## Convict Sues the System

The Adult Authority is being taken before the state Supreme Court by an incurably ill and blind convict who claims he is illegally imprisoned.

The action is a habeas corpus proceeding that could change detentional procedures for a large proportion of all parole violators — between six and seven thousand men and women.

Joseph Mazor is a blind former Los Angeles attorney with only a little time to live. Informed observers say he has an excellent chance of winning his freedom.

So he was returned to prison. Subsequently he was "whisked" away from his home territory, his family and his doctor and sent north to the California Medical Facility at Vacaville.

The Department of Corrections says this is routine procedure. Mazor and his attorneys take the position that corrections wished to enforce a monopoly situation on medical treatment of the prisoner. "A probable death sentence" is their term for what was happening.

The prisoner refused brain surgery at Vacaville and sought to force the Adult Authority to consider his case and to release him.
