The letter requested certain items of information and evidence in the possession of the FBI regarding the assassination of Congressman Leo J. Ryan at Port Kaituma, Cuyana, on November 18, 1978, be turned over to the Cormittee. As you will recall a meeting was held on March 29, 1979, between representatives of the Criminal Division, the Committee, and the FBI at which time it was mutually agreed that the FBI would furnish the copy of the "Death Tape," a 43minute tape recording of the final hour of Jonestown; a statement as to FBI pro-tragedy knowledge of the activities of the People's Temple; FBI assistance to the Committee in locating one Stanley Clayton and one Odell Rhodes; and a copy of the HDC villeo tape film footage of the crime scene at Port Kaituma, It was additionally agreed that the FPI would not turn over to the Committee the Jonestown guest book, however, the Committee would be allowed to view a copy of the book at FDI Headquarters (W) Accordingly, enclosed herewith is a copy of the above-mentioned video tape film footage which may be transmitted te-representatives of the Committee \ しし The last known address for is Dotroit, Michigan otelephone number The last known addiess for is Oakland. TEI knowledge of activities of the People's Temple prior to the assassination of Congressman Leo J. Ryan at Port Littie, Gayane, on Movember 13, 1978, consists of a communication received in June, 1978, from the Office of Senator S. I. Hayakawa concerning an allegation by a constituent of Senator Layakawa that Jim Jones was coaxing individuals into traveling to Georgetown, Guyana, where they were being hold against their will for unknown reasons. The constituent was contacted by this Bureau and during personal interview it was determined that relatives of the constituent had voluntarily gone to Guyana and no ovidence of forced confinement could be developed. It was determined that no violation of the Federal Kidnaying Statute had occurred and no further investigation was conducted.
