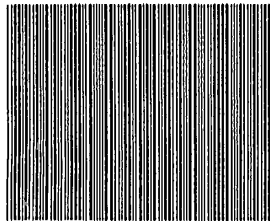

DETAILS: On 3/23/79, Mr. [redacted] Legal Counsel, State Department, telephonically advised SA [redacted] FBIHQ, that a representative of HIRC asked him to obtain from the FBI the code book for People's Temple communications. Mr. [redacted] was advised that such books were considered evidence collected by this Bureau during the ongoing investigation of a criminal matter and that the HIRC was previously informed of this fact directly by the FBI. Mr. [redacted] was further advised that due to the nature of the code book, they could not be released at this time. Mr. [redacted] stated that he fully understood our position and acknowledged that the committee representative had not mentioned to him that the FBI had previously declined to release these documents

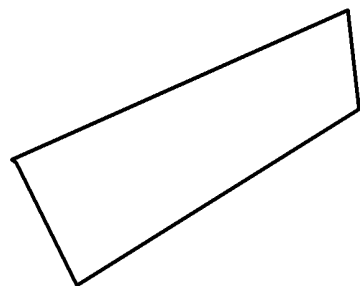

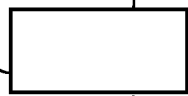

Result of examination: (U)

Qc827 through Qc830 are codebooks containing names and phrases used in radio communications by members of the Peoples Temple (PT) in Guyana, both Jonestown and Georgetown, and the PT in the United States. Qc1288 (E-3-a-7) is a similar listing but was designed for use by the PT in Caracas, Venezuela and the PT in Guyana. (U)

These codes were updated and revised periodically to protect their security. It appears that Qc827 (E-4-b-1-aaaa) is an update of Qc829 (E-4-b-1-a) and was in use at least from March, 1978 through possibly June, 1978 at which time the codes appear to have been revised. This revision would be Qc828 (E-4-b-2, E-4-c-1 and 2) which was used from possibly July, 1978 up to November 11, 1978. At this time, Qc828 appears to have been updated by Qc830 (E-4-b-1-aaa). This was determined by an entry in Qc826 (E-4-a-5-t) dated November 11, "OK Mike by the way u will be sending me a picture of ur new dog." This coded phrase, according to Qc830, means "new code list," indicating that the new code list was being used. (U)

There were times during radio broadcasts when the PT radio operators would get their codes confused. One radio operator would be using an old code list and the other operator would be working from a new list. The overall alphabetized listing of Qc827 through Qc830 and Qc1288 should facilitate the decipherment of any questioned segments of radio transmissions by the PT. (U)

Computerized listings requested by San Francisco are being forwarded under separate cover. (U)

Qc826 through Qc830 and Qc1288 are being retained at Headquarters. (U)

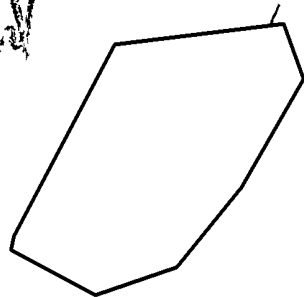

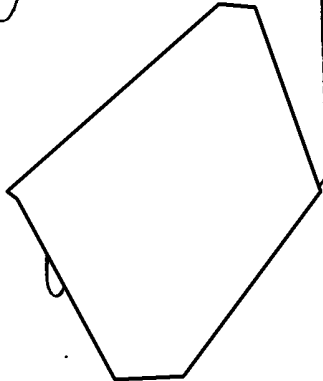

HE WAS APPOINTED TO THE APPEAL COURT IN GUYANA IN 1969 AND WON THE CACIQUE CROWN OF HONOUR, GUYANA'S HIGHEST AWARD FOR SERVICE, IN 1975. HE IS MARRIED AND HAS ONE DAUGHTER.

5. (C) CRANE HAS A REPUTATION FOR BEING THOROUGH AND METICULOUS. HE IS PROBABLY CONCERNED, AS MOST GUYANESE LAWYERS OF GOOD REPUTE WOULD BE, TO AVOID ANY ACTION THAT MIGHT PREJUDICE THE OUTCOME OF THE BEIKMAN AND LAYTON MURDER TRIALS. THERE ARE INDICATIONS THAT CRANE MAY BE EITHER THE NEXT CHANCELLOR OF THE JUDICIARY OR THE NEXT CHIEF JUSTICE. 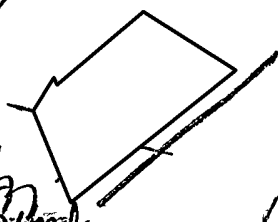
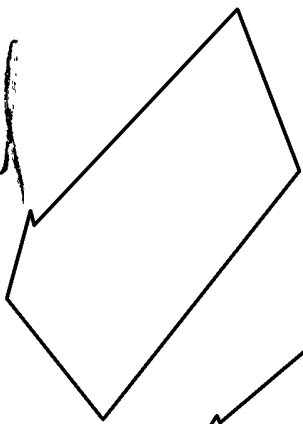

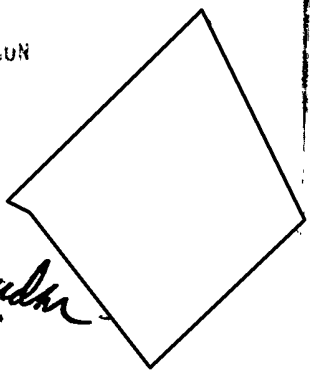

INTERVIEW WITH COMMUNIST IN 1950'S

Document, Said to Be the Writing of Cultist, Says Religion Was Means to Political Ends

GEORGETOWN, Guyana, Dec. 17 — Jim Jones, whose People's Temple settlement here espoused more socialism than religion, was a Communist from the early 1950's on, according to a rambling, disjointed personal history found among his effects and published by the Government-owned newspaper here.

Carl Blackman, editor of The Chronicle, this nation's largest newspaper, said the document appeared to be legitimate, to be Mr. Jones's personal writing and thoughts, prepared in 1974.

The document implied throughout that Mr. Jones was always a Communist and that he used his religious connections only to further Communist ends and to politicize congregations.

Interviews with members of the People's Temple who survived the Nov. 18 death ritual indicated that the group had not been formally religious for several years, even though it registered as a religion with the state of California and took advantage of the provisions for religious organizations in Federal income tax laws. And they said they heard a great deal of "socialist rhetoric."

Attachment to the Technique

Several survivors, like the former farm manager, Jim Bore, suggested that Mr. Jones's attachment to religion was not to the substance but to the technique. Mr. Jones, he said, had found evangelical speaking, music, faith-healing and other tent-meeting techniques useful in attracting and controlling the many working-class members, particularly the aged, whose Social Security and Government support checks were an important resource.

According to the document, Mr. Jones, while studying at the University of Indiana, "somewhere along in 1949-1950," became convinced there was a conspiracy in the United States to ostracize Communists.

"And if you had any Communist connections, your grandma or your cousin, or your trade union, you wouldn't get into this country (the United States). Immigration barriers were horrible. But Nazis kept coming in by the umteen thousands. That is why I became very pro-Jewish. The strongest on the Communist side were Jews."

He recalled "I was in a coma when the Rosenbergs [Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, convicted of treason in the sale of atomic secrets to the Soviet Union] were being executed. I was ready to die, infectious hepatitis." Mr. Jones said that he would have "marched till there were holes in my shoes trying to petition" to save them and that he kept asking his wife, Marceline, "Are they dead yet?"

"I just see thousands deaths. I wish I could have had them. Hell, you can have only so many revolutionary deaths," he wrote. Some time after the Rosenbergs were executed, Mr. Jones said, "I quit crying. Don't cry any more. Rough being a Communist. Lot of persecutions would make good stories but I don't know how to get them out, too painful."

The document continued: "I'd get picked up hitch-hiking, talking Communism — car would come to a screeching stop, and I'd be ordered out of the car, middle of nowhere. Happened not once but dozens of times."

It said that talking about Communism was what put Mr. Jones in touch with a man he called "Martin," a Methodist superintendent, who put him into his first church.

"He said I want you to take a church. I said, you giving me a church. I don't believe anything. I'm a revolutionary ... and he appointed me, a Communist, to a church, and I didn't even meet him through the party, I met him in a used car lot. This was in 1953," the document said.

Religious Trappings Absent

At Jonestown, newsmen noticed that there were no religious placards, or outwardly religious trappings, in the community. There was a map of the Soviet Union; a sign over Mr. Jones's mother's grave read: "Lynette P. Jones, in commemoration of a true fighter for the just, who gave the ultimate, a son, so he could serve the people in the struggle for justice, for freedom from oppression and for the foundations of socialism."

Two survivors, both of whom asked during interviews that their names not be used because they feared retaliation, strongly believe that, even if Mr. Jones did not have a clear ideological position, a tight croup of militant Marxists surrounded him.

Indeed, several Jonestown leaders went to great lengths during the settlement's last hours to bequeath some \$7 million to the Soviet Union. The money, in Panamanian and Venezuelan bank accounts, was placed in the names of several of the Temple's leaders.

The rambling memoir has little detail on Mr. Jones's understanding of Marxist socialist ideology, but it contains a rather superficial view of 20th Century Communist political history:

"I Went With the Maos"

"But when [Mao Tse-tung, the late Chinese leader] turned against the Soviets, I had troubles with that period even though I idolized him for what he did in the long march, I thought that was tremendous; but I had real trouble. Because Mao was the lover of the Soviets, he loved Stalin [Joseph Stalin, former Premier of the Soviet Union]. I never would accept that Stalin was all that bad as he was portrayed."

The document added that when revisionists condemned Stalin "that's when I broke with the C.P. The American C.P. [Communist Party]. I broke all my connections and went with the Maos. Because of loyalty again, deep-seated loyalty."

One long section of the document extols the virtues of Stalin, stating, "If it hadn't been for Stalin, Russia would have never won the war."

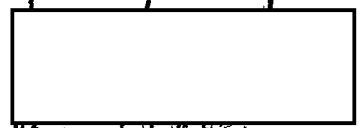

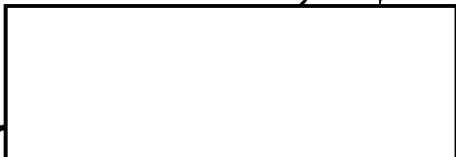

Reference is made to your communication of April 10, 1979, which communicated a letter from the Chairman of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs (HCF) to the Assistant Attorney General of the Criminal Division. The letter requested certain items of information and evidence in the possession of the FBI regarding the assassination of Congressman Leo J. Ryan at Port Kaituma, Guyana, on November 13, 1978, be turned over to the Committee. As you will recall a meeting was held on March 29, 1979, between representatives of the Criminal Division, the Committee, and the FBI at which time it was mutually agreed that the FBI would furnish the copy of the "Death Tape," a 43-minute tape recording of the final hour of Jonestown; a statement as to FBI pre-tragedy knowledge of the activities of the People's Temple; FBI assistance to the Committee in locating one Stanley Clayton and one Odell Rhodes; and a copy of the NBC video tape film footage of the crime scene at Port Kaituma, Guyana. It was additionally agreed that the FBI would not turn over to the Committee the Jonestown guest book, however, the Committee would be allowed to view a copy of the book at FBI Headquarters. (u)

Hayakawa concerning an allegation by a constituent of Senator Hayakawa that Jim Jones was coaxing individuals into traveling to Georgetown, Guyana, where they were being held against their will for unknown reasons. The constituent was contacted by this Bureau and during personal interview it was determined that relatives of the constituent had voluntarily gone to Guyana and no evidence of forced confinement could be developed. It was determined that no violation of the Federal Kidnapping Statute had occurred and no further investigation was conducted. (u)

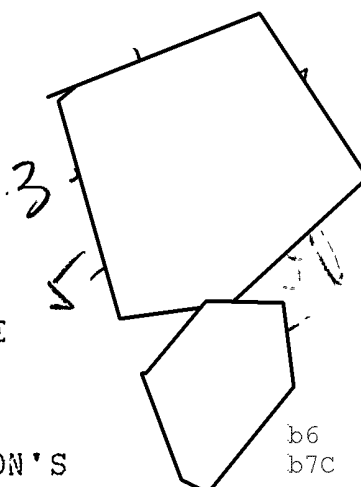

Reference is made to your communication of April 10, 1979, which communicated a letter from the Chairman of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs (HCFR) to the Assistant Attorney General of the Criminal Division. FBI knowledge of activities of the People's Temple prior to the assassination of Congressman Leo J. Mrs. Bouquet's name was given to me by Sen. Hayakawa's administrative assistant, Eugene Prat, after a check of district offices found her to be the only case they were aware of that might have been investigated by the FBI.

I simply want to clarify that point and to apologize for any embarrassment the reference may have caused to you. *DE-51*

AN OPEN LETTER:

I was extremely shocked to read, in the San Francisco Examiner (March 8, 1979), an article by Tom Eastham, concerning your recent remarks before the George Washington Law Association. Someone -- either you or Mr. Eastham, does not have the facts straight.

I quote, "The F.B.I. looked into only one complaint against the Peoples Temple before the Jonestown murder-suicides, director William Webster has revealed." My name is mentioned as being the person you "probably meant". The article goes on to say, "Agents interviewing the woman found she had no actual evidence -- only 'very good woman's intuition' -- which was not enough to open an investigation."

First of all, I would like to clarify the fact that NO F.B.I. agents interviewed me when I asked for help. Also, your alleged statements appear to be slanted to make the listener believe that no one, other than myself, registered complaints against the Peoples Temple prior to the Jonestown massacre. The fact is that I personally know of at least two other people, members of the Concerned Relatives, who did complain directly to the F.B.I., sometime ago. If their pleas were not given any attention -- why?

I have in my possession copies of two sworn affidavits, both from ex-members of the Peoples Temple, which spell out the abuses at Jonestown, including the mass suicide threats. Not only was all this information given wide newspaper coverage, last June, but also these affidavits, I believe, were sent to the State Department, in Washington D.C. With the lives of so many Americans threatened, was there no communication between the State Department and the F.B.I.? What assistance was offered, by any government agency, to Leo Ryan when he courageously attempted to free the people at Jonestown?

There are a multitude of unanswered questions arising from the tragedy of Jonestown. Those of us who lost our loved ones deserve and demand to know the entire truth about all that went before November 19, 1978. The public at large is also entitled to honest answers about the involvement, or lack of it, of local and federal government agencies and officials.

[redacted] advised that he had heard comments regarding MC COY's conduct prior to the trip that was taken to Guyana wherein Congressman LEO J. RYAN was assassinated. [redacted] at this time, could not state specifically who he had heard these comments from, however, he stated that it seemed to be general knowledge among all individuals who were familiar with the Guyanese operation of the People's Temple (PT). (u)

[redacted] stated, in response to the inquiry regarding any first-hand knowledge or evidence of misconduct on MC COY's part that he particularly had, that he was not personally aware of incidents or behavior that was any indication of misconduct on MR COY's part. He stated that his information was all received from outside sources and that he had no personal first-hand knowledge of any activities. (u)

[redacted] stated that, as far as any individuals who would have first-hand knowledge of misconduct, including the original allegation of a sexual liaison between [redacted] and [redacted] he believes that the individuals who would be best advised of these type of activities would be the Georgetown Officials of the PT. In addition, [redacted] stated that people in Jonestown who controlled MC COY's trips in and out of the compound at Jonestown would be fully aware of any attempts to compromise officials of the character of MC COY, that is in his official capacity with the State Department. 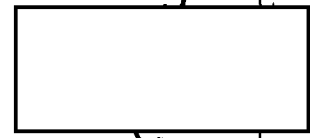

SA DONALD R. HALE and Legal Attache ROBERT J. OGLESBY, JR., having arrived in Guyana late Saturday evening, April 21, 1979, and informally meeting numerous U.S. Embassy Officials on Sunday, April 22, 1979, were furnished an official audience with JOHN R. BURKE, U.S. Ambassador to Guyana on the morning of April 23, 1979, at which time SA DONALD R. Michael Prokes states:-

I am an American citizen formerly of 1859 Greary Boulevard, San Francisco California. I am a member of the People's Temple at Port Kaituma, North West District Guyana. I joined the People's Temple in November, 1972 whilst living in the United States. I joined the People's Temple at Port Kaituma during the month of August, 1977. The People's Temple at Port Kaituma was being carried on at an area known as Jonestown there were about eight hundred persons out of which there were about four Guyanese, when I arrived at Jonestown I met Pastor Jim Jones and the first type of job I did was working in the cassava gang (generally) secondly I did the work of a school teacher and thirdly I worked in the machinery shop ordering and delivering of spare parts for Agriculture Machineries. There are about four or five times shown I came to Georgetown and during such times I did community work on behalf of the People's Temple. During my entire stay at Jonestown I was never restricted in any way by Jim Jones or any of his security members whom he had picked to guard him and the farm. Sometime about 12.00M.D. on Friday the 17th November, 1978 I heard over the public address system at Jonestown that on that very day, Congressman Leo Ryan of the United States will be visiting Jonestown; Leo Ryan arrived at Jonestown about 5.00p.m. and that very afternoon he was shown around a few buildings by Mrs Jim Jones, Jim Jones was in the farm at the time when Leo Ryan arrived there. There were about five persons including myself who went to the airport to meet Congressman Leo Ryan and took him to Jonestown. After Leo Ryan was finished shown around he met a few persons through the farm's Secretary Harriet Tropp (deceased) in the pavilion; the discussion there was private; during which time Jim Jones was speaking to reporters representing the Washington Post, San Francisco Chronicle - Ron Jarvis, San Francisco Examiner - Tim Reiterman, and National Broadcasting Company News. Don Harris (deceased) and Bob Flick; these were all persons who came with Leo Ryan. There were also four American relatives who came with the reporters and they were Jim Cobb, Tim Katsairs, one by the title of Oliver and the fourth person I cannot recall. After the discussion at the pavilion dinner was served after which after which there was entertainment by the bank of the Jonestown farm and this lasted for about two hours. I should mention that Jim Jones came from the back door about half an hour after the Congressman and party had arrived and he was mostly engaged in speaking to reporters. The entire community went to bed about 12.00M.N. The Congressman and a few who came with him slept at Jonestown whilst the reporters slept at Port Kaituma and they did not return to Jonestown until about 10.30a.m. to 11.00a.m. the following day the Congressman continued his interviewing and the newsmen were taken on a tour. When it was about 12.00m.d. Richard Dwyer who was a member of the Congressman's party expressed to Jim Jones that forty six persons on the farm were

of leaving the very day for the United States. Jim Jones spoke to these persons enquiring from them why they wanted to leave, during such time about fifteen more persons on the farm came up saying that they also wanted to leave. At that moment Jim Jones sent someone for several thousand of dollars to send away those desirous of leaving; this was about 3.30p.m. and several persons boarded the truck to leave the farm; the Congressman was yet speaking to Jim Jones in the pavillian and attorney when suddenly a member of the People's Temple came up and probably attempted to stab the Congressman as both were lying on the ground jostling as they were being seperated the same time, The attacker was pulled away and lead off, shortly after, the entire party that came with the Congressman left, and few of the farm remained at the pavillion with the attorneys whilst the majority went to their homes. At that moment Maria Katsairs came to me whilst I was near the pavillian and told me that there would be trouble as some of People's Temple members have gone after the Congressman and party. Katsairs was one of the Secretaries to Jim Jones and she told me to go to her house and wait for her and I did so and whilst there Tim Carter a member of the People's Temple came with an empty suit case and handed it to someone who was also in the house and someone asked him to give a message to someone and after he left Maria Katsairs came and filled the bag with money and and told me that there were letters also inside and she said to take the letters and mail them and the money to the Embassy. She did not mention which Embassy. I presumed it was the Soviet Union Embassy because there was taking at Jonestown about moving to the Soviet Union. At that moment she told to wait for Mike and Tim Carter who will be accompanying me with the money. She then gave a .38 revolver and five rounds of ammunitions and another to Mike Carter with five rounds also. Mike, Tim and I then left, this was about 4.30p.m. - 5.00p.m. and went intent heading for Port Kaituma but found the money bag too congested for us to fetch and move quickly so we hid some of the money by the chicken pen and in the plantain fields and we took small amounts which we could have walked with and these consisted of Guyana and American dollars. As it was nightfall we were passing the vicinity of Kaituma Police Station when the Police stopped us and we told them what had happened and they took the money, arms and ammunitions from us and we stayed at a cassava mill, which was near the Police Station. The Crime Chief Mr. Roberts came Sunday night to Kaituma and I told him of all the incidents in general and I subsequently returned to Jonestown incompany with the Police where I identified dead bodies at the farm and took the Police where the money was buried. I donot know how much money was buried but it was made up of American and Guyanese currencies. Before Tim and Mike Carter and I left with the money there was no killing of humanbeings taking place; the only thing I heard whilst we were leaving was the sound of a round being fired off.

[redacted] I am a member of the People's Temple since January, 1973. I was very active member of this Organisation in California where I used to live also. I came to Guyana on [redacted] then I went to Jonestown. I know a [redacted] and once in 1972, I visited her and in the course of our conversations she told me about Jim Jones and that he was one of the most loving person she ever met in her life. She advised me to see him. When she told me about Jim Jones it was the first time I was hearing about him. I never heard about the Peoples Temple before too. Sometime later I saw an article in the Newspaper about the Peoples Temple and what I read in the article told me that the Headquarters of this organisation was at Redwood Valley, California. In the same year I went to the Temple's Headquarters and made contact and later about one month I became a member. On the first meeting I spoke to Jim Jones briefly after he introduced himself to me. I attended meeting regularly and I became more acquainted with Jim Jones and the Organisation. As a matter of fact I was working full time with the Organisation since I joined. I learnt that the police of the Organisation was to help poor people in clothing, food, finance and Medical Treatment. The membership of the Organisation was very wide and included quite a few prominent people in the Community. From time to time being in the Organisation the things I saw and the way I saw Jim Jones conducted himself interested me. About one year and a half after I joined the Organisation Jim Jones told me that he had sex with both male and female. I know for a fact that he was involved sexually with a lot of women within the Organisation in some cases other people's wife. I learnt from Jim Jones also that about 17 year ago he was in Guyana and he liked the place a lot. Late 1973 or early 1974 for the first time I heard Jim Jones saying at a meeting at California that the group had decided to settle at Guyana to start an agriculture project and later in the year 1974, Jim Jones came over to Guyana to seek permission from the Government. He went back to California and informed the group that permission was granted by the Guyana Government to start an experimental Agricultural project. After that whenever Jim Jones talk about Guyana, he refer to her as the promise land. The first group came to Guyana sometime in 1974. Jim Jones did not come with them to my knowledge. Jim Jones came to Guyana finally to live sometime in June 1977. About one month after he came over the head office was transferred to Guyana also. Jim Jones had informed the members of the Organisation that the Government of Guyana had named the place Jones town and that was the first time I heard the name Jonestown. There were radio sets both at Jonestown and California and although Jim Jones was at Jonestown he and members used to make contact by the sets. He used to make contact with other top members of

the Organisation who were still at California also by set and would pass on whatever instructions he would have to. [redacted] I came over to Guyana with some other members and by this time there were about 600 persons already at Jonestown including Jim Jones. When I arrived in Guyana I stopped for about two weeks at [redacted] then I went to Jonestown. I saw the people had started to plant plantains, and cassava, eddoes and other vegetable crops also fruits. I saw that the people appeared to be happy. I spent an average of about three months at Jonestown and during that time everything seem to be alright. I ate primarily rice and gravy also greens. I observed that everybody was actually eating the same food. In all to me the people at Jonestown seem to have been on good terms with Jim Jones. [redacted]

[redacted] From time to time I heard Jim Jones talking about committing suicide by himself and all the members of the Organisation. I heard him saying many times that dying was easy and was freedom from pain of the world. I heard him saying many times that to die by revolutionary suicide is dignified. I do not know anything about the plans Jim Jones had to poison the people. I know that in the states on one occasion Jim Jones carried out a suicide drill but it was not poison insect but cool-aid. Later I heard that this happened at Jonestown too but I have no personal knowledge about it. I did not sign any suicide letter at Jonestown or in Guyana but I signed a letter at California sometime after I joined the Organisation saying that I do not wish to live anymore. I gave this letter up at a meeting to either the Secretary or someone who was collecting it for Jim Jones. I signed several Blank sheets of paper at California but I never signed any blank sheets of paper at California, but I never signed any blank sheets at Jonestown. I was not the owner of any property in the states. [redacted]

[redacted] came over before me whilst she was pregnant and that was in early July 1977. [redacted] was born in Guyana on [redacted]

I know for a fact that the persons who were brought across from California to live at Jonestown were told to sell all their property and gave the money to the Church. I do not know who was controlling the finances of the Peoples Temple at Jonestown. When I left Jonestown to come to Georgetown to do Customs work for the Temple I went back to Jonestown on two occasions and spent about two weeks. I did not observe any dissatisfaction in the people to my mind living condition had improved. I was present at Jonestown when [redacted] and [redacted] of the American Embassy and few other guests on about three occasions and these guests were well received by the people at Jonestown. I know for a fact that the people were allowed to talk to the guests during these visits. I know for a fact Jim Jones would intimidate the people not to tell any lies to any of the guests. When I was at Jonestown for the three months if anyone should violate any of the rules they are punished in accordance with the punishment recommended by a committee. I know that they had something called the learning crew whereby the people are given hard labour. I cannot say if after I had left Jonestown the situation had changed. I know that there are Security Guards at Jonestown. I have never seen the Security Guards beating anyone at Jonestown. I know that they had shotgun and rifle at Jonestown. I was told by Jim Jones that the weapons were all licensed. During last month I went for a period of three weeks in the states on Temple business and read in the newspapers over there that Congressman Leo Ryan was going to visit Jonestown. I returned to Guyana on [redacted]

[redacted] I went to Jonestown and I spoke to

Jim Jones. I told him about the visit I had in the states and discussions I had with concerned relatives groups that were acting very actively against our Organisation. He told me that he was very worried about the visit of the Congressman Leo Ryan to Jonestown. Jim and I with some of the other top people both men and women had a discussion on the subject and it was decided to allow him to enter Jonestown after much discussion. Before the visit of Congressman Leo Ryan, Jim Jones asked the people at Jonestown not to make any complaints to him because the concerned relatives group in California were actively working against our Organisation. On Friday 17th November, 1978, about 5.30 a.m., I was at Jonestown when Congressman Leo Ryan, two attorney, one Secretary came in to Jonestown by means of a truck sent for them by Jim Jones. When the Congressman and party came in they were greeted by several persons, not Jim Jones because I understood he was in bed sick. [redacted] them. Later Jim Jones came up and joined us and he spoke to the Congressman who asked him if he would allow some relatives of the people and the newsmen to come into Jonestown. Jones I understood, finally agreed to allow everybody to come in to Jonestown. There was nothing unusual on that Friday night. The Congressman slept at the guest college with his aides and the Attorneys. The relatives and the newsmen slept at Port Kaituma. About 10.30 or 11.00 a.m., I saw the Congressman talking to different people one after the other in the pavillion. At the time Jim Jones was at his house and he did not come over until about 12.m.d. I did not hear what the people were telling the Congressman. About 1.00 p.m., the [redacted] family decided to leave Jonestown for America. A little later the [redacted] family decided to leave Jonestown. [redacted] and [redacted] also decided to leave. I saw Jim Jones talking to them, but did not hear what he was telling them, Suddenly the rain started to fall so they could not leave the same time. It was during this period that Larry Layton also came up and said that he wanted to go. About 3.50 p.m., whilst the Congressman was still in the pavillion in conversation with [redacted] Charles Gary and [redacted] I saw Don Sly b6 coming up and he asked who was this man I was talking to. I told him Congressman b7C Ryan. I saw Sly held on to Ryan suddenly in a hugging manner and attempted to pull him down. [redacted] on to Sly, Charles Gary and [redacted] also held on to him and after a while separated them. A crowd suddenly gathered and everybody was helping to get off Sly from the Congressman. Sly got his hand out but I could say and said that it was a terrible incident and I heard him telling the Congressman, the newsmen, the person who said that they were going back to the states, and the Secretary of the Congressman, all boarded a truck and they left for the airstrip. I did not go to the Airstrip with them. Someone then got on the loud speaker. I think it was Marcelene Jones wife of Jim Jones and she told the people to go back to the College and rest as everything will be alright. Jim Jones, [redacted] Charles Gary and about fifteen others just sat around in the pavillion talking about the attack on the Congressman's life. I did not hear Jim Jones gave an instruction to anyone to go to the airstrip and kill the Congressman. I heard Jim Jones saying that he knows something is going to happen and kept repeating that a few times. At that point of time I left and went to my college to see my wife and child. I did not see [redacted] at that time anywhere. I spoke to my wife and played with my boy. I suddenly heard someone saying over the loud speaker that everybody must report to the pavillion. ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ I did not recognise the voice my wife and I went to the pavillion. I did not recognise the voice. My wife and I went to the pavillion and I saw a black American woman name Shirley Smith on the stage. She was dancing and singing I am going to be a freedom

School tent next to the pavillion and started talking. I was not involved in this conversation. Marceline Jones was also in the conversation. At this point someone asked me to get Marceline Jones some water and

[redacted] and went back to the stage which is about twenty yards away. Maria Katsaris said that she wants to talk to

[redacted] She also told [redacted] that she wanted to speak to him and he also came in the said room. Maria Katsaris then told [redacted]

[redacted] Carolyn Layton. Carolyn Layton sister Thane Moore asked me to ask Maria whether or not to go to the meeting. I went back towards the pavillion and I met Maria in the vicinity of Chimpanzee's cage and I asked whilst I was speaking to Maria I heard over the loudspeaker set 'suicide' I became afraid immediately. I went to the kitchen and I heard people crying. I went over to the pavillion to see what was going on and I saw my wife dying and she was holding my baby who was already dead. I saw several on the ground dead and persons were crying. I went down and told my wife on the ground I love her but she did not answer me. The place was now in a state of confusion. I did not see Jim Jones because I also was in a similar state. I did not see how the poison was administered but I saw the people lining up behind the pavillion. I did not look for any guards. At that point I made up my mind to escape. I went back to West house and there I

I am a citizen of the United States of America.

I used to live at [redacted] California, U.S.A.

[redacted]. He resides alone. My mother is dead. I am a member of the Peoples' Temple for the past five years. I came to Guyana on the 23rd September, 1977 and was stopping at the Peoples' Temple at

[redacted] I spent about nine months in Jonestown and about [redacted]. It was done at

intervals. I am a [redacted] and that is the work I was doing at the Peoples' Temple in Guyana or working in the fields at Jonestown, North West District. James Warren Jones was the Bishop or Pastor as he had wanted us to call him. He tried to implied to the citizen of Jonestown that he was Jesus even though I did not hear him said that he was Jesus Christ. The things he said want me to believe that is what he was saying. At Jonestown he wanted you to admit that persons of one sex is attracted to his own sex a sort of home sexual affair. This had to be done in public before the entire settlement. He even give lecture to the settlers about how men would prefer to be with men and women prefer to be with women. I had cause to sign a form rejecting the visit of Congressman Ryan but I did not read the words that were typed at the top of the form. I signed the form because I know that if I did not signed same they would have called out my name in public and asked to sign and if refused would be punished by putting to work harder. I never received order before (Public). There were threats at Jonestown before when people claimed that they were going to commit suicide. That was when Debbie Blake nee Laton sister of Larry Laton went away to the United States with some of the temple money. It was being said that when she arrived at the States she would tell a lot of lies about the place and that would tear up the entire organisation. After a long time Jim Jones said that he don't think they would have to do it anymore. However I heard Jim said that Debbie went over to the States and told a lot of lies. The Peoples' Temple at Jonestown. These three were capable to make contact with the United States and Georgetown. They were also another set that could have caught Georgetown and several others that were out of order and others that were not working. They also had three sets that could have contacted the States and Jonestown at the Peoples' Temple at Dennis Street, Campbellville. Only one they were using at the time. The sets were used to relay information at different location, speaking to relatives etc. They also have radio on 'Cudjoe' and 'Albatros' a trawler and a boat that the Temple had in the area. I know that they had a meeting at which they said that they don't want Ryan at Jonestown but I was not at the meeting because I was required to work the said. Jim Jones said that he would not let Ryan into Jonestown unless he has words from

Charles Garry and [redacted] for the Peoples' Temple. However up to Friday 17th November, 1978 everything looked O.K. I recall on the said day while I was at Jonestown they call all person up to circle the camp, like a banner guarding the area. Old persons were not allowed to do this and the children and the babies were placed under the dining area. I don't know what he said to the people but they break up and told to go home and put on some nice clothes for Congressman Ryan would be there. This was about 1.00 - 2.00p.m. in the evening. I would also like to say that [redacted] Name Joycelyn Carter and a small girl name Kaywana. [redacted] and they were all dead. They were not shot. They were poisoned I don't know if they drank poison or it was administered on them. About 4.00p.m. to 5.00p.m. on 17.11.78 Ryan and party arrived at Jonestown. The entire settlement had supper. I know Ryan and party was at the dinner table eating. All persons were eating the same food but that was only for this occasion for guest usually have better food. They had a show dancing and I have the feeling that it ended at about 11.00p.m. the said night. Before the show was over Ryan had been speaking to several persons whom he requested to speak to and this was granted to him. I saw him spoke to [redacted] and I heard him speak to other persons. They were news men and some relatives who came to Onestown with the Ryan party. They came in about 7.00 p.m. the said night. About 12.00midnight the entire party left for Port Kaituma. The following day Saturday 18th November, 1978 Congressman Ryan and party returned to Jonestown. I now say Congressman Ryan and his aid slept in Jonestown. The newsman and relatives slept at Port Kaituma. The following morning they returned to Jonestown. However about 7.30a.m. and 8.00a.m. Congressman Ryan and his aid ate breakfast and started to speak to people again. It was about 10.00a.m. the relatives and news people came in. Ryan was talking to people while newsmen were taking pictures etc. About 2.30p.m. Penny Klass who is now dead by Poison came up to the radio room and said that Parks wanted to leave with Congressman Ryan. I then said that I figured that some people would want to leave, because every body did not like that kind of living. She left, shortly after I saw Bishop Jones went to where the Congressman and party was and they started to talk. All the [redacted] family was over there. After that Mr. Dick Dwyer of the U.S. Embassy in Guyana came to the radio room and asked me to radio Georgetown and let them make arrangements for another plane to be up there because six more people wanted to leave the Jonestown. He did not give me the names of the persons. Dick radio Georgetown. About 3.00p.m. Dick came back And said that now is nine persons. He again made contact with Georgetown. The person operating the set in Georgetown was Sharon Amos. She relay a message that [redacted] the U.S. Council had found a five seat plane to help bring out people and so after that all kinds of people were in the pavillion and the after it was stop raining they started to leave on a truck. Dick Dwyer again came back to the radio room and relate to [redacted] that 12 more would be coming and congressman Ryan would be staying at Jonestown along with himself. The settlers

watch them get on to the truck. I don't know where Rev. Jones was at the time. I heard the truck came up and R v. Jones came walking up the path way with about one hundred or two hundred people. At the said time I heard a commotion on the pavillion and in the compound everybody was trying to see what was going on. Shortly after someone asked for a bulldozer over a public address system for the truck was stuck and it needed a bulldozer. Then Penny Kerns came up to me and said Ujara Sly Legal name Donald Slay try to stab Congressman Ryan. He said that he was O.K. but she cannot believe it. Shortly after 5 minutes someone said over the public address system that "every one please go home and relax". The person was Marciline Jones. She is dead. Then Marie Katson the Personal Secretary or aid to Jim Jones told [redacted] the radio so that they would transmit and tell Georgetown is power problems. [redacted]
