Reference is made to your inquiry of April 12, 1979, to the Department of State on behalf of your constituents, The inquiry was referred by the Department of State to this Bureau on May 10, 1979, because it concerns the tape recording allegedly made by the People's Temple during a mass suicide at Jonestown, Guyana; an event which is currently under FBI investigation. [U]

The tape in question is considered to be evidentiary in nature and pertinent to our ongoing investigation into the facts surrounding the death of Congressman Leo J. Ryan at Port Maituma, Guyana, on November 18, 1978. Accordingly. we are unable to release the tape at this time. W

This Eureau is aware of the tape played by the National Broadcasting Company (NBC) on Harch 15 and 16. 1979, which purports to be portions of a true copy of the original tape. We are unable to comment on the source or the authenticity of the NBC tape, however, the tape was not made available to IBC by the FBI. For your information, authorized copies of the original tape are in possession of the Government of Guyana, the United States Department of State, the House Foreign Affairs Committee, and the FD
