PURPOSE: The purpose of this memorandum is to advise you of the receipt of a letter from Chairman Boland and a list of questions from the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) and to recommend that the Records Management Division (RMD) prepare a response to both the letter and questions and coordinate this response with the Intelligence Division (INTD) and Criminal Investigative all infurmation contained Division (CID). 160 HEREIN IS JINCLASSIFIED

The HPSCI has previously advised us that they are #248/12 conducting an investigation regarding allegations of possible Central Intelligence Agency involvement in the events that took place at Jonestown, Guyana, on 11/18/78. The Staff of the HPSCI has reviewed at FBI Headquarters a voice-enhanced tape recording of Jim Jones which was recorded on 11/18/78. On 10/3/80, the Committee was furnished with copies of all documentary material available to the public on this matter' in the FBI Headquarters reading room. On 10/17/80, based on Department of Justice approval, SA Donald Hale of San Francisco was interviewed by the Committee Staff in their offices in the presence of Arden Schell, Deputy Assistant Attorney General, and SA of the Congressional Affairs Unit. During this interview the Staff asked that the Department furnish them with answers to three questions. By a memorandum from Alan A. Parker, Assistant Attorney General to Mr. dated 10/20/80 (copy attached), the Department has requested that we provide them with answers to

these questions for delivery to the Committee.

- (5) Pre-tragedy knowledge and investigation of the People's Temple by the Department of Justice and Federal Bureau of Investigation;
- (6) Copy of the People's Temple Jonestown guest book;
- (7) Copy of all NBC films taken in Guyana; and
- (8) Copy of Richard McCoy's interview and statements submitted to the FBI. Herein enclosed is a copy of Mr. McCoy's waiver of the Privacy Act requirements.
