Memo Monroe to Mr. Young INQUIRY FROM THE HPSCI REGARDING JONESTOWN, GUYANA

By teletype dated 1/28/81 (attached) the soffice advised that a review of their that on 12/14/78 a former protain documents for the former former and the former fo Los Angeles Office advised that a review of their files disclosed that on 12/14/78 a former FBI employee admitted taking certain documents from our Los Angeles Office while employed. The former FBI employee subsequently turned the documents over to an attorney. The attorney advised that one of his former employees, who was also a former People's Temple (PT) member, possibly copied the documents and caused them to be transported to Jonestown. A document found at Jonestown indicates that the attorney's former employee discovered where the attorney maintained the documents which he received from the former FBI employee and made photocopies. The recovered documents revealed the identities of nine FBI informants by name and referred to four FBI informants by symbol number. The informants were made aware by the FBI of the release of their identities to persons outside the FBI. The informants who were identified were not at that time furnishing information to the FBI. The U. S. Department of Justice was made aware of
