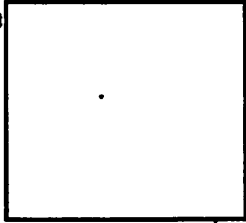

REBUTEL, MAY 8, 1979. *(u)*

ON MAY 10, 1979, LT. COLONEL BRUCE FOITRAST, CHIEF, HOWARD AIR FORCE BASE CLINIC, CANAL ZONE, ADVISED THAT HE WAS PROBABLY THE FIRST DOCTOR ON THE SCENE AT JONESTOWN, GUYANA, ALONG WITH PATHOLOGIST LEN CROOK, UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA MEDICAL SCHOOL, CHARLESTON, SOUTH CAROLINA. FOITRAST STATED THAT HE NOTED THAT JONESTOWN HAD A VERY WELL STOCKED PHARMACY THAT COULD EASILY HAVE LASTED FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS FOR THE POPULATION GIVEN AT THAT TIME. HE STATED THAT HE NOTED THAT MAINLY ANTIBIOTICS AND PSYCHOTROPIC DRUGS WERE IN JONESTOWN AND THAT THE QUANTITY OF PSYCHOTROPICS WAS GREATER THAN WOULD BE NECESSARY FOR THAT POPULATION. HE EXPLAINED THAT PSYCHOTROPICS ARE USED IN PSYCHIATRY. HE STATED THAT HE AND THE OTHERS WHO ARRIVED AT JONESTOWN HAD BEEN TOLD NOT TO TOUCH ANYTHING AND THEREFORE, HE HAS NO KNOWLEDGE OF WHAT HAPPENED TO THE DRUGS.
