never we get any MUHRXX money wat of him, because he has none. He said if we wanted we could vindicate our character in court, and get an injunction against him to ever print anything about us again. He said this sort of thing is done. (My opinion: I think we could get a cour injunction but while the procedures are going on Benn would probably attack us every week, just adding fuel to the rumors already going around town.) -He said he read the Dymally article and he saw nothing ix init at all to call for the reaction of Hoyte. He said he doesnt see why he worked up the ire that he did, and though Hoytes letter was "uncalled for." -He said one reason Hoyte may have been upset was because he didnt get the opportunity to meet with Dymally (I wonder if he even knows to this date if Dymally didnt come.) --He said that Kennard said that we were the best cooperative development Guyana has ever had. He said this last september or october. -- He said in regards to the Hoyte article he wondered if it was the entire cabinet atting because it came a day after a cabinet session. He said that bothered him and he wondered if cabinet was changing position towards us. -he said he would try to arrange an appointment for us with Hoyte and try to find out his feelings towards us. He said last time he asked Hoyte to meet with our people he

-He said the replacemens for him and Blacken were: Douglas Bllis to replace McCoy, and Richard Dwyer to replace Blacken. Ellis is supposed to have a good reputation and is coming from Luxembourg. Dwyer was hand picked by Burke, and has been working int he state deptartment. (Note: Wills has always told us that the #2 k man in American embassys is usually CIA. He said MC Coy was the exception here. However, when McCoy leaves, it most likely will be Dwyer again. When you consider that Burke's last assingment before he came here was Thailand - he was ambassador when they had the right wing coup with US support - I wonder what this new combination will-be like.) -He mentioned there was a man named Malcolm Jensen who is with USAID, who has been here for a couple of months, who is a HAM operator and who has talked to our people before. -He said in the rumors he had heard whenever he traced them back he never found one coming from an American.

-He said when he is asked about us he tells people what we are doing here. He says he tells people that no allegations have been proven against us, that we are decent, lawabiding citizens who are trying to help develop Guyana. He tells peple that none of the charges againsts us have any substantiation.

-he said that Chief Justice Bollers was very, very praiseworthy. He said that "he filled my ears with praises" about the Temple, talked about the slide show he had seen and party he had been to. McCoy said we should keep that kind of thing up.

--he talked about Stoen, and how about ex-members of any organization are very strong in their opinions. He gave an example of people being converted from one religion

to another how zealous they usually ware with their new religion. ---When we told him that Stoen had suggested radical activities he said "What does a

church have to do with radical activities? Why would be suggest something like that?" His implication was that we must have been political in the first place for him to suggest that, but we just told him that we didn't know why he did that, we wondered ourselves.

-he told a story of how he had seen a young american kid spit on the flag in israel, and then got thrown int jail fordrugs. the kid at called McCoy for help, and McCoy said he felt like telling the kid where to get off, but he couldnt. -he said he was only going to Wash DC for two weeks, he wouldnt be leaving Guyana

until August. Blacken will be leaving next week.

- at first the mother wasnt home, jsut Jennifer, Andrea (youngest at 15), and Marilyn. -when asked what she did for Antilles she said everything, that she did documentaries, she was a disc jockey, she did whatever.

-she used to have her own radio program on GBS, something about women. ishe said she wanted to do a documentary on us, andwrite in the Chronicle. . She said whe was going to ask Carl Blackmon to give her the Comment column for a week to anser the rumors that have been circulating about the Temple. When I asked if she thus thought she could get the column for a week she said sure.

-- I remember her taking notes when she asked me about my background (I made no mention of drugs at all), when she asked what we a wanted to do here, and thats all I remember. At the end of the night she had a very x few notes, at the m most a half of a steno page full. Some of the other questions she asked included: Are people free to leave if they want to? How did we get the moeny to do this, how do we support ourselves?

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JENNIFER SHALL (ccontd)

--- she wanted to know if anybody could visit Jonestown, if we had a man with a gum posted at the gate, what the racial balance of our group was (they thought we were primarly white)

--- she criticized our radiox show, saying that she thought we could fit more into it,

and she didnt like the informal format.

-the rumors that they had heard that Jim Jones named the town after himself. that we had come and gottenxxxxx what was due the Guyanese people (thye said this was the general feeling among the people), thatme we are out for ourselves and dont want to integrate into society, that we dont let people visit Jonestown, that we had to flee the United States.

-they said that they had heard on the radio a former official in the government say something about "who are the se people in Peoples Temple? who knows about them? who are they to drive around town with a foregn license plate - what would happen

if we went to American and drove around with our plates.?

-- they suggested that we give to other charities besides the Uncle Eddy home. the mom siad that the Uncle Eddy home gets all the donations, that the Bellfield Home for Delinguent girls never got any, nor did the Mahaica Hospital for Lepers, or the Chisre Home for Retarded Cyildren. She said that they should get some donatins also -everybody was always giving to Uncle Eddys. She is a social worker at Bellfield Home.

-- the mom is incredibly agressive -she literally makes Sharon look passive in comparison. I detected a look of resentment on Jennifers face when the mom came in, like she was upset she was doing all the talking. The mom won out, and dominated the conversation for the entire night.

-- the mom claimed to be so close to Fred Wills that he was almostlike a relative, and also that she knew the Prime Minister and Vila Burnham. She showed us some pictures of herself with the Prime Minister.

-she used to be the chapter head of a PNC group

-she was very, very strong in her support for Burnham, you could almost say she was

literally raving about him.

-she said that Guyana had to learn how to develop its own resources, and that she loved her country . She said it was a developing country and it would be hard now, but would get better if people would work and produce what they have. She gave an example of how when English white potatoes were coming into the country, the people cooked eddoes and cassava. Now that the potatoes arent coming in, they are complaining about not having them, and not cooking them cassava and eddoes.

-thye told jokes former over an hour, mostly riddles, some dirty jokes. -- We did express absolute support for the Prime Minister in our conversation and told how active we were in the party.

-Jennifer methioned early in the night at that George Luna (prensamlating rep) was her

old boyfriend.

-the mother made the racist remark that East Indians were able to pick up on things better than africans. She said that africans just "sort of let life go by."

phone conversation with Dr. Baird 9/3/78

-wanted to know if the Public Health Inspector had come back in to Jonestown yet. I told him I didnt know and would get back to him.

--- was a little upset with Sharon, said she got too excited.

-- In regards to Larry: the normal period fo training is one year, with the intern s ob & gyn, surgery, and medicine. He said he knew that Larry's training would have

-but he wasn't satisifed to see that part of the country so one day he wand
wandered around tho they didn't want him to do that - he saw hovels where
babies had a disease in their eyes and flies were eating off their eyes and
sometimes their mothers wouldn't even have the strength to brush the flies
away. Swarms of flies would come - he said "you've heard of Belson (concentration
camp) well this was the closest I've seen to that" - and he said he's never been
able to forget that, and it is that that makes him believe in socialism
-in London he used to read books on Marx and ENgels but he said in England it's
just like the Gtates, you have to feel a little buit scared reading literature

of the sort

-he's a funny man, mixed in some ways as he seems to have some degree of enlightenment on some issues but is very primitive in certain notions (he is somewhat light skinned and has been able to just barely pass in certain places which he said was "fortunate" so racially he is not enlightened at all on religion he said that he was brought up very religious/ he's got seven in his family/ they used to spend the whole day Sunday in prayer, very religious family, they'd pray with an aunt and they'd go to service and study the bible he said however when khe got older he started to question religion and tho theye are still somek things he believes in, there are a lot of things he can't accept

-I mentioned "servants obey your masters" and how that was put in by making James to manipulate and oppress his subjects and he agreed/ but I spoke of PT as trying to be christians in the pure sense of service and living communally as he had said that was one thing that made sense about the bible -he said he tries to help others, works in PNC and doesn't just do the administrative things, goes door to door etc as he feels he can't ask people to do things he won't do (I mentioend JJ being the same way)

**MEXT-he was talking about Guyanese people having no motivation and he thinks about this a lot trying to figure it out - he sayshe'd like to do social work (I told him about my job in the US andin PT) but he wouldn't want this to be full time as he likes to work with scientific things too (predictable things he said as humans are unpredictable)

-he was talking about how far Guyana needs to go, I said well USSR was in very primatave state af first too, he said well that's different, we're going about it in a non-ximm violent gradual way. I said yes, I knew and that's good but I was just meaning the early stages being primative as they even lived in cayes at first

caves at IIISU -he said then refulectively, You know sometimes I think it would be better (over)

the other way (like in USSRQ) - he came back to this again later. (But the gradual revolution is very much the slogan of the PNC and he went out a little to even hint it could be the only way to go)

-later on in the conversation, I mentioned that showing of American films was the one thing I thought was a mistake as it gave people a desire for consumer goods and it made them want them the short cut way, not by working and developing the country

-he said he knows this is a problem. He said they experimented with this a lot, at first showed films from Cuba and educational films but people didn't have a taste for them/ they wanted filsms of action. So they even tried showing a double bill of one good one and bad one, but the people have a taste for certain things and in a gradual situation they worry if they don't give the people what they want as if they are dissatisfied they want to leave. I said "well it seems it is a catch 22 situation, as the films make them want to leave too and they line up in quew quiesx long linesx to leave and I mentioned the film Sweet dEcember I took my kids to (something like that tho the timbel may be wrong) it had some good points but it was with Sidney Pointier and showed a black doctor who was working with the State Dept to help people and he goes to England and there he meets a daughter of an AFrican Ambassador, a beautiful black woman. They have a sad romance as she ix has cycle cell and doesn't want to marry him as she knows she will die etc, but the background is that he has white friends in England he's staying with/ he is well fixed monetarily and has a country home xxxxxx he can take her to which is quite lovely

and she is very well fixed monitarily

-he said again, that sometimes he thinks itx would be better if things weren't
done gradually/ he said that this transitional stage is dangerous

-he was in the States he said and he was visiting his brother in Chicago/
his brother is a very successful doctor. HIs siter-in-law is light skinned
but is very prejudiced to whites (especially hostile to red necks) however
she mostly hands around light skinned blacks soshe has her own caste system
but she was made because Herbie went to an exclusive club that will not
allow blacks. They eyed him over there and started questioning him about
where he was from. He said when they found out he wasn't from US, they
left him alone, but then a group of honky military men came in and eyed
him over and were getting real hostile. They questioned him and he said
he was from London, originally from Guyana and that he was in the Royal
Air Forcein England/ and that satisfied them and they became real buddy with
him talking about the service and getting real friendly and wanted to see
him again/ his sister-in-law was very mad and said he shouldn't see them again

which he didn't but he wanted to because he liked them
-but he said in England people would use expressions about blacks not realizing
or forgetting that he was black, and then they'd start to explain and if they
seemed to sincerely mean what they said and it was just an expression he wouldn't
hold it against them altho sometimes it would hurt him

-his wife was white, English
 -he said women are unpredictable and then went on to say that's why they are interesting and he went into some detail about the mysteries of women
 -he said he didn't feel like dancing too much (I was relieved about that)

-ixxxked said he's traveled all eround the world/ I asked if he had been to any socialist countries/ said he'd been to Checkoslyvakia, East Germany, but unfortunately, he said, he hadn't been to China

-we talked about Viola, km I said she was very brilliant, he said "yes, she's quite clevar" - he said she was the one in the family who always knew what she wanted todo while Herbie didn't. She never argued, he can't remember her ever arguing/ if she had something to say, she wouldjust say it and then not argue. but he said he tends to quarrel more. 4 of his siblings are in Guyana and 3 are out of the country.

-he used to go see Viola and the PM every month, to play with the children and be in contact with the family but who felt people thought he kan went because of the connection so he doesn't go around all that much now

-however 2 years ago, the Newsweek article came out about PT and ihe took (OVER)

Herbie Harper pg 2 Sharon Amos it right to the PM's residence and he said "what are these people doing mm in our country" -the PM said "you really ought to go out there and see for yourself. Don't pay any attention to that kind of stuff" - he said apologetically, Herbie did, It really shows how gullible a person can be. He came to our cultural program and was quite impressed with the whole thing, with Marcie's speech and everything and it made him want to know more about PT. -he wants to visit PT and said that if we have films at our house he'd like to be invited/ I told him we preview films so they aren't always good as we preview them and send the good ones out but if he'd like to take his EXEMPE chances that would be fine, we'd be delighted to hve him -I think he's kind of lonely but he's not desperate or anything/ is minterested in some sense of peace or that kind of happiness (still searching I think for something that doesn't exist but has had a few illusions topped) -he asked if I was happy. I said I was very fulfilled with my life in PT but that I think life is bitter sweet and I was sure if you asked MLK if he was happy he wouldn't exactly said yes but he was doing what he wanted to do. I said that I had at one time in my life searched forhappiness and I not only was miserable but also felt that my life was meaningless, but since I have been in PT, I have never felt either miserable or that my life was meaningless and that I felt communal life was personally fulfilling as well as fulfilling in terms of what it can accomplish for others -I told him however that the world seems so full of pain that if you start to be aware of it xearkermex, it's a pretty heavy thing. I toldhim of your early committment and work with for civil rights and how you worked with MLK and some of the things you went thru, and the work with political prisioners (I didn't mention names like Angela but in general) with Chilean refugees and described some of them we met etc. I told how I was came to PT with a child, sort of beat down and a product of a very unhappy marriage and how you gave me a job and helped me and others in PT helped too and how we all take on each others sorrows and joys so no-one ever is abandoned -told him how you are a great motivator of people - you make people feel involved in decision making/ he was worried about what would happen if you kkin go" and I told him how you try to develop leadershitp in people/don't allow people to be yes men and women and bring out people's talents -he wondered how we deal with people who are in anti-social patterns/ I told him about peer pressure (not violent ever but thru a common agreement about & certain & standards of behavior axlike not allowing any xxxviolence - parent to child, or parent to parent etc) and that if you whave agreement about that and all respond with disapproval - it's a strong social force. I told him you don't find that in some places because in the States people will cheer if someone steals something and of course somepeople do that because they know you're often seealing from a big monopoly corporation, but if you can have a consistent standard and in a community like ours, if you steal you know you're stealing from each other. He seemed very interested. Told him about the positive incentives and how you have made it your business personally to praise people and point out their strengths so that people are motivated to bring out the constructive aspects in themselves. Also, that we give treats for good behavior, good work, and

character w shown in daily life.
-I told him in the States about the program we had/ free legal advice, free kitchen etc/ how this program went back when you started it 30 years ago etc.

-he seemed to be interested in everything

-likes to philosophize too/ he seems to be at the age/ (not just chronological age but emotional age) when he wants to think his life is meaningful, that he wasn't here for nothing - and he likes to find meaning in things

-MR I finally kind of ended the conversation as I didn't want it to be too drawn out/ it seemed like I talked to him at least 2 hours/ once we invited Robert Williams to join us as Robert Williams and Robert Corbin both were dancing upstairs where we were talking but Robert was kind of high

-lot of the people at this thing were poluted drunk or pretty high
-lierbie askedif we had a ride home and w seemed to really want to drive us/ I told
him that would g be good as he could see where we live and come by/ he said on the
way home, he has seen the house, he patrols the neighborhood as there are voluntary
(over)

patrols. They were having some many theives etc. and since he's been patrolling they have stopped crime about 50% because it is known in the area when they see his car patrolling that someone is watching the said he kwew of the person kmw who lived there before us the had forgotten who it was but knew of him - I said it was some British somebody

-he wondered if our rules ex were in twriting/ I toldhim that if you have some basic standards over the years tike like JJ has put in practice you really don't have to put them in writing - and that our rules come out of group deliveration and everybody gets a chance to discuss them and deliberate
