[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] of Old Church, Virginia, another Ham Radio Operator, assigned call letters [REDACTED] who maintains a teletype terminal, notified him the previous evening that the American Radio Relay Leg (ARRL), Newington, Connecticut, had sent a nationwide teletype advising that the FBI wished to interview anyone who might have had radio contact with parties in Guyana, South America, prior to the assassination of Congressman RYAN and the subsequent mass murder-suicide. The teletype mentioned two stations in Guyana, a Jonestown station with call letters WB6 MID/8R3, and a Georgetown station with call letters WB6 (next three letters unrecalled)/8R1. (u)

[REDACTED] stated that he had radio contact during the summer of 1978 with the first mentioned Jonestown station, operated by an individual who identified himself as ALBERT TOUCHETTE. [REDACTED] confirmed this identity through the American Amateur Radio Call Book, which reflected the call letters as being assigned to one ALBERT TOUCHETTE, believed located in Redwood, California. [REDACTED] stated that the three figures following the slash mark in the call letters is an indication that the station is operating portable in Guyana. (u)

[REDACTED] stated that he had contact with the station on one or two occasions and communicated for the most part with a female named SARA, whom he understood to be ALBERT TOUCHETTE'S sister. He furnished a copy of a "QSL" card confirming a radio conversation on April 9, 1978. He stated that prior to receiving the card, he received a letter, which is unsigned but believed to be from SARA.
