Specimen Ol consists of four pieces of lead shot which have been determined to be size "F". This size of shot is not commercially loaded into shotshells in either the United States or Great Dritain. However, size "F" shot is available in many countries for hand or reloading runoses. (w

Specimen Q2 is a .38 Special or a .357 Magnum bullet jacket which has been fired from a barrel rifled with six grooves, right twist, such as the K5 revolver. However, the barrel of specimen K5 was found to contain a large quantity of foreign material and corrosion which effected the microscopic markings used in identification. Therefore, it was not possible to determine if Q2 had been fired from K5. None of the other recovered weapons could have fired Q2.(M)

Specimen Q3 was identified as having been fired from the K15 rifle. (\mathcal{W}

Specimens Q4, Q6 and Q20 are lead cores from jacketed bullets which do not contain any marks of value for identification purposes. Therefore, the origin of Q4, Q6 and Q20 could not be determined. (W)

Specimens Q5 and Q18 are .30 caliber bullet jackets which were fired from a barrel(s) rifled with four grooves, right twist such as the barrels in the K17 and K20 rifles. However, due to a lack of sufficient matching microscopic marks between Q5, Q18 and test bullets fired from K17 and K20, it was not possible to determine if Q5 or Q18 had been fired from K17 or K20.

Specimen Q7 is a .300 Auto caliber jacketed bullet which was fired from a barrel rifled with six grooves, right twist. Although the barrel of the Kll pistol contains six grooves, right twist, nothing was found to indicate that Q7 had been fired from Kll. ($\mathcal V$)

Specimens Q8 and Q19 are .30 caliber bullet jackets which were fired from a barrel(s) rifled with six grooves, right twist such as the barrels in the K14 and K15 rifles. However, there are not sufficient microscopic marks of value for identification purposes in either Q8 or Q19. Therefore, it was not possible to determine if they had been fired from K14 or K15. 





THE SECOND DAY OF THE PRELIMINARY INQUIRY INTO THE MURDER CONGRESSMAN RYAN AND FIVE OTHERS AT THE PORT KAITUMA AIRSTRIP ON NOVEMBER 18, 1978 WAS TAKEN UP BY THE TESTIMONY OF FORMER PEOPLE TEMPLE'S MEMBERS VERNON DEAN GOSNEY AND ODELL RHODES WHO RELATED AT LENGTH THEIR EXPERIENCES IN JONESTOWN AND PORT KAITUMA. GOSNEY AND RHODES FLEW INTO GUYANA ON OCTOBER 30 AS WITNESSES FOR THE GOG'S USC LAWRENCE LAYTON FOR THE MULTIPLE MURDERS.

2. THE SESSION WAS AN EMOTION CHARGED ONE IN WHICH SENIOR COUNSEL FOR THE DEFENSE, REX MCKAY, CROSS-EXAMINED BOTH WITNESSES AT GREAT LENGTH

AT ONE POINT GOSNEY, BADLY SHAKEN BY MCKAY'S ROUGH TREATMENT, AND ALREADY ON THE VERGE OF TEARS THROUGHOUT THE PROCEEDING, BEGAN SHOUTING AT MCKAY. THE DEFENSE ATTORNEY THREATENED TO HAVE GOSNEY LOCKED UP FOR HIS BEHAVIOR IN COURT, MCKAY THEN ALSO DELIVERED A LONG HARANGUE ABOUT EXPATRIATES COMING TO GUYANA AND BREAKING THE COUNTRY'S LAWS. THE MAGISTRATE DISMISSED MCKAY'S CHARGES STATING THAT GOSNEY'S OUTBREAK WAS PERFECTLY UNDERSTANDABLE GVEN THE EXPERIENCES HE HAD UNDERGONE.







FOR APPROXIMATELY THE PAST FOUR MONTHS DEPARTMENTAL ATTORNEY ALFRED HANTMAN HAS BEEN COORDINATING EFFORTS BETWEEN FBI, DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, U. S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE, AND THE GOVERNMENT OF GUYANA TO ARRANGE APPEARANCE OF KEY WITNESSES AT LARRY LAYTON'S PRELIMINARY HEARING, GEORGETOWN, GUYANA. LAYTON HAS BEEN CHARGED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUYANA WITH ATTEMPTED MURDER FOR HIS PARTICIPATION IN THE SHOOTING INCIDENT AT PORT KAITUMA, GUYANA, LL/LB/78. OF THE FIVE KEY WITNESSES REQUESTED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUYANA, ONLY TWO, VERN GOSNEY AND ODELL RHODES, APPEARED AND TESTIFIED AT LAYTON'S PRELIMINARY HEARING DURING THE WEEK OF 10/29/79. DALE PARKS WAS ANOTHER KEY WITNESS, BUT DURING INITIAL CONTACTS WITH HIM BY SAN FRANCISCO AND MR. HANTMAN, PARKS REFUSED TO RETURN TO SUBSEQUENT CONTACTS WITH PARKS BY SA DON HALE HAVE GUYANA. SUCCEEDED IN SECURING PARKS' TENTATIVE COOPERATION TO RETURN THE GUYANESE PROSECUTOR AND LAYTON'S DEFENSE TO GUYANA. ATTORNEY HAVE SET ASIDE LL/L2/79, TO TAKE PARKS' TESTIMONY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUYANA CONSIDERS IN THE EVENT HE RETURNS. PARKS' TESTIMONY ESSENTIAL TO THEIR CASE AGAINST LAYTON. 



Memorandum from C. S. Banner to Mr. Stames RE: ARTICLE CAPTIONED "AFTER GUYANA: THE FORGOTTEN CHILDREN," WHICH APPEARED IN THE WASHINGTON POST NEWSPAPER OF NOVEMBER 11, 1979

DETAILS: The enclosed article captioned "After Guyana: The Forgotten Children," appeared on page 5 of "The Washington Post Magazine" section of the Sunday, 11/11/79, issue of The Washington Post newspaper. The article states that, "Nearly a year after the horror of the Jonestown, Guyana, mass suicide-murder, 210 of the 276 children who died there are still unidentified." Mr. Kenneth Wooden, who is described as an author, is quoted as saying, "The FBI told me they didn't have the time or money to identify all of the victims, and it wasn't a priority." (W)

The article further relates that, after months of 'Washington lobbying' to speed up the identification of the young victims, Wooden is planning a midnight candlelight service outside the JEH Building next weekend (11/17-18/79), which is the first anniversary of the incident, and that '(c)elebrities such as Ed Asner, Otto Preminger, and Julian Bond have lent their names to the memorial service. "Mr. Wooden is further quoted as saying that it is crucial that the children be identified 'because there are some people in California who share some heavy responsibility for not monitoring those kids' and because the families should be able to give the children a 'decent, human burial.' The article states that, 'Most were buried by bulldozer in a mass grave in Guyana.' (\mathcal{M})

After the Jonestown mass suicide-murder took place on 11/18/78, the bodies of all of the victims were flown to Dover Air Force Base, Delaware, where the FBI's Disaster Squad and the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP) processed them for identification purposes. Of the 913 bodies involved, 654 were identified -- 594 by fingerprints or footprints and 60 by other means. Disaster Squad records reflect that there appeared to be 170 children under the age of 16 among the victims. Of that total, 58 were infants from whom only footprints were obtained, 105 were juveniles from whom fingerprints or footprints were obtained, and seven bodies were so decomposed that neither fingerprints nor footprints were obtainable from them. Thirteen of the children were identified by the Disaster Squad -- one infant by footprints and 12 juveniles by fingerprints. Additional children were identified by the AFIP using other identification procedures. (M)

On 3/30/79 Mr. Wooden telephoned me and identified himself as being with "NBC News." He asked about the progress in identifying the children.

I responded that very few of the children had been identified by fingerprints to date because of the lack of available fingerprint records relating to them, pointing out that the usual sources of fingerprints are criminal, employment, and licensing records. I explained to Mr. Wooden that, consequently, the best sources for identifying children would be from dental records and hospital records where the children were footprinted at birth.

Mr. Wooden stated that insufficient efforts were being made to identify the children and he asked why the FBI was not out contacting dentists and hospitals to obtain the needed records. I replied that it is FBI policy (established by SAC Letter 69-76 dated 12/23/69) to confine its efforts in disaster situations to conducting fingerprint comparisons using available fingerprint records and that it is left up to the authorities requesting the FBI's assistance to obtain dental and other records. I explained that the requesting agency in this case was the State Department and that they had advised me that they were asking surviving relatives to acquire the needed dental and footprint records. I added that the FBI would perform comparisons on any footprints furnished to it. Mr. Wooden asked what the basis was for the FBI's policy. I replied that the basis is budgetary in that the FBI is not funded to expend manpower to search for dental and footprint records, and that considerable manpower effort would be involved if the FBI undertook this responsibility in this instance. I pointed out that, because of budgetary cutbacks in recent years, the FBI had been forced to direct its manpower resources toward its highest investigative priorities (\mathcal{M})

Mr. Wooden advised that, if the Government would not mount the effort which was needed, he was prepared to do so. He said that another employee of NBC had already obtained a set of footprints. He suggested that he bring them to the Identification Division and personally assist in making the comparisons since he had acquired knowledge of fingerprint matters while previously affiliated with New Jersey law enforcement authorities. I advised him that the FBI would be pleased to conduct comparisons on any fingerprints or footprints submitted by him or others, but that the FBI would not need his assistance in conducting the comparisons.

Subsequently, on 4/6/79, I received a copy of a set of footprints from Ms. Catherine Porter of NBC. It was quickly determined that the submitted footprints did not contain sufficient ridge detail to make an identification and I telephonically advised her of that fact the same day. No further footprints have been received from either Mr. Wooden or persons acting on his behalf.

Wooden's efforts are a labor of love borne out of his childhood in Burlington, N.J. He was a punk and arsonist who graduated from high school unable to read. Drafted to fight in Korea, Wooden was introduced to classical music and books by fellow soldiers. with college educations. He married the woman who tutored him through Glassboro State College. After four years of teaching high school history and a few years of political organizing, he was appointed by former New Jersey governor William Cahill to help study the state's penal system.

"I came full circle," he remembers. "I saw kids locked up and it reminded me of Ken Wooden, a real high school vandal. There but for the grace of God...."

And then the rebel knew he had a cause.

On 11/17-18/78 Congressman Leo J. Ryan, certain members of his staff, various news media representatives, and a group of concerned relatives visited Jonestown, Guyana. The purpose of the Congressman's visit was to personally investigate allegations he had received from various sources that some Peoples Temple (PT) members were being held against their will at the PT compound in Jonestown.

After inspecting the PT compound at Jonestown,

Congressman Ryan and his party returned to their two airplanes at
the Port Kaituma airstrip to fly back to Georgetown, Guyana.

A member from the PT compound (Larry Layton) had professed to
be a defector and secured permission from Ryan to accompany
his party back to the U. S. Shortly after arriving at the
Port Kaituma airstrip, a tractor pulling a flatbed trailer
carrying a number of PT members opened fire on the Ryan Party.
Layton had boarded one of the aircraft and began firing
at the persons already on board with a handgun. It appears
Layton began firing after hearing the shots fired from the
flatbed trailer.

A few of the people on the plane with Layton when he began firing at them were injured, but none died as a result of their wounds.

FBI involvement in the investigation of the assassination of Congressman Ryan is based upon the Congressional Assassination Statute, Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 351. Immediately after Congressman Ryan was murdered, the Department of Justice (DOJ) was contacted to determine jurisdictional aspects of the FBI and DOJ in this matter. The Department replied that the Congressional Assassination Statute gives the Department extra-territorial jurisdiction to prosecute attacks on Congressman. Such prosecution, of course, must be conducted in the U. S. FBI investigative jurisdiction under this Statute is limited, however, to the U. S., its territories and possessions. The FBI has authority to investigate this matter in the U. S. to determine whether a conspiracy existed to assassinate Congressman Ryan. Investigation to determine if a conspiracy existed is continuing.()

Within hours after Congressman Ryan was murdered at Port Kaituma PT leader Jim Jones ordered his followers to drink a poisoned fruit flavored drink. It was later alleged some of the PT members were forced to drink the poisoned liquid at gunpoint. (\mathcal{N})

A subsequent count revealed 913 bodies at the Jonestown compound as a result of suicide or murder. These bodies were flown by U. S. Air Force personnel to the Armed Forces mortuary at Dover, Delaware; autopsies were performed on seven bodies including that of PT leader James Warren Jones. The combined efforts of FBI Identification Division and Dover Air Force Base personnel were successful in identifying 631 bodies of the 913 total (69%). (v)

577 individuals were identified by fingerprints alone. $\left\langle \text{U}\right\rangle$

The above identifications were reported by the FBI Identification Division on 1/3/79. A few other identifications may have been successful as additional fingerprints, dental charts, X-rays, etc., were located. ($\mathbb N$)

Of the unidentified bodies most were infants and children for whom there were no identifying documents available.

The Government of Guyana has charged Larry Layton with five counts of murder, three counts of attempted murder, and two counts of gun violation. A preliminary hearing began in that country during the week of 10/29/79. If the presiding magistrate determines there is sufficient probable cause, he will authorize an indictment to be issued charging Layton with those offenses.

The U. S. Department of State (USDS), DOJ, and FBI coordinated efforts to assist the Guyanese by helping two key witnesses, Vernon Gosney and Odell Rhodes, return to Guyana to testify. The preliminary hearing in Guyana has been continued and the results will be reported when it concludes. (M)

returned by the Grand Jury charging Larry Layton and 14 un
indicted deceased co-conspirators with conspiracy to murder

Congressman Ryan, a violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 351 (d). Layton was also charged in a separate count with aiding and abetting, a violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 351 (a). (\mathcal{M})

The DOJ is closely following Layton's possible prosecution in Guyana. Depending upon the results of prosecutive action in that country, decisions will be made as to prosecution of Layton in the U. S. on the charges set forth above. M





PEOPLE'S TEMPLE MEMBERS (PTM) CONTACTS WITH THE CUBAN EMBASSY IN GUYANA

A cursory review of the People's Temple Members File revealed that the Russian Embassy, as well as the Cuban Embassy, apparently did not want to establish solid contacts with the People's Temple members. (U)

The following paragraphs, extracted from different communications, lead to conclude the above:

From a letter addressed to "Dear Charles (Charles Garry, PTM Attorney), " the following was extracted: (U)

> "One time when Jim (Jim Jones) was projecting what would happen should his health fail, that all his people might go to Russia. Russia was not sure she could help in that situation. The thought was communicated to Moscow that PT (People's Temple) might help any way we could-and the response was, 'Why don't you give your help to the United Nations?', and that disturbed a lot of our people. But Russia is still very friendly and helpful, but

> Russia said she could not help--but Cuba was willing to talk further with us. Some could not understand why Russia, being so powerful, could not help, when Cuba, despite her own hardship and precarious position, was willing to be of help." (U)

The above was not dated or signed; however, it read, "Jim sends his dear friend his love." (U)

Excerpts of a letter by Sharon Amos, entitled, "Visit of Alfriedo Ferreira, 14/8/78 (Tony W., Sharon A.), Administrator of the Cuban Embassy," are as follows: (U)

"I told him when he came about the idea of sending in a medical team and equipment from Cuba and he said he doubted if that would be possible. He first thought I had asked because they were going to refuse to have J.J. (Jim Jones) go to Cuba and he said that they had not refused for J.J. to go the they didn't yet have the answer about it. (U)

"He didn't think it would be possible, but he would ask. (U)

"He said that the team in Guyana was perfectly capable of giving J.J. full medical tests and could have all the equipment necessary at Georgetown Hospital." (U)

Another paragraph from the same letter reads as follows:
