On November 30, 1978, Special Agents [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]  
all assigned to FBI Headquarters, traveled to Georgetown, Guyana, to assist in the investigation of captioned matter. They remained in Guyana until December 16, 1978. Special Agent Robert J. Oglesby, Legal Attache Caracas, Venezuela, was already in Guyana. (u)

Attached are FD-302s, FBI Laboratory Report, and an investigative insert indicating pertinent investigation conducted in Guyana during the aforementioned period. (u)

The attachments appertain to interviews conducted with Guyana National Police authorities, Guyana Pathologist, Doctor Leslie mootoo, examination of documents and tapes made available to the FBI by the Guyana National Police, and two Guyana National Police Reports: examination of documents and a listing of tapes and documents to be returned to the United States for further review and analysis: an FBI fire-arms identification laboratory report containing the following significant findings (u)

1. Two bullets were recovered from Leo Ryan; one is .30 caliber, the other .38 Special or .357 Magnum. The .30 caliber bullet was identified as having been fired from the .308 Winchester caliber Remington, Model 700, rifle. The .38 caliber bullet could have been fired from the .357 Magnum Ruger, Security Six, revolver, but not from any to the other recovered weapons.
2. The two bullets recovered from Monica Bagby were identified as having been fired from the .38 Special Smith and Wesson, Model 36, revolver (u) recovered from Larry Layton.
3. The other weapon identified as having fired ammunition components recovered at the airstrip is the .22 caliber Ruger, Model 10-22, rifle.

4. Also present at the airstrip, as evidenced by recovered ammunition components, was a .308 Winchester caliber or 7.62 NATO (they are the same cartridge) rifle and a .380 Auto caliber pistol which have not been recovered. (u)

Authority for FBI to interview pertinent individuals in Guyana, especially those not returning to the United States, was not granted. Documents and tapes obtained from Jonestown, Guyana, and maintained at the United States Consulate, Georgetown, Guyana, were not turned over to the FBI until December 29, 1978, when these items were forwarded to the United States for investigative review by the FBI. (u)

On December 6 and 7, 1978, FBI Headquarters personnel traveled to Kaituma Airfield, near Jonestown, Guyana. Ballistics related items were located at the Kaituma airstrip and custody was immediately assumed by Guyana National Police authorities. Observations at Jonestown on above dates indicated that voluminous documents, wooden trunks, and other material were still in Jonestown. Guyana National Police took custody and control of some documents. Numerous tapes were also observed. On December 7, 1978, five wooden trunks were filled with the numerous tapes and observed the previous date, and tapes were taken into custody by the Guyana National Police and returned to their police headquarters in Georgetown. Douglas Ellice, American Consulate, Georgetown, Guyana, advised that he had received numerous checks of various types totalling over two hundred thousand dollars from the Guyana National Police authorities and Richard Martin, American Vice Consul, who obtained these checks at Jonestown, Guyana, when he visited that area. (u)


Attached are photo copies of a sample number of the checks in the possession of Mr. Ellice. It was noted that the first three items are for fifty dollars thirty three cents each and the remittances are from three different areas in the United States. (u)


Check numbers 110 and 111 drawn on Barclays Bank of California, by Phyllis D. Houston, are for seven hundred and ninety three dollars and sixty three cents, and are noted for Patricia and Judy Houston, room, board (lodging), and educational expenses. The remaining checks are observed to be payable to cash and are all drawn on various accounts at the Bank of Montreal, San Francisco, California. Drawers' signatures appear to be different, but the remaining writing of the payee cash and dollar amounts appear to have been written by a person other than the drawer. (u)

Mr. Ellice advised that he is in the process of returning these checks to their rightful owners as soon as such right ownership is determined. (u)



Here are some more of the informers statements. These were taken off of a tape & some of it I couldn't hear too clearly, but I think that most of it is accurate. It is written ~~as~~ the way they were stated.

There are some more still that I haven't recieved but will do them when I get them.

David Phillips-2 years ago was in high school and a friend of his had a bicycle and he did too. the police came and questioned him about it and he told them that it was someone else totally different and they convicted and arrested the guy they blamed. He said that he told on this unrelated guy because he was slow and small and he wanted to help him. This was in Palo Alto.

Robert Rankin-In virginia he was arrested for forging, writing and cashing checks two of them were caught and the other man escaped and Robert gave the name of the guy that escaped and his whereabouts.

Ken Norton-His real name is Gerald Grubbs. In long Beach 1967 may first he was arrested for grand theft. While being interrogated, he informed the police that a man named Bud Goodman was doing the theft out of the back door. To his knowledge, nothing was ever done about it. (This is all Ken said).

Contonia Jackson- Called the police on her son for tearing up the house. she told the police that her son was also smoking dope little over a month ago. She has called the police other times for other things but didnt say what.

Iola Pikes- Told on some guys who were stealing parts from a car 2 years ago.

Sandra Thompson-Police came by wondering if her brother had robbed the store. She said no because he wasn't home. Then she told him that her cousin had come back and all of a sudden he had hundreds of dollars. They were going to arrest her brother and they had started to beat him up. This was last year Fremont P.D. (u)

Ronald Duckett-Goes now by the nam of Nicki Lawrence- He and his friends broke into a store and he ran off and told the police on the others.

Mai Alexander- When she was 10 years old hom alone with her brothers and sisters , the police knocked on her door and asked her if a little white dog lived around and she said no but that a little white dog lived behind her and they went back there and took the dog to the pound. The owners paid a fine to get him out. They wanted him because he had bitten someone. She said that she didn't know why she told on these people that owned the dog.

Vivian Pennywell- Said that she had an intimate relationship with a detective walking jay. The affair lasted a year and a half. He was a detective of fraud, investigator detective over burglaries and would ask her if she knew certain people that have broken into neighborhoods and ask her if she knew different people that were selling hot items and have and if they had asked her if she would buy any any of them and other detailed questions but she said that she can't recall giving any information about them. She told him that to her knowledge she knew a few of them. He wanted her to ask people that she knew to find out about them. She said that she never got a chance to do it. She answered to the ones that she did know of. She had a sexual relationship with him. Has worked for the Fresno Police Dept. for 18 years and he is still there.

Edith Cordell- Called the police to send her brother home from a tavern. Another time she called them about a drunk man long ago, she doesn't remember what he was doing.

Rob Gieg-Parents called the police on him for having a drunken party at the house while they were at work. So then Rob then told the police on a friend of the family's and his older brother, that he was the one who bought the alcohol, Concord 1967.

Donald Carroll-Turned someone in for disturbing the peace at that time he was working at the Hyatt Regency Hotel as a security officer. He turned in someone who had stolen silverware and liquor from the hotel. (This is all he said on the tape, but I Joan and Ruth Tupper remember speaking with him on the last summer trip and he told us that he was an undercover agent, had a gun and drove some blue car. He sounded like he was bullshitting around and he told us that he finally got out of it because he had to turn in his own friends. He didn't mention anything about this on the tape and so I, (Joan) told Mike Prokes and Grace about it and they are going to meet with him in a counselling type situation and find out more about it. (

Joanne Paul- 2 years ago she called the police on her husband, Robert Paul for fighting her and using karate, she said that he was drunk he kicked her in the back and she was bleeding from the nose. Every time she called the police he would get away so she had to call the police three times before they could get him. She said that it was necessary that she call them because she thought that he would hurt her.

Rhuletta Brown- Called the police because her companion and her were fighting and when the police came, they found out that they were from Peoples Temple. They told the officers that they were from the church and that Jim Jones was their Pastor and they told them of their background and then she said it was alright. Joanne and Robert said while the officers were present that Jim was going to get them and that Father doesn't teach us this kind of behavior". The police then told them how they shouldn't fight and it was okay.

Earnestine T. March- In 1966 Called the F.B.I. because neighbors were selling dope to teenagers and sub teens and she didn't want it to be around her children. Shortly after the neighbors moved.

Lisa Layton- 15 years ago she had a noisy teenage neighbor who would have morning parties instead of going to school. She got tired of them she said that she feels bad about doing this many times and that it was wrong.

Mary Carrasco- 16 years ago she called the police on her husband because they had a big argument and fought and then she had him arrested.

MaryJane Myers- 5 years ago she was babysitting and the man that she was going with threatened her that if she kept on babysitting that he was going to kick her so she called the police and they talked to him on the job and she said that they told him what they were going to do to him if he bothered her any more.

Jessie Boyd- Her ex-husband threatened her with a gun and they had a fight (1969). By the time the police had come she had hit him in the head with a skillet and he was sent to the hospital but they didn't do anything to her because he had a very bad record but she hadn't known it.

J.C. Williams (male) 1965 found on a man a bunch of heroin and he told the FBI and he was sent to jail for five years. J.C. said that when he did this someone had set him up to buy heroin from this guy. He said that he was afraid that someone had informed on him and tried to set him up.

Vickie Moore- In 1965 she gave information to the police regarding a young lady that worked under her supervision who had jumped bail and Vicki posted bond for her. 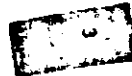

THE CAMPAIGN AGAINST PEOPLES TEMPLE IN PERSPECTIVE  
(A Background Sketch)

For twenty-five years in the U.S.A., Jim Jones and Peoples Temple have worked tirelessly for equality, justice, and humanitarian service. We have organized around issues of civil and human rights, inhuman conditions, and the crying need for world peace and international co-operation. We have a solid record of achievement in drug rehabilitation, in providing opportunities for jobs and education for thousands of young people, in helping untold numbers of persons who were destitute, despondent, in need of medical help, counseling, food, clothing, and shelter. One can well understand how a man like Rev. Jones would be the subject of malicious gossip, lies, hate-campaigns, and even conspiracies orchestrating government agencies, the intelligence establishment, the media, and various individuals who may or may not be duped by these schemes. We have been the object of constant, organized harassment, vandalism, violence, smear campaigns, arsonists, racists, even hired assassins.

Political frame-ups are not unfamiliar to us, and truthfully, we are not surprised that there is today an organized effort to destroy us. But the reality of it is no less offensive, just because it was anticipated, even expected. We cannot stand idly by and endure injustice without protest. In fact, Peoples Temple has earned its unpopularity with certain elements in the United States precisely because it has fought actively against injustice for so many years. We do remember history, and we prefer not to repeat it. The efforts that have been mounted against us are indeed part of a shameful heritage of subterfuge that has

claimed many victims over the years: individuals and groups that were pursuing progressive directions in American life, to bring together oppressed people, overcome racism, and win economic and social justice.

Though we have not gotten to the bottom of the conspiracy to destroy Peoples Temple, we are certain of enough facts to alarm just-minded individuals, and those who wish the democratic system in the United States to survive. Some of these facts have been presented to the press. However, the mass media has been distinguished by its reluctance (if not refusal) to publish any reports that would point to what is really happening. An exception to this is the black press, which has recognized the attempts to destroy us, and has been most supportive of our work.

The story began years ago when certain individuals joined Peoples Temple who had prior experience working with U.S. intelligence establishment and ultra-right wing organizations. The hard facts came to light beginning in late 1976 when two military officers connected with an influential U.S. Senator were caught trespassing near our church while a black woman mayor from Mississippi was speaking to our congregation about her trip to the Peoples Republic of China (We have always attempted to keep informed about alternative forms of government and their accomplishments). The very fact that we pursued these agents and published our startling findings about their spying mission no doubt intensified the determination of those wishing to harm us. Would it have been proper, or more to remain silent about this threat to our rights? We think not. Democracy depends upon the people knowing what is happening to them. What happens to Peoples Temple is only an example, in some instances a harbinger, of what is planned for other minority groups.

The full picture includes a group of people who specifically organized over the last year and a half, at least. They first met secretly to plot a smear and slander campaign in the sensationalist press (they even hired a prominent, expensive public relations firm to help), then conspired to pressure and recruit people who would join them in lies and subterfuges, then went further to harm innocent people, using government officials of the United States.

Some of the devices that have been used in the attempt to destroy us include the following:

--Government agents who have conspired directly with members of the group of 'concerned relatives' (aka Human Freedom Center, Inc.) that have pushed the campaign have offered bribes and blackmail to various people to lie about and denounce Jim Jones and Peoples Temple. American Indian Movement leader Dennis Banks was pressured to do this and was offered help with his own serious legal problems as an enticement.

--Our mail and other communications have been monitored and regularly sabotaged. One large batch of mail, including important legal documents, was doused with a wine-smelling substance. There have been many similar instances.

--Shipments of vital medical supplies and food have been interfered with by U.S. Customs agents. Some have never been delivered.

--News articles, letters, and other communications designed to slander our organization and sow confusion have been planted in various publications on the 'left' and circulated widely in Guyana in the modus operandi that COINTELPRO has used against progressive and civil rights groups in the United States.

--Other 'dirty tricks' have included making phone calls to law-enforcement officials and media representatives of an harassing nature, impersonating members of Peoples Temple to create hostility against the Temple. There have been numerous innuendoes and charges to the effect that Peoples Temple has been guilty of break-ins, bomb threats, vandalism, rape, and even murder...without a shred of evidence.

Thus, the people in the so-called "Human Freedom Center" are only the front line of a conspiracy. They have spend tens of thousands of dollars to pursue their schemes. We are currently investigating the source of their funding. They have brazenly masqueraded as pious, outraged, morally-offended people who are seeking honest redress of grievances. But what lies behind that mask?

Most of the people who have decided to collaborate in these maneuvers (some, evidently, after much pressure), are operating out of personal resentments against Peoples Temple and Jim Jones.

they did not want to follow the path of human service, except on a very superficial level. While they fancied themselves humanitarians, they were only posturing. Eventually, they couldn't go on in the contradiction, yet they could not simply leave goodness alone. They became eager to destroy Jim Jones, who represented to them the kind of human commitment that they were incapable of.

This is a familiar syndrome, and made many of these people susceptible to being used by others who were interested in destroying Peoples Temple for many years: people with strong right-wing, reactionary impulses, who could not stand to see persons of all races and backgrounds co-operating and pursuing their rightful share of rights and opportunities in life. Such people are typified by the followers of McCarthy in the 1950's and the neo-McCarthyites gathering prominence on the current American political scene.

Another group of individuals, not part of Peoples Temple, were furious that their (grown) relatives chose to spend their lives in service to humanitarian goals and the ideals of Peoples Temple rather than to fulfill others' expectations of them. They, too, have a personal grudge against Jim Jones and Peoples Temple, and have joined the efforts to harm us. (u)

Thousands of people all over California and the nation -- progressive leaders, civil rights and community activists, government officials, private citizens, people who have worked with Jim Jones and who have seen his consistent devotion to justice and the struggle for human liberation, are quite aware that we are just another target in a long history of what amounts to an act of treason against ordinary people trying to secure a life for themselves. We are unusual, perhaps, because we are actively demonstrating (in Jonestown) a successful alternative for people oppressed by racism, and we sense a deep responsibility to keep alive the hope and opportunity we express to others.

Among us there are people who would have been dead, in prison, in street gangs, in organized crime, involved in drugs, prostitution; who would today be swelling the welfare rolls, who would be a drain on an already overburdened economy, who would have had nowhere to turn, who would have been abandoned in their later years in squalid hotel rooms, who would have been victimized by rapists, thieves, and muggers -- and would have victimized others -- had it not been for Peoples Temple and Jim Jones. Many were caught in that vicious cycle of poverty, crime, and despair. We are predominantly people who have had very little, if anything of our own: lousy neighborhoods to

live in, terrible educational facilities, unsafe working conditions. Many of us are children of broken homes, and some of us have even been sold into human slavery, right in the twentieth century, in the United States. Today, thanks to our people's collective and our community organizations, built on care and concern for the individual, as exemplified by a most principled and self-sacrificing leader of men, we have been able to achieve a measure of security and well being that we never before have had.

We have painstakingly built this community, this movement, and it has not been easy. We have gone through all kinds of harassments; our buildings have been burned, our animals killed, our children's lives threatened. We have carved out of the virgin forests here a model of human co-operation and love, where people who were once at each others' throats in an environment that fostered violence and gave people no creative outlet for their feelings, are now working together, building a solid foundation and a bright future for our children.

We are determined that it will not be taken away from us.

Memo in re: Arrival of the Party of Congressman Ryan and others

As you know, our information has it that U. S. Congressman Lee is to come to Guyana early next week for the express purpose of "injuring" the Jonestown community, as a part of a larger plan to use Peoples Temple as a vehicle to embarrass the government of Guyana. He will be accompanied by several representatives and certain members of the "Concerned Relatives," and perhaps certain relatives of residents of Jonestown.

As you also know, when he asked to come, our community's response was that we would be willing to see him if he came in the company of other persons we feel are sympathetic to, or at least not hostile to, our community so that a fair view of our community might be reflected.

His reply to our reasonable request is that he is coming anyway. We are resolved not to permit the party to enter Jonestown under those conditions. Accordingly, and in the hope of preventing a serious incident, we ask that you see Minister Vibert Mingo, and make the following requests on our behalf:

- 1) That, if there is any way possible to do so, he make arrangements to notify us if the party is coming in on a plane from the U. S.
- 2) That he ask an appropriate official of the Guyanese Government, on our behalf, to serve the Congressman, upon his arrival at Georgetown with several documents, including a NOTICE, STATEMENT and EXPLANATION, copies of which we are transmitting with this memo. If arrangements cannot be made to effect this service at the airport, then arrangements should be made to do so at his hotel on the day of his arrival.
- 3) To refuse the assistance of the Guyanese Government in facilitating a visit of the party to the N. W. R., including the use of government airplanes and ground transportation, and rest facilities.
- 4) To provide police protection for the boundaries of Jonestown (The Peoples Temple Lease of State Land for Mixed Farming Purposes) in order to prevent trespasses. This is in order that should any attempt to physically enter the area we will not be obliged to use self-help methods to restrain them. In this situation, it will be of the utmost importance that we have advance notice of the instructions that are given local police, and that we meet with them in advance, so that the matter is clearly understood by all, and that there is no chance of any confusion or mis-understanding.

It is our conviction that when this arrangement is firmly established and when it is understood by all that the government will support the normal rights of the residents of Guyana to be safe in their homes from unwanted intrusions, that our communication of same to the Embassy of the U. S. A. will be sufficient to dissuade the Congressman from his (political or politically inspired) enterprise. This format will also minimize the possibility of adverse press coverage of the situation in the U. S. because there will be no actual events or incidents to cover.

I am advised that Rev. Jones decision to remain in Guyana for the time being. I understand that decision. I respect it and I am sure that Rev. Jones will return to this country when he deems it wisest to do so.

From the news stories about Rev. Jones absence from the country, it is clear that many persons opposed to Rev. Jones are attempting to exploit the absence for their political purposes. I am frankly appalled at such efforts. I hope that you will not be persuaded to assist in their efforts. (u)

Dear Mr. President:

I would like to commend to you highly the work of Reverend Jim Jones and the Peoples Temple. I first became acquainted with Jim Jones when he and his church came out early on behalf of my defense when I was in prison on charges for which I was later vindicated. This was at great risk to himself and his church, because my cause was not a popular one in church circles at that time. But I found on later personal contact with him, and to this day, that he is an ardent spokesman for justice who will speak out whenever he sees individuals or groups unjustly harassed or persecuted, whatever their race, background, or political persuasion. He is a humanitarian in the broadest sense of the word, who renders assistance often at great personal sacrifice, never concerned about what people think of his actions, but only that he is following the right course. He is a great champion of the poor and oppressed of our country, who has been able to organize and mobilize people to struggle for the racial equality and social justice which is our only insurance of freedom in the days to come.

You cannot realize how fortunate you are to have Rev. Jones spearhead his agricultural project in the Third World. He communicates with great sensitivity to Third World peoples, and his commitment to alleviating human suffering can hardly be matched. I am certain his intentions are of the best, and he will be a potent influence for good in strengthening America's relationship with that area of the hemisphere. (u)

I understand efforts are underway to influence Congressmen to exert pressure on the State Department to intervene in a court matter under local Guyanese jurisdiction. This would be a foolhardy move, both from the standpoint of the best interests of the United States, and would surely antagonize the Guyanese, who are very competent to handle the matter, and the many thousands of Peoples Temple members and supporters here in the United States who are prepared to stand by Rev. Jones.

I urge you to give this matter your utmost consideration.

#1 STATEMENT: REGARDING VISIT OF VISIT OF LEO RYAN AND  
MEMBERS OF "CONCERNED RELATIVES"

"Concerned Relatives,"\* an organization specifically formed to spearhead activities against Peoples Temple, has stepped up its malicious, year-round campaign of lies and harassment of the peoples of the Temple.

The group has now enlisted the support of a California Congressman, Leo Ryan (who styles himself as a "liberal", but who voted for military aid to the Pinochet regime). Mr. Ryan is coming to Guyana with the expressed intention of "visiting our agricultural community of Jonestown," ostensibly to "investigate" the complaints and charges made by the "Concerned Relatives" group, three members of which will accompany him.

Also part of the entourage will be certain members of the news media, who have also taken part in the vendetta against Jim Jones.

The visit is actually a contrived "media event." It is being staged for the purpose of manufacturing adverse publicity for the Jonestown community, hopefully by provoking some sort of incident.

This sham investigation is only the latest in a long series of ploys orchestrated by the anti-Temple faction, some of whom have threatened to hire mercenaries to illegally enter Guyana and invade Jonestown.

In September, civil rights attorney Mark Lane and author Donald Freed visited Jonestown to investigate the charges of "Concerned Relatives" about Jim Jones and Peoples Temple. Lane and Freed are founders of the \*Concerned Relatives is now actually known as the "Human Freedom Center"

Citizens Commission of Inquiry, a nation-wide organization in the United States that has been instrumental in re-opening investigations of the Kennedy and King assassinations. They found all charges of the "Concerned Relatives" against Jim Jones and the Peoples Temple to be completely false and reported their findings fully to the news media at a press conference held in both Georgetown and San Francisco. They also concluded that the "Concerned Relatives" are part of a national conspiracy ultimately aimed at destroying Peoples Temple. The Citizens Commission of Inquiry, as Mark Lane reported in Georgetown, is currently preparing a lawsuit that will name several government agencies and individuals involved, and ask for damages into the several millions of dollars.

The residents of Jonestown are fully aware of the activities and the intentions of the so-called "Concerned Relatives" group. They had agreed to meet with Congressman Ryan in Jonestown, but only on the conditions that 1) Mr. Ryan and his staff would be accompanied by other Congresspersons more representative of third world concerns (Mr. Ryan's constituency is all white and well-to-do); 2) that Mark Lane of the CCI would also come along; 3) that no media and members of "Concerned Relatives" would participate. These conditions were refused by Congressman Ryan. Mr. Ryan had originally planned to be accompanied by notoriously ultra-conservative Congressman Edward Derwinski of Illinois. Consequently, the residents of Jonestown have signed a statement refusing to see Congressman Ryan and those accompanying him.

The residents of Jonestown are also putting Congressman Ryan and his group on official notice that they will be requesting Guyana police protection in the event that attempts are made to enter the Jonestown community against their will. Such attempts have been made in the past, and are again anticipated.

Further, Peoples Temple charges that Congressman Ryan and the persons traveling with him ( including media representatives) are planning to misportray Jonestown. Jonestown is by no stretch of the imagination a "closed society." On the contrary, the community wishes to make it clear that its collective refusal to entertain the false front group of "Concerned Relatives" (and whoever they may use to attempt to dignify their lies) is warranted by the intentions behind their "visit," and their history of substantial and malicious anti-Temple activity. Jonestown has always been an open community. Literally hundreds of people, including Guyanese officials, U.S. government officials, people from many nations, relatives and friends of residents, representatives of the press (U.S. and international), film companies, and many more, have visited Jonestown. Some have remained for extended periods of time. All have recognized and enthusiastically praised the achievements of the now more than 1100 "pioneers" of all races who have built a society of equality and sharing that has been variously termed a "model of cooperation", a "first-rate example of community life", and even "a society of the future."

However, there are those who for personal or political reasons seek to slander this community. Peoples Temple rejects any charges that any residents in Jonestown are being, or have been in any way abused, held in their community against their will, or are in Guyana illegally. We are not at all surprised or discouraged by these and other lies or co-ordinated efforts that are being made to undermine this community. It is not surprising, either, that such efforts would be "dignified" with the name of a U.S. politician (at some expense to taxpayers). We note that Congressman Ryan is as busy covering up investigations as Mark Lane and Donald Freed are in pursuing them. Mr. Ryan, for example, voted against the reopening

of the investigation into the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, which the Citizens Commission of Inquiry has shown was a conspiracy by the F.B.I.

Wherever the efforts of ordinary people to take control over their own lives emerge, they will encounter ruthless opposition. Peoples Temple, however, is confident that such efforts will be recognized for what they are and will not succeed.

(2) That the founders of Peoples Temple of the Disciples of Christ leased of state land for mixed farming purposes which constitutes the boundaries of exclusive residents of members of the Jonestown Community who exert their rights under the law of Guyana to formalize by resolution of the Board of Directors under the laws of Guyana and every member to exclude therefrom all persons whose presence is not considered desirable. (excluding officials of the Guyanese government).



"There's no money in Jonestown, there's no need for money. It's an experiment in full community, an experiment in the future, certainly in socialist economy where people work together. They raise their own food, they create their own electricity, their own well water, all of the houses are built by the people of Jonestown, all of the furniture they have built in their factory. They have established a machine shop -- there's a young black woman who is second in charge of the machine shop, and an older white man who was a machinist in the United States and has retired, and is teaching his skills to her. And she said, 'If I had lived in the United States for the rest of my life I never would have, because of union or other problems, I never would have had the opportunity to be able to do my life's ambition, which is to run a machine shop.' And she's an expert metal-worker. There's a kiln now, where they are baking bricks, and they've decided they are going to experiment now with brick houses, which have not been used in the jungle before, but which appear to have greater potential for providing insulation than wood or trouble, palm frond houses.

"It's an incredible experiment, and one which is working. ...It makes me almost weep, to see such an incredible experiment, with such vast potential for the human spirit and the soul of this country, to be cruelly assaulted..."

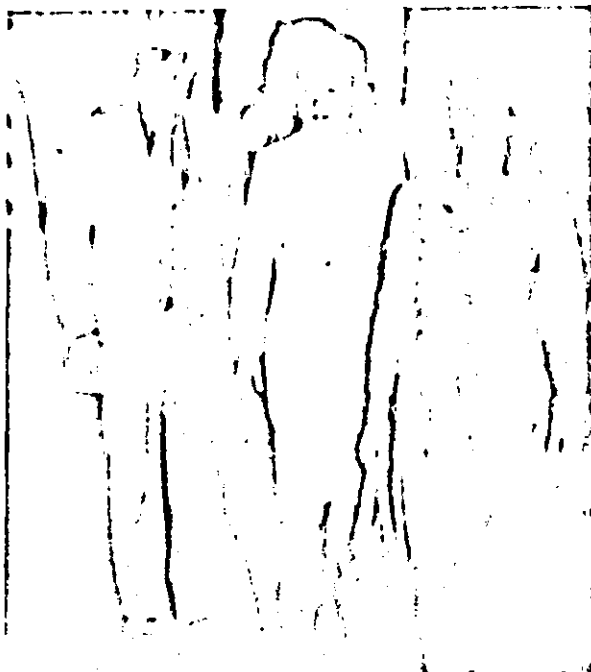

Hands-Off Policy

Three journalists in Guyana on separate occasions told us that there is a hands-off policy in regards to Peoples Temple. They also stated that there has been pressure put on Guyana by the U.S. Embassy officials to expel Peoples Temple from Guyana. One of them said that we have always been undermined in the press. Please let us know if there is anything that can relieve our minds about this.

When Donald Freed came here to visit, he as well as our other guests, were not believers in the Guyana government because of propaganda in the U.S. but now Dr. Freed and others of our visitors are lecturing all over the United States on Peoples Temple and Guyana's behalf. They had packed crowds in Unitarian Churches in Los Angeles and San Francisco. We didn't tape the speech; it was so crowded that we had to stand up in the back. The same happened when Dr. Carlton Goodlett came to Guyana. He had been very favorable to Cheddi Jagan when he first came--in fact he had helped Cheddi get his son into a professional school in the United States. He too had been brainwashed by the propaganda in the U.S. He wrote a very good article praising us and Guyana. It was right in the headlines in a newspaper on the West Coast. He is a MD, the President of the National Newspaper Publishers Association (the black press of America), and Ebony Magazine considered him to be one of the 50 most influential and powerful black Americans. He said that Jagan was full of crap about Guyana. These guests coming meant a great deal, and we will continue to do our part.

We are not going to sue the U.S. even if the conspiracy members step forward and say that the U.S. Government is involved. We don't intend to unless it is a have to situation. All we want the U.S. Government to do is to understand and we want the harassment stopped, such as the break-up of the 94 crates we had on the docks by U.S. Custom Officials. We have affidavits that this did in fact happen in Houston, Texas. There have been all kinds of harassment but we don't blame President Carter or the State Department per se, though liberal supporters of ours say and believe that the State Department is involved. We always have tried to hard to keep up good relations with the United States and to do nothing that would affect relations with the U.S. We just don't understand why there is a total blocking out

concerning the press.

One pro-PNC man who is in a high position wanted to say something but the press wouldn't allow it. This certainly makes us feel very alienated to say the least. I don't know whether you realize it or not but there may be some quarrel over border rights in which we would have to stand up for our rights and our property because we love Guyana. We will lay down our bodies to protect that Guyanese land in the conflict with Venezuela. Venezuela is certainly wrong to believe that it has any territorial claims to the North West District.

Pressure to Expel Peoples Temple from Guyana

As was mentioned before the journalist said that there was pressure for us to leave Guyana and someone from the State Department said the same thing. Of course we didn't believe him singularly--that's a cinch, we don't believe everybody--but we do trust you and that's why we are coming to you. We are in a frustrating situation. Even though the State Department official spoke badly about Guyana, we stood up for Guyana. When we defended Guyana we could see that this person came back with a sort of retaliation and what he said was "well, they're trying to expel you from the country." What seems strange to us is that four people have given us the same image, and it is obvious that we are being played down in the press.

We know you are terribly busy but if you could just get a word to us through Minister Hingo it would allay our anxieties.

The following discussion was held with Special Agents (SAs) ROBERT J. OGLESBY, JR., [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at the Guyana Police Department Headquarters: (u) b7c

On December 11, 1978, Assistant Police Commissioner, CECIL A. "SKIP" ROBERTS, Guyana Police Department, advised that to date his investigation has uncovered no information indicating a pre-planned conspiracy to assassinate Congressman RYAN or any of his party. The investigation had developed no information concerning any list of proposed assassinations or murder in the United States, and they have discovered no list of potential victims. (u)

His investigation has uncovered the fact that the People's Temple (PT) maintained various bank accounts at the Guyana Cooperative Mortgage Finance Bank and Barclays Bank International Ltd, both of Georgetown, Guyana. (u)

Assistant Commissioner ROBERTS advised that he was not able to turn over copies of individual statements from surviving PT members since they were presently being reviewed by the Government's prosecutor. He did furnish the following: (u)

1) Four page investigative report dated December 4, 1978, concerning the murders committed at Lamaha Gardens; (u)

2) Nine page pathology report concerning the following individuals: LINDA SHARON AMOS, LIANNE HARRIS, MARTIN AMOS, CHRISTA AMOS, LEO RYAN, GREGORY ROBINSON, PATRICIA PARKS, BOB BROWN, and DON HARRIS. (u)

Assistant Commissioner ROBERTS advised that his prior request for a pathologist from the United States should be rescinded since Dr. L. MOOTOO has performed the necessary pathological examinations. (u)

He advised that his department has recovered approximately 2.5 million dollars (Guyanese dollars) from various locations in the Jonestown area. These funds consist of United States and Guyanese currency. In addition, numerous checks have been turned over to the American Embassy in Georgetown, Guyana. (u)

I have to report the results of my investigations carried out on the  
above mentioned subject.

4. At 9.10 p.m., on Saturday 10th November, 1970, acting on information  
received a party of policemen under Detective Assistant Superintendent  
went to 41 Dennis Street, Leona Gardens, which is the Headquarters of the  
Church of the Disciples of Christ (D.C.) and which has its Head-  
quarters in San Francisco, United States of America.

5. The building is a two storied concrete structure situated on the  
southern side of Dennis Street and the entire yard is fenced with a four  
foot concrete wall. The building in question is bounded on the north by  
a road and a track which runs parallel to this road. To the east there is  
a small plot of land, to the south there are two houses about (60) sixty  
yards apart, and to the west there is another open plot of land followed  
by two houses.

6. The entry to this Headquarters is through a gate situated on the  
western fence. There are two steps to the building one on the eastern  
side which takes you to the porch and into the hall of the top flat while  
the other runs from the kitchen door on the west (top flat) downwards to the  
terrace. On the bottom flat can be found a door which faces the road.  
At the end of the passage to the east is an office which is also used as a radio  
room and access to this office can be made in by way of a southern door.  
There are three other rooms situated on the said bottom flat in which the  
living dwell.

7. Access to the hall on the top flat is the dining room and kitchen  
on the west. The living quarters on the upper flat is separated from the  
hall and kitchen by way of a wall and at the end of this wall is a door which leads  
up into a passage down to the east or southern room. There is also a  
door which takes you to this east or southern room. To the east of this  
passage are two rooms used by the inmates one of which is used as a radio  
room. In the west of this passage are situated from north to south are  
(i) a cupboard, (ii) a room and (iii) a bathroom.

8. The southern room is self-contained with bathroom, toilet, and wash  
basin and has one large bed situated immediately behind the door giving entry  
to the room. Opposite to this bed to the west is the bathroom which has a door  
which opens directly in a western direction. The distance between the bed  
and the bathroom is about five feet. There are also in this bedroom in

9. On arrival at the scene, the police found the bodies of Linda, Sharon  
Anos, Liane Harris, Christa and Martin Anos, lying on the floor of the hall

1. A member of the People's Temple told four bodies were found at the residence of the People's Temple Headquarters at 41 Bonita Street, San Francisco. He informed Detective A. L. Lee and the Headquarters was contacted by the Police.

2. The attentions commenced at the scene throughout that evening and the results were obtained from all forty-four (44) occupants and the results were reported in the preceding paragraphs of this report. The bodies of the deceased persons which were identified by Lee Ingram to Detective A. L. Lee were conveyed to Lydon's funeral parlour later the very same day.

3. On Saturday 23rd November, 1978, at 11.30 am., Dr. Leslie Hooton, Pathologist and Government Medical Officer performed post mortem examinations on the bodies of Linda Sharon Jones, Linda Martin, Christine and Martin Ann at the residence of the People's Temple after the bodies were identified by Lee Ingram to Detective A. L. Lee. The bodies were later taken to the office of U.S. Embassy and left there with an attendant for the night.

4. On Thursday 23rd November, 1978, Stephanie Jones, aged 9 years, was interviewed by the Police at C.I.B. Headquarters. She lived in the house of her uncle Stephen Jones who is 19 years old, and she made another statement in her uncle's presence. In this statement she said that she was lying on the bed in the northern room when the deceased Sharon A. Jones came out of the bathroom and pulled her in the doorway bathroom and closed the door. In the bathroom were the accused Charles Edward Bellman, Linda Martin, Martin and Christine. They were all alive. She said she saw Sharon pick up a big knife from the night, and Bellman held Christine and pulled her head backwards. Sharon then went to Bellman's throat and fell on the bathroom floor bleeding. Bellman then pulled her by his neck and pulled his head backwards and Sharon used the knife to cut Martin's throat. He also fell on the floor bleeding. She said she was screaming and tried to open the bathroom door but Bellman was blocking the door to keep it shut that prevented her from doing so. She further said that Bellman told Bellman to "let her" and Bellman grabbed her by her neck and pulled her head backwards. Bellman then took up a smaller knife which was on the floor and started to stab it on her throat cutting it. At this stage, she went on to say that the bathroom door was burst open and she was pulled out of the bathroom by Calvin Douglas and placed on the bed. The victim was then dressed by Vernie Lee Poffin in the Medical Centre.

5. Linda Stephanie Jones had told two different accounts of the incident investigation was carried out with a view to corroborating every statement she made and this was done with a view to success. It should be noted that the persons from whom the evidence was obtained had given statements to the Police on the evening of Saturday 24th November, 1978, and were not in the same position at that time. Linda Stephanie Jones' explanation when she was interviewed and she had stated in her first statement that it was Sharon A. Jones who had cut her throat and that she had no recollection of the accused in the bathroom. She said she knew the accused did not want to hurt her, as she did not want to get him in trouble. This explanation is not understood.

6. Calvin Douglas in his further statement said when he heard someone knocking from the bathroom he tried to push the door open and felt as if someone was blocking it from inside. The door opened because he pushed harder and he saw Linda Stephanie Jones standing by the shower area. The accused was standing behind a big knife on the floor. He also saw Christine lying on the floor. He said before he held Stephanie he had picked up the knife and when he took her out of the door closed back. He said he took the knife and placed it in the little table and returned immediately to the bathroom and found both Sharon and Linda. He said at this stage he did not see the accused and his explanation was he did not tell the Police this in his first statement was because the accused in his mind did not have put someone in trouble whom he loved as a member of the People's Temple.

20. Joan Lurley testified that she had seen the blood on the floor in the kitchen sink that evening after the bullets were found.

11. Evidence was also obtained from Diana, Alfred Garza and Josephine Rodriguez who heard children screaming in the bathroom. Of Diana Garza's testimony, Diana Garza who had a great fear to the medical center that she was told to kill her. I do not feel that what Elphile Jones told Garza will fit in the roscopie rule.

20. The accused Charles Bell, a 40-year-old G.I. Homeowner, on Thursday, 14 November, 1974, was arrested by Detective Assistant James J. [redacted] at 5.00 p.m., who told him that the police are in receipt of information that he was concerned with the alleged murder of Garth and Martin Stephen Jones, known as Brian and Lianne Martin, and the alleged murder on Stephen Jones. On 14 November, 1974, he was questioned in the presence of Stephen Jones, who refused to make a statement which was taken down in writing by Stephen Jones, at his request. The statement is a confession.

52. The accused was charged with the murder of James Earl Ray, James Earl Ray, Charles and Martin Lane, and Edward Albert Butler on the basis of a 1968. He appeared before the Federal District Court in England, in Court on 11th 1970 (1970), and the case is postponed to Monday 4th December, 1971, and following days for trial.

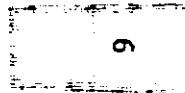

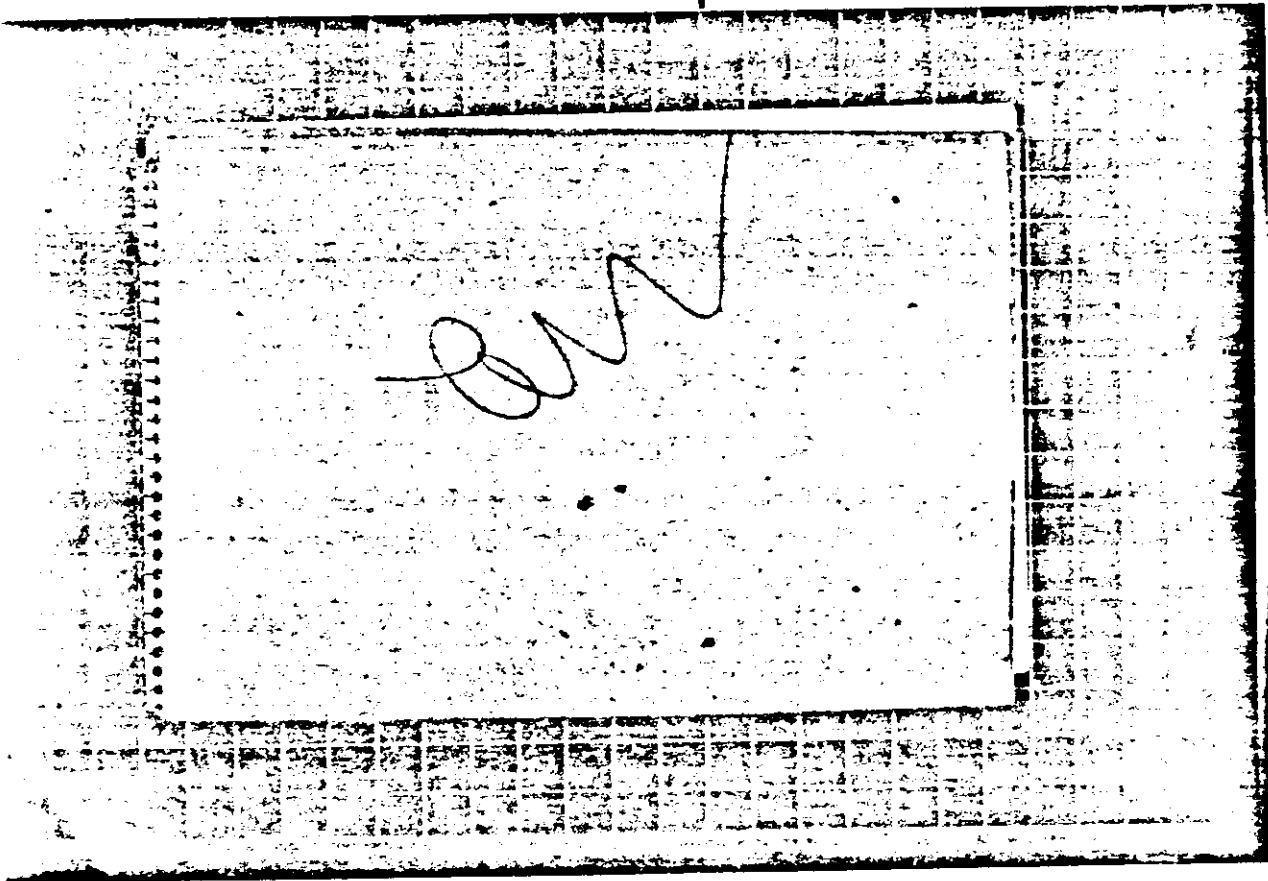

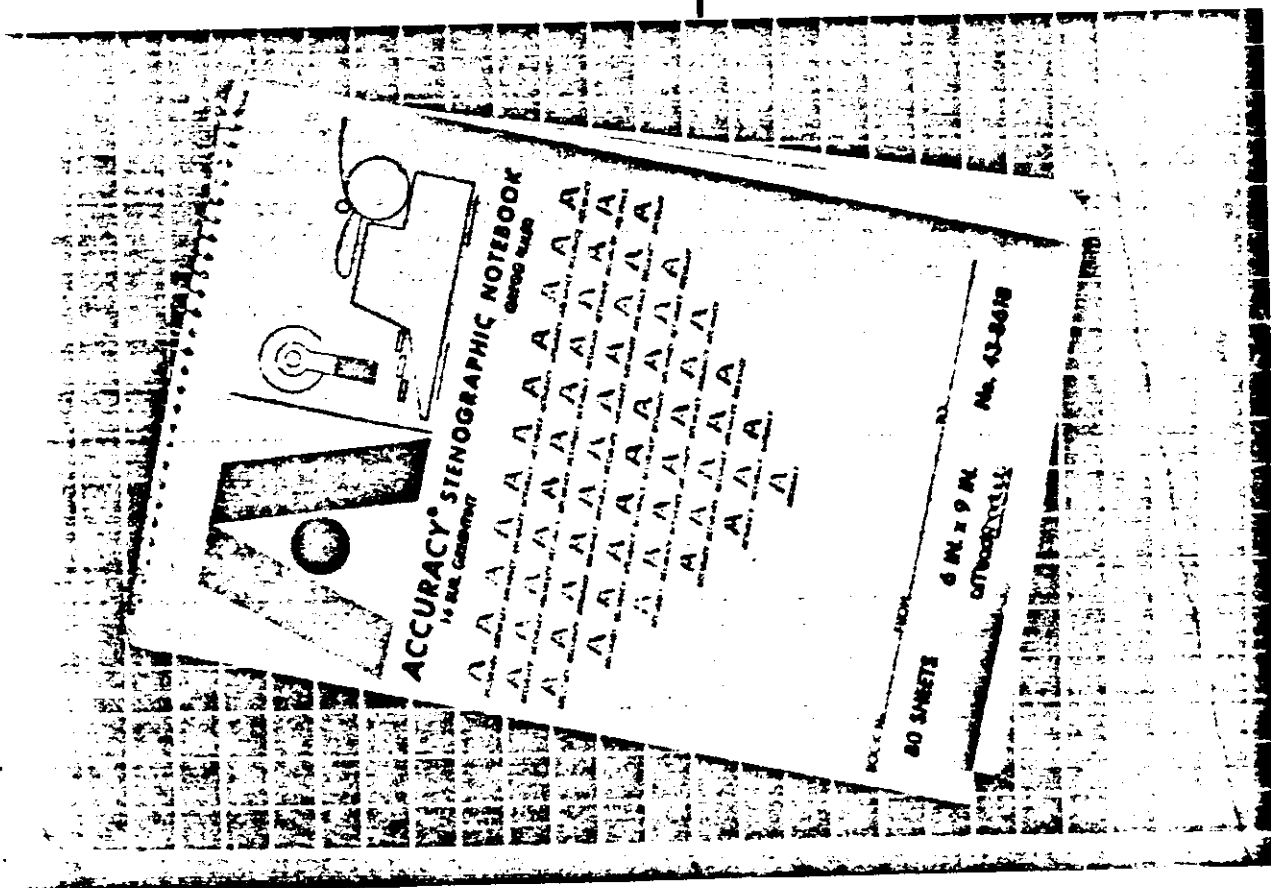

I am 24 years of age right now and don't expect to live through the end of this book. I thought I should at least make some attempt to let the world know what Jim Jones and Peoples Temple is - as was all about, to seem that some people - and perhaps the majority of people would like to destroy the best thing that ever happened to the 1200 or so of us who have followed Jim. I am at a point right now so embittered against the world that I don't know why I am writing this. Someone who finds it will believe I am every bit as sincere in the broadest sense that does not exist in Jonestown. It seems that everything good that happens to the world is under constant attack. When I write this I can expect some mentally fastest persons to find it and decide it should be thrown in the trash before anyone gets a chance to hear the truth - which is the ~~most~~ what I am now writing about.

Where can I begin - Jonestown - the most peaceful, loving community that ever existed. Jim Jones - the one who made this paradise possible. Much to the

Contrary of the lies spread about Jim - was being a power hungry, sadistic mean person who thought he was God - (of all things!) I want you who reads this to know Jim was the most honest loving - caring, concerned person whom I ever met and knew. His love for animals - each creature - poisonous snakes, tarantulas - none of them even bit him because he was a gentle person. He knew how mean the world was - took any and every stray animal and took care of each one. His love for humans was unmountable and it was many whom he put his love and trust in and they left him and spit in his face. Teresa Hubbard - Debbie Stebbins - they both wanted sex from him which he was too ill to give. Why should he have to give them sex - and Jane and Tim Stoen also - include them too. I should know I have spent them past few months taking care of Jim's health - however it was difficult to take care of anything for him - he

always would do for himself. His hatred of racism, sexism, elitism and mainly - classism is what prompted him to make a new world for people - a paradise in the jungle. The children loved it. So did everyone else. There were no ugly, mean police waiting to beat our heads in. No more racist stores from whites and others who thought they were better. No one was much fun of for their appearance - ~~but~~ something all one had no control over. Manners and making fun was not allowed. Maybe this is why all the lies were started - besides the fact that no one was allowed to live longer than ~~any~~ one else. The United States ~~attacked~~ always classism - the problem being this and not all the side tracks of ~~the~~ black power, woman power, Indiangoneer gay power. Jim Jones showed us all this - that we could live together with our differences - that we were all the same - human beings. Luckily we were more fortunate than the

starving babies in Ethiopia and the starving babies in the United States. What a beautiful place this was. The children loved the jungle - learned about animals and plants. There were no cars to run over them - no child molesters to molest them, nobody to hurt them. They were the freest, most intelligent children I had ever known. Survival had dignity. They had whatever they wanted - a plot of land for a garden. Sewers were treated with respect, something they never had in the United States. A mere few were sick and when they were - they were given the best medical care.

We died because you would not let us live in peace!

**A Report on (1) Murder of Leo Ryan, Don Harris, Bob Brown,  
Greg Robinson and Patricia Parks; (2) Attempted Murder on  
Monica Bagby, Varne Gooney and Dale Parks and Mass Suicide  
at Jonestown.**

I refer to the above subject and submit the following report.

2. The deceased - Leo Ryan, aged 53 years was a United States Congressman. Don Harris aged 42 years and Bob Brown aged 36 years were reporters attached to the National Broadcasting Corporation; Greg Robinson aged 27 years was a reporter with the San Francisco Examiner Newspaper. Patricia Parks, 27 years was a member of the Peoples Temple at Jonestown. They were all American citizens.

3. The injured - Monica Bagby, Varne Gooney and Dale Parks are members of the Peoples Temple at Jonestown, Jacqueline Spiers is the Congressional Secretary. The accused, Larry John Layton aged 32 years is also a member of the Peoples Temple at Jonestown. They are also American Citizens.

4. The Peoples Temple is a Religious Organization founded about 1966 in the United States of America by Rev. James Earl Ray Jones, a 47 year old American Indian. He is married and has a son named Ryan Jones aged 19 years. He also has a number of adopted sons who have lived with him since childhood. The Peoples Temple was originally based in California, but moved shortly afterwards to Guyana, where it functioned as a Rural Social Community in the struggle against the evils of (poverty, hunger and injustice). The members indulged in communal living and followed the practice of handing over all their money and valuable possessions to the Temple upon obtaining membership. Prior to the introduction of the Peoples Temple, Jim Jones who allegedly holds a master's degree in Psychology was known to have been involved in the struggle for Equal Rights for all races, particularly the poor in the United States of America and had also done much for the poor. He exerted an over-powering influence upon his followers - most of them blind and obeyed him without question. It is rumored that he often referred to himself as 'God' - the Reincarnation of Christ. His followers called him 'Pa' and called his wife 'Mother'.

5. During the month of October 1974, Jim Jones having acquired a lot of 1,000 acres of land in the North West District brought some of his followers to Guyana and started the Peoples Temple Agricultural Project at Jonestown. Within a relatively short period the Project made rapid gains in terms of Production and Productivity. The number of settlers increased in a similar manner over the years with new members travelling from U.S.A. to Guyana at the invitation of relatives already at Jonestown and mainly by Jim Jones, by publishing attractive brochures and making exciting propaganda, and the idea that happy conditions existed at Jonestown which he often referred to as the 'Promised Land'. Little was however known of the manner in which the members worked or lived or existed because of the strict rules for secrecy imposed upon the community by Jim Jones.

6. On repeated occasions in the U.S.A. and in Guyana Jim Jones told his followers that they must be prepared to commit revolutionary acts in the name of the Church and in preparation he conducted rehearsals. He was also outside by poison in U.S.A. and in Guyana - the first rehearsal was in 1978. The rehearsals were referred to as a test of loyalty and faith. The word "Red Light" was used to indicate that the members were to be poisoned and told by Jim Jones to drink it. Some of the members believed that Jim Jones had been poisoned.

7. A number of Guyanese voiced their suspicion but no evidence was unearthed to either deny rumours that the outward progress was just facade to a great operation being carried out at Jonestown. These rumours and bits of information were primarily channelled to relatives in the U.S. and were confirmed by a few - mainly James Cobb who had left the Church about 5 years ago after claiming that the Peoples Temple was no longer pursuing its professed goals under the leadership of Jim Jones. It was disclosed that there was at Jonestown about 100 security guards highly trained in the use of firearms - half of them were Vietnam war Veterans who are very loyal to Jim Jones and would not hesitate to kill if told to do so by Jim Jones. The most dangerous men the legal outside world knew of were: Jim Jones, Tom Rice, Bob Rice, Neville Bradburn, Albert Touchette, Willie Henderson, Johnny Cobb, Pancho Johnson, Jim Jones, Steve Jones, Mike Touchette, Tom Rice, Leo Jones, Stanley Glick, Clifford Rice, Tim Guitney and Ronald Jones.

8. There is also a committee appointed to receive all incoming mail from relatives and overseas members and to prepare replies which indicated that Jonestown was a happy community. The relative or friend to whom the letter was addressed is then called to sign the prepared letter. Many overseas relatives and members were lured in this manner to sell their property in the U.S. and to come to Jonestown to live only to find on arrival that they had fallen into a trap from which they could not escape. The members were made to work for 12 hours a day and were kept on a poor diet of rice and gravy with an occasional meat or chicken, while Jim Jones, his security guards and a select group were well fed. Jim Jones also took his pick of the young female members and cohabited with them while in the presence of his wife and would occasionally speak openly at meetings about having sexual intercourse with both male and female members who were then told to stand and confirm these acts. Jim Jones often explains that these men had sexual problems and he was helping them.

9. In the meantime James Cobb got together a U.S. Based Group called the 'U.S. Relatives' who after persistent efforts were able to bring about a visit of the U.S. Congressman Leo Ryan to Guyana to investigate the reports of abuse. Jim Jones at first objected to the visit, but was eventually persuaded by his Attorneys Charles Garry and Mark Lane to permit the visit. Jim Jones, however, called a meeting at Jonestown and warned his followers to be ready to flee about Jonestown to the Georgetown.

10. On 17th November, Congressman Leo Ryan and a party which included his wife, a freelance Spurn, National Geographic Reporters, Bob Brown, Dan Hooper, and Bob Flick; San Francisco Examiner Newspaper reporter Greg Robinson and other U.S. and press reporters travelled to Port Kaituma airstrip arriving at 4.00 p.m., U.S. Johnny Connolly in Guyana Richard Dyer and Guyanese Ministry of Information employee Neville Bradburn and Leo Rice, Jim Jones' Attorney Garry and Lane also travelled with the Congressman's party. They were met at the airstrip by a group of 100 men and women headed by Johnny Jones, the adopted son of Jim Jones. The men were told that they and the women were the only people who would be allowed to enter Jonestown, that the Congressman Garry and Lane would be permitted to enter Jonestown to allow them to see the people. Garry, Robinson, Richard Dyer and Neville Bradburn went to meet with the Congressman and his Secretary.

11. The party entered Jonestown at 5.00 p.m., on 17th November, 1978, and was met by Jim Jones who had cordial discussions with the Congressman and his party. A cultural dinner of Guyanese food was put on for after dinner at 7.00 p.m. Everyone appeared happy and the Congressman voiced this observation by clapping loud cheers from the members present. The congressman and his party were allowed to sleep at the other that night but the remainder of the party went to a Rest House at Port Kaituma.

On the following day the party returned to Jonestown where they were met by Jim Jones who produced a list of names of members of the party and the Congressman and his party were taken to the Rest House at Port Kaituma. was to take him and his party to the Airport. This development  
prompted a number of other members to rush forward to join the truck and leave  
Jonestown. A few other members who were afraid to be interviewed had earlier  
left the bushes as the Congressman's presence distracted the attention  
of the security guards. The escapees were riding their way to Matthews Field  
in the truck. The names of these members are as follows: Robert Lamb, George  
Lamb, Shirley Evans, Shirella Evans, Larry Wilson, Johnny Franklin, Sharon Lamb,  
Matthew Lamb, John Wilson, Richard Clarke, Diana Roberts.  
The contact was then made by Radio operator Gladys Carter with the Deane  
family. He spoke to Sharon Lamb and told her of the developments  
and asked that she make the necessary arrangements for a private aircraft  
to take the 20 odd members who requested to leave.  
The Congressman expressed shock at this development but made the arrangements.  
The truck was delayed around 3.00 p.m.

10. A large number of the members who were anxious leaving began to move  
towards the airstrip in a hasty manner. One member Don Sly attacked the Congressman with a  
knife but was disarmed by the Attorneys Charles Garry, Jack Lane and a few  
others. He could inflict any injury. By this time the truck could take  
only a few of the persons who wished to leave, but among those in the truck was  
the member Larry Layton who displays a fanatic devotion to Jim Jones. He was  
identified by Dale Faris and others as a traitor on board. A direct  
message was made to the U.S. Counsellor Richard Greer to have Layton put off the  
truck, but Layton who was seen in conversation with Jim Jones immediately before  
the truck insisted that he wanted to return to the U.S.A. even though  
he had no passport, passport other passport with him. A similar request to  
Richard Greer was put off the truck and also turned down.

11. The truck eventually left Jonestown around 3.45 p.m., and arrived at  
Matthews Field about 4.30 p.m. The passengers numbering about 20 were  
waiting for the plane to fly them out but had not yet arrived. Joe Wilson who  
was in charge of the passengers to the Airstrip began shaking hands with each  
one as they got out. To Layton they shook hands with a pouch which Larry Layton was  
carrying at that time and it appeared to some of the passengers, particularly  
to the Deane family, that Wilson handed Layton a pouch which he concealed on his person.  
Layton then left with the truck which drove to one end of the airstrip near  
the hangars where it was parked by the Deane family. The  
passengers waited on the plane. One of the passengers told Layton that  
he was a traitor, but by this time Layton was feeling him seriously. A crowd  
of people gathered around Layton and Layton was found on him. About 10

with the Deane family, Jerry Lamb, Verne Gooney and Justice Dobby. Layton was a protest  
against the flight. Layton did not immediately board the aircraft.

12. The Congressman, along with Don Sly, Bob Brown, Gary Robinson,  
Charles Garry and other family and friends were waiting on the Airstrip  
for the flight. The departing members of the group were told the  
Congressman's name. In the plane a few minutes after the flight was  
completed, the Congressman, the Deane family, the Gooney family and the  
Dobby family, also the Deane family, were all in the plane. The  
Congressman and his family were on the Airstrip with the 16 passengers  
and three Privates all in haste and in a hurry to get to the

10. Jim Jones then ordered the Security Guards who were all armed with rifles, crossbows and shotguns to surround the members to ensure that no one escaped. He then ordered that the mixture be brought out and urged them continually before the soldiers arrived. He was speaking quickly and repeating that it was beautiful to die by Revolutionary Suicide. Some of the members began to repeat that it was beautiful to die, some were screaming while others were bidding farewell.

11. Jim Jones continually reassured them that it will not be painful.

12. The mixture was brought out in a half an hour and Jim Jones ordered that the babies be taken care of first. These babies were taken up to the doctor in his tent of Nurses who used syringes to squirt some of the mixture into the mouth of each baby, and the mother then laid them out on the ground to die. They died quickly, vomiting and gagging for breath. Some mothers wanted out Jim Jones kept urging the medical team to work faster. He also assisted in laying out the members up for their death. When the time came for the adults to take the mixture, a few adults, 21 in total, were also given an injection, including the children, to make them die. As the mixture began to take effect, they were led to point and laid on the ground to die.

13. At this point member Ed L. Shoden who was not willing to commit suicide, decided in passing out of the ring of armed guards on the pretext of seeing one of the nurses to the Dispensary to get a stethoscope. He then slipped away from the guards to Port Kaituma. Another member Stanley Clayton escaped by slipping into a nearby tent after moving to the edge of the ring of bodies prepared to die and was crawling on survivors. He then escaped into the bushes where the other persons remained to be the fatal doses. Clayton, however, claimed that he then learned that he had been his passport from the office where his passport was kept. The other two, Shoden and Clayton were carrying out some propaganda work to indicate that they were Security Guards, but they deny this. The other two, Harry and Lane claimed that they did not witness the suicide incident but on the advice of Temple member Lanche Johnson they slipped away into the bushes where they passed the night under a tree. They also claimed that they heard several gunshots being fired in Jonestown during the night and also the sound of Jim Jones voice shouting 'krother' several times.

14. Meanwhile the Kaituma Airport incident was reported to police at Port Kaituma. Injured woman Monica Bayby was put on board the small aircraft which was flying to Georgetown, and flown to Timor's Island to O.L. Strip where she was taken to a hospital. She is now out of hospital. The other aircraft was also flying to Timor's. The other injured persons Verna Gosney, Jacqueline Giers, and Kim Raitman were moved to a small shift tent where they were given first aid, and then transportation to hospital.

15. The accused Harry Clayton, who had also run into the bushes after the shooting was later seen walking along a road leading towards Jonestown. He was seen by Williams, Wain at Lilodai and Jewel Clemison and taken to the police station where he was detained for questioning. Nothing was found on him. He was then taken to the airport where he was taken over to the airport to U.S. Coast Guard. He was then taken to the airport where he was taken over to the airport. On 1.11.77 suspects Michael Troes, Timothy Carter and Jim Carter were seen walking along a road in Port Kaituma and were arrested by 3/4 Squadron. Michael Troes and Paul Adams, Michael Troes and Timothy Carter were seen with a .38 Smith & Wesson revolver and 5 rounds. The three of them also had some of money which amounted to \$4,100.00 U.S. and \$764.00 Guyana currency.

16. Meanwhile news of the incident had reached Force Headquarters, Georgetown and a joint Police/Army contingent headed by Assistant Commissioner J. J. and Senior Army Personnel flew out to Port Kaituma and to commence investigation. The police and a section of the Army travelled by rail and trail to Port Kaituma while the main section of the Army moved in on Jonestown.

17. At Port Kaituma the police party contacted Gerald Adams about 1.11.77. He gave an account of the mass suicide at Jonestown. This was confirmed by many personnel when they arrived at the site later that day. The Air Force survivors - Dale Parks, Jerry Parks, Edith Parks, Tracy Parks, Juanita, Tom Doane, Harold Cordell, James Cobb, Linica Bayby were questioned by the Air Force Party and they supplied the names of the following Temple members who they actively identified as taking part in the shooting: Harry L. Jones, Joe Wilson, Ron Rice, Tom Rice, Harry Greenham, Albert Touch, etc.

and it was on 11.11.78 that he infiltrated the concerned Peoples  
Group to cause what steps were being taken against the Peoples Temple.  
Michael Prokes, is the Director of the Peoples Office, Jim Carter is the head of  
of the Radio Room and also works as a bar/restaurant clerk. They were all aware  
that the plan was for all of them to commit suicide and Michael Carter admitted  
that they were at Jonestown until the members started to commit suicide. They  
then left with all the cash recovered so far and important letters for the  
at given destinations in Guyana, with the wishes of devotees of the Peoples  
Temple. The three suspects were caught in Guyana when arrested. The letters  
indicated that very large sums of money are lodged in overseas banks in the  
names of members who died on 11.11.78. They having on the said day, deposited  
the money to a certain overseas country. The poor background of these members  
makes it impossible for them to deposit such sums.

23. A large quantity of Video and other tapes seized from Jonestown are  
being examined at C.I.D. Headquarters. An inventory is also being prepared  
in relation to the Stocks etc. found on the site. One of the Tapes examined  
so far relates to a "united front" rehearsal while another relates to the  
last address by Jim Jones to his followers to commit mass suicide.  
The cases against Barry Clayton are for hearing on 12.12.78. Arrangements are  
also being made for an early report into the Deaths at Jonestown.

Dr. LESLIE MOOTOO, Pathologist, furnished the following information: (u)

At the request of the Guyana Government he traveled to Jonestown in Guyana where he observed the vast number of dead at the Jonestown settlement. He conducted medical examinations on a number of dead bodies. He examined 38 identified adults and one identified child. All of these persons showed positive signs of having taken cyanide poison. He also examined the bodies of Reverend JAMES JONES who died from a gunshot wound to the head. JONES had no cyanide poison in his body. He also examined the body of ANNIE MOORE who also suffered a massive gunshot wound to the head. Dr. MOOTOO while at Jonestown observed many syringes (well over 50 but too numerous to count) and numerous hypodermic needles both uncapped and capped. He tested one syringe which contained cyanide. He tested one of the hypodermic needles and it contained valium. He observed numerous vials and one of the vials tested contained cyanide and valium. He observed a large vat in what appeared to be the main area of Jonestown and that vat contained cyanide and other unidentified fluids. In examining the many dead bodies he observed what appeared to be recent skin punctures on some of the bodies about the upper arms, and his personal opinion is that they may have been made by needles. He is presently having tests conducted on this skin tissue to verify his observation. The results of these tests will be available at a later date. Dr. MOOTOO also observed bottles of chloralhydrate on the table in the same location as the vat containing cyanide and other fluids. His personal opinion is that the chloralhydrate was possibly used on the children. (u)

In addition to examining the 39 identified bodies plus the bodies of JONES and MOORE he also examined a small number of unidentified bodies. (u)

Dr. MOOTOO advised that his report was not completed but that when it was completed, it could be obtained through Assistant Commissioner of Police CECIL A. ROBERTS, Guyana National Police. (u)

A search of the airstrip was conducted for the purposes of recovery of any additional fired ammunition components or other items not recovered by the Guyanese Police Department in their initial crime scene search. Present at the airstrip and participating in the search were Doctor Leslie Mootoo, Assistant Police Commissioner C.A. Roberts, [redacted] four U. S. Army helicopter pilots and two U. S. Army helicopter crew chiefs and numerous Guyanese natives. (u)

Assistant Police Commissioner Roberts was requested to interview the Guyanese natives present to determine if any of them had taken, or knew of anyone who had taken, any fired shotshell casings or other possible items of evidence, from the airstrip. He advised that no one admitted to taking anything from the scene or knew of anything taken from the scene. (u)

During the search 12 items were discovered and pointed out to [redacted] who recovered them and made notations as to the location of the items. These items consisted of two bullet jackets, a bullet core, two .30-06 Springfield cartridge cases, five .22 caliber cartridge cases and two pieces of possible shotshell wad. These items were all recovered in the vicinity of a Guyana Airways Dehavilland, Twin Otter aircraft having registration number 8R-GEJ. (u)

Two bullet holes were found in the stairs, one a through hole, the other not. It was therefore concluded that a bullet remained in the door. On December 4, 1978, RICHARD MARTIN, Vice Consul of the United States of America assigned at Caracas, Venezuela, but on temporary duty at Georgetown, Guyana, advised that on Thursday, November 23, 1978, he traveled to Jonestown, Guyana for the purpose of securing items of interest to the United States Government. MARTIN advised that he gathered tapes, papers and other items he felt would be of interest and with the help of several American soldiers loaded these items into bags and left them at the helicopter pad at Jonestown. MARTIN further advised that on Friday, November 24, 1978, he secured the help of several American soldiers and they went from house to house at Jonestown gathering additional tapes, papers and personal identifications. MARTIN advised that all of the items that he had gathered on Thursday together with those found on Friday were then transported via United States Army helicopter to Georgetown, Guyana. (u)

MARTIN stated that with the exception of two small packets of papers and one reel of tape, all of the items were placed in a room in the United States Consulate. This room was locked and all of these items are in the custody of DOUG ELLICE, Consul of the United States of America. (u)

I, Richard Martin, a Vice Consul of the United States of America, was temporarily assigned to the United States Embassy at Guyana on 19 November 1978. I was assigned responsibility for the preservation and protection of the personal estates of the deceased American citizens pursuant to 22 USC Sec. 1175 et seq. and 7 FAM Sec. 444, and for the identification of the American citizen survivors there. In this capacity, I visited Jonestown, Guyana, on 23 November 1978 and again on 24 November 1978. (u)

Among other items of property which I collected at Jonestown on 24 November 1978 was a tape recording. This recording was of the reel-to-reel type and was found on a tape recorder situated on a raised platform at the end of an open-air building known as the "Pavilion". The recorder was situated on <sup>A TABLE</sup> ~~the floor~~ <sup>12/4/78</sup> of the platform and was not running when I first observed it. Approximately 1/4 of the tape was on the take-up and the other 3/4 was on the rewind reel. The recorder was located less than two feet from a chair on the platform. (u)


I removed both reels from the recorder and placed them in a bag which I was carrying. On 24 November 1978, when I had completed my duties in Jonestown, I returned to Georgetown. The tape was in my custody from the time I departed Jonestown until

I transferred it to John Burke, United States Ambassador to Guyana, on the evening of 24 November 1978. The tape was played at that time and then locked in the Ambassador's safe. (u)

I was able to identify it as the tape which I had removed from the Pavillion both by the appearance of the reels and by the contents of the tape when it was subsequently played. Results of examination:

This report supplements and confirms the preliminary report furnished your office on December 12, 1978. (u)

Specimen Q1 consists of four pieces of lead shot which have been determined to be size "F". This size of shot is not commercially loaded into shotshells in either the United States or Great Britain. However, size "F" shot is available in many countries for hand or reloading purposes. (u)

Specimen Q2 is a .38 Special or a .357 Magnum bullet jacket which has been fired from a barrel rifled with six grooves, right twist, such as the K5 revolver. However, the barrel of specimen K5 was found to contain a large quantity of foreign material and corrosion which effected the microscopic markings used in identification. Therefore, it was not possible to determine if Q2 had been fired from K5. None of the other recovered weapons could have fired Q2. (u)

Specimen Q3 was identified as having been fired from the K15 rifle. (u)

Specimens Q4, Q6 and Q20 are lead cores from jacketed bullets which do not contain any marks of value for identification purposes. Therefore, the origin of Q4, Q6 and Q20 could not be determined. (u)

Specimens Q5 and Q18 are .30 caliber bullet jackets which were fired from a barrel(s) rifled with four grooves, right twist such as the barrels in the K17 and K20 rifles. However, due to a lack of sufficient matching microscopic marks between Q5, Q18 and test bullets fired from K17 and K20, it was not possible to determine if Q5 or Q18 had been fired from K17 or K20. (u)

Specimen Q7 is a .380 Auto caliber jacketed bullet which was fired from a barrel rifled with six grooves, right twist. Although the barrel of the K11 pistol contains six grooves, right twist, nothing was found to indicate that Q7 had been fired from K11. (u)

Specimens Q8 and Q19 are .30 caliber bullet jackets which were fired from a barrel(s) rifled with six grooves, right twist such as the barrels in the K14 and K15 rifles. However, there are not sufficient microscopic marks of value for identification purposes in either Q8 or Q19. Therefore, it was not possible to determine if they had been fired from K14 or K15. (u)

The Q9 and Q10 bullets were identified as having been fired from the K3 revolver. (u)

The Q11 through Q15 cartridge cases were identified as having been fired in the same firearm; however, they were not fired in specimen K11. (u)

Specimen Q16 was not fired in any of the recovered .308 Winchester caliber firearms. (u)

Specimen Q17 was identified as having been fired in the K15 rifle. (u)

Specimen Q21 does not contain sufficient microscopic marks of value for identification purposes. Therefore, it was not possible to determine if Q21 had been fired in K19 or K17. Specimen Q21 was not fired in K16. (u)

Specimen Q22 does not contain sufficient microscopic marks of value for identification purposes. Therefore, it was not possible to determine if Q22 was fired in K17. Specimen Q22 was not fired in K16 or K19. (u)

The Q23 through Q27 cartridge cases were identified as having been fired by the K23 rifle. (u)

Specimens Q28 and Q29 are consistent with 16-gauge shot shell wads but could not be identified further. (u)
