Thank you for your letter of July 2, 1974. I would like to retain your firm to provide me legal advice in a number of areas, and I will hereby try to give you some background in each.

I. GENERAL BACKGROUND.

Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ is a California nonprofit corporation whose articles were filed with the Secretary of State in 1965. These articles were amended in July, 1974. A copy of the original articles and the certificate (Eyhibit B) of amendment/is attached. As set forth in the articles, the primary purpose of the corporation is stated as follows:

"The specific and primary purpose is to further the Kingdom of God by spreading the Word."

The "Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ" is the official title of the corporation behind the church, which is commonly known as "Peoples Temple Christian Church." The church is an officially recognized "member church" of a 1.5 million member

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denomination which is listed in the "cumulative list of organizations" exempt from federal income tax as:

"General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Inc. (formerly International Convention of Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ), member churches, agencies, and institutions thereof)."

The aforesaid denomination is structured in such a way as to be broken down into regions which have almost autonomous powers to recognize and have congregations as "member churches." The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) of Northern California-Nevada is such a region, and it did in 1965 recognize Peoples Temple Christian Church as a member church within the region. As a short historical note, Peoples Temple Christian Church started out as a small congregation in 1965 with approximately 150 people and grew to around 600 people as of 1969. From 1970 onwards, the church was asked to expand into the big cities, which it has, and currently the membership in the church is approximately 17,000 in the State of California. The congregation now has three main churches: Redwood Valley (where its headquarters is), San Francisco (1859 Geary Boulevard), and Los Angeles (1366 South Alvarado). The Northern California region of the denomination has continued to recognize our congregation in all of its manifestations, including its manifestation in Los Angeles, and in other states of the country. In 1973, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) for Southern <u>California</u>, another distinct region in the national denomination, officially recognized our congregation. The practical result has been that our church financially supports both regional offices.

The aforesaid denomination publishes each year a "Yearbook and Directory" wherein are listed approximately 5,000 churches officially recognized by the denomination (and ipso facto by a region of said denomination). Unlike many denominations, this yearbook publishes an annual income and expenditure statement for each congregation. In the 1974 yearbook, Peoples Temple was listed under both the Northern California region and the Southern California region and, correspondingly, apportioned its income and expenditures accordingly.

In December, 1970, the church adopted bylaws/which are still in effect. These bylaws provide for two classes of membership: Associate members and voting members. The three original incorporators elect the voting members which meet annually in January. Although the bylaws permit any number of voting members, as a practical matter only nine have been elected. It is these nine voting members who have the sole authority to elect the directors of which there are seven. The directors have full powers to run the corporation including its finances.

Associate membership is deemed to automatically terminate upon the expiration date listed on a card which is given to each

associate member. A copy of the bylaws is attached

Since January 1, 1972, the corporation has purchased five care home facilities which will be defined in an addendum to this memorandum. These facilities include a "resident facility classification 'R'" for 14 mentally retarded ambulatory residents, ages 15 to 40, the license for which is issued by the Department of Health. A second facility is a residential care home known as "Hilltop Haven" which authorizes the care of 14 aged persons, ambulatory, male, the license for which is issued by the State Department of Health. A third facility is identical with the second and is known as the Swaney Residential Care Home, which authorizes care of ten persons of either sex, ambulatory. A fourth and fifth facility are also residential care homes for adults licensed by the Department of Health through the County Department of Welfare. Two of the aforesaid facilities are deemed show pieces, one of which had the highest rating of its kind in Northern California.

Of the preceding five care home facilities, the first four were deficit financed. Each is operated by a church member who has executed a five-year lease with the Peoples Temple corporation. As a practical matter, each member gives all of his income over to the church except what he needs to live on. Each of these facilities is deemed to be a human service ministry of the church, and therefore the standard of care is exceptionally high.

In addition, the church has purchased three houses which it makes available to poor people who come to it who have no place to go. They pay what they are able to pay, and church members stay in the dwellings to make life comfortable for the residents. Peoples Temple Church is primarily a human service ministry, and it takes literally Matthew 25 to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick and imprisoned. It has task forces around each of these concepts. It carries out a drug rehabilitation program, free legal counseling program, and a free education program whereby over 100 youngsters have received full or indirect financial support, and a host of other projects. Incidentally, the church has purchased two dormitories, one in Santa Rosa, and one in San Francisco, to house these students. Each of the students agrees to use his training to serve humanity and is expected to pay what he or she can from summer jobs to offset the assistance of the church.

In December, 1973, the church voted to establish an "agricultural mission" in Guyana, South America. Its primary purpose is to assist that country, which is one of the few in the world having spare agricultural land, in the growing of experimental crops under the auspices of its official "food-clothing-housing program." Accordingly, the church incorporated its venture in the Cooperative Republic of Guyana as the "Peoples Temple Agricultural Mission," to which the government Guyana

has now leased 10,000 acres or so of land. The purpose is to help the people grow experimental crops and, secondly, to allow members of our church here who wish to devote part of their life to go to Guyana and help raise crops. The church would like not only to raise crops but to process the products raised and to engage in related commercial ventures, such as (1) lumber mill, (2) commercial fishing business, and (3) food processing, e.g., soy beans, limes, etc. As of the moment, there are approximately 30 church members who have gone to Guyana and have been clearing the jungle in preparation for planting. The church moneys have been utilized to purchase tractors and other equipment necessary for this mission. A congregation is being established in Guyana open to our members there as well as to anyone else who wants to come. Formal worship services are in the process of being initiated to take place on a regular basis.

In June, 1974, another congregation "member church" of the Northern California region, i.e., First Christian Church of Oakland, commenced negotiations for the sale of its facility to Peoples Temple in order to "revitalize" their dying congregation. The Board of Directors and the congregation have scheduled meetings for voting to sell to us, and we have verbally promised to try this as an ecumenical venture including, if possible, the establishment of a separate "East Bay Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ" corporation holding title to the property



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

U. S. Army helicopter and conducted a crime scene search of the airstrip utilizing the standard "sweep technique." 
Upon completion of the search and examination of the aircraft the group then went to Jonestown. A "C" ration lunch was provided at Jonestown by the helicopter crew and inspection of the town followed.

The principle purpose for the visit to Jonestown was to look for any evidence of a conspiracy to harm any additional officials in reprisal to the Jonestown deaths and/or any other evidence which would assist the Bureau in its investigation. Because the Pathologist stated that Jones had been shot through be the head, SA searched the wooden supports and beams of the pavilion where the majority of the bodies were found. Thank you for your letter, dated January 18. 1979 and the enclosed letters from Journalist, dated October 12, 1978 and December 12, 1978. (U)
In reviewing letters, we noted that he made reference to five young German females and one Dutch male, who were on their way to join the People's Temple (PT) Colony in Guyana, South America. He furnished the following descriptions for these individuals: (U)
(1) white female adult, age - about twenty; dark blonde afro hairdo; wearing blue jeans; spoke high German and apparently had with her a blue Adidas travel bag. She appeared to be the recipient of a letter from the PT organization in California, which was mailed to her in Cologne, Germany.
(2) (last name unknown), a white female adult, dark blonde hair; spoke high German; described as the inconspicious type; chain smoker of French cigarettes (Gitane); wore blue jeans.

(First and last name unknown) also known as a white female adult, age - about 20; light blonde hair; very attractive; spoke high German; dressed in yellow corduroy pants and a white pullover with a yellow kerchief; appeared to be very intelligent; apparently had studied art in West Germany; was the owner of an "instamatic" camera; also had in her possession a small blue pocket calendar. This person apparently had a relative who was an Evangelic theologian in West Germany.

- (4) A white female adult, (name unknown) who spoke with a Bavarian accent, possibly was interested in the "children of God movement"; dressed in blue jeans.
- (5) A white female adult, (name unknown) who apparently was politically active in Mannheim or Heidelberg dirty looking chewed fingernails; possibly wearing blue jeans.

A white male adult (name unknown), Dutch National, approximately 190 centimeters tall, blonde hair, 19 - 22 years old; spoke good German; resided in vicinity of Groningen and was interested in clairvoyance. This individual had with him a backpack and a metal suitcase:

From conversation between these individuals and it was apparent to the latter, that all of the young people had sufficient funds for the trip abroad, however, no specific travel plans were named (U)

Please be advised that we checked all of the above information through our available identification records of victims and survivors of the Guyana incident and we were unable to affect an identification. (U)

We would like to point out that to date, no information has been developed with a single exception that any of the victims or survivors in Guyana were other than U.S. citizens. The exception being a British male National. We have also learned that any person entering Guyana was fingerprinted and properly identified by Guyanese officials and that immigrants to the Jonestown settlement had to surrender their passports on arrival there. Guyanese law enforcement officials have recovered close to one thousand passports belonging to former settlers of Jonestown, none of which was, as far as we know, from either a German or Dutch National.

X .b6 As a suggestion, I would like to mention that perhaps West German Police Authorities could through their Missing Persons Bureau, establish full identity of the above persons, which probably would enable them to also obtain fingerprints on record. With this information a complete and definite determination could be made whether any of the bodies from Jonestown, which have not as yet been identified, are identical with these persons

In the event your Government wishes to pursue this matter as suggested, inquiries as to finger-print comparisons should be submitted to the FBI at either Washington, D.C., or here in San Francisco. Identification requests by physical description and/or clothing and personal items should be directed to Colonel William R. Cowan, Deputy Director, Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, 6825 - 16th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., 20302. Colonel Cowan's office will handle dental and pathology record identification.

I hope the above will be of some help to you in resolving your task. If we in the FBI can be of any further assistance to you, please do not hesitate to call on us.

that she later moved in with another People's Temple member, ELLEN KEARNS, also of Redwood Valley. While in the Yucca area, GROOT states his daughter worked at various temporary jobs such as companion to elderly people and tutor, however, he was unable to find a permanent job. (%)

GROOT said he and his wife first visited their daughter in Yucca in 1972. GROOT said they noticed during the first few days of their visit that they never saw their daughter alone. He states that she was always accompanied by other People's Temple members. GROOT noted that many of these people worked for the Mendocino County Juvenile Department. GROOT states that he did not interpret this constant companionship as an attempt by the People's Temple to control his daughter. He emphasized that the People's Temple appeared to him to be a very gregarious group, and in addition to this, he states the congregation was very protective of their women. (W)

On the same topic of constant companionship, GROOT states that in 1973, PAULINE apparently became homesick and somewhat unhappy with her life in California. She had expressed an interest to return to Niskayuna for a visit. GROOT telegraphed money to her, and she purchased a round-trip ticket. When she came east, the People's Temple sent along another member, HARRIET RANDOLPH, as a traveling companion. GROOT states the girls stayed for approximately one week and then returned to California. He states that his daughter returned of her own free will and he does not believe she was coerced in any way.

GROOT states that during the period when his daughter was having difficulty finding employment, he would send her approximately \$200.00 per month for living expenses. He states that when the canceled checks came back to him, they had been endorsed by the People's Temple. He said he does not believe his daughter was turning the money over to the church, and the reason for their endorsement was that it was easier for her to cash an out-of-state check through them.

GROOT continued with his chronology of his daughter's years with the People's Temple stating that in 1974, she moved to Santa Rosa, California, where she lived in a duplex with other People's Temple members. During her stay in Santa Rosa, she tutored college students in science and math.

In 1975, she moved on to San Francisco in an attempt to find a job utilizing her background. Again, she had no success at finding a suitable job, and after serving as a physical therapist for a short period of time, she was again out of work. It was at this time that the People's Temple offered her a teaching position in Guyana which she readily accepted.

In December, 1977, PAULINE GROOT relocated to the People's Temple Agricultural Mission in Jonestown, Guyana. GROOT said that his daughter's final year in Guyana apparently was a very happy and productive one for her. He states that she began to write more frequently, and these letters expressed the satisfaction and joy she found in her new position. GROOT said that these letters never discussed any problems of the church. She never discussed her fellow churchman, Reverend JIM JONES, or church policies or philosophies.////

GROOT stated that he and his wife had no idea that there was anything unusual with the church which could lead to such a tragedy. He said that the People's Temple members he had met were extremely friendly and helpful people. He said that the only time he noticed a defensive air about the church was when they visited his daughter in San Francisco. He said he and his wife went to the Temple in San Francisco to locate their daughter. He went on to say that as they entered the front door of the Temple, they were met and detained by two, so-called ushers. GROOT said that they were not invited into the church while the congregation members attempted to locate their daughter, and the People's Temple members appeared to be quite suspicious. GROOT thought that this type of security for the church was quite unusual, however, he added, the church was located in a changing neighborhood and perhaps they had had trouble in the past. ///

GROOT could not relate any other facts about his daughter or the People's Temple Church which would be instrumental in learning about the organization

Mark Lane raps State Department

U.S. laxity cited on Jonestown

By JOHN FUNICIELLO

A nationally known conspiracy investigator and theorist involving the assassinations of President John F. Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. suggested Monday that the U.S. State Department may have allowed to occur a series of events which led to the murder-suicides of more than 900 persons in Jonestown, Guyana, last November.

Mark Lane, an attorney who was in Jonestown at the time of the mass murder-suicides in the settlement of the People's Temple, was semantically meticulous in avoiding an assertion that the State Department knew what was going to happen.

Speaking at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, Lane said that he "hoped" that the State Department had not felt that it was preferable that more than 900 men, women and children die in Jonestown, rather than be resettled in the Soviet Union.

He said that the Rev. Jim Jones, the leader of the People's Temple — which had been located in San Francisco and Los Angeles before Jonestown was established — had discussed taking some 1,000 persons to Russia for resettlement in various communities.

That, asserted Lane, would have been embarrassing to the U.S. and the administration of President Carter, who has spoken out on human rights and has made those rights an issue of foreign policy, including criticism of the USSR.

State Department officials who had anything to do with the People's Temple settlement in Guyana, located on the north coast of South America, Lane indicated, knew they were dealing with an unstable personality in Jim Jones, but they never warned Rep. Leo Ryan, who was killed by followers of Jones at an airstrip near Jonestown.

"He walked into a trap that had been set for him by the State Department," said Lane of Ryan, who, he added, was only told by the State Department that the



food and lodging at Jonestown would not be good.

Previous interviews with Jonestown residents, said Lane, were charades, in that Jones was given weeks to prepare those whose names were on a list for interview. In Ryan's case, said Lane, he went in and asked to speak with persons whose identities were not known before he arrived.

This kind of investigation, said Lane, was a proper investigation and was seen as very threatening to the existence of Jonestown in the eyes of Jones, who Lane described as "deteriorating" and "paranoid." Also, he said, Jones felt that, if just one person left Jonestown with Rep. Ryan and the television crews, "it'll destroy us."

TROY — Controversial Peoples Temple attorney Mark Lane is scheduled to lecture on "The Horrors of Jonestown" Monday at 8:30 p.m. at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

Lane's lecture is open only to RPI students, school officials said.

Lane was present in Jonestown during the bizarre events in Noveber and, according to an article which appeared Wednesday in RPI's student newspaper, Lane will be lecturing on "how he escaped death in Guyana, how he prevented a knife-wielding cult member from killing (California Congressman Leo) Ryan just before the fatal attack and his opinions on the Peoples Temple and other cults."

Lane, who represented the late Rev. Jim Jones who headed the Peoples Temple, asked the U. S. State Department to stop Rep. Ryan from going to Cuyana. However, he did accompany Ryan on the trip, and some claim he could have warned Ryan and prevented the assassination of the congressman and some members of his party. He has also been criticized for allegedly not revealing all he knew about what was going on in Jonestown prior to the assassination and the mass suicides that resulted.

Lane has had some resistance to his lecture tour; the University of Vermont decided not to let him speak because students said they did not want to take part in sensationalizing the Jonestown atrocities. But his agent has claimed Lane is booked solid through March 15.

An editorial which expressed negative feeling about RPI's student union's hiring Lane ran in the student newspaper Wednesday. Lane commands a lecture fee of \$2,750.

The editorial questioned the concept of "free" speech in light of Lane's fee.

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
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

NISKAYUNA - Pauline Groot "was trying very hard to do something good for the world" when she joined the People's Temple. She died trying:

Pauline, 29, a 1967 graduate of Niskayına High School and a 1971 graduate of State University at Buffalo, died along with 900-other men, women and children in the temple's jungle settlement in Jonestown, Guyana, last November.

It is with difficulty that Pauline's parents, Cornelius Groot, a scientist at the Knolls Atomic Power Laboratory here, and Elizabeth Groot, a librarian, speak of their daughter's tragic death.

Her father said Pauline joined the temple group soon after she had graduated with a degree in chemical engineering from Buffalo in 1971. She moved to California (Submitting Office: ALANY

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toward the end of that year and left for Guyana in December 1977 to teach high school math and science.

The Groots went to visit their daughter in California several times. They first saw her in Ukiah, where the temple had a large church and a solid following. Later, she moved to San Francisco, where the temple also had a church, and her parents visited her there as well.

"We visited her in May 1972. We went down to visit because she clearly was not coming to visit us... She was helping the people of the temple with their jobs and trying to find a job of her own," her father said of his first visit to California.

He said the temple group appeared to be very serviceoriented, and its members were very willing to help people. "They never turned anyone down," he said.

Why did his daughter go there?

"She did have trouble getting along with people... She felt welcomed there. In many places before she hadn't felt

welcomed. She was very intelligent. Very knowledgeable about things, but not about people," Groot said.

He said that during his first week-long visit to Ukiah his daughter found a job as a companion for a 90-year-old woman. "I felt it was the start of her making her cwn living and starting her own life," he said.

Groot said he found the temple members to be "able, competent people." In fact, Groot and his wife were put to work driving a nurse to a night-shift job and an 80-year-old blind woman to the doctor. He said the temple group was "very protective of the women and wouldn't let them out to travel after dark alone."

Groot said he left his daughter after that first visit feeling "reasonably secure." His concern was not so much about the people she was working and staying with, but rather a question of "divided loyalty."

"If you saw a member of your family with a different loyalty about to leave the family, you would be perturbed," he said.

During that first visit, the Groots attended a People's Temple church service. He said there was much audience participation in the service, reminiscent of some Southern church sessions. "They made powerful appeals for money. . . . It was the most powerful appeal I've seen," Groot said.

After their return to their 2512 Whamer Lane home in Niskayuna, Groot said, his daughter wrote "spasmodically." She held a succession of small jobs during her years with the temple.

"She liked it because she was doing good. She was trying very hard to do some good for the world," he said.

Groot said his daughter saw the People's Temple as something akin to the Peace Corps. The group operated a senior citizens home, a home for the retarded and even an animal shelter, he said.

"She could see that by all the temple members working together things could be accomplished that were not possible for an individual to do," Groot said.

Pauline visited her Niskayuna home in 1973, and the Groots traveled to California in 1975 and 1977 to see their daughter. Over the years she had worked as a tutor, a nursing home aide and a physical therapist.

"She had trouble keeping jobs. She never really found a job that used her technical training. She did enjoy tutoring in San Francisco. She worked as a nurse's aide. Again she was trying to do good.

"The people responded to her. She would smile at them and they would smile back," her father said.

It was when the funding for her job as a physical therapist ran out that Pauline elected to travel to Guyana. Her father said the temple had offered her a math and science teaching job in Jonestown, something she wanted to tackle.

"We were startled when she left the country

without stopping by to see us," Groot said. "We were notified just before she left."

Groot said he hadn't realized how many people had gone to Jonestown until the tragedy there began to unravel. He said his daughter told them the Jonestown settlement was a temple agricultural mission. -

Groot said his daughter seemed very happy in Guyana. She wrote more often and to members of the family to whom she hadn't written before. "We thought all was well," he said.

Groot was in Chicago when the Jonestown horror story began to unfold in late November. It wasn't until Dec. 8 that officials at Dover (Del.) Air Force Base, using dental records the Groots provided, were able to identify Pauline's body.

"When I read about Ryan (the slain U.S. congressman), I realized something was very wrong," Groot said. "Then when I read about the large number of dead, I wondered if she was among the survivors or the dead. By Thursday of that week, it was clear there were very few survivors."

A call from the U.S. State Department on Dec. 8 confirmed that Pauline was not one of the survivors.

The recounting of their daughter's story was plainly a difficult process for the Groots. Mrs. Grootspoke little, and wept through much of the discussion. She termed the whole incident "inexplicable."

Groot explained that "we gladly share our joys, but we dislike to share our tragedies." But he added: "This tragedy is much bigger than us."

Why was Groot willing to speak?

"I'm a scientist, and I feel things are better! known than hidden," he said.

Groot also bears no ill will toward the People's Temple's leader, the Rev. Jim Jones, who apparently ordered his followers to drink the poison that left ice: all but a handful dead in the jungles of Guyana.

First in Latin, and then in English, Groot said: "Of the dead say nothing but good."

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


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

- 3. Defendant, the Peoples Temple Christian Church Company Limited, is a corporation organized pursuant to the laws of the nation of Guyana. On information and belief, at all relevant

times the Peoples Temple Christian Church Company Limited was doing business in this District in its own name or and through its alter ego, the People Temple of the Disciples of Christ.

- 4. Defendant, Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ Church in Guyana, is a corporation organized pursuant to the laws of the nation of Guyana. On information and belief, the Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ Church in Guyana at all relevant times was doing business in this District in its own name or through its alter ego, the Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ.
- 5. Defendant, Asociacion Religiosa Pro San Pedro, S.A., is an association or corporation organized pursuant to the laws of the Republic of Panama. On information and belief, this association or corporation was organized for the purpose of holding the assets of the Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ or its alter egos and it is an alter ego of the Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ doing business in this District.
- 6. On or about November 18, 1978, the defendant, Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ, acting for itself or through its agents or its alter egos, did negligently or through willful and wanton conduct fail to take steps to protect from wrongful injury or death over 900 persons in Jonestown, Guyana, leading to an emergency situation which was a threat to health, safety and decency. On information and belief, James Jones as the alter ego, chief officer and agent of the Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ and its alter egos did intentionally, negligently or through willful and wanton conduct abet or cause the deaths.
- 7. The more than 900 persons referred to in paragraph 8 above were members of the Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ community in Jonestown who expressly or impliedly contracted with the Peoples Temple Disciples of Christ or its

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alter egos for the necessities of life and the incidents thereto including proper burial.

- 8. The defendant Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ or its alter egos failed to tend to the needs of its members in the emergency situation resulting from the deaths referred to above.
- 9. Among other things, the defendant Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ or its alter egos failed to protect or provide for the survivors of the events of November 18, 1978; it failed to search for and secure from harm the lives and property of its members; it failed to take reasonable steps to transport the bodies of its deceased members to a suitable place for burial or to the relatives of the deceased; it failed to provide for the burial of its members or to protect the deceased from indignities.
- 10. The United States requested the government of Guyana to permit burial on its soil which request was denied. The Government of Guyana then requested the United States to remove the bodies from Guyana.
- 11. Because of the failure of the defendant Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ or its alter egos to perform its duties, including those described in paragraph 9 above, the United States of America, for reasons including public health, safety and decency, did perform such acts with the intent to be paid therefor.
- 12. The United States continues to perform such acts and is entitled to compensation therefor.
- 13. Thus far, the United States has incurred damages of \$4,298,000. The United States expects to accrue further damages.
- 14. On information and belief, each of the defendants in this action and James Jones disregarded the separate forms and corporate status of the defendants and each defendant and James Jones are the alter egos of each other.

WHEREFORE, the United States demands:

- (1) Judgment against the defendants for the total amount of damages incurred by the United States in this matter; and
 - (2) Such other relief as is just and equitable.

DETAILS:

Attached to referenced memorandum was a document discovered at Jonestown apparently written by a member of PT. It is the judgement of INTD that his document was prepared for an official of the People's Progressive Party (PPP) of Guyana, which is aligned with the USSR. PPP leaders are Cheddi and Janet Jagan. According to the attached document the PT was openly pro-Soviet and had some connections with the CPUSA. (U)

As advised by E. C. Peterson, W. O. Cregar memorandum dated 1/18/79, captioned as above, INTD had sent leads to field offices where our top CPUSA assets were located. The following was reported. (U)

CG 5824-OA advised that the CPUSA has in the past, assisted Cheddi Jagan of the PPP in obtaining financial support within the United States. The asset further advised that Attorney Charles Garry, associated with the PT, was a personal friend of Dorothy Healey and Al Richmond, former leaders of the CPUSA who have since broken with the CPUSA.

NY 694-OA advised that Jagen has often visited the United States and that the CPUSA has a fraternal relationship with the PPP. It is noted that the CPUSA and PPP are both pro-Soviet. (U)

San Francisco Office reported that CPUSA members connected with the American-Russian Institute have had contacts with the PT and the CPUSA members have aided Soviet consulate officials in contacting PT members in San Francisco.

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INTD notes that there has been numerous news articles linking the PT with the Soviet Union. INTD is interested in reviewing any additional information regarding the Soviet involvement with PT. (U)

ALL INTELLATION OF APPLIANCE OF THE STATE OF

We are putting some things in writing, as we do not know if wiretapping + bugs are a problem here or not. We feel it is for your benefit as well as ours -- especially with the kind of conditions we are living under. It is more for you than for us, as we do not want to cause you any pain. We have to be very careful not to show our friendship to you or the PPP. We were told by some who said they were members of your party, to be very careful-extremely careful. Even someone in the PNC gave us a friendly warning and said that there were some in the government who are suspicious of us because of our connections with the Soviet Union and their Embassy here in Georgetown. We would have never the dreamed of coming to your home at night if it were not for the friendly warnings. We did not know what to do. Right now, we may not even be able to stay in Guyana for even talking to you. We were told by someone in the U.S., who has since died, and who helped get us into Guyana, to be discreet when we contact you. He admired you very much. There are some of the cabinet members and people in the government who speak very well of you. At least, they have told us that. But they have also warned us that any contact with you would be the end of our relationship, with them.

There was immediate resistance to Peoples Temple because we had been friendly to you. They knew that Jim Jones had gone to Freedom House and that he had spoken with your wife on one occasion. We had a hell of a time because of this and because we had spoken positively about you. They knew we also had other contacts. We were not hesitant to come to you for advice in the early days, but we have been advised to be careful because the time has not come for us to be affiliated with the PPP. We are friendly with your Party, and to whoever comes into our project and medical clinic. We do not ask who is friendly to the PPP or PNC. But for your sake as well as ours, it probably would not be good for us to make our friendship known. We have no ties here.

We are in no position to help you overtly, as we are not Guyanese citizens. We would come out more, but we were told by some Soviet officials and members of the PPP, that it would not be wise because the situation of our citizenship has not been settled. Our attempts to become naturalized have not been responded to. When we have discussed it, we have never gotten any positive feedback. Until the situation is resolved, we have no real security—unless you might know of some magic way of getting it done. If you are a citizen, you have bargaining powers Because of this, it would create a problem if we were to attract a lot of attention. You can understand why we have to be care-

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ful. In fact, one son told us reliably, the if we were to be caught speaking to you, we would have to leave Guyana.

We were asked by PNC government officials to come out in favor of the referendum with the Council of Churches, and we refused. It was also brought up locally in the Northwest. Of course we did not come out, and they wanted to know why. We took a great risk in doing this. We do not know what the repercussions of not coming out in favor of the referendum may be. It took a great stand to resist all of the pressures we encountered over the referendum. The PNC gave us hell because they wanted us to vote and we did not want to do that. If we had done so, you know what we would have voted.

We know that there are people in the PNC who hate us because we are Socialists. We have been told by someone in the cabinet that there is one cabinet member in particular who hates our guts, and does so just because we are Socialists, and because we have Soviet connections. We have been openly Pro-Soviet, and have a strong Soviet alliance. We never speak against you or your Party. We are pure in our Socialist commitment. We are Marxist-Leninists. TASS representatives came to Jonestown and did a remarkable story. When we spoke to them, we also spoke well of you and we did so at the Russian Embassy also. We disagree heartily with the Chinese these days, and we are disgusted. We have discredited China's doctrine of the Three Worlds in our school.

Our best friends in the U.S. are also your best friends—like Carlton Goodlett. Our people are taught to respect you fully. The MIRROR had something to say about Peoples Temple, and our people do not understand it at all. We haven't even let the people at the project see it yet, and they normally read the MIRROR from cover to cover. They will not understand why they have been attacked by people they have praised. We know that you did not give this to the MIRROR, but it would be alienating to our people if they read it. We wanted to come to you about it, so that it could be remedied. We mentioned it to our friends at the Soviet Embassy who said they would speak to you and your wife about it, and about our concern. Everyone there respects you.

We were told by leaders in the C.P.U.S.A., that we were about to be destroyed in the U.S. Even Carlton Goodlett does not want us to go back to the U.S. now because he thinks that Jim Jones and others in our organization will either be framed or assasinated. We have sent money (in the form of cash) to several African liberation movements. Jim did not want to leave the struggle in the U.S., and he

he did not know what to do. Had he remained, he would have been thrown in the sea. He had to use some sort of discretion—that is the only reason he did it. He did not like doing it, so please tell him if you have any solutions or how we can survive in Guyana and get along. Particularly now since the referendum, they have all the power. We are catching so much hell because of our work in liberation struggles back in the U.S.. We are doing our part and you can check with the pepple at the Soviet Embassey here. They know we are doing our part—and we cannot do all that we want to do.

If they were to come down on us, we would resist. We have more loyalty to you than some of your own Party members. We have written letters and made phone calls on your behalf when people were saying you had illegal guns and were trying to frame you. We were trying to help you at the time. No matter who comes in to Jonestown, and no matter what they have said, we have always defended you. No matter what anyone says negatively, Guyana needs to be unified. If the struggle comes, we would be one of your strongest assets because we are all committed Socialists and Pro-Soviet. Come to Jonestown and see if you aren't kindly and cordially received. (Those who have come and prefessed to be PPP, have just raved about it). The only thing is that your coming might be a problem to both yourself and to us. It might get us all thrown out. So what if it does—but we have to be realistic. Please understand our position.

The transcripts were reportedly turned over to the FBI by an unknown American who "copied down the messages." The article also states that the FBI has been able to decode the messages by use of a Peoples Temple code book in possession of the FBI (a copy of the article is attached) - 42 36 - 180 The Laboratory Division is unaware of any transcripts of coded messages in possession of the FBI meeting the description of those discussed in the article. The Laboratory's Technical Evaluation Unit (TEU), which includes the Cryptanalysis Subunit, is in possession of photocopies of four "code books" which were recovered from Jonestown. Our staff is currently analyzing these code books, along with other materials involved in the investigation, and will be preparing a Laboratory Report regarding the results of the examination. TEU also has two sets of tape recordings (a total of 68 tapes) of intercepted messages which have been made available to the Bureau by amateur radio operators (Hams). These recordings were apparently made prior to the visit of Congressman Ryan to Guyana and have not, to date, disclosed before the murder of Ryan. As of this time, no transcripts have been made.

The four "code books" in our possession contain a fairly sophisticated system for secret communication. It would have been extremely difficult to decript coded portions of Peoples Temple messages without access to the codes. The code system is a type of "double-meaning" code wherein innocuous-sounding words and phrases are transmitted in lieu of the intended message. Without access to the key, i.e., the code book, or without being able to correlate code words with observed events it would be virtually impossible to break this type of code through analysis. The code books employ an extensive "vocabulary" including code words for many prominent people, organizations, agencies, places, things, events, et cetera (\mathcal{U})

The Criminal Investigative Division has advised that they have been informed by a Legat, Robert Oglesby, who is in Guyana, that Guyanese Officials state they have no knowledge regarding the source of the article (U)



One of the Georgetown survivors, Paula Adams, still has contacts with rauia Adams, still has contacts with prominent Guyanese, including an ambassador and a well-known attor-ncy. She has said she had an affair with the ambassador.

In another development, it was learned here that Rex McKay, the attorney representing Beikman, Jones and Larry Layton, traveled recently to the United States. Layton has been charged with killing Ryan and four others at Port Kaituma and attempt-

ing to kill three other persons in the same attack Nov. 18. McKay reportedly went, in part, to arrange for payment of his legal fees.

Sources said McKay asked one of the defendant's families for \$20,000, the defendant's families, for school, to be paid to a bank deposit outside Guyana. Whether he received the money or whether he met with anyonc else connected to the Peoples Temple while in the United States is not known, the sources said.

Reports of Jones Fortune Denied by Mother-in-Law

RICHMOND, Ind., Jan. 28 (AP)-The mother in-law of Peoples Temple leader Jim Jones, the man who led more than 900 followers to their deaths in a mass suicide-murder ritual last year, has denied reports that the cult founder left a multimillion-dollar estate.

"What has been publicized about "What has been publicated about Jim and his millions just isn't true," said Charlotte Baldwin, mother of Jones' wife, Marceline, who died along with Jones and two of their children at the temple settlement in the children in the settlement in the the steaming jungles of Guyana last November.

Baldwin, who lives in this western Indiana community where Jones and his wife were raised, said Jones' adopted daughter, Suzanne, 26, told her a \$17,000 account in Nassau and some property were Jones' only remaining assets.

However, at a hearing held Tuesday However, at a hearing held Tuesday in San Francisco to dissolve the church and establish a receivership, it was determined that Peoples Temple had known assets of \$12 million.

Superior Court Judge Ira Brown named Robert Fabian, an attorney and banker to wind up the temple's

and banker, to wind up the temple's financial affairs as its receiver.

Jones' Sect Asked to Be Registered in Panama

Exclusive



It is estimated that the "People's Temple", the organization responsible for the assassination of Congressman Leo J. Ryan and the subsequent mass suicide of more than 900 members of the religious sect, has the sum of 15 thousand balboas deposited in Panama.

Our reporters have learned that the funds were deposited in the Union Bank of Switzerland and the Swiss Banking Corporation, both of which are located in the city of Panama. The Temple also has a safety deposit box in the Union Bank of Switzerland. The number of this box is 146-75 HUK.

"La Republica" has also determined that last September two members of the organization, Mrs. Teresa Gean Buford and Carolyn Leyton, used the services of a law firm on 31st St. East in the capital, to register an organization named "Pro San Pedro S.A."

The "People's Temple" has four accounts in these banks. We have not been able to determine the amount of money in these accounts, but we do know that their numbers are 222-00042, 220-11760 J, 121-135 A and 100-468-1.

The authorities in Georgetown, Guyana, have revealed that the funds belonging to the "People's Temple" were deposited in Panama and Venezuela. This money has been left to the Communist Party of the Soviet Union. We have not been able to determine whether or not it has made any withdrawals from these accounts. The future of these accounts is uncertain. They have expressly been left to the Soviets, but according to reports, the United States government is taking steps to obtain this money for itself. The total sum is estimated to be 15 million dollars.

Local San Pedro S.A. Officials Resign

The "Asociacion Religiosa Pro San Pedro, S.A." has been linked to the name of Jim Jones, the person responsible for the deaths of more than 900 people in Guyana. One of the provisions of this organization states that if the organization is dissolved, "Its remaining assets after payment of all debts and liabilities should be alloted to the "People's Temple of the Disciples of Christ, a corporation in the State of California, United States of America."

This morning "La Republica" studied the microfilm records on this organization which are held in the "Registro de la Propriedad". We found the "Asociacion Religiosa Pro San Pedro, S.A." listed in document number 1881 for March 4, 1977. This is kept in the Fifth Circuit Notary's office, whose notary public is Pablo L. Arosemena.

Our last edition revealed that last September Mrs. Teresa Gean Buford and Mrs. Carolyn Leyton, two members of the People's Temple headed by the late Jim Jones, used the services of the law firm "Bufete Tapia", located on 31st Street in Panama City. They contacted this firm to register the "Asociacion Religiosa Pro San Pedro, S.A."

Felipe Santiago Tapia Carrillo is the president of "San Pedro", Eloy Alfaro is vice president and treasurer, and Rodolofo Evaristo Mendoza Almanza is secretary.

The principal goal of "San Pedro" is described as the implementation of the following measures within the Republic of Panama or abroad:

1. To finance religious programs in general and recruit and train the personnel necessary for these programs in Central and South America;

- 2. To receive bequests and donations in accordance with the laws governing the transfer of assets through wills. To acquire and maintain in any other manner any type of property, including but not limited to stocks, bonds, or other securities belonging to other companies;
- 3. To dispose of any type of property in accordance with the goal and purposes of the organization by selling, ceding, transfering, exchanging, leasing, mortgaging, etc. any of the property.

The same document notes that "San Pedro's" capital stock amounts to ten thousand U.S. dollars. This amount is divided into one hundred shares of stock each having a value of one hundred dollars. The document points out, however, that "the amount of capital could be increased". "Bufete Tapia" is named as the resident agent of the organization in the Republic of Panama.

We also learned today that "San Pedro's" directors (Tapia, Alfaro and Mendoza) have resigned their posts because "they no longer were satisfied with them."

Daniel Jacinto-Fuentes

None of the international banks in our capital which were mentioned by international news agencies as possible holders of funds belonging to the "People's Temple" have agreed to provide any information about their numbered accounts. (The "People's Temple" is the organization involved in the assassinations and suicides in Guyana.)

"Ia Republica" interviewed directors or representatives of these banks. They noted that the National Banking Law (No. 18, January 28, 1959) does not allow them to provide any information. This law sets prison terms and fines for violating banking secrecy. It was therefore not possible to determine whether or not these funds exist in this country. These funds are reputed to amount to 14 million balboas.

The Director of the National Banking Commission

We interviewed Mr. Mario de Diego, Jr., the Executive Director of the National Banking Commission, who was kind enough to interrupt a conference to speak to us. He informed us, "I am sorry to say that I, neither personally, nor as Director of the National Banking Commission, have official or unofficial information on these deposits. Neither do the other members of the commission. We are therefore not able to give you any information. We know as much about this as you and the general public."

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The director continued by saying, "In any case, banking law in our country expressly, categorically and absolutely prohibits us from supplying any information on bank deposits. Panama's credit as an international financial center rests on strict and constant observance of banking secrecy and of the principle of confidentiality".

We then asked Mr. de Diego, "Does this mean that your commission cannot conduct an investigation to determine whether or not these deposits exist?"

Mr. de Diego replied, "That's right. We have absolutely no authority to take such action. This would be a violation of the principle of banking secrecy".

We then asked him, "Would you be able to take action to protect these deposits if someone tried to appropriate these funds without a legal right to them?"

Mr. de Diego answered, "We could not take action even in that case. The only way the real owners or those who claim to be the owners could gain access to information on possible deposits would be through the courts. Only in this way could any action be taken. Banking law is clear on this point. Such action has been taken in the past to recover funds held in the banks in this country".

An Official Statement

When we met with Mr. de Diego, the director of the National Banking Commission, he informed us that he was willing to make a statement on this subject to answer some questions and clear up some misconceptions on this matter. He noted that the government might issue an official statement on this matter.

Jim Jones Assassinated

Georgetown, December 23, 1978

A jury here has declared that Jim Jones, the leader of the sect the "People's Temple", was assassinated. Jim Jones ordered more than 900 of his followers to commit suicide in his community in Guyana.

The jury announced its verdict after conducting six days of hearings with the people of Matthews Ridge, which is close to the community of Jonestown. It also declared that Jones was responsible before the law for the death of 912 members of the sect.

The jury, which was made up of four men and one woman, affirmed that Jones was assassinated despite the fact that a scientist had determined that Jones had committed suicide.

The jury did not explain its decision or reveal the evidence that led it to the conclusion that Jones had been assassinated.

Most of Jones' followers committed suicide on November 18 at Jones' orders. They did this by drinking a beverage poisoned with cyanide. That same evening a group of Temple members assassinated U.S. Congressman Leo Ryan and four other people who were trying to leave with a woman who wanted to leave the sect.

Jones' cadaver was found with a bullet wound behind one ear.

Tragedy in Guyana Mankind, the Worshipping Animal

Voltaire said that if God did not exist then man would have invented him. When men did not understand the mysteries and phenomena of the universe, of the moon and the sun, of lightning, thunder and fire, he attributed supernatural powers to them. He has continued to do this to these days. It is possible to find churches or at least traces of ancient cults in every American or European town.

Paredes

In primitive societies we can still find people worshipping ancient gods side by side with the great modern religions. In New Guinea there is the "cargo cult" which arose from the worship of cargo planes which dropped their loads over this area during the Second World War. Along with these simple, though, absurd cults we also find white magic, black magic, sorcery and witchcraft (almost intentional in our environment) devil worship, etc., etc.

Christianity split up into various groups, Protestantism arose, and a number of sects developed within Protestantism. These sects were all a variation on the same theme. Most of them appeared in the United States where they seemed to be a marvelous business protected and aided by the government through splendid Solomonic laws.

A modern country cannot consider itself "in" (if you will forgive the expression) unless there is a paragraph in its constitution proclaiming "freedom of religion" even though more necessary types of freedom for the "kingdom of this world" are ignored or amitted. There is a disquieting need which could very well be called the "cult of cult" in that amazing northern country from which all that we have, all that we do and all that we should do comes. This phenomenon is damaging its inhabitants' well-being. It is very strange that a government that has the best paid employees in the world on its payroll could fail to see that this trend poses a serious threat to the emotional and mental balance of its citizens.

After the tragicomedy in Guyana it is hard for anyone to doubt the danger in this "gringo cultomania". The Mason family had already provided us with a magnificent example of freedom of cult.

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Their hair-raising crimes would have been followed by a speedy trial and fast and hard punishment in any other country. In the United States, however, an incredible legal battle was necessary to make it possible to punish them.

This "redeemer mania" goes back to the time of Cromwell. The men of this time brought a magnificent idea of freedom with them on the Mayflower. They also brought with them, however, the seeds of religious intolerance, the same intolerance which they had fled from when they boarded ship in Plymouth to come to America. Though it may seem paradoxical, this intolerance is tied to a large dose of childish credibility which has made it possible for sects and cults of all kinds to develop alongside Christianity and Protestantism.

They have made incredible advances in science but in religion they have turned to devil worship, to witchcraft and to personality worship of any maniac who thinks he is a Messiah. Legions of preachers and evangelists run all over the country speaking against the sins of the times and making vast fortunes for speaking against a society whose system makes it possible to "speak of the pear and eat it".

One of the United States' most serious mistakes was to officially acknowledge the existence of more than 500 churches, knowing that there are more than 3,000 cults. Most of these cults present a very serious danger to the American family as its children are the coveted prey of cult fanaticism. One of the most powerful and dangerous cults is that of the Korean, Moon. This man uses the pretext of uniting all the religions of the world to order young people of both sexes to collect money for him (a \$250 a week quota) and forces them to work at great sacrifice. He himself, however, lives in a luxurious home whose cost has been estimated at more than \$600,000.00.

What is alarming about this is that for some time now this has been infiltrating our weak, trusting and undefended America. This has been possible first of all because of our proverbial indifference. These people have futhermore been aided by our constitutions and by the good will of the many influential madmen among us.

It is true that freedom of religion is an inalienable right of man. However, it is also true that abuse of this liberty (as of many others) should be stopped instantly at the moment that it threatens the mental health and the shaky mental stability of a modern society.

Our part of the world must avoid the slaughter that took place in Europe during the Middle Ages. We must avoid incidents such as the St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre ordered by Catherine de Medici against

the French Protestants in Paris in 1572. We must avoid shameful situations such as that of Ireland, where Catholics and Protestants are presently battling. The nations of Latin America must prevent the infiltration of more religions. Laws and constitutions are not needed to do this; they have been pushed aside whenever the political situation has required it. As a last resort we can turn to the famous response made by the Spaniard to an English evangelist who tried to preach to him, "Look here Englishman, I don't believe in mine so how am I going to believe in yours?"

Now that the Guyana tragedy has shocked the world they will try to do something. The Department of Justice, however, might refuse to investigate this matter because it could violate constitutional guarantees of religious freedom. Mr. Robert Hay, a spokesman for the department, mentioned this point to the press during the Guyana tragedy.

Meanwhile a third tragedy is brewing somewhere else. We can only hope that this aspect of democracy does not reach us as our problems are already serious and worrisome. We hope that this tragedy will serve as a warning to our political directors and to the Catholic Church which at one time had the power to excommunicate and now watches the "dance of the sects" with seeming indifference.

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



Review of the K36 cassette revealed that the shooter standing in front of the tractor was firing what appeared to be a bolt-action rifle which did not have a telescopic sight. Therefore, this weapon is consistent with and could be the K15 rifle listed in Laboratory report 81219043 S NM, dated December 22, 1978. However, due to lack of sufficient detail in the K36 video-tape it was not possible to definitely establish that this firearm was K15.

It was not possible to determine the calibers or manufacturers of any of the weapons fired by the individuals in the trailer.





Guyana, Dec. 28 GEORGETOWN. (AP) - The People's Temple commune at Jonestown was stocked with thousands of doses of dangerous drugs, smuggled into Guyana. Two survivors of the sect said at least some of the drugs were used to control those who might defect.

A list of the drug inventory found in Jonestown shows large supplies of depressants. Survivors and law enforcement officials here said at least some of these were used to control the behavior of persons viewed as dangerous by the Rev. Jim Jones, the leader of the Temple.

Included in the drug warehouse were Quaaludes, Demerol, Valium, morphine and 11,000 doses of Thorazine, a drug used to calm people with extreme mental problems.

Checks with medical officials and medical journals produced a profile of a drug supply that promoted suicidal tendencies, could cause hallucinations, blurred vision, confusion, speech disturbances, involuntary movements and emotional euphoria and depression.

Since there were no records, it was impossible to determine how frequently or extensively the drugs were used.

Perhaps Imposed Forcefully

Strategy Council on Drug Abuse Prevention, said the list of drugs from the Peo-ple's Temple indicated "there were a lot of psychotic patients, or they were using them to control people."

Dale Parks, a nursing supervisor at Jonestown who is a trained therapist for respiratory ailments, said that he knew some of the drugs were used to control would-be defectors in the commune's "extended care unit." But he professed shock at the extent of the drugs found there, saying, "Oh, my God, I don't believe it. "

Mr. Parks fled Jonestown on Nov. 18 with Representative Leo J. Ryan, a California Democrat who had been there on a fact-finding mission. A short time later, Mr. Ryan, three American newsmen and Mr. Parks's mother were slain at a remote airstrip.

Those are absolutely hard-line, hardcore drugs," Mr. Parks said when read a: partial inventory from Jonestown.

"There's no way that many people were receiving treatment," he said in reference to the amount of drugs found in Jonestown. "I know they were using things to keep people under control, but not like this."



In response to Mr. Nellis' inquiry, the FBI is aware of large quantities of controlled drugs found at Jonestown, Guyana, following the incident which occurred there on November 18, 1978. An investigation has been interested to determine the source of the drugs and the nature and extent of their use. The drugs are currently in the custody of local authorities in Georgetown, Guyana. To date, the source of the drugs is not known. Investigation at this time indicates that all drugs were probably used by the inhabitants of Jonestown as opposed to compercialized trafficking in parcetics.

On November 18, 1975, Dennis was an "out" patient at Martin Luther King, Jr., Hospital, 12021 South Wilmington Avenue, Los Angeles, California, when X rays were taken of both knees. On June 26, 1972, Dennis was treated for a dog bite on the upper left arm. No X rays or stitches were noted in the medical records.



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

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
