Public Alls, Oll Dep. AD My. DETAILS: Retel advised of the identification of 32 individuals who were expected to depart Guyana on 12/3/78, via Pan American Flight 228 to arrive at J.F.K. Airport, New York, at 6:15 P.M., EST same date.

On 12/3/78, SA Robert Olgesby, Georgetown, Guyana, telephonically advised two of the above individuals had elected to remain in Guyana. He identified these two individuals as being Johnnie Mae Yates and Mary Ann Casanova[4]

Of the remaining 30 individuals Olgesby advised that eight have been tentatively identified as members of the Jonestown basketball team who are suspected of being members of the Peoples Temple security force. These individuals will be interviewed in detail upon their return to the United States. The names of these individuals are as follows:

Memo Ingram to Mr. Moore Re: RYMUR

At approximately 10:30 A.M., 12/3/78, SA advised that the State Department had advised him that the pilot of Pan American Flight 228 had refused to carry the above 30 individuals unless he was provided with armed guards to accompany his flight.

Deputy Assistant Director James O. Ingram was advised of the above, as well as Mr. Michael Abbell, of the Department of Justice. Abbell contacted the Department of State and subsequently advised that the pilot had agreed to take the women and children, but refused to take the males among the group, but departed for New York with approximately 10 - 15 individuals.

Mr. Abbell advised that the details regarding providing Pan American Airlines with adequate security personnel to facilitate the transportation of the Jonestown survivors would have to be discussed with the Department of State, on Monday, 12/4/78, and a determination made as to which agency would provide the necessary security.

SA Division Six, at the J.F.K. Command Post, was advised of the above information in order to coordinate preparation for the interviews to be conducted at New York, on 12/4/78.

A review of referenced teletype indicates the presence of the names of three individuals whose names are not listed on the previous survivor lists. The individuals are as follows:
