Reference is made to the letter dated January 8, 1979, to Honorable Phillip Jordan, Special Assistant to the Attorney Ceneral from Joseph L. Kellis, Chief Counsel, House Select Committee on Marcotics Abuse & Control. In his letter, which you furnished to Inspector, Deputy Assistant Director James O. Ingram on January 15, 1979, Mr. Hellis requested that the Department furnish the Committee whatever information has been received concerning car

whatever information has been received concerning captioned subject. Enclosed is the above-mentioned letter and its enclosure.

In response to Mr. Hellis' inquiry, the FBI is aware of large quantities of controlled drugs found at Jonestown, Guyana, following the incident which occurred there on November 18, 1978. An investigation has been interested to determine the source of the drugs and the nature and extent of their use. The drugs are currently in the custody of local authorities in Georgetown, Guyana. To date, the source of the drugs is not known. Investigation at this time indicates that all drugs were probably used by the inhabitants of Jonestown as opposed to compercialized trafficking in parcetics.
