Meeting with the Mr. McCoy from the US embassy, on ^{P-1-A-1-a} ~~2/11/77~~ Sept. 1977-----

Laura Johnston

Issue- McCoy wanted to meet with me 'because my "mom" had written to the US Ambassador to Guyana and asked what was going on with me, and would they check on my health, general wellbeing.

McCoy's statements:

If there was an unofficial inquiry about someone with PT in Guyana, He'd call the Georgetown office to confirm that they live here.

If there was an official inquiry from the Washington office, then he'll have to visit the person himself.

He recommended in his report to Washington that he visit every 6 months, since so many US citizens are there, and plans for his next trip in February, '78.

He said that he was very impressed with the hard work that has been done there, but that it isn't the life for him. He said that it was too isolated-- he couldn't jump in a car and move around if there, and on the other hand, ~~there was tee--~~ he couldn't do his own thing there. He said that he is comfortable, and didn't like privations, tho he has been through some, like the marines for 4 years, and the Korean war, and he has chosen Guyana because he can work as a free agent here, in his own office and doing things his way-- not like some of the big embassies which have alot of supervision. He said that the US almost broke relations with Guyana last October, and he was the charge'de Affairs, and at that time was tied to his desk. His predecessor had had some problem, and he had been training 2 other staff, and he hadn't been able to visit when he would have liked to.

He said that the custody problems and the inquiry problems would continue, because for a group getting started in Guyana, not in the well-known parts of the world, parents got alarmed over not having more information. He said that Jim may or may not lose over the custody of John Stoen.

From McCoy to JIM---- McCoy told Washington that he had visited, and that he was impressed with Jonestown. He wrote them that everyone was free to come and go. People were happy, healthy and that even in his short visit, he saw that no one was fearful, and there were no armed guards. He wrote that much work had been done in 3 years, and that altho he couldn't know everything in just 2 1/2 hrs., none were there involuntarily. Everything was in the open. He wrote that everyone was free to come and go, as with Broussard, who went to Port Kaituma, to Matthews Ridge, and then into Georgetown, and is now awaiting travel arrangements home(In other words, he didn't know that Leon had left already.) He said that he couldn't state categorically that no one was beaten, but his own observations show that he couldn't categorically say that they were. THIS WAS HIS REPORT

He said that in with his regular visits every 6 mos. he'd take care of registering babies (must be done with in the first 5 years of age), of seeing personally those getting social security-- requirement that they be seen yearly; and he'll notify us ahead of time when he plans to visit so we can organize that part. Also, we must notify him of any deaths.

He has 7000 applications for visas to US, out of a country of 63000-10% he pointed out.

He said that he asked Carolyn Looman if she wanted to go, ^{P. 1, A-1-G} when they were in private, and he had his vehicle right there, and she said no. He said that he included this in a report.

He said that the Embassy could be helpful to us if we had a medical emergency and needed GDF to get someone out, or if someone had an emergency in the US that they had to go back for, or if someone had to go to Trinidad for a medical problem, etc. He said that the Embassy didn't just look into people's lives, that it would be helpful.

He said that Jim was very, very upset about the custody contacts, and the inquiries, and said that McCoy's own feelings were that he wouldn't investigate custody unless officially asked because he felt that if we were able to get passports for the children, that obviously the parents had participated in that.

He said that if a lawyer, or a private investigator asked him to extradite someone on a charge, or for investigation, he would not, only if an "official court" sent him word would he turn the matter into the Guyanese officials for returning a person to the US.

A man from the US has called him, and talked to him since he's returned from J/tn. When McCoy told him that he'd been impressed, the man didn't want to hear that. He said that the man had given him a list of names, he couldn't place the letter right then, but he wasn't too worried about it, of children that were problems with custody. He said that he'd told the man his honest opinion.

McCoy said that he didn't like J/tn for himself because he didn't like cooperative living for himself. //X//

He mentioned Joyce several times- not by her name, but as the medical practitioner. He mentioned in the context of the help the embassy could be-- that he'd noticed a lot of seniors there, and also a lot of children.

- (in ref. to the unrest in Guyana now) Sharon asked him if he thought Cheddi's membership was growing?
- He said he didn't think it was any less or growing, said Cheddi didn't have charisma
- He said he wouldn't follow Cheddi to the toilet
- He said Guyanese won't fight

- he said that at the State Dept they had asked about the decision and McCoy's Ambassador had said that we can't speculate on that as the case is in court and the attorneys are reputable
- he said the Judge Bishop is a hard nosed reputable judge so there is no problem
- he said they had just asked because if the case goes on and on they want to know how to answer
- Elizabeth Foxers will be leaving to go to Arabia in May and James Henke will replace her (McCoy doesn't know James Henke)
- McCoy had told the State Dept about Jonestown and how no-one was held against their will and no people were happy, etc, he said he had done so in great detail and we would be getting his first report (thru the freedom of info)
- I asked about the 2nd report and he said you have to apply again under the freedom of info act for each report
- he said he went so far as to tell the State Dept (and he said we should quote him on this) that he didn't feel there was any use of anyone saying someone was held against their will and the US embassy checking on it as an. more of this checking, and PT could charge them with harassment as he took countless people aside and talked to them
- x-he said what he has gone thru with us is not unusual (in terms of people being worried about their children), he said he went thru the same thing in Israel when the war was on and American parents were worried they'd get hurt, and in K. turke, and Jamaica/ young people travel and don't notify their parents for months - in fact he said he went thru "triple" what I went thru with you
- he said that they have to check somewhat because there was a TV documentary called "Passport to the unknown" which showed that the govt was not active in looking for people

AMERICAN INVOLVEMENT

- he said it was only justified when it's discrimination simply because someone is an American
- or it's a criminal case and there is physical brutality
- he said there has been a problem in certain countries (not Guyana) where there is the Napoleonic law (where someone is guilty until proven innocent) and the guy sits in jail for 1 or 2 years (its no trial like France, Bolivia and Ecuador) - drug smugglers are often the ones charged but he felt they still should have a right to a trial

- when questioned by the State Dept he would say "I'm not in a position to say what we'd do in this decision", /the State Dept wants to know what will happen too

- interest didn't mean they were pro or con but they inquired
- Hyakawa wouldn't touch it, he said it's a case for the courts to deal with (we should write him our thanks for his objectivity, and I'm sure this is impressive to McCoy because Hyakawa he thinks was admirable for taking on the school system (said he had guts) when it was out of hand
- Batfield expressed an interest as did McCloskey
- Lugar from Indiana expressed interest
- but most of those Congressmen who wrote (actually their staff aide responded) not the congressmen themselves
- Clarke from Iowa, Church from Idaho (Senator), Cranston, Kent De. law, ... the Congressman from Oregon (I don't know the name), possibly Vice President Mondale but he isn't sure about that

-he said that even if the Amer. govt interceded on the part of ~~xxxx~~ us, no-one could prove political intervention (I thought this was suspect tho I thought he said intervened on Stoen's part - and I don't think they would intervene on our part anyway), but I objected to this stating we'd know if they intervened on Stoen's part because we have people who are progressive who would tell us (he said you couldn't prove it either way)

-we said in the outside waiting room what we were to say about the fact that it seemed they were trying (Amer. Embassy) but we didn't think they had enough administrative power (or whatever the word is) to do that for me, but we'd probably have to do anyway/ Mike and Debbie forgot the instruction and when I sat down after our appt to get my stuff together and saw that, he said "can't we discuss this in the car" but Marcie picked up on it (he didn't leave us alone in his office so we couldn't say it there, and will probably have to do it again)

Abandonment Is there a good case as McCoy said

-nothing can be done till the judge makes his decision on the basis of procedure/ all Grace has to do is say she wants her child back and it isn't considered abandonment ~~xx~~ (tho this doesn't mean Grace has a good case), but if abandonment was asserted, JJ would have to come in and make the case

-Luckho still thinks we have an excellent case but still asserts that he doesn't think we will win before this judge but will win in appeals

-re Guyana not going to the wall over the child and it said in the JJ or Joyce wouldn't be arrested/ he said McCoy hasn't a clue about the case, said we shouldn't go to a million people and we have an attorney (Luckho), we said McCoy had volunteered this info

-he said that McCoy should then convey to the court this view

-he said Chief Justice Bollers was very impressed with our case and that Bollers sympathies are with us

-he said we (Luckho said) we shouldn't lobby, this month he feels we will get a decision

-I asked if the judge had written the letters we had -toens wrote to the judge and he said no

-Luckho hasn't talked to the PW about visiting Jonestown

- Stoen claims the court order (Calif) is not being observed but McCoy told him that Calif. law is not even observed in Nevada or in another State and he pointed this out to Hawes who demanded that McCoy go in and take the child out
- he almost came to blows with Hawes and told him, "I'm not your employee, I'm not your agent"
- Hawes threatened McCoy and said he'd bring Congressmen in, McCoy said, "you can bring in the whole House of Representatives if you want to"
- some countries will make an agreement called "letters rogatory" to honor the laws from another country as binding, but that usually relates to criminal activity (like terrorism)
- re the precedent of other countries not giving custody to someone in the US if the child lives in this country
- he said Israel never gave xx custody back because it meant another Israeli soldier, he didn't want to be quoted on this but it was only Hungary that gave the child back
- McCoy is going to replace Frank Tumina
- Tumina sent a file to McCoy with our letters in it (Laura Johnston) etc
- after his Washington job, he'll go to Yugoslavia or Poland

YUGOSLAVIA

- he said it was a beautiful country, people are real nice "I never met a real communist there" (he feels the system of self-management in Yugoslavia is close to capitalism even tho the people there call themselves socialists)
- some people live in big apts and drive Mercedes and have boats and there is a wealthy class and a poor class and ~~xxxxxxx~~ there is unemployment (but the Yugoslavians claim the people are lazy) and their welfare system
- 16% unemployment
- there is private ownership of housing/ they allow for free expression
- McCoy is very impressed with the Yugoslavians/ however he did say the police was oppressive
- and if you say anything against Tito you can be arrested for 2 yrs, Tito's wife is on house arrest for meddling with some group
- he said the US has a lot of joint investments in Yugoslavia, has 3 nuclear reactors there
- Dow Chemical has a joint venture with US, 600 million
- in Yugoslavia there is even a US Chamber of Commerce
- US gives military aid to Yugoslavia and thanks of it as very important to our Eastern European policy as they are mavericks and are non-aligned

Bollers (Supreme Ct Judge) told McCoy that what's best for the child will be the decision

- however if you want to prove abandonment it's up to Joyce Bouquette because since she was awarded custody, she is the primary defendant and will one day have to appear in court to testify about the abandonment

re Guyana going to the wall on this case

- we can't see where any country would be involved in a foreign policy dispute (where none of their own people were involved)
- I asked if this could be a "foreign policy dispute" and he said he doesn't think it would be a foreign policy dispute if we don't pressure and the ~~maxi~~ pressure all comes from their side (Stoen's letter), but I'm not sure about this
- he said that he and his ambassador have repeated and re-acted to people that ~~they~~ it is American citizens on both sides
- only if it were a blatant denial of rights would there be a problem

Dear Ms. Murphy:

On behalf of Secretary Vance, I want to thank you for your communication concerning the custody case of John Victor Stoen, which is currently in the courts in Guyana.

All the parties to this case are American citizens. The parents of the child are on one side and the People's Temple, a California religious organization that also operates in Guyana, on the other.

Our Ambassador and his staff in Guyana have taken an interest in the case, but have emphasized that the interest of the United States is confined to assuring that the matter is fairly and impartially adjudicated in the courts strictly on its merits and without outside interference from any quarter. Consistent with this position, the Embassy has avoided taking any sides in what is essentially a civil dispute between two groups of Americans. Nor has any pressure been brought by the Embassy on the Government of Guyana or its courts, which have yet to rule on the matter, in favor of one side or the other.

The inquiries made by the American Embassy on behalf of the child's parents were normal protective services that any American citizen abroad could expect to receive from his government. The inquiries were not attempts to interfere in the internal affairs of Guyana and, indeed, have not been interpreted as such.

While we in the Department of State sympathize very much with Mr. and Mrs. Stoen in their efforts to regain custody of their son, regrettably there is little we can do to be of assistance. Neither the Department of State nor the courts of the State of California have the authority to enforce a U.S. court decision concerning the custody of John Victor as long as he is physically located outside of the United States. Child custody orders issued in the United States are normally not accepted for enforcement in another country on the basis of comity. While any American custody decision might be given evidentiary weight in the Guyanese proceeding, by no means will it be binding on that court.

Since the initiation of the custody suit in Georgetown, the Department of State and our Embassy in Guyana have been in close contact with the Stoens and their attorneys, both American and Guyanese. The Embassy has attended all court proceedings, when permitted to attend, and has assisted the Stoens in gaining access to Guyanese Government officials. The Embassy has regularly had conversations with the opposing attorneys and has spoken with Mr. Jim Jones, the head of the People's Temple. As Mr. Jones is also an American citizen and entitled to the same rights and protection as Mr. and Mrs. Stoen, the Embassy has been careful to avoid prejudicing the outcome of the dispute. It is the Embassy's responsibility to seek to ensure that the judicial outcome of the dispute results from a fair and impartial determination of the merits of the case, and all of our efforts are so directed.

Your representative, Mr. McCoy, came to check on me thru the interference of one of my relatives. I am 34, and am very happy on our Peoples Temple Agricultural Project and told him so. During Mr. McCoy's visit myself and others on the project were told that the American Embassy took a neutral position on custody issues, and we later found out that the assistant to Mr. McCoy was directly supportive an attorney and taking sides in a specific custody case. I question this kind of involvement by the Embassy and I would like to see that the Embassy does keep a neutral course regarding custody matters. I feel it's inappropriate for such an agency to behave in this way and hope it will be corrected.

I was glad we talked the other night by phone patch because I hoped it would relieve some of your concern for me. I hope you can understand that from my perspective (being that I am 24 years old), it seemed somewhat unfair for you to be making all kinds of demands, which seemed to me threats, especially when I told you the first time we talked that I already had plans to be in Venezuela with my fiancée at the time you said you were going to come to Georgetown. I guess I didn't explain myself that well, but over the airwaves, I was a little embarrassed to go into a detailed explanation when you insisted on coming to see me in Venezuela where I would be with my boyfriend. I trust that now you see that I wanted to be alone with him - not that I didn't want to see you. As I told you the other night, if you want to come to Georgetown in a few weeks, fine, I'll see you.

However, there is one thing that really bothers me, and I think it's best to say it now to kind of clear the air. I heard you came to the church in San Francisco after I called you the other night, and some of the things you said there, don't correspond to what you told me on the phone patch. You mentioned that while in Washington, you had gone to see several congresspeople about me, and this is the opposite of what you told me on the phone patch when I asked you. Also - and what really bothers me, is that you said you had contacted that guy, Magor, a man who is part of the conspiracy against the church. He has a criminal

record and is bent on destroying the church and everything liberals stand for - which is everything I stand for as well. Then there was something about you threatening to go to detectives. Maybe I got it wrong. I certainly hope so, because that kind of thing does not make for good relations between us. I certainly do not want any bad feelings between us, and neither does the church. In fact, they thought it was my duty to reconcile differences and misunderstandings I have had with you - past and present. But I do want you to accept that as an adult, I have a right to be my own person, and make decisions about my life - including my travel plans, etc. You want us to have a relationship of trust, and so do I. You expect me to trust you about your illness, but at the same time you make what appears to me to be threats and demands. I don't think your motivation was bad - you were probably just worried - but please try to see it from my side as well. Anyone my age, would react, I think, negatively when a parent makes those kinds of demands and seems to not understand that their child has a life of their own to lead.

Well, take care until I see you here when you and I can work out a convenient time. I'll talk to you on the radio - I know it's awkward but it's the fastest means of communication.

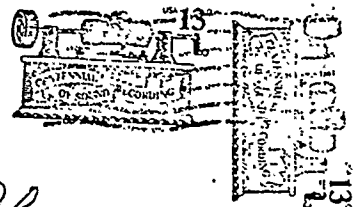
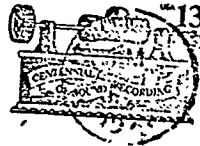

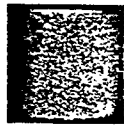
- has warned Tim Stoen not to do anything but abide by the court decision, he was warned there is a penalty if he does not (like kidnapping the child)

- regarding Lela Murphy's passport they cancelled it today
- told him about the research company (Milly slipped and mentioned the name, but I don't know that he picked up on it as he was reading some other paper at the time)
- told him that we were told by a high official that they may come ~~for~~ for JJ not Wanda as ~~Wanda~~ Wanda is already being used as a pawn to get JJ to go to the US

- he said that courts will almost always rule in favor of the national even if not a citizen except once in Hungary and possibly once in Yugoslavia but he didn't stay around to find out how the case came out in Yugoslavia
- our lawyer at one time ~~questioned~~ questioned the right of Haas to represent Grace because Haas went into Jonestown with the court marshal but the judge ruled it was legal
- in the rule ~~to~~ to enjoin Joyce to the case, our lawyer wanted it/ the opposition felt it was diffusing the issue/ the judge said it wasn't diffusing it because she had a legal paper (Joyce did)
- the longer the case goes on the more it becomes a cloudy issue/ he hasn't heard a word

- he said that the judge was a member of the FM's law firm at one time
- he said this kind of case where there is so much contention is not even a cut and dry case even in the US (they often have to do an investigation of the child's situation)
- we asked if that was being done (an investigation) - Terri said ~~that~~ would that be done in the US (to get background) - he said possibly but he hasn't been told and he thinks he would be told about it
- McCoy said that in terms of his ~~interest~~ objectivity in the case, he has even resisted the State Dept. from hurrying the decision up because people would say they influenced the case either way it came out (one side of the other would say that)
- regarding his replacement, his replacement and he will overlap so we have a chance to get to know him before McCoy leaves
- his new job, McCoy's, will be to replace Tuminia (this is a ~~vertical~~ horizontal move, not upward) - I said "well you will be still working on our case" but he said "No I'll be out of the firing line in this job" - the only thing he'll have to decide is how to respond to Stoen and the Congressmen in terms of their questions
- he said that there has been a lot of pressure in this case but it hadn't done any good/ this judge is a first class professional, no-one will move him
- the longer the case takes, the more favorable to us/ in the beginning, the Stoens had a strong argument, the birth certificate they had of John/ he said forgetting ~~of~~ Tim's transvestitism (which I had mentioned because of the tragedy of John being put with such a person), he said that they had a strong case at first/ also they left the child only 8 mos. without one or the other of them as it was Feb or March 1977 when Tim left and this doesn't show parental neglect
- I asked what would have changed the judge's mind lately (if it was changed) and he said he doesn't know unless it was the govt.
- Terry J. said how she felt about it, with John being Lew's brother and the tragedy it would be as John is so happy here etc
- I asked if something should be done to get stronger arguments in or whether someone should talk to Lionel/ he said "No We don't have to explain to Lionel, he knows what he's doing."
- I asked what he could do (if he thought the case was unbalanced in the arguments being stronger for Stoens) - he said if the people on the other side were Guyanese, he could have gone further but said that's why he asked Lionel if the arguments were given

- he said not only to Lionel but to others in the church at the time, his concern about someone going to court (Joyce or JJ) to make these arguments
- someone told Eddie Luckhoo about JJ being the real father but Eddie said "that won't sell" (that argument has no weight)

(by the way the Russians reported that they saw a man following them when we went to pick them up at the airport and drove home with them/ Debbie Blakey said she recognized the man downtown that was following the Russians, I went up to him and said he looked familiar to me (friendly) and he said his name was John Mirez and he worked at Geddes Grant/ he ~~was~~ looked Portuguese & rather than black or East Indian, was a rather large man)

- regarding the arrest order, he said he didn't see why there would be a problem for JJ as he is out of it/ Joyce is the legal guardian here/ the document left John in her custody
- when they rule about it, the judge will rule whether the child will be brought to court and turned over to the parents or Joyce will get the child, or there will be a decision on the arrest order
- regarding JJ coming to Georgetown (he suggested it might be safer if there was ~~some~~ some plan Stoen has to get him (through the Research Association) (we didn't give the name Eureka) - ~~xxxxxx~~ I said that he couldn't come to Georgetown because of the arrest order and he said in terms of that they could arrest JJ in Jonestown just as much as in Georgetown
- anyway, he said, it is not a criminal charge, only for him to appear in court, not criminal like robbery etc.
- I said we'd rather die than have him arrested (Debbie B. objected to my statement, she said it should only be used when the whole project was threatened. I said this statement that JJ might have to be arrested would threaten the whole project (McCoy was reading something when we said this) - she said that McCoy wasn't giving his opinions but just stating facts that might happen
- he said that California Court orders are not enforceable here (Terri J asked him about this) tho they can be admitted as evidence
- he said that a 2nd order for arrest is pending now, with the judge on contempt (that's one of the things the judge is considering)
- if JJ deliberately avoids service, he would be obstructing justice/ Dick feels he ought to appear in court to state his side of the case but I asked if Joyce is the one now considered the legal guardian why would JJ have to come at all and he didn't know
- the attorney said it was a dead issue about the arrest (Luckhoo and even Stoen's attorney)
- he said that no matter what happens, the case is appealable, sometimes they pick up the child before the appeal, sometimes they don't (I asked about that)
- in Guyana normally the parents get the child/ I told him about how grievous this would be for John, the suicide etc., his being used as a pawn, he said he agrees it would be bad for John to be shuttled around (especially before the appeal is settled)
- he is not sure the judge is aware of the suicide tendencies of John when he is with Grace/ he got the impression Lionel didn't get it across/ one hearing the Judge said you have until Tuesdays to get further arguments in/ at that time there was only the presentation of the California ruling etc. not much for the ~~the~~ case of JJ/ Dick doesn't know but doesn't think Lionel got the arguments in
- Dick McCoy said that Tim Stoen stated in his mailgram that JJ's political influence on this country was what affected this case/ he realizes this isn't true and he said he feels there is an independent judiciary tho all people have certain pressures
- this judge is known as a maverick judge, hard nosed independent judge

(by the way an addition to the paper on Fabian, the FR man for E GDF and Peoples Militia and Info Ministry) - he told us that you are required to attend church every week in the military)

- we told McCoy about the press not giving us equal coverage and about the Chronicle wanting to maintain an image instead of printing our side and he seemed to be bored with hearing this. When we told him about the accusations that were made that we threatened a DA in LA, he said that if we had really done that, there would have been criminal proceedings and since there are no criminal proceedings, we have nothing to worry about. On the other hand Doug Ellis, the new counsel, seemed interested and willing to hear what we had to say
- we told him about TOS representing himself as an international socialist and TOS telling Bonnie Mann that JJ was a fascist. McCoy then got up and excused himself saying he doesn't get into politics and left us there talking to Doug. Doug seemed interested in hearing what was being said
- we asked Dick if he knew about the National Enquirer and he said yes that they had visited him and he refused to talk to them and told them of his comment (he made the comments to the State Dept and they were a matter of public record. Doug asked why we didn't let the Enquirer in and ~~Sharon told~~ Maria told him we first knew of them after the plane incident that caused a lady to have a heart attack and that ~~Sharon told~~ Sharon told them that Guyana was the one that had the reporters leave after one day because they were taking pictures of a military base
- we asked McCoy if he thinks Congress would be brought in against PT And he laughed and also Doug laughed at the question. Acted like it was stupid that the congress would get involved in our case because of a magazine. Well the question was posed to him later because I felt he misunderstood me the first time and he commented that he didn't think so because he is sure TOS and others have probably contacted Congress before and if they were going to do something they would have ~~done~~ done it by now.
- Laxidazical attitude on the part of both is -y opinion. McCoy also said if they wanted to look into our case they could do this. McCoy seemed uninterested in the comment about the woman govt. official visiting Guyana and leaving her 3 children/ Doug also had the same attitude

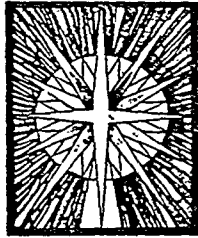

- Dick introduced us to the new Consul ^{Doug} Daniel Ellis. he's a rather pudgy, youngish looking man, younger than Dick, maybe early 30's or late 20's, wears a moustache and beard and may be Jewish/ he used the expression ~~xxxx~~ "schlepp" - he smokes a pipe and looks like he wants to appear to be somewhat of a liberal
- seemed very interested in us, said he wanted to get to know more about us/ I'm sure we must be a fascinating thing to inherit. Listened intently when we explained about Jim being the father of John and the whole situation with Grace. When Dick wasn't there I told him that Dick had been very accessible to us when we needed to talk (thought that might condition ~~me~~ him to what he'll have to go thru with us so he'll think he has to compete with Dick in being accessible)
- Maria asked ~~me~~ if there was an airline strike, Dick said that there was a possible "kick out" at Timeri - and this was a CCWU strike/ that's the group that had a strike right after May Day and were 24 hr protest against the problems of the blackout, food etc. It isn't Pan Am or anything but if CCWU does strike it ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ prevents unloading
- Toni told about the woman government official from the US who has been visiting in Jonestown and left her teenage children/ McCoy asked right away for her name and Maria said she worked for Disaster Relief
- ~~Daniel~~ ^{Doug} said he was kind of concerned with the responsibility of so many people/ he said that if there was a national disaster or a war he'd be responsible to help all of us and he didn't know if he could do that with so many
- he was in the past in Europe mostly/ just came from Luxembourg
- he said that he knows there's quite a bit of confusion with situations like this/ he said that in Europe there's similar situations, relatives get alarmed when children go abroad and the people abroad don't always help because they don't always write their parents and the distance always aggravates the ~~me~~ situation also
- he said that he is concerned about births and deaths because that is his responsibility and it is a problem (if the man in the area isn't available)
- Maria gave him the passport of Chlotile Butler/ he asked again for the death certificate of Emmett Griffith and Maria explained that Herbie Thomas was supposed to make a duplicate / Dick was a bit upset that this wasn't completed before he left
- Maria asked if he knows any more about the National Enquirer. He said he didn't and he never did like that paper but when he goes back to the states (sounds like he was going to say he'd use it for toilet paper but he said about it not being very well thought of in the US anyway. He said he was mad at the National Enquirer Reporter and told him that too. He said they'd probably write him up badly as they felt he wasn't ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ competent to say whether people were held against their will
- he turned to Tony (McCoy did) and said "are they breaking you in" meaning Maria and I
- I told ~~about~~ the National Enquirer reporters violating air space of Guyana and mentioned how McCoy had even advised them not to do this when they talked to him about flying from Guyana to Venezuela but stopping off to Jonestown and he said that they'd have to go along with whatever flight plan they filed.
- McCoy agreed he warned them about this but said it would be ~~me~~ the pilot that would be penalized for this. He said it's not a restricted area (North West) but they have to file a flight plan
- his words about the National enquirer was "it's hard on our most prestigious journal"
- Daniel said that he didn't know too much about us but ~~xxxx~~ he had heard we were ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ controversial. McCoy said that Daniel could ~~me~~ read our file
- the matter of the custody case came up and Maria and I explained the background

- of how John was born, how JJ had related to Grace at Marcie's request to save an interracial group/ the pain it caused him even a heart attack because Grace was so unstable/ TOS's transvestite pattern. How Grace left John with JJ and once when she visited John she threw John at J saying "you keep him" - Maria told of the trauma to John, the sex in the other room while John was locked up.
- the new man didn't say anything but listened intently with no criticism or no emotion, just interest.
- McCoy gave a overview of the legal situation, how Joyce Touchette was given a paper giving her legal right to have John in Guyana/ that usually in a case like this in terms of legal grounds, the Stoens would be on good ground, unless a man has acknowledged paternity legally. Usually the court has no choice but to give the child to the legal parents/ but he said in this case it is complicated.
- he said Guyana law can accept a California Court order as evidence only as there is no agreement with the US about accepting US court orders
- he said that in regards to whether TOS is the natural father/ McCoy said that TOS told him, McCoy, he was the natural father but TOS told someone in the State Dept. that he was the spiritual father.
- he told Daniel Ellis that Dick had thought of inviting Lionel Luckhoo to meet Daniel/ Dick said to Daniel, "you ought to meet him" - to get more background Daniel wears ~~xxx~~ wedding ring by the way
- regarding the case McCoy told Daniel that "you have to remember in this case that there are Americans on both sides"
- we were talking about what a tragedy it would be if John would have to return to Grace/ McCoy said that in either case (if either one wins) it would probably mean appeals. Daniel said "well if you win you'll have to surrender the child" I didn't know if we should mentioned we'd die first since it was his first meeting and McCoy's last one" - but we went into what a tragedy it would be for John and that he would be just used as a pawn in this case as ~~xxx~~ neither parents were interested in John and if TOS cared so much for him why did he leave John in Guyana and go off. ~~xxxx~~ we told what a brilliant child John ~~xxx~~ is and how he feels about Grace
- in regards to the National Enquirer, McCoy said he never consents to talk to the press. He started by saying "I have no faith in" but he didn't complete it. He said he feels he doesn't have to talk to them, especially not on the phone. He said the National Enquirer contacted the State Dept. the Bureau of Consular Affairs
- I showed him the articles again and asked if he'd put his comments on it/ he got ~~xxx~~ irritated and said that he had told me he would give me his comments which is a lie. He was very adamant about this and said it would do no good as he already wrote his official opinion which Charles Garry could use whatever way he wants to and there is no point in writing anything further. ~~xxxxxx~~ He said that he wrote that people told him they were not being held against their will and McCoy gave them the opportunity to leave with him if they wished to but they didn't wish to/ that there was electricity, doctor, medical care, all the people were housed,
- he said he did say people were doing heavy labor but on a farm people do heavy labor so he saw nothing unusual about that
- he laughed about us ~~xxx~~ suing TOS for 50 million dollars and when we talked about TOS representing himself as an International Socialist and saying we weren't socialist enough and telling Bonnie Mann ~~xxx~~ JJ is a fascist/ he got up and walked around/ didn't want to hear all that.
- regarding the trotskyites saying we threatened the LA DA - he said that if there was no criminal charges brought there were no threats as if we had made such threats there would be charges
- regarding the National Enquirer he said he would ~~xxx~~ pay good money for it
- he said you have to prove there is something wrong, not just say we did something wrong

-told him about Kathy Hunter (told Daniel this) and how she attacked Guyana and said that there was a picture of chair man Mao next to the PM/ Daniel said "well I did notice he had a Maoist jacket on" - told him how it was so unobjective that she didn't check out her material and that she had said the PM made a profit selling the property to us
 -talked about the racist lies, Kathy saying 2 black men raped her and forced liquor down her throat and how absurd this was as she is an alcoholic and certainly no black men would risk going into a racist community just to rape an old crippled alcoholic and I said that Bonnie Mann had told us that he had talked to a newspaper reporter who admitted Kathy was an alcoholic but he was going to print the article anyway and show this is what sensational press does, just to get attention as that is a typical ploy and they must have thought it was a dramatic story
 -and said how Kathy Hunter had said that in her heart she felt it was the Peoples Temple who raped her" and how she accused us of being involved in the fire incident at the Pegasus and we had been proven innocent and that according to Skip Roberts asst commissioner of police

Daniel seemed amused at the Kathy Hunter story (her saying she was raped by two black men and that she had liquor poured down her throat) - he sort of nodded his head when I said that was a typical racial slur etc.

Daniel and McCoy couldn't come out to Jonestown because of the plane not being able to land in Port Kaituma / and also there is some problem with the Guyana plane and it may have to be brought to the US to be repaired - Daniel may have to go to Mathews Ridge when he goes and then make the trip to Jonestown from there

regarding Congressional Pressure / could they get congress against us / he said that he didn't see what more they could do / TOS already contacted every senator. He said that there's very little Congressional pressure to do anything about Jonestown and he didn't think there would be / he said we certainly are not going to fight a war over John Stoen

-When we said good bye, Dick gave me a hug, pulled me close / Doug kind of stared as if he wondered if that was part of the job
 I had the feeling he was watching Dick to see how to model his relationship with us but as I said before he was more interested at least in this first meeting.
 He was very surprised when I said I had a 21 year old daughter / said I only looked 26 myself

- he said he saw that our school was approved and that was good
- I told him about the case of Rozyko and M ~~xxxx~~ what Vit said in his letter to Chris x that McCoy had told him if Chris wanted to "run off" to the US, McCoy said he'd help him etc. (I didn't use the names but McCoy mentioned them as & Vit had written him too)
- I asked if this was impartiality for him to tell Vit he'd help him etc./ he said that Vit's words were unfortunate and it hadn't happened like that/ Vit had asked McCoy if ~~xxx~~ his sons came to McCoy would McCoy help him get to the US/ McCoy said he'd help anyone get to the US if they requested to go and regarding the thing Vit said about McCoy not telling PT, McCoy said there is a privacy act that works both ways/ he doesn't tell people about PT and if people ask that PT not be told about their business like Vit or one of his sons if they were to come in, he has to equally respect that
- he said that many people have ~~xxxxxxx~~ contacted the Embassy to get them to take some kind of judicial action against PT but the Embassy is not a "cop" the work is normal consular work and so the Embassy has always refused x to do anything else even if people have accused them of protecting PT which people have done
- Chris and Mike signed the privacy act
- he said that there is no way for him to force any American citizen to meet someone else but if they were to come in to him requesting help, he would have to do so if they asked him to assist them to go to the US
- but he didn't like Vit's choice of words "help you get out"
- he said that he avoids talking to anyone who ~~xxxx~~ talks bad about ~~the~~ PT
- I asked then why did he sit with ~~xxxx~~ Debbie B. in the plane - he said "don't worry about that, I was only with her a few minutes, she sat in the back of the plane and I sat in the front." He said Debbie claimed at the Embassy that she was not going to get involved in any bad press against PT and didn't want to discuss PT
- I said that ~~xxxx~~ there were little ~~xxx~~ barbs against PT in the press and I wondered if the American Embassy and State Dept. wanted to remain neutral, why did they deny the report that they wrote saying people could move around freely and appeared to be happy, why did they deny that and say it was taken out of context when it was mentioned to the press
- he said ~~he~~ didn't know that the State Dept did deny that, he said that he has written 50 times to the State Dept. that no-one is being held against their will and that everyone looks healthy and happy.
- I said we appreciated that but why couldn't he reply to actual lies that he knows are lies, making us look like we have barbed wire and that we have monitoring of all people by closed circuit TV etc. He said he knows this kind of thing they say is ridiculous but he doesn't know what more he can do and it's just sensational journalism which sells paper
- I said I know that but the American system is based on principles of justice, and honesty and if we all don't work to see that these values persevere than how can we call ourselves good Americans (pretty heavy trip on him, huh?)
- he said that he could respond only if they first contacted him, ~~xxxx:xxxxxxx~~ and that for the same reason that we have problems with the press, he doesn't talk directly to the press. He said he talked to the man at the State Dept. that deals with the press and he thought he oriented the man to how to deal with us

- that man is Mr. Henneke and he saw all of McCoy's reports so he would be able to respond to ~~the~~ any press inquiry
 - I said it was ~~n~~ unjust for the ~~p~~ State Dept to say the reports was ~~z~~ used by us out of context because the context that was used was true and conveyed the report completely and didn't distort it and he said that was true and did seem unfair to him also
 - regarding guns (when the message ~~was~~ was to tell him that they are saying we have guns and that's ridiculous) - I told him all our crates have been inspected and there is no way we could have military equipment, he said he ~~n~~ never has reported that we have guns or any such~~xxx~~ thing and that he told the police office that the US embassy had no knowledge of any wrong doing on the part of PT
 - he said that any inquiry from people should be answered the way the State Dept answered Congressmen after they wrote, after Stoen wrote them~~xxxxxx~~ and the State Dept said some of what Stoen ~~xxxxxx~~ said wasn't accurate (with McCoy was a Mr. Holmes who is assisting him)
 - Mr. Holmes laughed because when McCoy went out of the room he Mr. Holmes said, "don't you think you're being hard on Mr. McCoy?" I said "No, I don't - I said He doesn't think we need any defense and so he doesn't either." (He laughed at that)
 - I said when we left, "Well you certainly couldn't say we were brain-washed as you can see we have our own minds" - they laughed at that too and McCoy put his hand on my shoulder

 - he also said that the material he has written, is going to our attorney as we had a released for information and we could publish it if we wish/ we said the problem is they don't publish what we say but we ~~w~~ will try/ and we have tried repeatedly but with no avail - he agreed that what is sensational ~~sells~~
 - said that the reason he won't talk to the press himself is that he knows how they splice you and tape you and don't print it carefully)
 - he said that the paper he wrote to Charles Garry that we can publish mentions our concern about the conspiracy and his response to what he saw up there
 - he said we should make an invitation to several reporters and he said he would consent to be interviewed by them
 - McCoy recently talked to Bishop Aubrey and Bishop is going to be going on a long leave/ they were talking about football and Aubrey ~~was~~ was in the US/ I asked if they talked about the Stoen case but he ~~s~~ said no

NOTES FROM THE LAST FRONTIER

BY DICK TROPP

P. I. C. Pa

The best location of Guyana has a tropical climate, but it's certainly pleasant, tempered by trade winds. Even in the rainy season there's more than two hours of rain a day. Though not a desert by any means, at sundown, thanks to the trades and the 40-50% cloud cover, the heat is not oppressive. Nights are in the upper 60's, cool enough for a light blanket. I couldn't begin to describe the natural beauty of the wilderness, the stillness that you can almost hear. The people in the capital (Georgetown, about 200 miles away), actually call this part of the world "paradise."

The community I live in is located on one of the world's last frontiers: a few acres of virgin forest near the Venezuela-Guyana border. Here, on several thousand acres of virgin jungle allotted by the Guyana Government in 1973, a group of Americans has been building an agricultural project. Already over a thousand acres have been converted into cropland and pasture. Bananas, cassava, pumpkins, vegetables, and beans of many varieties are being cultivated. Pigs, chickens, pigs, cattle, goats, ducks and rabbits. The community is the site of extensive experimentation with the aim of developing a continuously-cropped, diversified array of foodstuffs that will not only feed its nearly 1,000 residents, but will help boost the productivity of the surrounding region.

Perhaps more remarkable than the hundreds and hundreds of acres of tropical forest that are now producing food; more remarkable than the development of this lovely community out of virgin jungle, the housing construction, streets, electric lighting, sanitary facilities, fruit trees planted everywhere, is the population of Jonestown. Almost one thousand people are here in Jonestown and more come in every week. There are people here from every race, every background. Our farm supervisory staff, for example, includes a Pomo Indian woman, a young man from Northumberland who grew up on a farm in the shadow of Roman ruins, a former county attorney from Northern California, a young man from the Philadelphia ghetto who, through the inspiration and help of Jim Jones, studied agronomy at Cal State, a young woman from rural Mississippi, a 55-year-old farmer chemical engineer from a prominent family in Delaware, and an ex-Mormon dairy farmer from Shasta County.

250 senior citizens, mostly black, mostly ghetto-dwellers who suffered from hypertension, are here finding a place of peace and beauty, a new lease on life. The same goes for the over 200 teenagers and young adults who were unable to find the handle for their lives in the big cities. Here they have found something to put themselves into, a community to build, a challenging environment in a black nation.

The children have a future here. They are not, to use Paul Goodman's phrase, "growing up absurd." The world here makes sense. People are now part of a community, on land that is theirs, part of a purpose that is not confined to this community, but which is the pulse of the "third world." Here we have joined hearts, hands and minds with the Guyanese people in a massive effort to build a new society, based on the foundations of love and work, co-operation and equality.

The Peoples Temple Agricultural Project has become a model operation. Guyana has been trying to get her people to settle the rich interior here, to develop local resources, to move towards self-sufficiency and economic independence. We are doing just that out here, and in the process, as Americans, are building a kind of good will between the Caribbean peoples and our native United States. Government officials have praised our work highly. American officials have come and have been impressed. One of Guyana's highest ranking ministers, a man who has traveled the world as a spokesman for a non-aligned nations, and who has addressed the U.N. General Assembly on several occasions, was moved to tears by what has been accomplished here, by the total absence of racism, sexism, and 'ageism,' and the place of honor given to senior citizens and children, the meticulous care of our medical staff, the happy faces, friendly and open people who have taken Guyana, and her people and her goals to heart. Visitors are chartering planes to come here, to see this group of Americans who defy the stereotypes.

My main task in coming here was to organize a high school program for about 90 youngsters. Besides several levels of instruction in language skills, math, and social studies, we have put together a "community development institute" that embodies practical study and training in all areas of building this entirely "home-made" community. The students are involved directly in learning about every aspect of agriculture, sanitation, mechanics, construction, food processing, composting, power plant technology, even some civil engineering and surveying, and more. The development of the community is the "open air" school that brings study and practical application together. Since the school program merges with the life-style here, there is no such thing as "irrelevance."

It has been the most exciting, challenging, and rewarding educational experience of my life.

The students include local (Amerindian) teenagers along with the American settlers. We have dramatic proof out here in the jungles that social and environmental conditions determine what children will be like, and can bring about profound characterological changes that are almost unbelievable.

I have seen "street" kids who craved only junk food, television and cars transformed, into gardeners, builders, scientists, leaders ... involved in constructive activity, regaining their health, eating and liking the natural foods here, developing confidence, responsibility, maturity. It is awe-inspiring to see them responding to the challenges of work and study in a culture, an environment that they can relate to. Some of the young people here were literally given up on by everyone -- even the juvenile authorities didn't want to deal with them.

I'd note that quite a few of them -- had they remained on the streets of San Francisco -- would have added hundreds of thousands, perhaps millions of dollars to what is being spent on programs for rehabilitation, and for the repair of vandalized property. Some of them were hell raisers and they would have no doubt helped to heat up the inner city.

I have also been working on a program for the senior citizens who have come here to retire. The oldest, a woman whose parents were slaves in Virginia, came here in January. She took the up-river trip in our fishing boat, and she loves this beautiful, enchanting place. She will be 108 years old in October. Another fellow here, who came three years ago when the original

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jungle acreage was being cleared, is 102. He remains active, by his own choice, making furniture in his own shop.

We just cannot get the old folks here to "retire". The place turns them out, makes them forget they're old. Their wealth of experience has helped in numerous ways to find some tried-and-true, home-made solutions to problems that the younger folks never knew about. We have now set up a kind of high school program for those adults and seniors who didn't receive the advantages of an education (many grew up as children of tenant farmers and migrants, and had practically no schooling). It is moving to see people in their 70's and 80's diligently studying. They have also organized their own handicrafts and art classes. Their work has been displayed for the many visitors who come to the community, already famous and highly-regarded throughout the country.

Visitors stream in here. Guyana officials, as well as Americans, such as California's Lt. Governor Merv Dymally, anxious to see what has been termed by the Guyanese as a "model of co-operation."

The amazing thing to practically all who come is not only the co-operative spirit, the comprehensive planning and management that has gone into the project (with no outside funding), but the total lack of racism here: blacks, whites, Amerindians, latinos, Orientals, everyone working together like a big family. We know it has been precisely this level of human co-operation that has made the project such a success.

I wanted to also remark on the extensive medical services we have been able to bring to the region. Our clinic has saved lives, and is doing wonders in preventing and controlling parasite-caused illnesses common to the tropics, such as gastroenteritis.

The level of health care among residents here is very high -- higher than it was previously. The climate, diet, and peaceful, pressure-free surroundings have practically eliminated hypertension problems, kidney ailments, even heart problems among the elderly. A group of specialists and naturalists in the community have been working on herbal medicines, and we've had many successes -- for example, with papaya, in healing sores.

I took a leave from the college for one year. I didn't know what I was going to do when the year was up. I cannot see anything in front of me now but to continue with the work that is going on here. I will doubtless return to the States at some time in the future, but now, that is far from my mind.

The beauty here; the sense of the unexplored; the challenges of building a new community; the children who today have a new lease on life; the older people who can finally live in peace, in a place that is in real sense theirs, where they can have a voice, a dignity; these are all compelling reasons for me to remain.

While it may seem that this jungle is a place of escape, a retreat from the modern world, it is quite the opposite: here all is growth, all is rebirth, new horizons, becoming, development, a future.

But? Here in the South American jungle, we are stepping forward into the challenge of finding a future for mankind.

--He had someone who is working there as temporary vice-counsel, Arland Holmes ~~xxx~~ sit in. I think he has people sit in now on our meetings as a witness, because last time I went in he had Dan Weber sit in.

--Depending on whether or not the GuySuco plane is repaired, he will be coming on Aug. 1 with the person who is going to replace him, Douglas Ellis. Will probably be able to take 1-3 people with him if we want.

--There are no social security situations that he needs to look in to, but does want to see Marshall Farris and one other person whose name he couldn't remember. He says it is no big deal, just routine enquiries that have been made (or so he says).

--He said that the National Enquirer is going to do an article on us, that it is already written and will probably be out in the next 2 or 3 issues. They had already ~~xxx~~ talked to Katsaris and written a story. (why can't we send them my lie detector test, and say I heard they talked to him, and put them on somekind of notice if they print anything. Of course that would only take care of Katsaris, and they still have everything else to write about. But at least it would be something.) He said that he did not say anything to them, and that not only did he not want to, but could not because of the privacy act.

He said the guy probably wants to kick himself because he had been in his office and had not mentioned anything about PT. McCoy said he would not have anyway because of the privacy act. The writer and the photographer had come in to see if McCoy could help get ~~xxxx~~ their stay extended since they had already gone through the normal channels and had been refused. They had been given only 24 hours. He told them there was nothing ~~xx~~ he could do and ~~xxxx~~ besides that, the writer, Gordon Lindsey, was a British. (The photographer is American). McCoy told them to go to the British High Command. We asked him if he could do anything about the situation with the plane of course he said no. He ~~x~~ said the plane is from Trinidad, and the responsibility would be on the pilot, not the people who hired him. Also, he said that the International Civil Aeronautics Code is very lax and ~~xx~~ rarely enforced here. ~~xxxx~~ Planes in this part of the world often fly through each other airspace without filing a flight plan and that is not as uptight a situation as say planes flying between east and western Europe. He said the story would probably be a smear, but that it didn't make any difference since it was just a rag.

--McCoy said that if he were ~~xx~~ asked to comment about Jonestown, he could tell ~~x~~ people things like there is electricity, there is a communal kitchen. He said he could say that he is free to move around and that it does not appear that people are being held against their will. He said that he could not comment about situations like mine, because it is not something tangible that you can prove, just a psychological opinion. Also he said he would have to say that a person is not being held against their will if that is what they told him. It would make no difference if he believed it or not, he would still have to say it.

--He would not put his comment on the bottom of either the Hunter or the Layton articles. We kept handing them to him and he kept saying he didn't have anything to say. (we will talk to him with the new instructions) He said it was untrue that Debbie ~~xxxxxx~~ came in secretly, but that Dan Weber did give her a ride ~~xxxx~~ to the airport.

--Says that JJ and PT are often the subject of conversation at cocktail parties and around town. He said Guyanese talk a lot. There are people who like what ~~x~~ we are doing and then there are those who ask him things like is it true that JJ is wanted for murder in the US?, and if the rumors about the Pegasus are true, etc.

Meeting with Mr. McCoy from the US Embassy, on ^{P.I.C. 100} 2 August/ Sept. 1977-----

Laura Johnston

Issue- McCoy wanted to meet with me because my "mom" had written to the US Ambassador to Guyana and asked what was going on with me, and would they check on my health, general wellbeing.

McCoy's statements:

If there was an unofficial inquiry about someone with PT in Guyana, He'd call the Georgetown office to confirm that they live here.

If there was an official inquiry from the Washington office, then he'll have to visit the person himself.

He recommended in his report to Washington that he visit every 6 months, since so many US citizens are there, and plans for his next trip in February, '78.

He said that he was very impressed with the hard work that has been done there, but that it isn't the life for him. He said that it was too isolated-- he couldn't jump in a car and move around if there, and on the other hand, there was too-- he couldn't do his own thing there. He said that he is comfortable, and didn't like privations, though he has been through some, like the marines for 4 years, and the Korean war, and he has chosen Guyana because he can work as a free agent here, in his own office and doing things his way-- not like some of the big embassies which have a lot of supervision. He said that the US almost broke relations with Guyana last October, and he was the Charge'de Affairs, and at that time was tied to his desk. His predecessor had had some problem, and he had been training 2 other staff, and he hadn't been able to visit when he would have liked to.

He said that the custody problems and the inquiry problems would continue, because for a group getting started in Guyana, not in the well-known parts of the world, parents got alarmed over not having more information. He said that Jim may or may not lose over the custody of John Stoen.

From McCoy to JIM---- McCoy told Washington that he had visited, and that he was impressed with Jonestown. He wrote them that everyone was free to come and go. People were happy, healthy and that even in his short visit, he saw that no one was fearful, and there were no armed guards. He wrote that much work had been done in 3 years, and that altho he couldn't know everything in just 2 1/2 hrs., none were there involuntarily. Everything was in the open. He wrote that everyone was free to come and go, as with Broussard, who went to Port Kaituma, to Matthews Ridge, and then into Georgetown, and is now awaiting travel arrangements home (In other words, he didn't know that Leon had left already.) He said that he couldn't state categorically that no one was beaten, but his own observations show that he couldn't categorically say that they were. THIS WAS HIS REPORT

He said that in with his regular visits every 6 mos. he'd take care of registering babies (must be done within the first 5 years of age), of seeing personally those getting social security-- requirement that they be seen yearly; and he'll notify us ahead of time when he plans to visit so we can organize that part. Also, we must notify him of any deaths.

He has 7000 applications for visas to US, out of a country of 85000-10% he pointed out.

He said that he asked Carolyn Looman if she wanted to go, when they were in private, and he had his vehicle right there, and she said no. He said that he included this in a report.

He said that the Embassy could be helpful to us if we had a medical emergency and needed GDF to get someone out, or if someone had an emergency in the US that they had to go back for, or if someone had to go to Trinidad for a medical problem, etc. He said that the Embassy didn't just look into people's lives, that it would be helpful.

He said that Jim was very, very upset about the custody contacts, and the inquiries, and said that McCoy's own feelings were that he wouldn't investigate custody unless officially asked to because he felt that if we were able to get passports for the children, that obviously the parents had participated in that.

He said that if a lawyer, or a private investigator asked him to extradite someone on a charge, or for investigation, he would not, only if an "official court" sent him word would he turn the matter into the Guyanese officials for returning a person to the US.

A man from the US has called him, and talked to him since he's returned from J/tn. When McCoy told him that he'd been impressed, the man didn't want to hear that. He said that the man had given him a list of names, he couldn't place the letter right then, but he wasn't too worried about it; of children that were problems with custody. He said that he'd told the man his honest opinion.

McCoy said that he didn't like J/tn for himself because he didn't like cooperative living for himself. ~~He~~

He mentioned Joyce several times- not by her name, but as the medical practitioner. He mentioned in the context of the help the embassy could be-- that he'd noticed a lot of seniors there, and also a lot of children.

-he said that at the State Dept they had asked about the decision and McCoy's Ambassador had said that we can't speculate on that as the case is in court and the attorneys are reputable

-he said the Judge Bishop is a hard nosed reputable judge so there is no problem

-he said they had just asked because if the case goes on and on they want to know how to answer

Elizabeth Powers will be leaving to go to Saudi Arabia in May and James Heneke will replace her (McCoy doesn't know James Heneke)

-I asked if he had told the State Dept about Jonestown and how no-one was held against their will and how people were happy etc, he said he had done so in great detail and we would be getting his first report (thru the freedom of info)

OI asked about the 2nd report and he said you have to apply again under the freedom of info act for each report

-he said he went so far as to tell the State Dept (and he said we could quote him on this) that he didn't feel there was any use of anyone saying ~~xxxxxxx~~ someone ~~xx~~ was held against their will and the US embassy checking on it as any more of this checking, ~~xxxxxxx~~ and PT could charge them with harassment as he took countless people aside and talked to them

-he said what he has gone thru with us is not unusual (in terms of people being worried about their children), he said he went thru the same thing in Israel when the war was on and American parents were worried they'd get hurt, and in Turkey and Yugoslavia/ young people travel and don't notify their parents for months - in fact he said he went thru "triple" what I went thru with you

-he said that they have to check somewhat because there was a TV documentary called "Passport to the unknown" which showed that the govt was not active in looking for people

AMERICAN INVOLVEMENT

-he said it was only justified when it's discrimination simply because someone is an American

-or it's a criminal case and there is physical brutality

-he said there has been a problem in certain countries (not Guyana) where there is the Neopolitanic law (where someone is guilty until proven innocent) and they can sit in jail for 1 or 2 years with no trial (like France, Bolivia and Ecuador) - drug smugglers are often the ones charged but he felt they still should have a right to a trial

-when questioned by the State Dept he would say "I'm not in a position to say what we'd do in this decision", the State Dept wants to know what will happen too?

this is strange

-interest didn't mean they were pro or con but they inquired

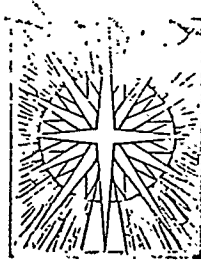

When I got there Debbie was waiting for me inside the Embassy, she had supposedly been doing Carolyn's tax clearance. We went in and I gave him the bottle of whiskey and he declined saying he didn't drink because of stomach problems, I said we'll make you something he said no, no need to, I said "Well we appreciate you staying neutral in these times. He said "I'm only doing my job, there have been times in the past when you haven't liked what I did and there will be times in the future I'm sure. We then took care of Lisa's divorce papers and picked up Sandy's passport. Then I started talking about the mercenary situation trying to get him to talk about what he said before about the guns, his whole attitude was different he was cooler he approached the whole thing differently by quoting a lot of rules and regulations he said we would have to depend on the protection of the police in Matthews Ridge or get on the radio and call for help. We continued like this for a bit and he wasn't even getting warm to the subject of us protecting ourselves so I said well Dick you know what, I've been thinking about what you said and he said very quickly "I know what you're speaking of forget about it, I only said it in jest because I didn't take the situation seriously forget about it you can't do that. At that point I just eased out of it and talked of something general like the fact he will be able to see his kids and the muddy road in Jonestown. He looked at my purse several times. When we got out of there I told Debbie it seemed like he knew exactly why I went in there, she said it was obvious that he did because of how he responded to you. I asked her why didn't you say anything she shrugged her shoulders and said I didn't have anything to say. It kept bugging me because he was so totally different I felt like I must be really unpolished and I totally blew it. Now I'm sure, or I think it is a very good likelihood that Debbie told him what I was coming in there for since she had spent the whole day there getting her passport.

BLACKAN AND MC COY (with Marcie)

- Blackan had McCoy sit in when Blackan saw Marcie
- Blackan said he was leaving soon and later Dick McCoy will be leaving/ the #.1.C.13
Ambassador Burke will be picking out new replacements right now in Washington
- when we said about the Stoen case that it would kill JJ if John was taken from him and returned to that horrible environment, Blackan said you have to weigh* the whole group against John/ Marcie and I cried, burst out in tears and said we couldn't sacrifice this child - on moral grounds/ to his certain death

Thirdly, and probably most important, we wanted to share with you a copy of the letter which the Lieutenant Governor of the State of California, Mr. Mervyn Dymally, sent to Prime Minister Forbes Burnham. The letter will speak for itself. It deals with the terrible realities of a conspiracy, a politically motivated attempt on the part of reactionary forces within the U.S. to render ineffective the progressive, socialist teachings and example of the Bishop Jim Jones. We are not the only ones to have suffered this kind of persecution. Martin Luther King, Malcolm X, John and Robert Kennedy, Black Panther Party leader Huey Newton, American Indian Movement leader Dennis Banks -- even as far back as Sacco and Vanzetti and the Rosenbergs -- people who have espoused progressive and collectivist views in this country have been subject to the extremes of harassment and in some cases even death.

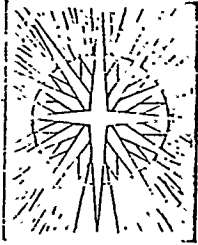

- he said that he realized after we talked to him that ~~were~~ were not completely satisfied after we left
- he said that the Embassy is not against you
- Nick told the Ambassador that it would be a good idea ~~if~~ if he met with us
- he is sorry he didn't do more about J's arrest order, he wasn't as active in Sept., still was feeling ~~his~~ his way in his job. he doesn't understand our feelings, can't explain why he did not become more active in that
- congressmen haven't corresponded directly to the US Embassy in Guyana but it was the State Dept that wrote 2 telegrams asking if Guyana will intervene against the Stoens
- Haas is a lunatic, will immediately try to get the US to take a stand if there is a loss/ Haas won't accept a loss
- Haas told Dick that PT has people in its pocket, Dick said "prove it", Haas didn't give specifics. He said that PT dropped money to people who were influential to get to the judge

- we asked him how he knew an article was coming out in the vandgard and he said someother Embassy Officer had told him, said it was just a rumour/claimed
- he didn't remember which officer
- said he does know Benn well, his son and daughter are in the US and he's come to Dick for visas etc.
- said Brindley is a radical closely alligned with the Chinese
- said Brindley used to be in the PPP and broke with it 14 years ago, he was the Minister of Health in Jagan's govt.
- know Brindley has a farm and grows pigs and chickens
- Brindley is alligned with U.C. Kwayuna and ~~is in~~ the Rampersard Defense Committee which is an alliance of black and East Indians (Ramparsard was accused of killing a policeman on Quarantee Rd, was declared on guilty)
- also is alligned with the Working Peoples Alliance and people that united for the Boxsid strike
- people working with Benn are Malcolm Rodriquest a priest, and Walter Rodney a former teacher (Paula met someone who knows Walter Rodney well) and talked at length to this man ~~XXXX~~
- Benn was in the Dryclean trial which involved the fact that his newspaper is not legal in Guyana but he publishes it anyway, the govt dropped the charges, also with him on this was Thelma Reese
- he said that Benn's paper and the PPP paper all have a funny way of distorting things
- he suggested we ~~in~~ contact Carl Backmon of the Guyana Chronicle and ask if we can print an retraction in the Chronicle
- Benn always criticizes the US for it's policy of aid to Guyana (not enough money)
- he said the PPP paper the Mirror comes up with charges and say they want police to investigate but someone has to make a complaint, can't investigate otherwise
- we said he did go in and talked to the Commissioner, Nick said the commissioner told Nick when Nick called him that he'd always be glad to talk to us
- Nick says Benn claims to have 10,000 people around the country of Guyana (support) but Nick doubts it
- Nick says Interpol is just an international police. farfetched about them being out to get anyone, they are just a clearing house located or prior were located in Paris

- he said that in relation to Hoyt that care in Guyana, health care, is a big scandle and that Hoyt or certain govt elements might feel that if we appear to be the only ones doing anything it could be used by the PPP to hammer the govt.
- Hoyt he said has a good reputation for being an honest man, Blacken knows him, he is one of the better ministers
- He said that in terms of the US, the US built the Gangi River Bridge (but at the appt with Blacken where Dick McCoy was present he said the bridge was a joint venture with the Guyanese) / he said that the US didn't get any credit for the Gangi River Bridge
- he said that Guyana is newly independent and is very jealous of anyone's ability to do things - whether black or white Americans are intimidating
- he said the Guyanese are very sensitive in this regard, they are happy to have us here because of our disciplined production but we are not the same as Guyanese to them (he was generalizing here, any American is not the same)
- he said even Americans who are close friends x of the PM, are still thought of as Americans / he said they are not going to throw you out
- we asked for his suggestions as we want to improve/ he said that there is a man Victor Forsythe who is in the Ministry of Info and Culture who maybe could help us know what to say in news releases etc.
- he said that people think we are crazy to leave the US, they can't understand why a group of Americans would leave the comforts of US to live in the jungle/ we mentioned our desire to help and that we thought Guyana has potentialities/ it was kind of surprising to me but he said, "We of the US Govt think Guyana has a great future also. There's room to grow here." (room because it isn't crowded and needs more population)
- he mentioned again in regards the article in the paper and Hoyt's reaction that he (McCoy) had heard us say we build the best houses in Guyana (I said that couldn't have been said) but McCoy still thinks he heard it/ but he referred again to us saying we have a medical facility that serves all the Northwest.
- he said that our group is looked at as a communal organization that is socialistic/ I said well it's not in political terms, we base our group on the acts of the Apostles where all shared w what they have. He said "yes, I could say it was like an Israeli Kibbutz too" but it is ~~not~~ seen as a socialist structure and not x just the typical religious organization
- he said that even in Parliament this could come up and does the subject of Americans (and our claims for what we're doing)
- but he felt that Hoyt was obviously angry at Carl Blackmon for letting it go in, the govt. is on shaky economic grounds/ there are all kinds of rumors going around and the govt. is very sensitive/ it's not the master of it's own house. and knows it's not doing all it can for the people/ atrocious medical facilities in the North-West. The govt. wants to intimate it can take care of the people x yet people are starving. He knows for a fact from people in the North West (or that know the Northwest that there is not a lot of food going into the Northwest. And there is the problem of Guyanese people being redeployed

Jones named Outstanding Clergyman

Pastor Jim V. Jones of Peoples Temple Christian Church was recently named one of the 100 most outstanding

clergymen in the nation by "Religion In America", an inter-faith organization. The award was made in

recognition of Pastor Jones' guidance and inspiration in establishing the many humanitarian programs and facilities in Peoples Temple that attempt to meet every type of human need.

Temple as a means of human service and is now helping to coordinate its agricultural mission in South America. During a recent visit home, she talked with her Lutheran pastor about her appreciation of the fine background she had in his church where the emphasis on Christ and the teachings of service prepared her for the inter-faith mission that Peoples Temple is operating.

Pastor Jones was also honored this month by a full-page article in a large newspaper where he was born and reared in the midwest, and served all of his life before coming to California.

The story gave a history of Peoples Temple, detailing its wide-ranging program, and also related an amusing incident that happened when Pastor Jones was a child. In 1938, when Jim Jones was just six-years-old, he and his mother encountered a ragged-looking tramp, who told the child, "Son, I don't have a friend in the world — I'm ready to give up." The boy responded firmly, "What do you mean mister? God's your friend. I'm your friend. And Mom will find you a job."

That's one story Mrs. Lynetta Jones, who still lives with her son in Redwood Valley, will never forget, because that's just what she ended up doing.

Peoples Temple extends throughout California with members in virtually every large city, who travel in the church's fleet of Greyhound-type buses to worship services at the Temples in Los Angeles, San Francisco, and the local facility in Redwood Valley.

The ministry is known for responding to both public and private appeals for assistance, giving strong support particularly to the local school system and law enforcement.

The Temple has rehabilitated over 175 young people from hard-line drug habits and educated many local residents through its college program.

Ronald Crawford is one young man who grew up in Ukiah and had to be rescued from the drug world. His rehabilitation by the Temple was so successful that he is now on the dean's list in law school. His living expenses and education are fully sponsored by the inter-racial church.

reports to Washington on the strike were based on daily newspaper reports of the trouble.

FBI director J. Edgar Hoover himself vetoed a suggestion by the San Francisco office to print and distribute 40,000 leaflets to sow anger and confusion between the New Mobilization Committee to End the War and the Socialist Workers party, sponsors of the huge anti-war rally and march from downtown San Francisco to Golden Gate Park.

In turning down the proposal, Hoover expressed fear that the pamphlets might be traced to the FBI. Washington did not give approval to a scaled-down plan that called for mailing anonymous letters to local activists claiming the Socialist Workers were frozen out of the planning for the rally and march.

Another letter, aimed at dividing white and black activists, was drafted by FBI agents and sent to the Black Panther party newspaper. In part, the letter read:

"What's this bullshit SDS outfit? I'll tell you what they has finally showed there true color WHITE (sic). They are just like the commies and all the other white radical groups that suck up to the blacks and use us."

A covering note from Bates to Washington said, "This letter contains numerous errors, both grammatical as well as typographical. It is felt the editors of this newspaper will accept this letter as being legitimate and from one of their own kind."

The documents, which cover the period 1968 to 1971, say the FBI fed anti-left material to a source at the Examiner on a regular basis. The name of that person was deleted from the files by the FBI.

"It is recommended that a copy of the enclosed be furnished to

(name deleted) for the San Francisco 'Examiner' who is an established source of the San Francisco Office and has been used on prior occasions under COINTELPRO," Bates wrote in a memo to Hoover on June 15, 1970.

The subject of the memo was the Institute for Policy Studies, a liberal think tank in Washington, and its San Francisco affiliate, the Bay Area Institute, which has offices at 694 Mission street in San Francisco.

Hoover approved providing the material, which linked the institutes to left-wing organizations, but it appears a story was not published. Explained Bates in a later memo:

"They felt that it would be more proper to wait until they engaged in some activity which would make this article newsworthy. It would also make it easier for them to ask more direct and embarrassing questions. They are interested, will retain the material and advise when it is used."

Bates indicated he had better luck a year earlier, reporting that he provided the information that led to an Examiner story linking former Stanford professor H. Bruce Franklin with a Maoist group at Stanford.

Before the article appeared in March, 1969, the professor's connections with the group had been secret. Bates said the story "sent shock waves through the group's executive board."

Ed Montgomery, a retired investigative reporter for the Examiner, filed a \$750,000 libel suit against the weekly Bay Guardian in May in connection with an article it published entitled "How the FBI 'Nailed H. Bruce Franklin.'"

The suit claimed that the article characterized Montgomery as a "conduit for the FBI to plant stories in the Examiner." Montgomery

denied yesterday that the FBI supplied him with any inside dope about Franklin.

According to FBI records in Washington, the San Francisco FBI office paid \$300 to an employee of the Express Times, who was also a member of SDS, to attend and report on a meeting of the underground press held in Madison, Wis., from Nov. 28 to Dec. 1, 1968.

According to FBI records, the informant chose to fly to the conference because he feared his colleagues planning to drive would be "smoking marijuana and frequently have accidents or are arrested en route over long distances."

In October, 1968, the FBI became aware of a radical plan to hijack a truck delivering military munitions in the Bay Area, according to the bureau's internal documents.

The agents knew who was behind the plot, but instead of taking action against the conspirators, the FBI suggested to Washington that the Army plant a story in area newspapers to let the radicals know authorities were on to them.

Such a story, the FBI surmised, "would help delay these hijacking plans or possibly convince these individuals that such a hijacking would be foolish."

The San Francisco office heralded the success Young Republicans and the Young Americans for Freedom were having in countering left-wing activity at Stanford and recommended that Washington try to encourage similar activities around the nation. Hoover did so.

Hoover's high regard for COINTELPRO was demonstrated by an incident involving Yippie Jerry Rubin. Rubin was flying from Chicago to San Francisco on a student airline ticket even though he was not a student at the time.

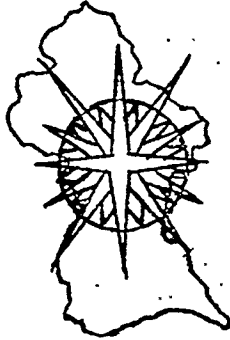
MC COY (his response after he and his embassy protested the expulsion of Stoens on 14/1/78 and they were allowed to stay

- the Stoens didn't violate law so they should be allowed to stay, it was stupid on the govt's part to throw them out
 - the Stoens are involved in litigation-the judge has reserved his decision to give it in writing so they should be able to stay and see what the decision is
 - McCoy said, 'you shouldn't' get involved in this'
 - McCoy claims he has taken care of a lot of people transportation (Suzanne)
 - said we should incorporate as a cooperative so we wouldn't have to pay duty
 - he said he is writing to the director of International operations
 - he is hammered by them on one side and us on the other side
 - said by the way that he has a new form for Larry Schact to report our births and deaths

- can't process social security application without death report
- whoever came in and did it shouldn't have done it

- will now go up every 3 mos.
- needs to have the privacy act releases so he can release info right away
- people were spontaneous, would have stayed longer, ~~played~~ would have played baseball
- talked to many alone,
- found that there wasn't much of a view of the hierarchy of Jonestown, hard to say who does what, there were 60 US govt checks sitting on the bench and no-one picked them up. no-one would say who handles the money

VISIT TO MCCOY BY CL

-seen on his desk: a telegram from Jan's father which states something to the effect that he received an anonymous letter stating that his daughter was in danger and also stating his intention to come down here and check things out. Unfortunately I did not see any date on the telegram.

-McCoy asked me if Jan had called her father, and I said yes, she did a phone patch. He asked me if she intended to return to see her mother and I said that I did not think so. He said that her father said the mother was to have surgery to determine if the growth was malignant or not. He said that the father said if it were serious he wanted Jan to return. McCoy said maybe it is not serious or mumbled something to that effect.

-He then mentioned that he had sent some SSA checks out to Kaituma. (Paula will call and try to have them sent to the FS box.) He said that once a year they must come out and check on the person, to make sure they are still alive. He also said any person who is a "representative payee" would also have to be investigated. I said that I didn't know that we had any person who was a representative payee. I said we may have some powers of attorney so that someone may deposit the check for another person. He said they would send someone out to us when it came time to check out the SSA thing. He also said it took 3 months to get the checks changed to here.

-I mentioned something about the seniors and said we had an X-ray machine in customs and he asked me if it had been approved and said that it was good we had one with all the older people we had. I said it had been approved but that there was some bureaucratic red tape in getting it out of customs. He said he would mention it to the head of Customs who he said was a friend of his. I said that would be OK, tho I in no way reflected badly on customs. You never know what he will say to someone as he is so dual, but I thought since he seemed to express that it was a good idea that it wouldn't hurt.

-I mentioned how well the health of the Seniors was monitored also. At this time I mentioned that we had one older person with a terminal disease tho I did not mention the name. I thought I had better do this to prepare him in case someone did pass so that they wouldn't start a rumor. I said that everything had been done medically that could be, and now he was with his wife and family there. I said it could be several months. He said that if anyone did die, and wanted to receive insurance for the family, he would have to be notified and submit some official document which was apparently routine. He also said that if a family wanted to send the remains back to the US it would cost the family about \$2,000. I said that would be unlikely in this case since the entire family was out there.

-In regard to parents contacting him--he alluded to Carolyn Looman again and said it was routine. I said something to the effect that parents just can't seem to relate to the idea that a younger person might want to live outside the US and mentioned that I had studied in France, etc. i.e. my parents thought this. He added and also the negative press has caused additional concern of parents or something to that effect. I said I suppose that is true, but how absurd it was and how satisfied people were there and happy.

-he did not mention Margaret or her father or John Stoen at all.

-since Wills definitely said he was a CIA attache in the past I tried to be very guarded in what I said but at the same time trying to find out any pertinent information I could that would help us.

-he remembered me from out there and actually did not try to pump me much, probably thinking it was hopeless anyway.

-I also met twirpy Reese who looks about 19 and not that bright. He is a perfect baby egg of a McCoy and given 10 years will be a replica. He said I couldn't come into the building and sit down and wait because they had all these files out. What a dope. I think he is rather dull, but a perfect CIA protege type anyway.

He reported in a letter on one lady's application for a visa to the US that she had lied on her form because she had applied before but did not indicate that on her form. - 1) DICK MC COY/AMERICAN EMBASSY; visited by Sharon, Deb, Prokes, Marceline...
 - People from the Embassy thought the cultural show was very good.
 - Dan Noble mentioned assassination attempts were mentioned in the speech, was surprised to say that to a group of Guyanese, in that you are a foreign country, to talk of Pres Kennedy's assassination. Dan took it in a political sense, our political stand.
 - Dan thought the show was very professional, but long.
 - Dan mentioned that part of speech that said the Embassy had been helpful in defending the Peoples Temple, but he was puzzled that there was a great deal of politics.
 - Dick said from Dan's explanation it sounded as if we were practically explaining why we were forced out of the United States. Why did you do that? he asked.
 - Sharon Prokes said yes, but it's due to the fact that we were asked to explain, to let people know because there was so much crap going around.
 - Dan Noble was in the Peace Core in Georgetown before he came to Guyana.
 - a man named Ellis will be replacing McCoy, has a young officer, Dick said a very fine officer, he served in Luxembourg, then Manila, has a little girl.
 - Sharon told him what Shirley Field-Ridley said we practiced for hours, she wished some of her people could have been there to see the example, they have trouble with this, also mentioned Min. Kennard had praised us.
 - McCoy said it went on and on and on. They could be a pretty tough audience here, he said a Russian group performed and they were really third class, they were bad, he left at intermission, he had to apologize to Cheddi Jagan, and even Cheddi was upset by the performance.
 - Sharon asked him if he knew Cheddi? McCoy was on speaking basis, sure I know the man, his daughter went to a Moscow university and couldn't stand it, she's now living in the states, Mr. Jagan spends most of his time in the states. He's a communist, but every time he wants to go, he had to go through this office.
 - Sharon mentioned to Marceline that Dick said his sons were young fascists, Dick agreed. Yes, their young fascists, they go to a school run by a baptist church but it's set up like a military-run by military discipline.
 - (ref. to Moon issue) Dick said, all this about a chief court officer is a strange issue. Both sides have reputable attorneys, he tells me it, the judge is hard nosed and independent, no one is going to influence him. Dick said people in power want to get from him what they can give as answers back there.
 - Sharon asked to see excerpt on us. Dick said they were getting it, it was on it's way. Sharon asked to see his copy, Dick said it was a classified document and he couldn't just give it out. To see the more recent reports we would have to apply again, each time a new one comes out.
 - Dick said he told state Dept. he didn't feel it was any further use to explain to peoples that people in Jonestown were not being held against their will. the Embassy could be charged with harassment. When they get inquiries about their children, well we will check it out when we go up there.
 - as soon as all this press came out in the U.S., inquiries about you were inevitable, Dick said. He told us of a situation in Ecuador and Israel when people inquired about their children, certainly three times more than they did about the P.L.
 - Dick said basically the only time the U.S. will interfere is 1) if a person is being discriminated against solely because he is American. 2) if a person has been subject to physical brutality. 3) people can be put in prison for years and years without knowing what they are being tried for, before they even have a trial.
 - Dick tells those that pressure him, I'm not in a position to say what they will do, State Dept. keeps pressuring them to tell them what the Guyana Government

Dick-Yugoslavia is a capitalist fact, they have alot of theory, but drive Mercedes Benz, there are some in upperclass, so Dick used to leave them, not everyone has jobs, depends on the republic, about 16% unemployment. They have a welfare system theoretically. Have free medical care, some are good facilities, some arent, but there system is better than some because they allow for some freedom of expression, they're tough people, he was very impressed with them. theres a certain oppressive police system, couldn't live there all his life. In terms of criminal law, thats different, but in terms of politics, they are much tighter. Dick said there were three nuclear reactors in

Yugoslavia from the U.S. also Petro State Chemical, and American Co. In Hungary as well. He have a certain amount of military systems in Yugoslavia. He mentioned something about Tito as one of the three leaders of the non-aligned policy. they were the corner stone of our Eastern Policy...I didn't quite understand this part...

Sharon asked what he thought the decision would be. Dick-Stoen ask me that, everybody ask me the outcome. It was mentioned that Chief Justice Bolders was at our program. Dick said he knew.

Dick-I think it is up to Joyce Touchette, one of the three guys shes going to have to appear in court and testify. Dick said "Sharon, I can't see where any country would go against it's foreign policy in a dispute where none of it's citizens were involved. To them (Guyana) it's a simple case of four or five people. If we don't pressure them, and it comes from this side, don't forget the government has enemies here too. He as the U.S. cant go to the Guyanese Govt. had say, hey, we want that child to be given back to it's parents.

Suppose Touchette has custody and Stones go bizerk, how does the Embassy prove that the Embassy didn't have political intervention. He told stoen to send him something in writing.
