[Redacted], U. S. Department of State, telephonically advised 1/4/79, that Stanley Clayton left Guyana via flight 942, KLM. He will arrive in Miami 1:30 p.m., today. SA [Redacted] telephonically advised.

Bob Oglesby, Guyana, at 8:48 a.m. furnished description of Stanley Roy Clayton, which is as follows:
 DOB: [Redacted] POB: [Redacted] California; American Passport Number [Redacted] Race: Black; Height: 5'10"; Weight: 180 lbs (u)

Oglesby stated Clayton was in Jonestown when the suicides began and went into the jungle returning to Jonestown when everyone was dead. He recovered his passport and at that time heard one shot, fleeing again into the jungle (u)

Clayton has changed his story several times, however, was paid by the "National Enquirer," San Francisco, for his story. Oglesby stated Clayton would be a good witness to the incident. SA [Redacted] was advised. (u)
