with the captioned investigation. On 9/4/80, Ms. [redacted]
telephonically contacted SA [redacted], of the
Congressional Affairs Unit and requested that the FBI furnish
her with the addresses of Charles Touchette and Steven Jones,
the eldest son of James Jones (deceased). Ms. [redacted] further
advised that she had attempted unsuccessfully to obtain
Touchette's address through his attorney. (u)

Dear Mr. Webster:

On June 20 and August 1, 1980, I notified you that the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence is investigating allegations that the Central Intelligence Agency was involved in some way with Jim Jones, the Peoples Temple and the tragic events in Jonestown, Guyana, on November 18, 1978.

Again, I wish to inform you that this inquiry is continuing.

From time to time, it will be necessary for the Committee staff to request from the Federal Bureau of Investigation information which is essential to our inquiry.

I have authorized Miss of the Committee staff to advise the Congressional Affairs Unit of the FBI which materials will be necessary in order for us to complete our inquiry. I trust the information will be provided whenever it is requested.
