 In response to Department of State inquiries regarding information obtained from [redacted] applicable to RICHARD MC COY, Consular Officer, Georgetown, Guyana, [redacted] was interviewed February 28, 1979, in the San Francisco Office of the FBI. Based on the questions as were posed in the memorandum of the Department of State, dated December 14, 1978, [redacted] furnished the following: (u)

[redacted] advised that his source of original information regarding MC COY was developed in 1978. [redacted] advised that he had heard comments regarding MC COY's conduct prior to the trip that was taken to Guyana wherein Congressman LEO J. RYAN was assassinated. [redacted] at this time, could not state specifically who he had heard these comments from, however, he stated that it seemed to be general knowledge among all individuals who were familiar with the Guyanese operation of the People's Temple (PT). (u)

[redacted] stated, in response to the inquiry regarding any first-hand knowledge or evidence of misconduct on MC COY's part that he particularly had, that he was not personally aware of incidents or behavior that was any indication of misconduct on MR COY's part. He stated that his information was all received from outside sources and that he had no personal first-hand knowledge of any activities. (u)

[redacted] stated that, as far as any individuals who would have first-hand knowledge of misconduct, including the original allegation of a sexual liaison between [redacted] and [redacted] he believes that the individuals who would be best advised of these type of activities would be the Georgetown Officials of the PT. In addition, [redacted] stated that people in Jonestown who controlled MC COY's trips in and out of the compound at Jonestown would be fully aware of any attempts to compromise officials of the character of MC COY, that is in his official capacity with the State Department.
