

Dear Cde. Kennedy

The Peoples Temple Agricultural Project in the North West District has been trying to obtain enough shell to help fertilize the land under cultivation in cooperation with the government FCH program. Until today I had thought that there would be no problem with this and had arranged for a boat to ship 500 tons of shell to the Northwest for this purpose. I applied for a permit and also thought that that would not be a problem and then found out today that no permits are being given due to a regulations concerning the extinction of turtles.

If there is anyway that you could further explain to us the situation or assist us in obtaining the permit need to ship the sea shells. The people who are shipping the shells have informed me that they will only be able to hold the boat for two days further before they go on to other assignments. As I am sure you are well aware - the soil type in the northwest district is in desperate need of the lime available in this type of sea shell in order to produce any sizable amount of a harvest.

Please do let us know if there is any possible way of obtaining this permit as we have based our food production figures for the community on the basis of a treated soil. Thank you for your assistance.
