whe asked his usual question about whether we have any elitism or not/ do we have specialization or will we develop specialization who we have a classless society? Do we think at any time we will develop specialization to the point that one person might work as a doctor all day instead of spending a portion of m his day in the fields?

we said that of course one has specialization but that the practice of having everyone somewhat familiar with the fields is very rehabilatative and gives all the people a common experience and a common understanding which is important right now to start a foundation of equality and to remove the prior x-illitism that some might have had he said "I see this is an interesting strategy of Comrade JJ" — he said that in Chiua they had used a technique to punish the minteligencia that had been friendly to the USSR and had recalled how the USSR helped—China, they would send them to the "desert" areas from the cities to punish them

but he said he could see that our idea was different/xharkar we said that we
did not use work wto punish people/ he said in USSR they still use work to
"punish" people if they are lazy/ we said we use positive mincentives (this might

-we told them they were naive in their view of the US (the publicity of 80% truth) in regard to us and other matters/ did they think things had changed since Carter-he didn't argue about being naive, just said he didn't think things had changed since Carter

-I mentioned Chilean refugees and how we helped them and even offerrad to have them come and stay at our prject in Jonestown/ he said "would Guyana go along with you taking in Galan early and said he noticed that Guyana hadn't taken in any Chileans
