

Dear Sir;

We hereby make application in the name of our church organization to purchase and carry a pistol for the protection of our personnel.

As you know, we are a religious organization engaged in the pursuit of agriculture in Port Kaituma in the North West Region established since December 1973 by Pastor Jim Jones. It is necessary, however, for us to have a Georgetown based office for administrative and accounting purposes. In connection with the administration of the project which is being executed with the approval and under the general aegis of the Ministry of Agriculture, we have to make fortnightly payments to a staff of approximately sixty-nine at Port Kaituma which means we must draw large sums of cash from the Guyana National Co-operative Bank to transport to our location in the North West Region. In addition to this, we must keep cash in our Georgetown office to effect domestic expenditures which run into several thousand dollars. Indeed, since we have been established here, our premises, including our boat, have been burglarized several times, and one of our personnel was attacked and robbed.

We have thus been advised to apply for firearms licence and I feel sure that you will handle this application with your customary dispatch. The permit we would wish granted in the name of our organization as hereunder noted, but the actual firearms will be carried solely by our accountant Mr. Paula Adams whose duties include withdrawal, banking and general safeguarding of our funds.

Dear Commissioner Barker:

The People's Temple Project would like permission to import and licence a .357 magnum revolver to one of our members, Timothy Jones.

Due to a number of recent incidents at the farm in the North West Region we feel it necessary to secure our supplies warehouse and to maintain an on-duty guard for the protection of our children who have been threatened with kidnapping. The kidnapping threats are not mere heresay but were witnessed first-hand and because of the possibility of this occurring undetected until after the fact, runs a high risk.

Timothy Jones, whom we wish to become our security person, has been employed as a security guard in the U.S. and has proven to be of fine character and demonstrates controlled reactions to crises. We therefore feel that he would be well suited to the urgently needed appointment.

The Peoples Temple Agricultural Project has always been a peace loving group but because of the organized conspiracy and the lengths gone to harass, we feel a protection weapon of this calibre to be an urgent necessity.

Our appreciation to the fine leadership of Guyana can never be stated enough, and—always sharing good relations with police authorities—we hope you will consider this request expeditiously. Our regard for you and your department has always been with great respect. Thank you.

We hereby make application in the name of our church organization to purchase and carry a pistol for the protection of our personnel.

As you know, we are a religious organization engaged in the pursuit of agriculture in Port Kaituma in the North West Region established since December 1975 by Pastor Jir Jones. It is necessary, however, for us to have a Georgetown based office for administrative and accounting purposes. In connection with the administration of the project which is being executed with the approval and under the general aegis of the Ministry of Agriculture, we have to make fortnightly payments to a staff of approximately sixty-nine at Port Kaituma which means we must draw large sums of cash from the Guyana National Cooperative Bank to transport to our location in the North West Region. In addition to this, we must keep cash in our Georgetown office to effect domestic expenditures which run into several thousand dollars. Indeed, since we have been established here, our premises, including our boat, have been burglarized several times, and one of our personnel was attacked and robbed.

We have thus been advised to apply for firearm licenses and I feel sure that you will handle this application with your customary dispatch. The permit we would wish granted in the name of our organization as hereunder noted, but the actual firearm will be carried solely by our accountant Mr. Paula Adams whose duties include withdrawal, banking and general safeguarding of our funds.

At that time we did bring Mazor's name into it and I think he felt that it might compromise us somehow. We might just say that we feel the need of some security because of past history. Harriet doesn't like the idea either.... she says we can just be vague about what we have done about it, but I think that is just another type of not being "straight" and if we are going ~~to~~ to put him on we had better cover our bases.

I AM ATTACHING TO THIS MEMO DETAILED PLANS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE CEMENT BASE FOR THE TWO STEAM ENGINE ALTERNATORS. WE NEED TO DRAW OUR OWN PLANS FOR THE SLAB FLOOR FOR THE ENTIRE GENERATOR BUILDING WHICH WOULD HOUSE, PRESUMABLY, THE BOILER, TWO ENGINES AND ALTERNATORS WITH PANELS, AND ONE 100 KVA DIESEL STANDBY GENERATOR WITH PANEL AND FUEL TANK. IN ADDITION, WE NEED SKETCHES OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE REFRACTORY WHICH SHOULD COME FROM ENGLAND.

WE FEEL THAT THE CONSTRUCTION COULD BE CARRIED OUT AS FOLLOWS. FIRST, WE SHOULD CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE AND DELIVERY OF THE CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS NEEDED FOR THE PROJECT. THESE WOULD INCLUDE SAND, GRAVEL, CEMENT, BRICKS, CONSTRUCTION STEEL. WE WOULD IMPORT A BOAT FULL, WHICH WOULD LIKELY INCLUDE AT LEAST 150 TONS OF SAND AND 150 TONS OF GRAVEL. AT PORT KAITUMA, IT COULD BE UNLOADED EITHER WITH OUR CRANE AND A BUCKET, OR, PREFERABLY BY THE GOVERNMENT CRANE INTO RAILROAD CARS AND DUMPED AT THE THREE MILE POINT.

WE SHOULD CONTRACT THE BUILDING OF THE FOUNDATIONS, SLAB AND REFRACTORY TO A BUILDERS CO-OP IN GEORGETOWN EXPERIENCED WITH CEMENT CONSTRUCTION WORK. THERE ARE SEVERAL BUILDERS CO-OPS IN GEORGETOWN WHICH MIGHT QUALIFY AND WHICH WOULD HAVE ALL OF THE REQUIRED EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE. THEY WOULD PROVIDE THE LABOR, EQUIPMENT AND SKILLS, AND COULD ALSO BUILD THE BRICK REFRACTORY AND SMOKESTACK FOR THE BOILER. THERE IS A GOOD BIT OF SOPHISTICATED CEMENT CONSTRUCTION WORK IN GEORGETOWN AND I AM SURE THAT PEOPLE COULD BE FOUND WITH THE REQUISITE SKILLS.

THE ENGLISHMEN WHO COME OVER WILL SUPERVISE THE PLACEMENT OF THE EQUIPMENT ON THE FOUNDATIONS, HOOK IT UP, PUT IT THROUGH A TRIAL OPERATIONAL PERIOD, AND TRAIN OUR PEOPLE IN MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR. THEY WILL GUARANTEE THAT IT IS OPERATIVE THERE. THIS IS


I am also willing to give my time to setting up security at Jonestown, but you people will have to pay for the equipment and get the necessary permissions for guns, mace, etc and I think that is a fair deal. I estimate a five man security force fully equiped will cost approximately \$1,500.00, give or take \$300.00 which depends on where the weapons are purchased and how they are shipped. I estimate the training at 7 to 8 days and I am willing to donate that time for such a cause. I do feel that you should consider the security of Jonestown as a prime activity. If you can purchase weapons in Guyana and get whatever permission you need, it might save time. You will also need permission for Mace (tear gas) which is effect but not harmful.

If you decide to do the above, I would like to be able to do the training during the last part of October. Please give me sufficient notice.

Gene, as I told you all when I was there, I am not sure of many issues and there are a lot of unanswered questions, but I am impressed with what you are doing and as long as you are straight with me, I will back you 100%, even though I do not like your politics, I like you as human beings and will go to bat for you in clearing up the problems. I will even donate my time to you from here on out, but not expenses because I cannot afford to, not that I don't want to. Secretarys and investigators on staff cost money.

As of today, I have Jim's vest and will get it to San Francisco this week for shipment. Make sure he wears it immediately for a day or two so that he gets use to it. By the way, it is a gift.


