



Interview of Terri Buford

Terri Buford was interviewed in the presence of her Attorney Mark Lane at San Jose, California, on 12/6/78. Present at the interview was United States Attorney William Hunter, Northern District of California, and representatives of the FBI. Lane advised that he had developed information that guns were stored in the basement of Charles Garry's office in San Francisco. Lane stated he telephonically advised Garry on the evening of 12/5/78 to this effect. 12/6/78 the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) was notified of these facts at which time the SFPD advised that on the evening of 12/5/78 Attorney Charles Garry personally contacted the SFPD and indicated that he had just determined that several weapons were stored in the basement of his The SFPD subsequently recovered three handguns in office. the basement of Garry's residence. Beikman denounced the PT and Jim Jones during interview. When confronted with the alleged true meaning of the phrases Beikman refused to make further comments.







WALTER HOWE THAIN, Cytotechnologist, home address 2401 N.E. 5th Avenue, Boca Raton, Florida, was interviewed at his place of employment, the Ayre Cell Biology Center, Incorporated, 170 West Spanish River Boulevard, Boca Raton, Florida, telephone number 392-6622 and furnished the following information: [4]

WALTER HOWE THAIN is the treasurer and corresponding secretary for the Pan American Cancer Cytology Society. He works approximately four hours per day and his work entails the study of body cells to determine early signs of cancer. Mr. THAIN was instrumental in initiating a pilot program for the early detection of cervical cancer in Venezuelaf M/

In addition to his medical experience, WALTER THAIN is a ham radio operator and his call letters are WB4KKB. Mr. THAIN is a member of the Medical Amateur Radio Counsel (MARCO). This organization has approximately 1,000 members and consists of licensed operators in the field of medicine. Once a week Mr. THAIN monitors a special medical frequency and takes emergency medical calls.

On Pebruary 3, 1978, at approximately 9:00 p.m. or 10:00 p.m., Mr. THAIN was monitoring this special frequency when he heard an emergency call from Guyana requesting assistance on a multiple birth situation. The caller from Guyana stated that he had a female patient in labor over 16 hours and the caller needed asssistance for the delivery. The caller from Guyana was a Dr. LAWRENCE SCHACT, a pediatrician. The ham radio operator in Guyana was AL TOUCHETTE. Mr. THAIN assisted the caller from Guyana by "patching through" an obstetrician and an anesthesiologist in the United States to Dr. LAWRENCE SCHACT in Guyana. Mr. THAIN stood by and monitored and taped all conversation on the evening of February 3, 1978 which had to do with the delivery of the twins in Guyana. The tape lasted approximately five hours. Mr. THAIN called Guyana the next day and the prognosis from Guyana was good in that twin girls 6 1/2 pounds each had been born and the operation was highly successful.

By letter dated January 15, 1978, Dr. JOSE M. DA'COSTA, dental surgeon and orthodontist, residence 75 SEC. "M" Camp Bellville, telephone number 02-61507 and employment address of Practitioner's Medical Centre, 132 Carmichael Street, C/BURG. Georgetown, telephone 02-65356, requested that Mr. THAIN come to Guyana and assist the people in Guyana in initiating a pilot program for screening the mass population of Guyana for the early detection of cervical cancer. This pilot program would be similar to the one which Mr. THAIN initiated in Venezuela several years ago / W/

Mr. THAIN explained that he had to go to Caracas, Venezuela around May 10, 1978 and decided to go ahead and go to Guyana as requested by Dr. DA'COSTA. In addition, Dr. SCHACT had asked Mr. THAIN to come to Georgetown to see the babies which had been delivered on February 3, 1978

Accordingly, about May 10, 1978, Er. THAIN traveled to Venezuela and then went to Guyana, When he arrived in Guyana at Georgetown, Mr. THAIN received a "VIP" treatment. His baggage was loaded into a limousine and then was taken to an airport where he was flown into the jungle to Matthew's Ridge, which is the last outpost in the northwest region of Guyana. At Matthew's Ridge Mr. THAIN got off the airplane and was taken by a land rover to Jonestown. He was traveling from Georgetown to Jonestown with Dr. JOSE H. DA'COSTA, Dr. DA'COSTA's wife and daughter, and a former CBS correspondent, MIKE (Last Name Unknown). Mr. THAIN went deep into the jungle to the mission village of the People's Temple, which was called Jonestown. Jonestown was named after the head of the community at Jonestown, Bishop JIM JONES. When Mr. THAIN arrived in Jonestown, he met with JIM JONES and signed the guest register located at the guest house in Jonestown. He was assiged a cottage to live in

with HIKE (Last Name Unknown) who was a former CBS correspondent. W

Mr. THAIN spent approximately four days in Jonestown and was given a tour of the community of Jonestown. He stated it was a utopia consisting of beautiful gardens and white picket fences. He said everything was neat and clean. He observed a great deal of heavy equipment including tractors, caterpillars and road building equipment. He recalled, however, that there was no telephone service in the community and all communication was conducted by CB radios.

While in Jonestown, Mr. THAIN lectured to Dr. LAWRENCE SCHACT regarding the pilot program for screening the mass female population for the detection of cervical cancer. Mr. THAIN described Dr. SCHACT as a knowledgeable and competent doctor. He also lectured to Dr. SCHACT's staff regarding pap smears.

He personally spoke with Bishop JIM JONES on six or seven occasions while in Jonestown and spoke to him regarding the community at Jonestown. JONES told him that the community consisted of about 1700 Americans and about 200 people from Guyana. JONES also showed him that there was a great deal of training for school children at Jonestown. Mr. THAIN stated that neither JIM JONES nor the people of Jonestown appeared to be "religious fanatics". During his stay at Jonestown, Mr. THAIN heard very few prayers and observed no worship services. He also stated there were no Gods or idols at Jonestown.

Mr. THAIN stated he did not have any specific knowledge of trouble of any type during Congressman RYAN's trip to Guyana nor did he have any specific knowledge of the acquisition, licensing or shipment of weapons by the People's Temple to Cuyana. Mr. THAIN also stated he did not have any specific knowledge of any firearms training received by People's Temple members nor did he have any direct knowledge of threats to harm any public officials or current or former People's Temple members as a result of persons attempting to expose the People's Temple, infiltrate the People's Temple, or induce a member to leave the People's Temple. During his stay in Jonestown, Mr. THAIN observed no storing of money or weapons at Jonestown. He also stated he was unaware of any contingency plan including a suicide pact that might have been part of the People's Temple community. He observed no guards or weapons in Jonestown and was free to visit every part of the community at will. On his tour of the mission village, he saw cattle, farmland, pig farms, a small 12 bed hospital and a pharmacy. He spoke with many young people of the community and generally they said that they had been in and out of jail and were happy to be in Jonestown and happy to be given "another chance". (1)

Mr. THAIN does not personally know any People's Temple members or ex-People's Temple members except the ones which he met in Guyana. He was able to furnish no specific names except Dr. LARRY SCHACT but stated that he had received a great number of letters from People's Temple members since his return to the United States. 



He had heard of "Guardians" who were in San Francisco and world search any people who were attending Temple meetings. also stated he had not heard of "Lady Satin". KIRKENDOLE was inter-On December CHARLES R viewed by Special Agents (SAS) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and Special Agent, Secret Service. KIRKENDOLE was advised of the identity of the agents and nature of the interview.

KIRKENDOLE advised that in the summer of 1973 after his brother DAVID was killed by the Oakland Police, he became interested in joining a political organization. Initially KIRKENDOLE considered the Black Panther Party (BPP) until a friend, L , persuaded him to investigate the Peoples! Temple (PT). KIRKENDOLE said that at the time he joined the PT was involved in programs similar to those of the BPP, composed mainly of blacks, but unlike the BPP the PT did not advocate the use of violence even those the PT made financial contributions to the BPP to aid the HUEY NEWTON defense

b7C

In order to join the PT an individual had to attend four consecutive meetings, to agree to abstain from drugs, alcohol and pay his bills. KIRKENDOLE denied that prospective members were asked to sign over any property or that they were forced to make financial contribution, he said that all members made contributions which were voluntary and based on income

All members were expected to perform some tasks at the temple. KIRKENDOLE was an "unarmed usher" who maintained security at the entrances. KIRKENDOLE denied that he acted as personal bodyguard for JIM JONES or his children; he did admit that on occasion he physically ejected visitors from the temple when they'd tried to get too close to JONES (W

KIRKENDOLE stated that he lived in Guyana for 16 months and that he worked as a truck driver. On the day of Congressman RYAN's visit KIRKENDOLE drove attorneys MARK LANE and CHARLES GARRY from the PT's Georgetown house to the Airstrip in order for them to fly to Jonestown to meet with Ryan'

party. KIRKENDOLE did not see RYAN during that visit nor did he hear any talk about the visit except that it was expected. KIRKENDOLE first became aware of the deaths at Jonestown the next day when he returned from the movies  $\frac{1}{2}U$ 

KIRKENDOLE advised that there were weapons at the camp, he said that 13 weapons, rifles, shotguns and bows and arrows, were used for hunting. Later during the interview he stated that he's seen approximately 21 weapons. At another stage in the interview he said that there may have been more than that number of guns. KIRKENDOLE said that to his knowledge there were no firearms training offered at the temple but many of the male members had been in the military and knew how to juse automatic rifles and that some of these men were on the security force. According to KIRKENDOLE the security force was armed and maintained camp security and defense / U/

KIRKENDOLE admitted that drugs were used to maintain discipline over people who were trouble makers, those who spoke against the leadership or spoke of wanting to leave Jonestown; also beatings were a part of the discipline, some of the beatings were as "bad" but to his knowledge no children were beaten or buried alive.

KIRKENDOLE further advised that during his stay at Jonestown there were two suicide drills. He stated that once during an assembly JONES asked the group if they were willing to die. KIRKENDOLE said that at that meeting he communicated his willingness. Asked why he would have been prepared to die, KIRKENDOLE said that he felt that one ought to be willing to die if what he'd worked for were to be destroyed. (U)

KIRKENDOLE said that the time the army was supposed to attack the community they were willing to fight and die to prevent being overrun or tortured. He also mentioned the possibility of some type of attack by the Central Intelligence Agency or the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

KIRKENDOLE advised that while at Jonestown all members of the village received instruction in the Russian language. He said that DON JACKSON was the teacher. JACKSON was described as a black male, mid thirties, approximately 190 pounds, curlyyhaired, who was formerly a history teacher in San Francisco. He stated that a member of the Soviet Embassy in Georgetown paid a visit to the Jonestown settlement and that a Russian doctor came once to perform a physical examination on JIM JONES. KIRKENDOLE said that there had been some talk at Jonestown of the Peoples' Temple re-settling in Russia.

KIRKENDOLE described PAULA ADAMS as a secretary at the Georgetown headquarters of the Peoples' Temple and said that after the suicides ADAMS mentioned to him that she's had an affair with a staff person at the American Embassy in Georgetown. KIRKENDOLE also stated that several months ago he's delivered a birthday present for ADAMS to that embassy officials home in Camelville (ph). (U)

KIRKENDOLE advised that among the high leadership the following were black individuals, JOHNNIE JONES, EVA JONES, and LEE INGRAMS INGRAM is supposely alive and was a member of the security force ( )

KIRKENDOLE stated that he'd heard the term "angels" buttdid not know what it meant; when asked again he answered that angels were all over the world and that JIM JONES had said that angels were "all around the world" and could strike at anytime. KIRKENDOLE said that he didn't know anything specific about who angels were but he said that he "wouldn't mess with them". KIRKENDOLE said that he didn't know if "angels" had killed any defectors from the church but that JIM JONES had stated "that they'd be taken care of in their own way". U/

KIRKENDOLE described the following individuals as.

JOE WILSON, black male on security force and armed.
AVA JONES, Jonestown leadership.
LEE INGRAM, head of security force.
PAULA ADAMS, secretary, gave sexual favors for JONES

LARRY SCHACHT, Camp doctor, JONES' lover. STEPHEN JONES, security force, armed.
ANDREA WALKER, Radio operator in Georgetown.
CHUCK BIKEMAN, security force. PERCY JONES, worked in Jonestown store. JOHNNIE JONES, Jonestown leadership.

Concerning the shooting of Congressman RYAN, KIRKENDOLE said that TIM CARTER had told him that LARRY LAYTON had shot RYAN as an act of revenge. KIRKENDOLE did not know why LAYTON wanted revenge or against whom. He also said that he's heard that the order to shoot RYAN did not come from JONES, that JONES did not come from on hearing of the killings stated that "life was over". KIRKENDOLE said that someone told him this

LANE met Dr. LAWRENCE SCHACHT in September, 1978, at Jonestown, Guyana, at which time Dr. SCHACHT gave him a thorough and complete examination. LANE understands from previous conversations with JIM and MARCELINE JONES that they met. SCHACHT several years ago and at the time he was a drug addict. SCHACHT was rehabilitated from drug addiction through the efforts of JONES and they eat him to nedical school at the University of California, Irvine, California, where he graduated number two or three in his class. In later conversation with JONES at Jonestown, LANE learned that

SCHACHT was not licensed to practice medicine in Guyana. LANE was requested to investigate procedures for obtaining appropriate licensing in Guyana for SCHACHT. LANE contacted HAMILTON GREEN, a ranking Guyanese official, and determined that if SCHACHT could routinely travel to Georgetown, Guyana, to practice medicine under the supervision of licensed Guyanese physicians, he could possibly thereby receive his license. LANE communicated this information to PT officials and later was informed by his client, identity not revealed, that SCHACHT was not allowed to leave Jonestown under any conditions because the PT feared he would not return.

LANE knows nothing regarding SCHACHT's employment background. At the time Congressman RYAN was attacked at Jonestown; LANE asked JIM JONES to get SCHACHT for RYAN. JIM JONES said he would, but SCHACHT never made an appearance. DALE PARKS, respiratory assistant in the clinic at Jonestown, who survived the shoot-out at Port Kaituma, Guyana, was an associate of SCHACHT at Jonestown. LANE could furnish no additional information regarding SCHACHT's involvement with the PT.

Through his client, LANE is aware of the existence of contingency plans known as the Last Stand Plans (LSP). The LSP include (1) mass suicide, (2) killing of defectors, (3) killing of hostile reporters, and (4) killing of public officials in order to politicize the event in state one. 171

To his knowledge, there was no standing list of public officials to be assassinated. The names were to be chosen at the time the plan was implemented. Selection of those to be eliminated was to be made without regard to

their party affiliation or whether they had made public statements concerning the PT. Even those persons who made statements supporting the PT could be included among those chosen under the plan. LANE understands that this plan has been formulated for some period of time and the principal PT members involved in the formulation of the plan were TIM STOEN and SANDY BRADSHAW. STOEN has defected from the PT, and BRADSHAW is in charge of the PT at San Francisco, where she reportedly resides at the present time. STOEN and BRADSHAW did extensive research into the use of various poisons for the purpose of carrying out the LSP.

LANE has no knowledge of a prepared "hit list," but his client states it is common knowledge, based on statements made at conferences and other meetings. Journalists LESTER KINSOLVING, MARSHALL KILDUFF and PHIL TRACY, as well as all defectors and aides to defectors, which LANE considers himself to be, are to be eliminated under the plan.

JIM JONES became personally angry with LANE because LANE counseled the members of the PARKS family to leave with Congressman RYAN and his group as opposed to waiting one week at Jonestown before departing, as requested by JONES.

LANE reported that SANDY BRADSHAW would be in charge of implementing the contingency plans. LANE feels that LEE INGRAM, coach of the PT basketball team at Jonestown, who with the members of his team, was not in Jonestown at the time of LANE's last visit because they were away to play a scheduled game with the Guyanese national team, is the type of person who would be involved in eliminating people under the plan. This is a personal observation, not based on any direct evidence. He has heard through an unnamed source that the PT basketball team has been involved in "sharpshooting not of the basketball type."

In regard to the shipment of guns to Jonestown, LANE pointed out that he never heard of the PT or JONES until about two and one-half months ago. In September, 1978, LANE visited at Jonestown and on this occasion observed it to be a pastoral community and saw no evidence of the presence of firearms. He did not hear any derogatory information regarding the PT until his client informed him of actual conditions within the PT about three weeks before the RYAN incident. It has been reported in the press that CHARLES GARRY, a PT attorney, had encouraged members of the PT to obtain firearms for self-defense purposes. In his first visit to Jonestown, LANE commented to several people

there that "anyone being in the jungle would be crazy not to have a rifle at least to protect himself from occlots and snakes." The Jonestown people replied they had no weapons at all but that they had been attacked by people from the bush and had no weapons. | WI

Was interviewed at his residence. Present during this interview was Secret Service Agent At the outset of the interview, Mr. LANE indicated he was representing a client who had been a member of the People's Temple and stated immunity must be granted to this individual, otherwise he would not be free to divulge all the information. He stated this client was anxious to speak and in view of the fact she had confided in him as an attorney he felt he must protect his client. It was pointed out to Mr. LANE that the immunity would have to be granted by the Department of Justice and this request would be brought to their attention.

Mr. IANE advised he is presently working on a diary which would relate his knowledge of the incidents at Guyana, as well as his involvement and knowledge of the People's Temple and Rev. JIM JONES. He stated he would make a copy of this available upon his completion, which he anticipated would be in the evening of November 26, 1978. Mr. LANE stated that after this diary was completed, he would be willing to answer any questions which would assist in this investigation.

LANE expressed fear that his own safety was in jeopardy and indicated he had called the People's Temple in San Francisco on the previous evening and indicated strongly to them that he did not want to be harassed nor did he want any of his loved ones bothered by any members of the People's Temple. LANE indicated he was concerned as his knowledge of this recent mass murder and suicide that occurred in Jonestown was merely stage one of a fourstage program. He explained stage one was a mass murder or suicide of the members of the People's Temple. two basically requires that all surviving leadership members condenn the actions of those who had led the congregation in this suicide. Stage three was that all defectors would be sought and killed. Stage four consisted of killing numerous public officials. LANE explained he was not aware of the identities of any public officials to be killed. ful

LANE revealed that an investigative reporter by the name of GORDON LINDSAY had done an 88-page report on Rev. JONES' People's Temple in which he did an in depth and accurate portrayal of the situation as it existed. LANE felt this report would be useful in this investigation. The report was never published as its authenticity could not be verified by the "National Inquirer" for whom LINDSAY had done this report.

LANE mentioned that there was supposedly \$3,000,000 in the cabin of Rev. JIM JONES in Guyana. He pointed out he had read recently in the paper that a half million dollars had been recovered and he feels now that one of the church members has apparently made off with the additional money. He also mentioned two ships that belonged to the Temple which he was of the opinion contained a considerable amount of valuables belonging to the Temple. He related the names of these ships as the Cucho (phonetic) and the Masalon (phonetic).

LANE also indicated that he felt attorney CHARLES GARRY was aware of the violent potential of Rev. JONES as he was aware a radio transmission between Guyana and attorney GARRY in San Francisco had been monitored on October 6, 1977. During this conversation, JONES related to GARRY that he was going to kill everyone in Jonestown. According to LANE, GARRY pleaded with JONES not to kill these people. LANE was of the impression this information had to be known to the Government of the United States./%/

LANE related that he was only involved with JONES and the People's Temple for a short time prior to the massacre. He stated Rev. JONES was obviously quite disturbed and posed a threat to Congressman RYAN. LANE stated he advised RYAN of his concern that something of a violent nature could happen if he visited the site in Jonestown. LANE stated he did not feel he could prevent the Congressman from going to Jonestown as it would appear his whole intentions were to prevent Congressman RYAN and his party from visiting the site at Jonestown.

LANE advised he would have his diary completed as soon as possible and would answer any questions after that.

STROUD returned to Jonestown in June, where he began to teach a science class to the children of the Temple. (2)

In July, STROUD substained serious injuries to his right leg and left ankle after being run over by a truck in a freak accident. He was given emergency medical aid by Dr. LAWRENCE EUGENE SCHACHT, and then sent to Georgetown, to recover in the Public Hospital, Mercy Hospital and Persuado Hospital. STROUD was confined to a wheelchair, and stayed in Georgetown until early November. STROUD returned to Jonestown, where he stayed until November 15, and then returned to Georgetown for medical treatment. STROUD stated that when he left Jonestown on November 15, Reverend JIM JONES looked sick.

STROUD stated that Congressman RYAN visited 41 DENNIS Street, Georgetown, Guyana, on Thursday evening. STROUD stated that at the beginning of that week, it was rumored that Congressman RYAN might be arriving in Guyana, and that he had heard that Reverend JIM JONES specifically requested that the PT in Jonestown as well as in Georgetown be cleaned up. This rumor was further substantiated by increased radio traffic between Georgetown and Jonestown. While Congressman RYAN was at 41 Dennis Street, STROUD witnessed him speaking to SHARON AMAS, in the Public Relations Office. (N)

STROUD stated that during his brief stay in Jonestown in early November, as well as in Georgetown in mid-November, their was no sign of hostility or imminent danger to members of the Temple or to Congressman RYAN and his party. (1)

STROUD stated that on Saturday, November 18, 1977, SHARON AMOS committed suicide at 41 Dennis Street, and that as a result of this act and what he had heard had happened in JOnestown, the residents of 41 Dennis Street were placed under house arrest until he departed Guyana. (2)

STROUD stated that he knew very little pertaining to the financial business of the PT. The largest amount of money seen by STROUD was said to be \$15,000, carried by EUGENE SMITH

to purchase wood in Georgetown in order to expand the Jonestown complex by 50 cottages. (N)

STROUD stated that he knew very little about checks being taken from members of the PT, but he did remember one instance when one MARION CAMPELL related to him that she had signed her check in Jonestown and that it was subsequently taken from her and never seen again. Passports were also relinquished by all members of the PT and never returned.

STROUD stated that he had no knowledge of mail being censored, but if it was, the following individuals worked in the mailroom and had access to all written communications: ///

STROUD statted that PSU and ECU (Extended Care Unit) did exist in Jonestown. In PSU, individuals cut grass, and carried trees as a means of punishment, which could possibly last up to three weeks in duration, u

STROUD stated that in September, 1977, there was an incident in Jonestown known as the "7 Day Seige." At this time, shots were heard out in the surrounding bush, and Reverend JIM JONES attributed these shots as a CIA assault, and declared an alert known as a white night. STROUD stated that the PT members had no weapons except one registered shotgun, but that every member did carry a cutlas during this seige period. (1)

STROUD stated that Reverend JIM JONES used suicide as a threat. During one white night, STROUD remembered Reverend JIM JONES stated that if any of his followers defected, they would be harassed if they succeed in getting to the United

States, and that if they did attempt to leave Jonestown by means of the jungle, they would not make it out alive. Reverend JIM JONES also stated that he had spoken to ANGELA DAVIS and DENNIS BANKS via radio, but STROUD could not remember what Reverend JIM JONES told the members what ANGELA DAVIS and DENNIS BANKS had said during this communication./U)

On another white night, STROUD quoted Reverend JIM JONES as stating: How many would rather take their own lives, than have it taken from them? Although STROUD never witnessed any drills of suicide or poisoning, he did admit to hearing rumors of such drills. (W)

STROUD stated that the heavy equipment used in Jonestown was purchased by MIKE TOUCHETTE from the Massey Ferguson Company in Georgetown, Guyana. The only individuals authorized and trained to drive the Massey Ferguson tractor were as follows:///

Stroud stated that he believed that Reverend JIM JONES maintained control over the members of the PT in Jonestown by keeping them in a constant state of battle or war psychosis (w)

STROUD stated that Reverend JIM JONES feared GRACE and TIM STONE, for JONES was afraid that GRACE and TIM would attempt to kidnap JOHN VICTOR STONE, who Reverend JIM JONES admitted to fathering.

STROUD stated that drugs were not used in Jonestown except for medicinal use. These drugs were purchased from the Guyana Pharmaceutical Company and that EVELYN LE ROY was responsible for picking up these supplies. STROUD stated that he never saw any poisonous drugs in Jonestown, and doubted that these sort of drugs could be puechased in appreciable quantity from the Guyana Pharmaceutical Company, but since customs was so lax in Georgetown, they possibly could have been smuggled into the country. (W)

In addition, STROUD stated that he as well as BOB (LNU) burned all written radio transmissions at the end of each day as standard operating procedure. (V)

STROUD stated that he knew very little about Dr. LAWRENCE EUGENE SCHACHT except that he was the only doctor at the PT in Jonestown. STROUD stated that Dr. SCHACHT's medical diploma was not displayed in his office, but he believed that Dr. SCHACHT acquired his medical training in Mexico, his schooling being paid for by the PT 10)

STROUD stated that to the best of his knowledge, SHARON AMOS was in charge of Public Reltions for the PT in Jonestown, and that she was friendly with DOUG ELLIS and DICK MC COY. As to other officials, STROUD stated that DAVID (LNU), Representative from the Ministry of Agriculture, painted propaganda material for the Temple, and that Judge BORLLERS, Highest judge in Guyana, had visited Jonestown at least three times, bu STROUD never saw him in Georgetown




